## BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACTS, 1914 AND 1918.

In the Matter of Sir Edgar Speyer, Bt.  
Revocation of Certificate of Naturalization.

Whereas I am satisfied, as the result of an enquiry conducted by the Certificates of Naturalization (Revocation) Committee, that Sir Edgar Speyer, Baronet, a Member of His Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, to whom a Certificate of Naturalization number A 7015 was granted on the 29th February, 1892,

(1) has shown himself by act and speech to be disaffected and disloyal to His Majesty; and

(2) has, during the war in which His Majesty was engaged, unlawfully communicated with subjects of an enemy State and associated with a business which was to his knowledge carried on in such manner as to assist the enemy in such war;\*

And whereas I am satisfied that the continuance of the said certificate is not conducive to the public good:

Now, therefore, by this Order, made in pursuance of the powers conferred on me by Section 7 of the British Nationality and Status of Aliens Act, 1914, I revoke the said certificate; and I direct such revocation to have effect from

the date hereof; and I further order the said certificate to be given up and to be cancelled;

And I further direct that Leonora Speyer, the wife of the said Sir Edgar Speyer, and Pamela Speyer, Leonora Speyer, and Vivien Clare Speyer, the minor children of the said Sir Edgar Speyer, shall cease to be British subjects.

# A PROCLAMATION

FOR A BANK HOLIDAY.

GEORGE R.I.

WE, considering that it is desirable that Monday, the Second day of January next, should be kept as a close holiday in all Banks throughout the United Kingdom, do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, and in pursuance of Section four of the Bank Holidays Act, 1871, appoint the said Monday, the second day of January next, to be observed as a Bank Holiday in England and Wales, and in Ireland, for the purposes of the said Act, and We do, by this Our Royal Proclamation, command the said day to be so observed, and all Our loving subjects to order themselves accordingly:

And whereas it is customary for the usual Bank Holidays to be kept as holidays by Our loving subjects generally and not only for the purposes of the said Act, but it is not Our intention that the said Second day of January should be kept as a general holiday in England and Wales, and in Ireland:

Now, therefore, We do hereby enjoin that the said Second day of January shall not be kept as or deemed by virtue of this Our Royal Proclamation to be a holiday in England and Wales, and in Ireland, for any purposes whatsoever other than the purposes of the said Act.

Given at Our Court at *Buckingham Palace*, this Thirteenth day of *December*, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and in the Twelfth year of Our Reign.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 17th day of November, 1921 (G.H.), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks, and Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and

Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

"And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas Mr. C. H. R. Stansfield, C.B., Director of Greenwich Hospital, retired on the 14th July, 1921, from the service of Greenwich Hospital on account of age:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the grant from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Mr. Stansfield of a pension at the rate of Seven hundred and forty-nine pounds, six shillings and fivepence (£749 6s. 5d.) a year as from the date of his retirement, and a gratuity of Two thousand, two hundred and seventy-six pounds, fourteen shillings and eightpence (£2,276 14s. 8d.):

"And whereas Mr. J. E. Evans, a former Head Master in the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, retired from the service of Greenwich Hospital on the 18th September, 1920, on account of age:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the grant from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Mr. Evans of a pension at the rate of Twenty-six pounds, seventeen shillings and threepence (£26 17s. 3d.) a year as from the date of his retirement, and a gratuity of Six hundred and forty-four pounds, fourteen shillings and one penny (£644 14s. 1d.):

"And whereas by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 17th May, 1920, a pension at the rate of One hundred and seventy-two pounds, eighteen shillings and fourpence (£172 18s. 4d.) a year, and a gratuity of Four hundred and sixty-one pounds, two shillings and twopence (£461 2s. 2d.) were granted from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Mr. C. J. Isaac, a former Master in the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, on his retirement from the service of Greenwich Hospital on the 18th September, 1919:

"And whereas these amounts require slight amendment:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the grant from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Mr. Isaac of a further pension at the rate of Two pounds, eighteen shillings and sixpence (£2 18s. 6d.) a year as from the date of his retirement, and a further gratuity of Seven pounds and sixteen shillings (£7 16s.):

"And whereas Mr. A. P. Johnson, a former Assistant Master in the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, died whilst in the service of Greenwich Hospital:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the grant to the Widow from the funds of Greenwich Hospital of a gratuity of Forty-one pounds, ten shillings and tenpence (£41 10s. 10d.):

"And whereas Mr. D. W. Rees, a former Assistant Master in the Royal Hospital School, Greenwich, retired from the service of Greenwich Hospital on account of age on the 31st December, 1920:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the grant to Mr. Rees from the funds of Greenwich Hospital of a pension at the rate of Thirty-one pounds, nine shillings and ninepence (£31 9s. 9d.) a year as from the date of his retirement, and a gratuity of Eighty-three pounds, nineteen shillings and fivepence (£83 19s. 5d.):

"And whereas by Section I of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1921, the restriction contained in Section 4 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872 (which empowers the Admiralty to provide for the education and maintenance of daughters of seamen and marines), with respect to the amount that may be expended on the education and maintenance of any girl, shall cease to have effect:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the removal of the restriction contained in Her late Majesty's Order in Council dated the 16th January, 1873, under which the amount to be expended on the education and maintenance of any girl shall not exceed the rate of Twenty pounds a year."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 21st day of November, 1921 (N. 22518/1920), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas we consider that the experience of Engine Room Artificers of Your Majesty's Navy trained in Hydraulics would be specially valuable in the new Ordnance Artificer Branch instituted by Your Majesty's Orders in Council of the 22nd January and 13th October, 1920, and that such Engine Room Artificers who volunteer when required to transfer to Ordnance Artificer should be compensated for loss of the Engine Room Artificer Certificate Allowances referred to in Section C of your Order in Council of the 17th May, 1920:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by

Your Order in Council, to sanction the scheme described in the attached Schedule.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

#### "SCHEDULE.

"1. A lump sum to be paid at the outset to each Hydraulic Engine Room Artificer transferring to the Ordnance Artificer Branch who was in receipt of the Watchkeeping Allowance of 1s. per diem before transfer.

"2. An Engine Room Artificer transferring to the new Branch who would probably have obtained the Watchkeeping Certificate in due course to be considered eligible for the compensation, but where the certificate would probably not have been secured the compensation to be withheld.

"3. The sum payable to men in their first engagement to be the present value of the amount of the allowance payable in respect of the remaining period of their first engagement (the rate of interest being taken at 5 per cent. per annum) subject to the deduction specified at (4).

"4. From the amount due under (3) a deduction of 5 per cent. to be made (to allow for possible loss to the Crown due to the death, &c., of men who have received capitalised sums paid in advance). A similar deduction also to be made from the amount to be paid on re-engagement.

"5. On completing his first engagement and re-engaging a man to become entitled to the present value of the allowance of £18 5s. per annum for 10 years, the amount to be paid on re-engaging in every case to be £75, less a deduction of 5 per cent., the balance with interest at 5 per cent. per annum, being paid on completion of the engagement.

"6. Hydraulic Engine Room Artificers serving under a second engagement to be paid on transfer the full amount payable in respect of the remaining period of the engagement, subject to a maximum of £75 (less deduction of 5 per cent.), the balance, with interest, at 5 per cent. per annum being paid on completion of the engagement. Hydraulic Engine Room Artificers serving under a third engagement to receive on transfer the amount payable in respect of the remaining period of their engagement, less a deduction of 5 per cent.

"7. Compensation also to be allowed for the additional allowance of 1s. a day for which Chief Engine Room Artificers are eligible and to be calculated from the estimated date on which advancement to Chief Engine Room Artificer would have occurred had the man remained in the Engine Room Artificer Branch. The whole of the compensation in this respect to be paid when the man completes time for pension, with the exception specified under (8).

"8. If the date of advancement to Chief Engine Room Artificer would have been prior to completion of first engagement, the compensation in respect of the additional Chief Engine Room Artificer allowance for the remaining period of the first engagement to be paid on completing that engagement.

"9. A proportionate amount of the compensation for any unexpired period to be recovered in full or in part at the discretion of

the Admiralty from men discharged by purchase or promoted to Warrant or Commissioned Rank.

" 10. The amount of prepaid bonus for any unexpired period of service of men discharged for misconduct, &c., or deserting to be met as far as possible out of any balance of pay, &c.

" 11. No recoveries to be made in the case of men discharged dead or invalided.

" 12. The final instalment not to be due to any man who fails to complete time for pension; but payment may be granted in deserving cases at Admiralty discretion.

" 13. The scheme not to apply to men likely to be invalided but in cases of special hardship the Admiralty to be able to award reduced amounts.

" 14. The scheme to apply to Hydraulic Engine Room Artificers of satisfactory character in the Royal Navy on the 23rd February, 1921, and to Ordnance Artificers transferred from Hydraulic Engine Room Artificer on or before that date, or within a period of three months thereafter."

And whereas it is expedient that section 4 of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, should come into operation on the 23rd day of December, 1921, and that the Grand Juries (Suspension) Act, 1917, should cease to have effect on that date:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by section 4 of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, is pleased, by and with the advice of his Privy Council, to direct, and it is hereby directed, that the said section 4 shall come into operation on the 23rd day of December, 1921.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 20th day of October, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

" We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint John, Blackpool, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester:

" Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint John, Blackpool, is a New Parish wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular part of the said New Parish of Saint John, Blackpool, which is hereinafter mentioned and described, should be constituted a separate District in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

" And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use for the purpose of Divine Worship:

" And whereas for the purpose of providing an endowment for the said proposed District there has been contributed a sum of £5,049 15s. 8d. Local Loans £3 per centum Stock and the same has been transferred into our name to be held in trust by us towards the endowment of the said proposed District and so soon as the said District shall have become a New Parish under the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act then of



the said New Parish and towards the maintenance of the Minister or Incumbent thereof for the time being, the amount of the annual interest and dividends to accrue due in respect of the said sum of Stock to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent as aforesaid when duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the lastly mentioned Act:

"And whereas the said annual interest and dividends to accrue due on account of the said sum of Stock and to be receivable by the said Minister or Incumbent for the time being will amount to the sum of £151 9s. 10d.

"And whereas the said sum of Stock has been so contributed and transferred to us as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that we should grant out of the Common Fund created by the firstly hereinbefore mentioned Act a capital sum of £1,000 in respect of which there shall be paid by us to the Minister or Incumbent for the time being of the said proposed District or New Parish when duly licensed as before mentioned a yearly sum of £50 and upon the further understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) we should recommend and propose to Your Majesty in Council that the whole right of Patronage of the said District or New Parish and of the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the said Grant of £1,000 will after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

"And whereas the principal contributors of the said sum of Stock have nominated John Henry Buxton, of Easeneye, Ware, in the County of Hertford, Esquire, Sir Edward Hildred Carlile, of Ponsbourne Park, in the said County of Hertford, Baronet, the Reverend Hanmer William Webb-Peploe, of Number 1, Evelyn Gardens, London, S.W., Clerk in Holy Orders and a Prebendary of the Cathedral Church of Saint Paul in London, the Venerable Robert Charles Joynt, of Holy Trinity Vicarage, Redhill, in the County of Surrey, Clerk in Holy Orders, Archdeacon of Kingston-upon-Thames and a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Southwark, the Reverend Edward Grose Hodge, of the Rectory, Birmingham, Clerk in Holy Orders and an Honorary Canon of the Cathedral Church of Birmingham, the Reverend Arthur Blackwell Goulburn Lillingston, of The College, Durham, Clerk in Holy Orders and a Canon of the Cathedral Church of Durham, and Thomas Walker Hobart Inskip, of Number 3, Hare Court, Temple, in the City of London, one of Your Majesty's Counsel and a Member of the Commons House of Parliament, (commonly known as the Patronage Trustees of the Church Pastoral Aid Society) as the persons to whom they desire that the whole right of Patronage of the District or New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend William, Bishop of Manchester (in testimony whereof he has signed

and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all that part of the said New Parish of Saint John, Blackpool, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part together with the boundaries thereof is delineated and set forth on the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme become and be constituted a separate District for spiritual purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Thomas, Blackpool.'

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid then of the said New Parish and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereto shall without any assurance in the law other than this scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may be exercised by the said John Henry Buxton, Edward Hildred Carlile, Hanmer William Webb-Peploe, Robert Charles Joynt, Edward Grose Hodge, Arthur Blackwell Goulburn Lillingston, and Thomas Walker Hobart Inskip, their heirs and assigns for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Thomas, Blackpool, being:—

"All that part of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint John, Blackpool, in the County of Lancaster and in the Diocese of Manchester, which is bounded upon the north-west by the New Parish of Christ Church, Blackpool, in the said County and Diocese, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south-west, upon the south and upon the east by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackpool, from the said New Parish of Saint John, Blackpool, at the junction of New Road with Elizabeth Street, and extending thence south-eastward along the middle of Elizabeth Street for a distance of 30 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Raikes Road, and extending thence eastward along the middle of Raikes Road for a distance of 38 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Layton Lane, and extending thence first north-westward and then generally northward along the middle of Layton Lane for a distance of 45½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with New Road and Westcliffe Drive upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint John, Blackpool, from the said New Parish of Christ Church, Blackpool."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly hereinbefore mentioned Act, been

transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbent of the Cure out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbent have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Manchester.

**W**HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, of the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and of the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme or Representation, bearing date the 3rd day of November, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting under the provisions of the Act of the 7th and 8th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 94, the Act of the 13th and 14th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, and the Act of the 32nd and 33rd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 94, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme or Representation for altering the boundaries of the New Parish of Saint Mark, Broadwater, situate partly in the County of Sussex and partly in the County of Kent, and wholly in the Diocese of Chichester:

"Whereas by the authority of an Order of Her said late Majesty in Council bearing date the 26th day of June, 1867, and published in the London Gazette on the 28th day of the same month, a Consolidated Chapelry comprising portions of the Parish of Frant, in the said Counties of Sussex and Kent and in the said Diocese of Chichester, and of the New Parish of Eridge Green, in the said County of Sussex and in the said Diocese of Chichester, was assigned to the consecrated Church of Saint Mark, situate at Broadwater, in the said Parish of Frant, and the said Consolidated Chapelry was named 'The Consolidated Chapelry of Saint Mark, Broadwater':

"And whereas it has been represented to us and it appears to us to be expedient that the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Broadwater, should be altered in the manner which is hereinafter mentioned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Winfrid Oldfield, Bishop of Chichester (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme or Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, recommend and propose that from and after the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or Representation and without any assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the boundaries of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Broadwater, shall be altered so that all that portion of the said Parish of Frant, which is described in the Schedule hereunder written and is delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed and is thereon coloured pink, shall be dis severed from such Parish and shall be annexed to and shall in future form part of the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Broadwater.

"And we further represent, recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from representing, recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the hereinbefore-mentioned Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"THE SCHEDULE to which the foregoing Scheme or Representation has reference.

"The territory to be annexed to the New Parish of Saint Mark, Broadwater, situate partly in the County of Sussex and partly in the County of Kent and wholly in the Diocese of Chichester, being:—

"All that portion of the Parish of Frant, situate in the said Counties and Diocese, which is bounded upon the north by the New Parish of Saint Peter, Windmill Fields, Tunbridge Wells, in the said County of Kent and in the Diocese of Rochester, upon the north-west partly by the said New Parish of Saint Mark, Broadwater, and partly by the New Parish of Eridge Green, in the said County of Sussex and in the said Diocese of Chichester, and upon the remaining sides, that is to say, upon the south and upon the east, by an imaginary line commencing at the point near the south-eastern corner of the house and premises known as Fir-tree Cottage where the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Eridge Green from the said Parish of Frant crosses the middle of the road leading from Groombridge to Frant, and extending thence first south-eastward and then eastward along the middle of the said road for a distance of 1 mile and 14 chains or thereabouts to its junction with the road leading from Frant to Tunbridge Wells, and extending thence northward along the middle of the last-mentioned road for a distance of 8½ chains or thereabouts to its junction with Tangier Lane, and extending thence first north-eastward and then eastward along the middle of Tangier Lane for a distance of 19 chains or thereabouts to the point where it is joined by the footpath leading past Quarry Farm to Bayham Road, and extending thence first northward and then

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Plympton Saint Mary is vested in the Dean and Canons of Your Majesty's Free Chapel of Saint George within Your Castle of Windsor (hereinafter called 'the said Dean and Canons of Windsor'):

"And whereas one moiety of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Sampford Spiney with Horrabridge is vested in the said Dean and Canons of Windsor:

"And whereas the remaining moiety of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Sampford Spiney with Horrabridge is vested in the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, in right of his See:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Dean and Canons of Windsor (in testimony whereof they have to this Scheme caused their Common or Capitular Seal to be affixed) and with the consent of the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof he has to this Scheme affixed his signature and Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Plympton Saint Mary and the Church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from the said Dean and Canons of Windsor and from their successors and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever, and that in exchange for the same the said moiety of the Advowson or perpetual

right of Patronage of and presentation to the said United Benefice of Sampford Spiney with Horrabridge and the Church thereof which is now vested in the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, as aforesaid, shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter, and from his successors, and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time

The following Statutes, made by the Governing Body of Trinity College, Cambridge, on the 26th day of November, 1921, and sealed on the 2nd day of December, 1921, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes of Trinity College, Cambridge, which amending Statutes were duly made at a College Meeting, being a Meeting of the Governing Body of the College specially summoned for the purpose, and held on the twenty-sixth day

of November, one thousand nine hundred and twenty-one, and having been passed at such Meeting by the votes of more than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting, are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Master, Fellows and Scholars of Trinity College, in the University of Cambridge, in exercise of the powers given to us by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, do hereby alter and amend the existing Statutes of our said College in manner following:—

i. By repealing Section 2 of Statute X intituled "The Fellows," and substituting the following amended Section to form Section 2 of the same Statute:—

2 (b) The Council may at their discretion elect to a vacant fellowship any person holding the office of Bursar, Prælector or Lecturer in the College.

ii. By repealing Section 5 of Statute XV intituled "Tenure and Vacating of Fellowships," and substituting the following amended Section to form Section 5 of the same Statute:—

5. The qualifying offices above referred to which shall entitle a Fellow to retain his fellowship while holding any of them shall be the University Professorships and

Readerships, the offices of Public Orator, Registrary and Librarian in the University and the offices of Prælector, Bursar, Tutor, Assistant Tutor, Lecturer (as distinguished from Assistant Lecturer) and Librarian in the College. The College may by writing under the College Seal add any other University office or class of University offices in the list of such qualifying offices. Provided that no meeting of the Council for the purpose of ordering the Seal to be affixed to any such writing shall be held unless a Special College Meeting shall have been previously held at which a resolution in favour of adding such office or offices to the list of such qualifying offices shall have been carried in accordance with the provisions hereinafter contained respecting resolutions binding on the College. Such resolutions, however, shall not bind the Council to order the Seal to be affixed. Any such writing shall be revocable by writing under the College Seal subject to the same conditions as to the affixing of the Seal, provided that no such revocation shall affect the interests of any person who is at the time holding such an office. Provided always that a University Professorship or Readership, the holder of which is not by virtue of his office bound to residence in the University, shall not be deemed to be a Professorship or Readership within the meaning of this Section unless the holder of such Professorship or Readership have been elected a Fellow as hereinbefore provided under title (8) in virtue of his Professorship or Readership.

iii. By repealing Statute XXIX intitled "The Deans," and substituting therefor the following amended Statute XXIX:—

#### XXIX.—*The Deans.*

1. There shall be elected annually from among the Fellows of the College two Deans, who shall each of them be separately responsible for his own department.

2. One of them, who shall be called Dean of College, shall superintend the conduct and behaviour of the Members of the College *in statu pupillari*, and the other, who shall be called Dean of Chapel, shall provide for the celebration of Divine Service in the College Chapel according to such rules and regulations as shall from time to time be made by the Council, and shall see that all persons conduct themselves decently therein.

3. They shall also each of them perform such other duties as the Council shall from time to time assign to them respectively.

iv. By repealing Statute XXXV intitled "Compulsory Retirement from Office," and substituting therefor the following amended Statute XXXV:—

#### XXXV.—*Compulsory Retirement from Office.*

No person shall hold the office of Bursar, Prælector, Tutor, Assistant Tutor or Lecturer after more than twenty-five years' service in one or more of the said offices, and the office of Assistant Lecturer in the College, unless a Special Meeting of the Council, exclusive of such person if a Member of Council, shall have been held at which a resolution shall have been passed in which not less than nine votes shall have concurred

to the effect that it is desirable in the interests of the College that such person retain his office. Such resolution shall have the effect of postponing the time at which such office is necessarily vacated for a period of five years or for any less period which the resolution may fix, and at the expiration of any such period a further extension of tenure may be granted under like conditions, and the like extension of tenure may be granted under like conditions as often as the Council shall think fit.

v. By repealing Section 2 of Statute XXXVIII intitled "Residence in College," and substituting therefor the following amended Section to form Section 2 of the same Statute:—

2. The following obligations shall subsist as to residence in College (that is to say):—

(i.) The Tutors shall reside in College during full term, and one Tutor shall reside in College during such part of the long vacation as may from time to time be determined by the Council.

(ii.) The Dean of College shall reside in College during full term and during such parts of the vacations as may from time to time be determined by the Council, but with permission for him in lieu of personal residence to provide from time to time a substitute to be approved by the Master or in his absence by the Vice-Master.

vi. By repealing Section 7 of Statute XLIII intitled "The Council," and substituting the following amended Section to form Section 7 of the same Statute:—

7. The Council shall include as *ex-officio* members the Master, the Vice-Master, the Senior Tutor, the Senior Bursar, being a Fellow, and the Junior Bursar, being a Fellow. If either the Bursars be not a Fellow he shall not be an *ex-officio* member of Council, but unless elected a member shall be an assessor only without a vote. For all cases of discipline and questions affecting the discipline of the College and for all questions affecting the celebration of Divine Service in the College Chapel the Dean, whose department the question concerns, if not a member of Council shall be an assessor without a vote.

vii. By repealing Section 16 of Statute XLIX intitled "Distribution of Revenues," and substituting the following amended Section to form Section 16 of the same Statute:—

16. For each Fellow holding one of the next-mentioned College offices the following amounts in addition to his one *modulus* (that is to say), after he shall have held the office of Prælector, Bursar, Tutor, Assistant Tutor, Lecturer or Assistant Lecturer or any two or more of such offices for five years, one-fifth of a *modulus*, after he shall have held such office or offices as aforesaid for ten years, two-fifths of a *modulus*, after he shall have held such office or offices as aforesaid for fifteen years, three-fifths of a *modulus*, and after he shall have held such office or offices as aforesaid for twenty years, four-fifths of a *modulus*; for each Fellow elected to his Fellowship before the eleventh day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three, who shall have finally ceased to hold a College office as aforesaid or the University office of Regius Professor of Greek, and who

shall have held such office or two or more of such offices for twenty years but less than twenty-five years (in addition to his one *modulus*), three-fifths of a *modulus*; for each Fellow elected to his Fellowship after the tenth day of August, one thousand nine hundred and three, who shall have finally ceased to hold a College office as aforesaid or the University office of Regius Professor of Greek on account of ill-health, and shall have been permitted by the Council to retain his Fellowship as a pension Fellowship, and who shall have held such office or two or more of such offices for twenty years but less than twenty-five years (in addition to his one *modulus*), one-half of a *modulus*; and for each Fellow finally ceasing to hold a College office as aforesaid or the University office of Regius Professor of Greek, who shall have held such office or two or more of such offices for twenty-five years (in addition to his one *modulus*), one *modulus*. Provided always that the period of tenure by any Fellow before the approval of this Statute by His Majesty in Council of the office of Dean shall be reckoned for the purposes of this Section as if the office of Dean were included among such College offices as aforesaid.

**MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR FEMALE WORKERS AS VARIED AND MADE EFFECTIVE FROM 12TH DECEMBER, 1921,\* TOGETHER WITH MINIMUM RATES WHICH ARE NOT AFFECTED BY THE VARIATION, AND WHICH REMAIN IN OPERATION.**

The Schedule to this Notice sets out the Minimum Rates of Wages for all Female Workers in Great Britain, and incorporates:—

(1) The General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers in Great Britain (excluding the Administrative County of Cornwall and the Orkney and Shetland Islands) as varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by Order of the Minister of Labour specifying the 12th day of December, 1921,\* as the date from which they should become effective.

(2) The Overtime Rates for Female Workers in the Administrative County of Cornwall and the Orkney and Shetland Islands as varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by Order of the Minister of Labour specifying the 12th day of December, 1921,\* as the date from which they should become effective.

(3) The General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates for Female Workers in the Administrative County of Cornwall and the Orkney and Shetland Islands, contained in the Notice W. (5) issued by the Trade Board and dated

4th November, 1920, which remain unaffected by the variation.

\* NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 18th December, 1921.

Female Workers, other than those specially employed for emergency work or whose employment is of a casual nature:

*General Minimum Time-Rates:—*

1. Workers of 18 years of age and over, with not less than 12 months' experience, 7½d. per hour.
2. Workers of 18 years of age and over, with less than 12 months' experience, *see* Part I, Section I, of the Schedule set out below.
3. Workers under 18 years of age, *see* Part I, Section I, of the Schedule set out below.

*Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate:—*

Female Workers of all ages, 9d. per hour.

*Guaranteed Time-Rates for Piece-Workers:—*

1. Workers of 18 years of age and over, 6½d. per hour.
2. Workers under 18 years of age, *see* Part I, Section III, of the Schedule set out below.

*Overtime Rates for Time-Workers, see Part I, Section IV, of the Schedule set out below.*

Female Workers, specially employed for emergency work, or whose employment is of a casual nature, *see* Part II of the Schedule set out below.

The Rates in full as legally enforceable are set out in detail in the Schedule below.

During the period of employment required to complete the 2nd Six Months of such experience, 27s. 6d. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6¾d. per hour.

(a) For all hours worked in excess of 5 on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, for the first two hours, and One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF thereafter, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(b) For all time worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(c) For all hours worked in excess of 48 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be TIME-AND-A-QUARTER for the first two hours and TIME-AND-A-HALF thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are

payable under the provisions of Sub-Sections (a) and (b) of this Section.

(d) The Overtime Rates shall not apply to Piece-Workers.

Provided that, where, in the case of workers to whom the Shops Act applies, the day which under that Act constitutes the weekly short day (half-holiday) is a day other than Saturday, and in the case of other workers another day is substituted for Saturday, under the provisions of Section 43 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, the above provisions shall apply as though such half-holiday or short day were substituted for Saturday and Saturday were substituted for such half-holiday or short day.

Provided also that in cases in which another day is substituted for a Statutory Holiday under the provisions of Section 35 of the Factory Act, 1901, the above provisions shall apply as though such other day were the Statutory Holiday and the Statutory Holiday were an ordinary working day.

*Note.*—The hours which women, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

#### SECTION III.—*Overtime Rates for Time-Workers.*

(i) The Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be the same as for workers comprised within Part I of this Schedule.

(ii) The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Female Worker employed on time-work in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows:—

(a) For all hours worked in excess of 5 on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(b) For all hours worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF, notwithstanding in both cases that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(c) For all hours worked in excess of 48 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be TIME-AND-A-QUARTER for the first two hours and TIME-AND-A-HALF thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-section (b) of this Section.

(d) The Overtime Rates shall not apply to Piece-Workers.

Provided that, where, in the case of workers to whom the Shops Act applies, the day which under that Act constitutes the weekly short day (half-holiday) is a day other than Saturday, and in the case of other workers another day is substituted for Saturday, under the provisions of Section 43 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, the above provisions shall apply as though such half-holiday or short day were substituted for Saturday and Saturday were substituted for such half-holiday or short day.

*Note.*—The hours which women, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

### PART III.

SECTION I.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Notice shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Workers employed in the areas and of the classes specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919 (that is to say, the laundering of articles of every description and all processes and opera-

tions incidental thereto performed by way of trade or for the purpose of gain), as varied by the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, and the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, by virtue of which all processes of laundering and other similar operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of the articles specified in the Appendices to the three last-mentioned Orders are excluded from the scope of the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to Workers earning higher rates of wages.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers, and the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates for Female Workers employed upon Piece-Work, at present effective and set out in the Trade Board's Notices H.L. (4) and H.L. (6), dated 15th February, 1921, and 6th July, 1921, respectively, so that in lieu of such minimum rates of wages the minimum rates of wages for Male and Female Workers in the trade shall be as set out in the Schedule below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

(a) In the case of workers entering the trade for the first time between the ages of 16 and 18 years, the General Minimum Time-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates for Piece-workers payable during the first six months' period of employment shall be  $\frac{1}{2}$ d. per hour less than the proposed minimum rates otherwise applicable as set out above. Such workers, on completing six months' employment in the trade, shall be entitled to the proposed minimum rates applicable to their age as set out in the foregoing table.

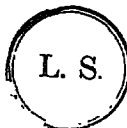
