Increased Rating Powers.

INTOXICATING LIQUOR, ENGLAND.

ORDER, DATED 29TH NOVEMBER, 1921, MADE BY THE SECRETARY OF STATE UNDER SECTION 16 (1) OF THE LICENSING ACT, 1921 (11 & 12 GEO. 5, c. 42).

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by Section sixteen, sub-section one, of the Licensing Act, 1921, I hereby make the following Order:—

Except as hereinafter provided, no person shall sell by retail or supply, either by himself or by any servant or agent, any intoxicating liquor in any licensed premises or in any club in the Carlisle State Management District as defined in the Second Schedule to the Licensing Act, 1921.

Provided that the above Order shall not extend to—

(1) the sale by retail or the supply of intoxicating liquor in any licensed premises in respect of which a licence for the sale by

retail of intoxicating liquor was in force on the twelfth day of February, 1920, or in any club which was at that date registered in manner provided by the Licensing (Consolidation) Act, 1910;

(2) the sale by retail or the supply of intoxicating liquor in any licensed premises or club in which such sale or supply is or may be hereafter carried on under my written authority and in accordance with such terms and conditions as may be specified in such authority.

SPECIAL ACTS (EXTENSION OF TIME) ACT, 1915.

BY virtue and in pursuance of the provisions of the above named Act, the Minister of Transport hereby orders that the period limited (1) for the completion of the training wall or embankment authorised by Section 5 of the Aire and Calder Navigation Act, 1914, shall be further extended for one year from the 8th day of July, 1922, and (2) for the completion of (a) the widenings of the Knottingley and Goole Canal, described in and authorised by Section 23 of the Aire and Calder Navigation Act, 1899, (b) the extension or enlargement (Work No. 9) authorised by the Aire and Calder Navigation Act, 1908, of Widening (E) of the Knottingley and Goole Canal authorised by the Aire and Calder Navigation Act, 1899, and (c) the widening (G) (Work No. 10) of the said Canal authorised by the Aire and Calder Navigation Act, 1908, shall be further ex-
