## PART III.

Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers: All Ages.

Overtime Rates calculated on the Proposed Minimum Rates specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part III of the Trade Board's Notice H.L. (6) dated 6th July, 1921, shall apply in substitution for the Proposed General Minimum Time Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to their said Notice H.L. (6) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

## PART IV.

The above Proposed Min mum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade as specified in Part III of the Trade Board's Notice H.L. (6), dated 6th July, 1921.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 19th day of December, 1921. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary, The Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to
