STOCKTON-ON-TEES.

Whereas the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Stockton-on-Tees (hereinafter called the Corporation), being the Urban District Council for the said borough, have made application to the Minister of Health for the issue of a Provisional Order under Sections 297 and 303 of the Public Health Act, 1875, partially to repeal, alter or amend the Stockton-on-Tees Extension and Improvement Act, 1869, the Stockton-on-Tees Market Act, 1876, and the Stockton-on-Tees (Quay and Markets) Act, 1878, so as:—

(1) To alter the tolls, standages and stallages which the Corporation are empowered to demand and take in respect of their markets under the said local Acts;

(2) To make clear the extent of the markets, extend the definition of the word "stall," to confer power to make arrangements for a special charge to be made for any special stand or privilege, to amend the clause as to power to levy by distress for any sums due under the schedule, to confer power to regulate the user of different parts of the markets for special or other sales, and to confer power to lease any portion of the markets for such period of time and upon such terms as may be considered advantageous by the Corporation.

(3) To confer power from time to time to vary the days upon which and the hours during which the markets and fairs shall be held, to make it compulsory upon itinerant vendors to pay tolls and obtain licences at fixed times, to enable the Corporation to provide places for the garaging of motor-cars, and to prohibit the standing of motor-cars in the market place except in parts approved, and then upon payment of a toll or standage; to prevent the playing of organs and other forms of music upon hiring and fair days before certain hours; to make provision whereby passage ways shall be made of such width as the Corporation may decide between the kerb and the position of goods exposed for sale; and

(4) For the several purposes of the application or for purposes connected with, incidental to, or consequent on those purposes to make any such alteration or amendment of the said local Acts, or of any other local Act or of any Act confirming a Provisional Order made in pursuance of any of the Sanitary Acts or of the Public Health Act, 1875, and in force in the said borough, as may be necessary or desirable:

And whereas a schedule of tolls, standages and stallages as proposed to be authorised, and copies of the above-named Acts are deposited at the Town Clerk's office, Borough Hall, Stockton-on-Tees, and may be seen at any time by any person interested during ordinary office hours:

And whereas it is proposed that a Provisional Order should be issued in compliance with the said application;

Notice is hereby given, that R. C. Maxwell, Esquire, LL.D., Barrister-at-Law, one of the Inspectors of the Ministry of Health, will attend at the Council Chamber, Town Hall, Stockton-on-Tees, on Thursday, the fifteenth day of December, 1921, at ten o'clock in the forenoon, to hold a Local Inquiry into the subject-matter of the said application and the proposed Provisional Order.
