WHEREAS by section 26 of the Pluralities Act, 1838, after reciting that "Whereas in some instances tithings, hamlets, chapelries, and other places or districts may be separated from the parishes or mother churches to which they belong, with great advantage, and places altogether extra-parochial may, in some instances, with advantage be annexed to parishes or districts to which they are contiguous, or be constituted separate parishes for ecclesiastical purposes," it is, amongst other things, enacted, "That when with respect to his own diocese it shall appear to the Archbishop of the Province, or when the Bishop of any diocese shall represent to the said Archbishop, that any such tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place or district within the diocese of such Archbishop, or the diocese of such Bishop, as the case may be, may be advantageously separated from any parish or mother church, and either be constituted a separate benefice by itself or be united to any other parish to which it may be more conveniently annexed, or to any other adjoining tithing, hamlet, chapelry, place, or district, parochial or extra-parochial, so as to form a separate parish or benefice, or that any extra-parochial place may with advantage be annexed to any parish to which it is contiguous, or be constituted a separate parish for ecclesiastical purposes; and the said Archbishop, or Bishop, shall draw up a scheme in writing (the scheme of such Bishop to be transmitted to the said Archbishop for his consideration) describing the mode in which it appears to him that the alteration may best be effected, and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect to ecclesiastical jurisdiction, glebe lands, tithes, rent charges, and other ecclesiastical dues, rates and payments, and in respect to patronage and rights to pews, may be made with justice to all parties interested; and if the patron or patrons of the benefice or benefices to be affected by such alteration shall consent in writing under his or their hands to such scheme, or to such modification thereof, as the said Archbishop may approve, and the said Archbishop shall, on full consideration and inquiry, be satisfied with any such scheme, or modification thereof, and shall certify the same and such consent as aforesaid, by his report to His Majesty in Council, it shall be lawful for His Majesty in Council to make an Order for carrying such scheme, or modification thereof, as the case may be, into effect."

And whereas the Right Reverend Hubert Murray, Lord Bishop of Oxford, hath made a Representation in writing to the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, Lord Archbishop of Canterbury, as follows:—

"We, Hubert Murray Lord Bishop of Oxford, in pursuance of the 26th section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, do hereby represent to Your Grace as follows:—

"There is in the County of Buckingham and Diocese of Oxford the Vicarage or Benefice of Buckland the Parish whereof contained a population of six hundred and eighty-nine or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for one hundred and seventy-five persons.

"The net annual value of the said benefice of Buckland is Two hundred and sixty pounds or thereabouts.

"There is also in the same County and Diocese the Vicarage or Benefice of St. Leonards the Parish whereof contains a population of one hundred and thirty or thereabouts with accommodation in the Parish Church for one hundred and thirty persons.

"The net annual value of the said Benefice of St. Leonards is three hundred pounds or thereabouts.

"A certain portion of the said Parish of Buckland known as Buckland Common with a population of two hundred and fifty or thereabouts is distant about three miles from the Parish Church of Buckland and in close proximity to the Parish Church of St. Leonards.

"That it appears to me and I do hereby represent to Your Grace that under the provisions of the said Pluralities Act, 1838, the said portion of the said Parish of Buckland known as Buckland Common more particularly described in the hereinafter mentioned Scheme and delineated on the plan annexed to such Scheme appended to this Representation and thereon coloured pink, may be advantageously separated therefrom and be annexed to the said Parish of St. Leonards to which it is contiguous.

"The Right Honourable Frederick, Baron Birkenhead, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, as such Lord High Chancellor is the Patron in the right of the Crown of the said Benefice of Buckland and the Reverend Aylmer Vivian Arthur Scott is the present Incumbent thereof.

"Messieurs Joseph Grout Williams, Charles Edward Briggs, Ernest Mathews, Stewart William Jenney, Constantine Osborne Phipps, Thomas Vernon Garnier, and Sir Charles Frederick Hadden, K.C.B., are the Patrons of the said Benefice of St. Leonards and the Reverend Gordon Frank Sharp is the present Incumbent thereof.

"That pursuant to the directions contained in the 26th Section of the Pluralities Act, 1838, I, the said Lord Bishop have drawn up a Scheme in writing annexed to this Representation describing the mode in which it appears to me that the alteration above proposed may best be effected and how the changes consequent on such alteration in respect of Ecclesiastical Jurisdiction, Glebe Lands, Tithe Rent charges and other Ecclesiastical Dues, Rates and Payments and in respect to Patronage and rights to pews may be made with justice to all parties interested and I do hereby submit the same to Your Grace together with the consents in writing of the Patrons of both of the said Benefices of Buckland and St. Leonards and also the consents of the Incumbents of the said Benefices to the intent that if Your Grace shall on full consideration and enquiry be satisfied with such Scheme you may certify the same and such consents aforesaid to His Majesty in Council."

And whereas the said Scheme drawn up by the said Bishop, and the Consents referred to in the said Representation, are as follows:—

"SCHEME."

"It is proposed to separate from the Parish of Buckland and annex to the Parish of St. Leonards all that portion of the Civil Parish of Buckland known as Buckland Common which lies to the south of a wood known as

Northill Wood and is bounded on the south western and south sides thereof by the Parishes of St. Leonards and Aston Clinton and on part of the north eastern side by the Parish of Drayton Beauchamp and on the remainder by the Parish of Cholesbury which portion is more particularly delineated on the plan annexed to this Scheme and thereon coloured pink.

"That the Incumbent of St. Leonards shall have sole and exclusive Cure of souls within such portion so to be separated from Buckland and annexed to St. Leonards.

"That the inhabitants of such portion shall be entitled to accommodation in the Parish Church of St. Leonards but shall cease to be entitled to any right or accommodation in the Parish Church of Buckland except nevertheless any person or persons (if any) possessing a legal right by Faculty or otherwise to any pew or sitting in the said Parish Church of Buckland and who may not be willing to relinquish and give up the same.

"That the inhabitants of the aforesaid portion shall have such and the same right to have Marriages, Baptisms, Churchings, and Burials solemnized and performed in the Parish Church of St. Leonards as they might have had in the Parish Church of Buckland.

"That all fees, ecclesiastical offerings and emoluments arising from the said portion so to be separated from the Parish of Buckland shall henceforth belong to the Incumbent of the Benefice of St. Leonards.

"That no alteration shall be made in the endowment of the said Benefices or either of them.

"That no alteration shall be made in the Patronage of the said Benefice or either of them.

" CONSENTS.

"We, The Right Honourable Frederick, Baron Birkenhead, Lord High Chancellor of Great Britain, the Patron or person in the right of the Crown entitled to present to the Benefice of Buckland in the County of Buckingham (if the same were now vacant) the Reverend Aylmer Vivian Arthur Scott, M.A., Incumbent of the same Benefice, Joseph Grout Williams, Charles Edward Briggs, Ernest Mathews, Stewart William Jenney, Sir Charles Frederick Hadden, K.C.B., Constantine Osborne Phipps, and Thomas Vernon Garnier the Patrons or persons entitled to present to the Benefice of St. Leonards (if the same were now vacant) and the Rev. Gordon Frank Sharp, B.A., the Incumbent of the same Benefice, do hereby respectively signify to Your Grace our several consents to the Scheme above proposed and set forth and to every matter and thing therein contained.

but excluding:—

1. any of the operations mentioned above when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the weaving of jute, flax or hemp, or the dyeing, bleaching or finishing of jute, flax or hemp yarn or cloth;

2. any of the operations mentioned above when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in a business in which the sacks or bags are used as containers for other articles the production or sale of which forms part of the business;

3. the making of rope-bound coal or coke sacks when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department engaged in the making of made-up textile articles other than sacks or bags, whether rope-bound or not, of the kind mentioned in this Order;

4. any of the operations mentioned in

paragraph (b) above when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the warehousing of, the packing of and similar operations in regard to made-up textile articles other than sacks or bags, whether rope-bound or not, of the kind mentioned in this Order;

5. operations included in the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920.

PART III.

SECTION II.—In the case of all Female Persons employed on Piece-Work each Piece-Rate paid must be such as will yield in the circumstances of the case not less than 8½d. per hour to an Ordinary Worker. In determining whether any Piece-Rate satisfies this condition, regard must be had only to the earnings of Ordinary Workers, *i.e.*, Workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question and not to the earnings of Workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, *e.g.*, Learners and Infirm Workers.

PART IV.

*Overtime Rates.**Male and Female Workers.*

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

(a) For Workers employed on Time-Work:—

1. For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Saturdays, Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

2. For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

3. For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

4. For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of sub-paragraphs 2 and 3 of this paragraph.

(b) For Workers other than Learners (as defined in Part V of this Schedule) employed on Piece-Work:—

Workers (other than Learners) employed on Piece-Work shall receive in

respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, or to One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, or to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section if the Worker had been employed on Time-Work were Double Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

(c) For Learners (as defined in Part V of this Schedule) employed on Piece-Work:—

Learners employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, in addition to Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section if the Worker had been employed on Time-Work were Double Time, Time-and-a-Half, or Time-and-a-Quarter respectively.

SECTION III.—The provisions of this Part of this Notice are subject to the proviso that:—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rates in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall only be payable after 50 hours have been worked.

Note.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART V.

For the purpose of this notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—A Female Learner is a worker who:—

(a) Is employed by an employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning the branch or branches of the trade (as carried on by the employer subject to the provisions of this section) in which the Learner is for the time being employed; provided that no person shall be deemed to be a Learner if employed for a longer period than six months on any one or more than twelve months on any two or more of the following processes, *viz.*, carrying about; collecting work from benches and machines; lidding-up (other than round boxes); tying-up and nesting:—except in so far as any of the aforementioned processes may be incidental

to any other process upon which the worker may be engaged.

(b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of Learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding eight weeks, but the probation period shall be included in her period of Learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION II.—The expression "Home-worker" means a worker who works in her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART VI.

The above Minimum Rates shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to

(a) All Male Workers of the classes specified in Part I. of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in that branch of the Box Trade in Great Britain which is engaged in the making of boxes or parts thereof, made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material; and to

(b) All Female Workers in Great Britain who:

(i) Are engaged in manufacturing processes upon boxes or parts thereof made wholly or partially of paper, cardboard, chip or similar material, and generally, to all workers directly connected with such processes; or

(ii) Are engaged in transferring material from the store-room to the factory or workshop, and to workers engaged in transferring finished boxes from the factory or workshop to the warehouse, if such workers are also to any considerable extent

engaged in connection with the work of distributing the material among, or collection of the finished boxes from, the workers engaged in the processes of box-making.

They shall not apply to Female Workers who:—

(i) Are wholly or mainly engaged in occupations in a store-room which involves no change in, or treatment of, the material necessary to its being made into boxes; or

(ii) Are wholly or mainly engaged in a warehouse on occupations directly connected with the storage or despatch of finished boxes which involve no examination or change in the form of such boxes; or

(iii) Are wholly or mainly engaged in transferring material *in bulk* from the store-room to the factory or workshop; or

(iv) Are wholly or mainly engaged in transferring finished boxes from the factory or workshop to the warehouse, or from the warehouse for despatch to customers; or

(v) Wherever employed are engaged as clerks, telephone attendants, and others whose work stands in relationship to the trade similar to that of such workers.

PART VII.

The above Minimum Rates of wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—In the case of Female Workers employed on Piece-Work each Piece-Rate paid shall be such as will yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 8½d. an hour to an Ordinary Worker, i.e., a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the classes of work in question.

PART IV.

Overtime Rates (as Varied) For Male and Female Workers.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	48
On any day (other than Saturday) ...	9
On Saturday	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows:—

(A)—*Workers Employed on Time-Work.*

(1) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter.

(2) For the second two hours of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Half.

(3) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and for Overtime after the first four hours on any other day the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Double Time.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs 2 and 3 of this Part of this Section.

Provided that—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rates in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required shall only be payable after 50 hours have been worked.

(B)—*Workers Employed on Piece-Work.*

I.—All Male Workers (including Learners) employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked as set out in this Part of this Schedule, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the General Minimum Time-Rate, to One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-section (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half, or Double Time respectively.

II.—*Female Workers:—*

(i) Female Workers other than Learners employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked as set out in this Part of this Schedule in addition to payment at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, to One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, or to the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime

Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-section (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double-Time respectively.

(ii) Female Learners employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked as set out in this Part of this Schedule, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, to One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, or to the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half, or Double-Time respectively.

Note.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshops Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART V.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

SECTION I.—A Machine Tackler is a male person who is engaged in setting, adjusting, and keeping running Paper Bag Machines and in superintending and carrying through all other operations that can be performed in whole or in part by such machines.

SECTION II.—A Male Learner is a worker under 21 years of age, who while employed is engaged during the whole or a substantial part of his time in learning some branch or process of the trade.

SECTION III.—A Female Learner is a worker who—

(i) Is employed by an employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning the branch or branches of the trade in which the Learner is for the time being employed; and

(ii) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding eight weeks, but the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided also that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION IV.—The expression "Home-worker" means a worker who works in her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall apply to all Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag) Order, 1919, and set out in Section II below.

SECTION II.—The Paper Bag Trade as specified in the Trade Boards (Paper Bag) Order, 1919, is as follows:—

The manufacture from paper (including gauze-lined or cloth-lined paper) of any bag or container without a gummed flap, *including* the operations of packing, parcelling, warehousing, receiving, store-keeping, despatching, time-keeping, lift-operating, and cleaning, when these operations are carried on in connection with paper-bag manufacture and *including* the printing of paper bags when the printing apparatus is attached to the making apparatus, but *excluding* the manufacture of bags or containers with ungummed flaps (for use in the transmission of printed matter or samples) when made by the same processes as gummed envelopes and

excluding the manufacture of receptacles from cardboard, such as boxes, cartons or skillets.

PART VII.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are to be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.

- (a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period, whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 40 a "week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the class in question;
- (b) In all other cases a "week" means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION III.

For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment, the rates set out above must be divided—

- (a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section II (a) above by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question;
- (b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION IV.

Payment at not less than the hourly rate, calculated as described in Section III, must be made for all hours of employment (not merely for those constituting a "week" as described in Section II), except in so far as higher rates are payable under Part II below.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers (all ages).

In lieu of the Overtime Rates as at present fixed, Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Part I of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part III of the Notice M.D. (3) issued by the Trade Board, dated 5th November, 1920, shall apply in substitution for the Proposed Minimum Rates otherwise applicable, as set out in Part I of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the above mentioned Notice M.D. (3), to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

PART III.

Definitions of Classes of Workers and Areas.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Schedule the following definitions shall apply:—

(a) A *Foreman* is a person who is employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, and to whom is deputed the duty of exercising supervising authority over workers exceeding 5 in number (exclusive of the foreman) working in any shop, department, or other branch of the trade.

(b) A *Roundswoman* is a female person in charge of a round or rounds.

(c) A *Shop Assistant* is a male or female person wholly or mainly employed in a shop in serving customers and/or in checking in and out.

SECTION II.—The proposed rates set out in the respective Scales A, B and C in Part I of this Schedule shall apply as follows:—

SCALE A.—(a) To all areas administered by Rural District Councils and (b) to all areas administered by Municipal Borough Councils and Urban District Councils which according to the most recent Census had a population of less than 10,000; but so as in neither case to apply to any area within the Metropolitan Police District.

SCALE B.—To all areas other than those to which Scales A and C apply.

SCALE C.—To the area comprising the City of London and the Metropolitan Police District.

Provided that the rate applicable to a roundsman or roundswoman shall be determined by reference to the area in which the greater part of his or her round of distribution lies.

NOTE.—The minimum rates of wages fixed by the Trade Board and at present in operation apply as follows:—

SCALE A.—To areas administered by Rural District Councils, but not to any town or village having a population exceeding 10,000 within any Rural District Council Area.

SCALE B.—To all areas other than those to which Scales A and C apply.

SCALE C.—To London; that is to say the City of London and the Metropolitan Police Districts, except such parts as are administered by a Rural District Council.

PART IV.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in England and Wales in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Milk Distributive) Order, 1920, as set out in Part VI of the Board's Notice M.D. (3), dated 5th November, 1920.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above proposed General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act, to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, to workers of greater skill or length of experience, or to Agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from 5th November, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Milk Distributive Trade Board (England and Wales), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

(6) dated 21st October, 1921, in their applications to Male Workers of 21 years of age and over who are employed as Hemp Rollers on non-reciprocating machines or as Hemp Breakers, the proposed variations being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Certain Classes of Male Hemp Rollers and Hemp Breakers.

SECTION I.—For Male Workers of 21 years of age and over who are employed as Hemp Rollers on non-reciprocating machines or as Hemp Breakers:—

General Minimum Time-Rate at present fixed, 48s. 6d. per week.

General Minimum Time-Rate proposed, 54s. per week.

SECTION II.—(a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period, whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 44, "a week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the class in question.

(b) In all other cases "a week" means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION III.—For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment the rates set out in Section I of this Part of this Schedule must be divided—

(a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section II (a) of this Part by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question.

(b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION IV.—Payment at not less than the hourly rate calculated as described in Section III of this Part must be made for all hours of employment, whether in excess of the customary working week or not, except for those hours in respect of which a higher rate is payable under the overtime provisions specified in Part II below.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Male Hemp Rollers and Hemp Breakers.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part VII of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (6) dated 21st October, 1921, shall apply in substitution for the proposed General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice F.H. (6) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male workers of the classes specified in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, and set out in Part VIII of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (6) dated 21st October, 1921.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 7th November, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name

and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

PART I.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Apprentices (as defined in Part V of this Schedule) who are Apprenticed to Tenting or Dressing.

The General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Apprentices as defined in Part V of this Schedule, who are employed under the conditions set out in this Notice in the branches of the Flax and Hemp Trade specified in this Part of this Schedule and included within the scope of the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, shall be as follows:—

Male Apprentices who are apprenticed to Tenting shall receive:—

During the 1st year of their apprenticeship, 14s. per week.

During the 2nd year of their apprenticeship, 17s. 6d. per week.

During the 3rd year of their apprenticeship, 21s. per week.

During the 4th year of their apprenticeship, 32s. per week.

Male Apprentices who are apprenticed to Dressing shall receive:—

During the 1st year of their apprenticeship, 14s. per week.

During the 2nd year of their apprenticeship, 17s. 6d. per week.

During the 3rd year of their apprenticeship, 21s. per week.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Improvers (as herein defined) in Tenting or Dressing.

A Male Improver in Tenting, that is to say, a male worker who has completed a term of four years' apprenticeship in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule with regard to Male Apprentice Tenters, shall receive during the first year of his employment as a Tenter, subsequent to the completion of his apprenticeship, 40s. per week.

A Male Improver in Dressing, that is to say, a male worker who has completed a term of three years' apprenticeship in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule with regard to Male Apprentice Dressers, shall receive during the first year of his employment as a Dresser, subsequent to the completion of his apprenticeship, 32s. per week.

PART III.

Definition of "Week."

SECTION I.—(a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period, whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 44, "a week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the class in question.

(b) In all other cases "a week" means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment the rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule must be divided—

(a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section I (a) of this Part by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question.

(b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION III.—Payment at not less than the hourly rate calculated as described in Section II of this part must be made for all hours of employment whether in excess of the customary working week or not, except for those hours in respect of which a higher rate is payable under the overtime provisions specified in Part IV below.

PART IV.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Male Apprentices and Improvers in Tenting and Dressing.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner set out in the Schedule to the Notice F.H.(6) issued by the Trade Board and dated 21st October, 1921, shall apply in substitution for the rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the Notice F.H.(6) dated 21st October, 1921, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART V.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in Parts I, II and IV of this Schedule, an Apprentice is defined as being a male worker of 16 years of age or over who—

(a) Is employed during the whole of his time in accordance with the provisions of

this Schedule under an Indenture (duly stamped) for a period of four years in the case of apprentice tenters or for a period of three years in the case of apprentice dressers, in the form prescribed by the Trade Board as set out in Part VI of this Schedule, and

(b) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that:—

(i) The registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of apprenticeship are not complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the minimum rates and under the special conditions for apprentices without registration for a probation period not exceeding twelve weeks; but in the event of such worker being continued thereafter at his employment as an Apprentice, the probation period shall be included in his period of apprenticeship.

PART VI.

Form of Indenture of Apprenticeship Prescribed by the above Trade Board.

This Indenture made the _____ day of _____ between _____ of _____ a minor of the age of _____ years (hereinafter called the "Apprentice") of the first part, _____ of _____ the parent or guardian of the Apprentice (hereinafter called the "Guardian") of the second part, and _____ of _____ (hereinafter called the "Employer") of the third part;

Witnesseth as follows, that is to say:—

1. The Apprentice of his own free will and with the consent of the Guardian hereby binds himself to serve the Employer as his apprentice in his trade of _____ for the term of _____ * years from the date of these presents.

2. In consideration of the covenants and agreements entered into by the Guardian and the Apprentice, the Employer hereby covenants with the Guardian and the Apprentice and with each of them severally as follows:—

(a) That he will keep the Apprentice as his Apprentice during the said term and to the best of his power, skill and knowledge instruct the Apprentice or cause him to be instructed in the section of the Flax and Hemp Trade known as _____.

(b) That he will keep the Apprentice under his own supervision or place him under a fully qualified Journeyman (or Journeymen).

(c) That he will pay to the Apprentice every week during the said term wages in accordance with the appropriate scale of wages as fixed and as varied from time to time for Male Apprentices by the Trade Board, subject always to the wages being paid pro rata in the event of the employer being unavoidably compelled to work short time for any period, and provided that should the period of short time last for four

continuous months the parties may agree to cancel the Indenture.

(d) That, in the event of the Apprentice being absent from work through ill health and in receipt of sickness benefit under the National Insurance Act, or through unemployment within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, the Employer shall not be bound to pay wages to the Apprentice in accordance with Clause 2 (c) of this Indenture.

(e) That if the Employer shall die or become permanently incapacitated through illness or injury (to be certified by a fully qualified Medical Practitioner) or cease to carry on the said trade of _____ before the expiration of the said term of apprenticeship, then, and in any such case, the Employer or his Executors or his Administrators, as the case may be, shall, after obtaining the consent and approval of the Guardian and of the said Apprentice, which consent and approval shall not be unreasonably withheld, use all reasonable efforts to find another suitable employer for the Apprentice to take over this Indenture.

(f) That in the event of the death, incapacity or removal of the Guardian from the District in which the Apprentice resides, it shall be open to the Apprentice to propose to the Employer in writing that the Indenture be cancelled, and the Employer shall not unreasonably withhold his consent to the cancellation of the Indenture on these grounds.

(g) That he will not hold the Apprentice liable to make good the value of any work which he may spoil whilst learning his trade, except in the case of wilful or malicious damage.

(h) That he will cause the Apprentice to attend during the terms of this Indenture such approved technical classes as may be agreed by the parties concerned in the Indenture, the Apprentice to suffer no loss of wages by reason of such attendance or by reason of his attendance at school in accordance with the Education Act, 1918, and the time so spent to be reckoned as an equivalent part of the usual working hours and not extra thereto.

(i) That he will supply the Apprentice forthwith, upon its execution, with a true copy of this Indenture.

3. In consideration of the premises, the Guardian and the Apprentice jointly and severally covenant with the Employer as follows:—

(a) That the Apprentice shall truly and faithfully during the said term serve the Employer as his apprentice and his secrets keep and shall diligently attend to the said trade and at all times willingly obey the lawful and reasonable commands of the Employer, and shall not absent himself from the Employer's service without leave.

(b) That the Apprentice shall not do any damage or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the goods, moneys or other property of the Employer.

(c) That the Apprentice shall willingly perform all such shop duties as are usually done by Apprentices.

(d) That the Apprentice shall attend such continuation classes between the hours of 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. as the Employer desires pro-

vided that the Apprentice suffer no loss of wages by reason of such attendance.

(c) That in case the Apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to lawful orders or commands of the said Employer, or be slothful or negligent or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself towards the Employers then it shall be lawful to cancel this Indenture and discharge the said Apprentice.

4. Any matter in dispute between the parties arising out of the interpretation or application of the terms of the clauses of this Indenture shall be submitted to the Chairman of the Trade Board for the time being with a view to a settlement.

PART VII.

H. (6) dated 21st October, 1921.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 7th November, 1921.
