The following Statute, made by the Governing Body of Magdalen College, Oxford, on the 19th day of October, 1921, has been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

STATUTE to amend the existing Statutes of Magdalen College, in the University of Oxford, duly made at a General Meeting of the President and Fellows especially summoned for this purpose on the 19th day of October, 1921, and passed at that Meeting by the votes of two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, and submitted to His Majesty the King in Council.

Statute for Magdalen College, made by the College under the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877.

CHAPEL SERVICES.

1. In clause 1 of Statute XI. of the Statutes of 1881 under the title "Chapel Services" the words "four Chaplains" shall be struck out and the words "two Chaplains" shall be substituted.

2. In clause 3 of the same Statute the words and figures "£200 per annum; the stipend of each of the other Chaplains" shall be struck

out and the following words and figures shall be substituted: "£150 per annum; the stipend of the other Chaplain."

3. In clause 8 of the same Statute the figures "2500" shall be struck out and the figures "2750" shall be substituted.

TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 25th November, 1921, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914 to 1919, to the amount of £45,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any date from Monday, the 28th November, to Saturday, the 3rd December inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England, not later than two o'clock (Saturday twelve o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are dated.

7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 26 of the Finance Act, 1915, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

COFFIN FURNITURE AND CEREMENT MAKING TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY AND FIX MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the branches of Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Coffin Furniture and Cerement Making) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers in the Trade, at present effective and set out in the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board dated 10th September, 1921, and TO FIX General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Female Workers in the Coffin Furniture section of the Trade as set out in the Schedule below.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS.

SECTION I.

The Coffin Furniture Section of the Trade.

The Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for Female Piece-Workers of 18 years of age and over in the Coffin Furniture Section of the Trade shall be 15 per cent. above the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as proposed in Sections I, II and III of Part I of this Schedule.

SECTION II.

The Cerement-Making Section of the Trade.

The Proposed Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for all Female Piece-Workers of 18 years of age and over employed in the Cerement-Making Section of the Trade shall be 1d. per hour higher than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate as proposed in Sections V, VI and VII of Part I of this Schedule.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part III of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice U (6) dated 10th September, 1921, shall apply in substitution for the Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked by a Worker, whether employed on Time-work or on Piece-work, in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice dated 10th September, 1921, to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

PART IV.

The Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers set out in Parts I, II, and III of this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Act, to all Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Coffin Furniture and Cerement-Making) Order, 1919, as set out in Part IV. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice U (6), dated 10th September, 1921.

The above Proposed General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-work Basis Time-rates and Overtime Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 23rd November, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Coffin Furniture and Cerement Making Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

BRADFORD CANAL (ABANDONMENT).

(Abandonment, Discontinuance and Closing of Bradford Canal; Extinguishment of Rights of User of Canal and Works and other Rights and Privileges; Release of Leeds and Liverpool Canal Company and Undertakers of the Aire and Calder Navigation from Obligation to Maintain Canal and Works; Repeal or Amendment of Acts relating to Canal; Provisions as to Sale or Transfer of Canal Undertaking or part or parts thereof; Maintenance of Bridges and other Works; Vesting of Bridges, &c., in Local Authority; Agreements; Dissolution of Joint Committee of two Canal Companies, Tolls, Rates and Duties; Amendment of Acts, and other purposes.)

NOTICE is hereby given, that application is intended to be made to Parliament in the ensuing Session by the Leeds and Liverpool Canal Company and the Undertakers of the Aire and Calder Navigation (hereinafter together referred to as "the two Canal Companies") for leave to bring in a Bill (hereinafter referred to as "the Bill") for the following, or some of the following, among other purposes (that is to say):—

1. To abandon, discontinue the use of and close, or to authorise the two Canal Companies to abandon, discontinue the use of and close, that part of the Bradford Canal Navigation authorised by the Act passed in the 11th year of King George III. "for making a navigable cut or canal from Bradford to join the Leeds and Liverpool Canal at Windhill in the township of Idle in the county of York," which lies between the north side of North Brook-street, Bradford, and the termination of the Canal at its junction with the Leeds and Liverpool Canal at Shipley, and which portion of Canal (hereinafter referred to as "the canal") is in the Bradford Canal Act, 1871, referred to as "the lower part of the canal," and for the purposes of such abandonment, discontinuance, or closing and in connection therewith, to fill up, raise, remove or otherwise alter or interfere with the bed, towing-path, banks, locks, pumping stations, basins, bridges, culverts, drains, fences, dams, flood-gates, weirs, wharves, lay-byes and other works forming part of or connected with the canal (hereinafter collectively referred to as "the canal works.")

2. To extinguish all rights of user of the canal

and the canal works, and of the land connected with or held by the two Canal Companies for the purposes of the canal, and all rights of way, water and other rights, easements, liberties, and privileges of every description now or heretofore enjoyed by any person, corporation or company whosoever over, upon or along the canal and the canal works.

3. To relieve the two Canal Companies from obligation, whether by statute or agreement, to preserve or maintain the canal or the canal works, except to such extent (if any) as may be provided by the Bill, and from any obligation incumbent on the two Canal Companies, or either of them, to supply water to or allow water to be taken from their canal for the supply of the canal.

4. To repeal, alter or amend the hereinbefore mentioned Act of the 11th year of King George III., the Act 42 George III., cap 93, the Bradford Canal Act, 1871, the Bradford Canal Transfer Act, 1878, and the Canal Tolls and Charges, No. 3—(Aberdare, etc., Canals) Order Confirmation Act, 1894, so far as relating to the Bradford Canal, and in particular, but without prejudice to the foregoing generality, sections 8, 9, 10, 11, 12, and 17 of the Bradford Canal Act, 1871, and sections 18, 29 and 32 of the Bradford Canal Transfer Act, 1878.

5. To empower the two Canal Companies to sell, lease, mortgage, transfer or otherwise dispose of the canal and the canal works and the lands and buildings connected therewith or held by the two Canal Companies for the purposes thereof respectively, or any part or parts thereof respectively, and all rights, powers and privileges, whether statutory or otherwise, of the two Canal Companies in connection therewith, including the power to levy and recover tolls and charges for the use of the canal and the canal works, upon such terms and conditions as may be agreed or prescribed by the Bill, or to provide for the transfer of the canal, the canal works, lands, buildings, rights, powers and privileges as aforesaid to any person, company or corporation, and to make provision for enabling such person, company or corporation to carry on the undertaking so transferred.

6. To enable the two Canal Companies, if thought fit, to transfer part or parts of the canal and the canal works to the owners of adjoining lands upon such terms as may be agreed or provided by the Bill and to enable such owners to continue the use thereof, and to empower and require such owners to repair and maintain the canal and the canal works or the part or parts thereof so transferred.

7. To make provision for the maintenance of bridges over and culverts and drains under the canal by landowners or others, or for the vesting of such bridges, culverts and drains in the local or road authority of the district in which a bridge, culvert or drain is situate, and for the maintenance and repair of such bridge, culvert or drain by such authority, and to empower such authority to widen, improve, reconstruct or remove such bridge, culvert or drain.

8. To enable the two Canal Companies to make compensation to landowners and others in respect of injury consequent on the exercise of the powers of the Bill, and that either in money or by the construction of works or otherwise.

9. To enable the two Canal Companies to enter into and carry into effect agreements with any corporation, company or person in relation to any of the objects of the Bill, and to confirm any agreement or agreements in relation to

those objects entered into before the passing of the Bill.

10. To dissolve the Joint Committee of the two Canal Companies constituted by the Bradford Canal Transfer Act, 1878, and to enable the two Canal Companies to apply their funds for the purposes of the Bill.

11. So far as may be necessary for giving effect to the objects and purposes of the Bill, the Bill will or may confer powers to levy tolls, rates and duties, and will or may alter existing tolls, rates and duties, and confer, vary or extinguish exemption from the payment of tolls, rates and duties, and will vary and extinguish all rights and privileges which would or might interfere with any of the objects of the Bill, and confer other rights and privileges.

12. In addition to the Acts hereinbefore mentioned, the Bill will or may alter, amend or repeal the Act 10 Geo III., cap 114, and any other Act relating to the Leeds and Liverpool Canal Company, the Act 10 and 11 William III., cap. 19, and any other Act relating to the Undertakers of the Aire and Calder Navigation, and any Act or Order relating to the Lord Mayor, Aldermen and Citizens of the City of Bradford, or the Council of the urban district of Shipley, which it may be necessary or expedient to alter, amend or repeal for the purpose of giving effect to the objects of the Bill.

To provide for the maintenance and carrying on of the said undertaking until the transfer thereof to the Corporation, and for the transfer to the Corporation of all or any of the officers and servants of the Company employed in the said undertaking, to define the terms of their employment, to provide for the payment of compensation to such of the officers and servants in the regular employment of the Company (if any) as may lose their offices or employment by reason of the transfer, and to make such other provisions as may be necessary for or incidental to effecting the said sale and transfer.

4. To extend and apply to the said undertaking and the area of supply of the Company in connection therewith all or any of the provisions of the enactments relating to the supply of gas of or in relation to the Corporation, or any of their existing gas undertakings, and to empower the Corporation to exercise and enjoy in connection with their enlarged gas undertaking all or any of the powers, rights, privileges and exemptions of the Company, or to be conferred upon the Corporation by the intended Act.

5. the Stoke, Fenton and Longton Gas Act, 1858, The Stoke-upon-Trent and Fenton Gas Acts, 1878 and 1883, The Stoke-on-Trent Gas Order, 1921 (S.R. & O. 1921, No. 1335), The Burslem Local Board Gas Act, 1877, the following Local Government Board Provisional Order Confirmation Acts, namely:—(No. 10) Act, 1888 (Stoke-upon-Trent Order), (No. 2) Act, 1893 (Stoke-upon-Trent Order), (No. 15) Act, 1895, Session II (Fenton Order), (No. 6) Act, 1886 (Burslem Order), (No. 3) Act, 1900 (Burslem and Fenton Orders), and (No. 1) Act, 1905 (Burslem Order); The Stoke-on-Trent Gas (Temporary Increase of Charges) Order, 1919 (S.R. & O. 1919, No. 496), The Local Government Board Provisional Order Confirmation (No. 3) Act, 1908, and particularly Article XVIII of the Order thereby confirmed, The Ministry of Health Provisional Order Confirmation (Stoke-on-Trent Extension) Act, 1921, and particularly Article 21 of the Order thereby confirmed, and any other Act or Order relating to any of the said Undertakings.

6. To provide for the continuance by the Corporation of the said undertakings of the Company and of the Corporation respectively, and to empower the Corporation to amalgamate all or some of such undertakings into one or more undertakings, to empower the Corporation to manufacture and store gas and materials employed in or about the manufacture of gas, and to convert and manufacture and store all or any products resulting or arising from the manufacture of gas, and to maintain, continue, erect, alter, improve, extend and renew or discontinue works necessary for all or any of those purposes upon the lands now authorized to be used therefor by the Company and the Corporation respectively, and for those purposes, or any of them, to take licences for the use of patents, and to re-enact and amend the powers of the Corporation in respect of such matters.

7. To authorize the Corporation to break up streets and public places and streets not dedicated to the public for the purpose of laying pipes and other works for the purpose of supplying gas and ancillary purposes, and of repairing, renewing or discontinuing those pipes and works and the pipes and works already laid by the Corporation or the Company, and in connection therewith to alter, remove or interfere with bridges, canals, railways, tramways, sewers, drains, pipes, rivers, streams, watercourses, mains, wires, cables, apparatus and appliances, and supply and sell gas, and exercise all the rights, powers, privileges and exemptions relating to the supply of gas already conferred and by the intended Act to be conferred upon the Corporation within the several existing limits of supply of the Company in respect of their said undertaking and of the Corporation being and to define the limits for the supply of gas by the Corporation as the parish and county borough of Stoke-on-Trent, the parish of Newchapel in the urban district of Kidsgrove, the parish of Norton-in-the-Moors in the rural district of Leek, the parishes of Caverswall and Forsbrook in the rural district of Cheadle, the parishes of Fulford, Barlaston and Trentham in the rural district of Stone, and so much of the parish of Stone in the last mentioned rural district as does not lie within three miles of the Town Hall of Stone, all in the county of Stafford. The parishes and districts above referred to are the parishes and districts as con-

stituted immediately after the commencement of the Order confirmed by the Ministry of Health (Stoke-on-Trent Extension) Act, 1921.

8. To provide for the cesser of the rights, powers and privileges of the Stone Gas Light and Coke Company Limited in relation to the supply of gas in so much of the parish of Stone Rural (as the same existed at the passing of the Stone Gas and Electricity Act, 1914) in the rural district of Stone, in the county of Stafford, as does not lie within three miles of the Town Hall of Stone, and to repeal so much of that Act and of the Stone Gas Order, 1881, as authorizes the supply of gas in the said portion of that parish.

9. To repeal the saving of the purchase and other rights in or in connection with the Burslem gas undertaking and the Stoke and Fenton gas undertakings of the Corporation respectively conferred by section 4 of the Burslem Local Board Gas Act, 1877, and section 34 of the Stoke-upon-Trent and Fenton Gas Act, 1878, respectively upon any sanitary authority for the Lordship of Abbey Hulton and any urban sanitary authority who has been or may be constituted for any sanitary district within the limits for the supply of gas prescribed by the last mentioned Act respectively, and if thought fit to make other provision in relation to the sale of any portion of any of the undertakings aforesaid which may be situate outside the said parish of Stoke-on-Trent and of any pipes, works or apparatus of or belonging thereto.

10. To empower the Corporation to hold and use the lands, buildings, hereditaments, easements, rights of way and other rights in, over or affecting lands and buildings already acquired by the Company or the Corporation in connection with any of the said undertakings, and to acquire, hold and use other lands, buildings, hereditaments, easements and rights; to provide, erect, fit up, maintain and let dwelling houses for persons employed by them, and offices and showrooms for the purposes of or in connection with their gas undertakings or undertaking, and to sell, lease or otherwise dispose of any lands and houses for the time being belonging to them, and to provide for the application of the sale proceeds of surplus lands.

11. To define and fix the price, quality and pressure of the gas to be charged and supplied respectively by the Corporation, and to provide for the testing of the gas, and if thought fit to authorize the Corporation to charge for gas supplied by them at different rates, and to supply gas of different qualities and at different pressures and for different purposes in different parts of their limits of supply.

12. To empower the Corporation to manufacture or otherwise provide, fix and repair or remove gas meters, lamps, stoves, engines and other apparatus and fittings, and to exclude the same from liability to be taken in distress or execution, and to provide that apparatus let on hire shall remain the property of the Corporation, notwithstanding that it may be fixed to the soil of any premises.

To confer upon the Corporation all such other powers, rights, authorities and privileges in relation to their gas undertakings or undertaking as are usually conferred upon or enjoyed or exercised by gas undertakers, and to make all incidental and ancillary provisions with reference to any of the matters hereinbefore mentioned, which will enable the Corporation to better carry on and manage the said undertakings.

19. To vary or extinguish all existing rights, powers and privileges which would or might in any manner interfere with any of the objects or purposes of the intended Act, and to confer, vary or extinguish other rights, powers and privileges.

To incorporate or apply, with or without amendments, or render inapplicable all or some of the provisions of the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1847; the Gasworks Clauses Act, 1871; the Gas Regulation Act, 1920; the Commissioners Clauses Act, 1847; the Lands Clauses Acts; the Municipal Corporations Act, 1882; the Forgery Act, 1870; the Local Loans Act, 1875; the Bankers Books Evidence Act, 1879; and all Acts amending those Acts respectively.
