Benjamin Axford and M. P. Axford, situate partly in the parish of Hildenborough and partly in the parish of Sevenoaks Weald, in the administrative county of Kent.

KENT (SEVENOAKS DISTRICT) FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE ORDER OF 1921 (No. 2).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. Part II of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the several boroughs of Bromley, Maidstone and Tunbridge Wells.

2. This Order may be cited as the KENT (SEVENOAKS DISTRICT) (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 2), and shall be read with the Kent (Sevenoaks District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1921.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 1ST DECEMBER 1921.)

KENT (SEVENOAKS DISTRICT) (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested

in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. (1) The Area described in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as the "principal Order."

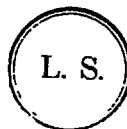
(2) Part III. of that Order is hereby applied to the Scheduled District described in the Kent (Sevenoaks District) (Foot - and - Mouth Disease) Order of 1921.

(3) The provisions of Article 2 of the Kent (Sevenoaks District) (Foot - and - Mouth Disease) Order of 1921 shall continue to apply to the Prohibited Area, and the provisions of Article 6 of the "principal Order" shall be read and have effect subject to this modification.

2. This Order shall come into operation on the fifth day of December, nineteen hundred and twenty-one.

3. This Order may be cited as the KENT (SEVENOAKS DISTRICT) (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1921 (No. 3), and shall be read with the Kent (Sevenoaks District) (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1921.

The borough of Tunbridge Wells;

The petty sessional divisions of Tonbridge (excluding the parish of Brenchley), Sevenoaks (including the detached part of the parish of Brasted, but excluding the detached part of the parish of Kemsing), and the parishes of Ashurst, Speldhurst, Knockholt, Pembury, East Peckham, West Peckham, Mereworth, Wrotham (including its detached parts), Ightham, Addington, Offham, Trottscliffe, and the detached portion of the parish of Leybourne.
