2.—For the purposes of the provisions of the Act (including the Eighth Schedule) relating to the transfer of services and officers, the several days mentioned in the first column of the Schedule to this Order are hereby fixed to be the appointed days as respects Northern Ireland in relation to the several services and officers respectively mentioned in the second column of that Schedule, provided that if any question arises as to which of the said days is applicable to any particular service or to any particular

officer or class of officers that question shall be determined by the Lord Lieutenant.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared and laid before His Majesty in Council a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of October, 1921, in the words and figures following,

that is to say:

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council the following Scheme for constituting a Separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District) of Heeley, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime Particular District) of Saint John the Evangelist, Sheffield Park, both in the County of York and in the Diocese of Shef-

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Heeley and the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sheffield Park, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral super-intendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof, and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Heeley and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sheffield Park, which are hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a Separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed district any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the

purpose of Divine Worship:

And whereas in pursuance of the power and authority given by an Order of the High Court of Chancery dated the 1st day of August, 1854, confirming a Scheme for the future application of the income of the trust property of the Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of the Town and Parish of Sheffield, in the said County of York, and of an Order of the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales dated the 4th day of March, 1874, in partial variation of the Scheme established by the said first mentioned Order, the said Burgesses and Commonalty have proposed to appropriate the sum of Three hundred pounds per annum out of that part of the income of their trust property which is applicable to Ecclesiastical purposes in and towards the endowment of the District herein

proposed to be constituted:

And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have signified by a Writing bearing date the 20th day of October, 1921, under our Common Seal, our approval of and consent to the proposed endowment of the said

proposed District:

And whereas the said endowment of Three hundred pounds per annum has been so appropriated as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of Patronage of the said District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned to the Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of Sheffield aforesaid:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Heeley and of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sheffield Park, which are more particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a Separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named The District of Saint Aidan, Sheffield.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of patronage of the said district so recommended to be constituted and when such district shall have become a new parish as aforesaid then of the said new parish and of the nomination of the minister or incumbent thereof shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be vested in and shall be exercised by the said Twelve Capital Burgesses and Commonalty of the Town and Parish of Sheffield and their successors.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid or any of them in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts or of either of them or of any

other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Aidan, Sheffield,

comprising: -"I. All that portion of the New Parish (scmetime Particular District) of Saint John the Fvangelist, Sheffield Park, in the County of York and in the Diocese of Sheffield, which is bounded upon the north-east by the New Parish of Darnall, upon the south-east partly by the Parish of Handsworth and partly by the New Parish of Christ Church, Gleadless, upon the south-west partly by the New Parish (sometime District) of Heeley and partly by the New Parish of Dyer's Hill, all in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining

side, that is to say, upon the north, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Dyer's Hill from the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sheffield Park, at the junction of City Road with Fitzwalter Road, and extending thence north-eastward along the middle of Fitzwalter Road and in a straight line in continuation thereof for a distance in all of $36\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading from White's Lane and Manor Laiths Gardens to Manor Lane, and extending thence southeastward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 31 chains or thereabouts to a point opposite to the southern end of the fence forming the north-western boundary of the close numbered 800 upon the Ordnance Maps of the City of Sheffield published in the years 1905 and 1906 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the Map or Plan which is annexed to this Scheme, and extending thence north-eastward first to and then along the said fence and along the fence forming the northwestern boundary of the close numbered 801 upon the said Maps for a distance in all of 123 chains or thereabouts to the point where the last mentioned fence crosses the middle of the footpath leading from White's Lane to Manor Lane and Corker Bottoms Lane, and extending thence eastward along the middle of the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 10 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Manor Lane, and extending thence southward along the middle of Manor Lane for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to its junction with Corker Bottoms Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Corker Bottoms Lane for a distance of $31\frac{1}{2}$ chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries Corker Bottoms Lane across the stream known as Kirk Bridge Dike, and extending thence first northward and then north-eastward along the middle of the said stream for a distance of 241 chains or thereabouts to the point where the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sheffield Park, the New Parish of Attercliffe, in the said County and Diocese, and the said New

Parish of Darnall all meet.
"II. And also all that contiguous portion of the said New Parish of Heeley, which is bounded upon the south-east by the said New Parish of Christ Church, Gleadless, upon the north-east by the above described portion of the said New Parish of Saint John the Evangelist, Sheffield Park, upon the north by the said New Parish of Dyer's Hill, and upon the remaining part, that is to say, upon the south-west, by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Dyer's Hill from the said New Parish of Heeley at a point in the middle of Granville Road near the northern entrance to Norfolk Park and opposite to the middle of the footpath running along the eastern side of the said park to Arbourthorne Road, and extending thence south-eastward to and along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 28 chains or thereabouts to the point where it meets Arbourthorne Road, and extending thence south-eastward across Arbourthorne Road for a distance of 1 chain or thereabouts to a point in the middle of the footpath leading from Arbourthorne Road past the western end of Spring Lane to Hagg Lane, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of

the last mentioned footpath for a distance of 1 mile or thereabouts to the point where it meets the north-western side of Hagg Lane upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Heeley from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Gleadless."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been

approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

The following Statute made by the Governing Body of Oriel College, Oxford, on the 12th day of October, 1921, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

A STATUTE to amend certain Statutes made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877 (40 and 41 Vict., c. 48), and approved by the Queen in Council on the 3rd day of May, 1882, in relation to Oriel College in the University of Oxford (as amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 18th day of April, 1884, and approved by the Queen in Council on the 27th day of January, 1885, as further amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 25th day of April, 1917, and approved by the King in Council on the 16th day of January, 1918, and as further amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 12th day of November, 1919, and approved by the King in Council on the 13th day of August, 1920), duly made at a General Meeting of the said Provost and Fellows, specially summoned for the purpose, held on the 12th day of October, 1921, and passed at such meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Whereas by Statute III., 17, as made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and approved by the Queen in Council on the third day of May, 1882, in relation to Oriel College in the University of Oxford (as

amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 18th day of April, 1884, and approved by the Queen in Council on the 27th day of January, 1885, as further amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 25th day of April, 1917, approved by the King in Council on the 16th day of January, 1918, and as further amended by a Statute made by the Provost and Fellows of the said College on the 12th day of November, 1919, and approved by the King in Council on the 13th day of August, 1920), it was enacted as follows:—

"17. Each Ordinary Fellow shall be entitled to receive the annual stipend of £200 out of the Corporate Revenues, clear of Income Tax as hereinafter provided, but inclusive of all allowances save as hereinafter mentioned."

And whereas by Statute III., 22, as made by the University of Oxford Commissioners under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and approved by the Queen in Council on the 3rd day of May, 1882, in relation to Oriel College, in the University of Oxford, it was enacted as follows:—

"22. Any Ordinary Fellow who shall vacate his Fellowship under Clause 18 or 19 may, nevertheless, if he shall then be qualified for election under Clause 21, be reelected to his Fellowship in the manner and under the conditions specified in that clause; and any person who shall have been elected under Clause 21, or re-elected under this clause, shall be capable of re-election from time to time in like manner: Provided that the whole number of persons holding Fellowships under the powers conferred by this and the last preceding clause, or either of them, shall not exceed three at any one time."

And whereas the Provost and Fellows are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the said Statutes in manner hereinafter appearing:

We, the said Provost and Fellows of the said College do hereby, in exercise of the powers given to us by the 54th Section of the said Act, alter Statute III., 17, by substituting for the existing clause the following clause:—

"17. Each Ordinary Fellow, other than a Fellow elected after examination, shall be entitled to receive out of the Corporate Revenues, clear of Income Tax as hereinafter provided, but inclusive of all allowances save as hereinafter mentioned, such annual stipend, being not less than £200 and not more than £300, as the Provost and Fellows may, from time to time, at any stated general meeting, determine,"

and Statute III., 22, by substituting for the word "three" the word "five," and by adding at the end the words "exclusive of persons employed in educational work in the College."

COAL MINES ACT.

THE EXPLOSIVES IN COAL MINES ORDER OF THE 9TH NOVEMBER, 1921.

In pursuance of the power conferred upon them by Section 61 of the Coal Mines Act, 1911, (a) and under the provisions of the Mining Industry Act, 1920, (b) the Board of Trade hereby make the following Order:—

Section II.—The proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Section I of this Part of this Schedule are subject to the proviso

that in the case of workers who return to the trade after an absence of not less than four years, the minimum rates payable to such

(a) Where the worker is absent without the permission of the employer or at his own request or in order to comply with an obligation imposed by Law, or through being incapacitated from work by illness or other cause, or during any customary local holidays.

(b) Where, at his own desire, it is agreed that any worker shall be regularly employed for a less period than the full working week of the Laundry.

(c) Where, in pursuance of an agreement made in writing between an employer and the workers affected (and registered with the Trade Board) it is provided that by reason of seasonal trade, or for any cause not within the control of the employer, short time is regularly to be worked for any period commencing not less than seven days after the date of such agreement.

(d) Where in any week a worker is required to stand off for not less than a quarter of the normal working week of the Laundry by reason of a stoppage of work caused by a

breakdown in machinery, a stoppage in supplies of water, gas, electric current or fuel, a general breakdown in transport services or other similar emergency over which the employer has no control. Provided that this clause shall not operate until the expiration of at least seven days from the date on which notice so to stand off is given to the worker by the employer.

In such cases a proportionate deduction may be made according as the number of hours worked is less than the full working week of the

Laundry when not on short time.

Provided that for the purpose of calculating the proportionate deduction under the provisions of the foregoing clause, no deduction shall be made in respect of absence from work on any day during which the Laundry is closed by reason of such day being a holiday allowed to female workers under the provisions of Section 35 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, except where in any week in which such holiday occurs the worker without reasonable and sufficient cause absents himself for more than two hours during the period in which he had the opportunity of working.

† The General Minimum Time-Rates at present fixed and set out in the first column under paragraphs (a) and (b) of this Proviso apply to workers *entering* the trade at the ages shown.

^{*}Note.—The General Minimum Time-Rates as at present fixed and set out above are for a week not exceeding 48 hours, and save as provided in Section V hereof no deductions shall be made from such rates where the number of hours of work in a week is less than 48 except:—

workers unless they had previously had a period of unbroken experience in the trade of not less than one year's duration, shall be those applicable under Section I to workers of the same age who have had no previous experience in the Industry.

PART II.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Male Wash-howse and General Inside Workers employed on Time-Work.

Section I.—The Trade Board propose to declare in accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:

Hours. 48 In any week On Saturday

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall

Section II.—In lieu of the Overtime Rates at present fixed the proposed Minimum Rates for Overtime to apply in respect of all hours worked by Time-Workers in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade proposed to be declared, as set out in Section I, shall be as follows:-

- (a) For all hours worked in excess of 5 on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be Oneand-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Timeand-a-Quarter, for the first four hours, and One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Time-and-a-Half thereafter, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.
- (b) For all time worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., Double Time, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.
- (c) For all hours worked in excess of 48 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-Quarter for the first six hours and Time-and-a-Half thereafter except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-sections (a) and (b) of this Section.
- (d) The Overtime Rates shall not apply to Piece-Workers.

Provided that, where, in the case of Workers to whom the Shops Act applies, the day which under that Act constitutes the weekly short day (half holiday) is a day other than Saturday, and in the case of other Workers another day is substituted for Saturday, under the provisions of Section 43 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, as respects Female Workers and Young Persons, the above provisions shall apply as though such half-holiday or short day were substituted for Saturday and Saturday were substituted for such half-holiday or short day.

Provided also that in cases in which another day is substituted for a Statutory Holiday under the provisions of Section 35 of the Factory Act, 1901, the above provision shall apply as though such other day were the Statutory Holiday and the Statutory Holiday were an ordinary working day.

PART III.

SECTION I.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Notice shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Wash-House and General Inside Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919 (that is to say, the laundering of articles of every description and all processes and operations incidental thereto performed by the way of trade or for the purpose of gain) as varied by the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, and the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen and Piece Goods) Order, 1920, by virtue of which all processes of laundering and other similar operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of the articles specified in the Appendices to the three last-mentioned Orders are excluded from the scope of the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919.

Provided that the Minimum Rates set out in this Notice shall not apply to Male Workers wholly or mainly employed as Transport Workers, Enginemen or Stokers.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Notice shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Notice are without prejudice to Workers earning higher rates of wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 9th November, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Laundry Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely and so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

To repeal, alter or amend Section 28 of the Hexham Gas Act, 1881 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act of 1881"), and to make new provisions as to the rights of the stockholders of the Undertakers of voting at meetings of the Undertakers.
