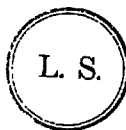

#### AGRICULTURAL WAGES—DENBIGH AND FLINT.

Notice is hereby given, that the Minister of  
Agriculture and Fisheries has, under the Corn  
Production Acts (Repeal) Act, 1921, confirmed  
the Agreement as set forth below as to the  
rates of wages in agriculture in the area com-  
prising the administrative counties of Denbigh  
and Flint, and the parish of Llysfaen, in the  
administrative county of Carnarvon, entered  
into by the Joint Conciliation Committee for  
the said area, and hereby gives notice that the  
above rates are the minimum rates payable,  
subject to the provisions of the said Acts, in  
respect of all workmen covered by the agree-  
ment as from the 14th November, 1921.

In witness whereof the Official Seal of the  
Minister of Agriculture and  
Fisheries is hereunto affixed this  
tenth day of November, nineteen  
hundred and twenty-one.

#### *Particulars of Agreement.*

During the period up to the 31st December,  
1921, the wages payable to all male workers of  
21 years of age and over employed in agricul-  
ture shall be not less than 37s. 6d. for a week  
of 50 hours (excluding Sunday); all time in  
excess of 50 hours per week (excluding Sunday)  
to be paid for at the rate of 10d. per hour, and  
all employment on a Sunday to be payable at  
the rate of 1s. per hour.
