

3. The District in which the District Auditor shall act as Auditor, and which is hereby assigned to him for the performance of his duties under this Order, shall be termed "The Durham Audit District," and shall, until the Minister otherwise directs, comprise the districts or areas subject to the jurisdiction of the several Authorities described in the Schedule to this Order.

4. This Order shall take effect notwithstanding any Order in force assigning a District to a District Auditor or prescribing his duties, but nothing in this Order shall affect or interfere with the existing duties and powers of any District Auditor as regards any Audit of which notice has already been given or any matters or proceedings already commenced.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the date hereof.

SCHEDULE.

1. The several Authorities whose districts or the areas of whose jurisdiction are for the time being wholly situated within the following Poor Law Unions, that is to say:—

Chester-le-Street.
Durham
Easington.
Houghton-le-Spring.
Lanchester.
South Shields.
Sunderland.

2. The County Council of the Administrative County of Durham, and the Visiting Committee of any Lunatic Asylum belonging wholly or in part to that County Council.

3. The Northern Counties Joint Poor Law Committee.

4. The Durham County Water Board.

5. The Easington and Sedgfield Smallpox Hospital Board.

6. The North East Durham Smallpox Hospital Board.

7. Any other Authority the audit of whose Accounts is hereafter assigned to the District Auditor.

BOGNOR.

Whereas the Urban District Council of Bognor have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, to partially repeal, alter, or amend the Local Act 5 & 6 Will. IV, cap. ci, as amended by the Local Government Supplemental Act, 1867 (No. 5), and by certain Provisional Orders made by the Local Government Board and duly confirmed by Parliament, so as:—

(1) To empower the Council to exercise on and in respect of certain lands belonging to the Council at the rear of the Merchant Taylors' (Ladies') Home at Bognor certain

powers in connection with and incidental to the use of such lands for the purpose of pleasure grounds and winter gardens, and thereon to extend, alter, remove, enlarge or improve any existing buildings, and to provide, maintain, furnish and equip music and other pavilions, concert halls, cinematograph theatres, ball rooms, conservatories, winter gardens, band-stands, reading rooms, shelters, baths, lavatories or other buildings and conveniences;

(2) To let the said lands and any buildings or conveniences thereon for the purpose of entertainments, and to authorise charges for admission thereto; to provide and manage refreshment rooms thereon; to provide thereon bowling greens, tennis courts, croquet grounds, rifle ranges and spaces for other games and recreations, together with apparatus in connection therewith and to charge for the use thereof; to provide or contribute towards the expenses of bands of music and other entertainments; to charge for admission to the lands and any buildings thereon, and the entertainments, amusements and other conveniences provided in connection therewith, and to make bye-laws for the regulation of such lands and the buildings and conveniences thereon;

(3) To empower the Council to sell, let, lease or exchange certain lands acquired by them for the purpose of pleasure grounds and known as Rock Gardens, and to provide for the application of capital moneys received by them in connection therewith towards paying off other borrowed moneys or in the purchase and equipment of the lands referred to in paragraph 1 above;

(4) To confer on the Council any borrowing powers necessary for the purposes of the Provisional Order and to make provision for sinking funds and the reborrowing of moneys; and

(5) For the several purposes of the Application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said Local Act, or of any other Local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said district, as may be necessary or desirable;

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said Application:

Notice is hereby given, that H. R. Hooper, Esquire, M.I.C.E., one of the Inspectors of the Ministry of Health, will attend at the Congregational Institute, London Road, Bognor, on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of December, 1921, at quarter past ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject matter of the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.

And notice is hereby further given, that any person interested may attend at such Inquiry and be heard with reference to the said Application and the proposed Provisional Order.
