PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

**W**HEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 6th day of December, 1921 (C.E. 6390/21), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas His late Majesty was graciously pleased by His Order in Council bearing date the 12th day of August, 1907, to sanction the grant of increased retired pay on scales and subject to regulations set forth therein to Officers of the Royal Navy who were placed on the Retired List while serving on the Staff of the Inspection and Experimental Departments or in posts at the Admiralty connected with those Departments:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Your Order in Council bearing date

the 23th day of November, 1910, to sanction, subject to certain conditions, the grant of similar increases of retired pay to Officers of the Royal Marines who were seconded for service, and retired while serving, in any of the aforesaid posts:

"And whereas Your Majesty was further graciously pleased by Your Orders in Council bearing dates the 11th day of June, 1910, the 10th day of February, 1919, and the 25th day of June, 1919, to extend the benefits of the Order in Council dated the 12th day of August, 1907, to Officers of the Royal Navy who were placed on the retired list while holding certain other appointments specified therein:

"And whereas under Schedule V of Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, fresh regulations regarding the ages for compulsory retirement and rates of retired pay of Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines were approved with a view to assimilating as far as practicable the conditions of service and rates of retired pay of Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable to amend the provisions of the aforesaid Orders in Council bearing dates the 12th day of August, 1907, the 28th day of November, 1910, the 11th day of June, 1910, the 10th day of February, 1919, and the 25th day of June, 1919, with a view to—

(a) assimilating the conditions of service of Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal

Marines in any of the appointments therein referred to in accordance with the principle prescribed in the Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, quoted above;

(b) extending the provisions of the several Orders regarding increases of retired pay, so that they may apply to Officers of the Royal Navy and Royal Marines who may be appointed from the Retired List to any of the posts referred to, as well as to those retired while serving in any such posts; and

(c) extending the provisions of the said Orders as thus amended to Officers serving on the Staff of the Compass Department of the Admiralty.

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the cancellation, without prejudice however to the validity of any increases of retired pay already granted thereunder, of all the aforesaid Orders in Council, except that dated the 22nd day of January, 1920, and the substitution therefor of the regulations set forth in the Schedule annexed hereto.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in these proposals.

#### "SCHEDULE.

"REGULATIONS RESPECTING THE RETIRED PAY OF RETIRED OFFICERS OF THE R.N. AND R.M. SERVING IN THE INSPECTION, EXPERIMENTAL AND COMPASS DEPARTMENT AND IN CERTAIN SIMILAR POSTS.

"1. These regulations have effect from the 1st February, 1919, and apply to all Officers of the R.N. and R.M. who were serving on that date in any of the posts (except those on the Staff of the Compass Department) referred to in rule 2 as well as to all Officers appointed to any of them thereafter. As regards Officers on the Staff of the Compass Department they have effect from the 1st April, 1920, and apply to all Officers then serving as well as those subsequently appointed.

"2. The posts to which these regulations apply are:—

(a) All posts on the Staff of the Inspection and Experimental Departments and all posts at the Admiralty connected with those Departments;

(b) The posts of Superintendent and Assistant Superintendent of the R.N. Torpedo Factory at Greenock;

(c) The posts of Superintendent of Torpedo Experiments and First Technical Assistant to the said Superintendent at Stokes Bay;

(d) The post of Technical Assistant to the Director of Armament Supply for Duty as Ordnance Inspector of Depôts and Factories; and

(e) All posts on the Staff of the Compass Department at the Admiralty.

"3. Service in any of the aforesaid appointments before retirement from the R.N. or R.M. will count for increase of retired pay under the ordinary regulations from time to time in force for Officers on the active lists of the R.N. and R.M. and increased retired pay under these regulations will accrue only in respect of service rendered in any of the appointments after retirement from the R.N. and R.M.

"4. The retired pay of all retired Officers of the R.N. and R.M. serving in any of these appointments will be suspended during such

service and their service will count for increase of retired pay on the scales and subject to the conditions set forth hereunder, subject, however, to the proviso that an Officer of the R.M. who at the date of his retirement from the R.M. had earned retired pay in excess of the maximum at that date permissible in the case of a Lieutenant Commander, R.N., shall not count his further service for increase of retired pay.

"5. All Officers in any of the appointments referred to in these regulations who have not previously been discharged to retired pay at their own request or for some other reason, will be liable to such discharge on attaining 60 years of age.

"6. An Officer who is discharged to retired pay at his own request, or on completion of any period for which he may have been appointed or as unfit for further employment from any cause other than those specified in rule 7 may have the retired pay earned by his service before retirement from the R.N. or R.M. increased by one-sixtieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment held on discharge for each complete year of service after retirement in any of the appointments to which these regulations relate.

"7. An Officer who is discharged to retired pay on account of age, or medical unfitness, or abolition of office, or reduction or re-organisation of establishment, may have the retired pay earned by his service before retirement from the R.N. or R.M. increased:—

(a) if with ten or more years' service after retirement in any post to which these regulations relate, by one-sixtieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment held on discharge for each complete year of service after retirement;

(b) if with less than ten years' service after retirement in any post to which these regulations relate, by one-fiftieth of the pay and allowances of the appointment held on discharge for each complete year of service after retirement, provided that the total addition shall not exceed ten-sixtieths of such pay and allowances.

"8. For the purposes of rules 6 and 7 service on the retired list before the 1st February, 1919, in any post to which these regulations relate may reckon for increase of retired pay in the case of any Officer who was then so serving.

"9. Officers on the Active List of the R.M. who are appointed to any of the posts to which these regulations relate shall be seconded from the Corps of the R.M. until they reach the rank of Lieutenant Colonel when they will become supernumerary. They will be subject to the same rules as regards qualifications for promotion and retirement for age in any rank as other Officers of the R.M."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS by the Children Act, 1908, it was, amongst other things, enacted that His Majesty may, by Order in Council

under the Metropolitan Police Courts Acts, 1839 and 1840, provide for the establishment of one or more separate Juvenile Courts for the Metropolitan Police Court District, and for assigning as a division to each such Court such portion of that district as may be specified in the Order:

And whereas by the Metropolitan Police Courts Acts, 1839 and 1840, it was, amongst other things, enacted that it shall be lawful for His Majesty, with the advice of His Privy Council, to alter the number of Magistrates appointed to any of the Police Courts theretofore established, and to order that a Police Magistrate or Magistrates shall attend regularly at any Police Court or Courts thereafter to be established, either daily or on such days or times as His Majesty, by the advice aforesaid, shall order:

And whereas by divers Orders in Council made under the said Acts such Police Court Divisions as to His Majesty from time to time has seemed fit have been constituted within the Metropolitan Police District and the extent thereof defined respectively, and such divisions have been assigned to the Police Courts continued or established under the said Acts:

And whereas by the Juvenile Courts (Metropolis) Act, 1920, it was, amongst other things, enacted that an Order in Council made under the Children Act, 1908, for the establishment of Juvenile Courts for the Metropolitan Police Court District may, notwithstanding anything in the Metropolitan Police Courts Act, 1840, provide for such Courts being held elsewhere than in the buildings used as Metropolitan Police Courts, and for every such Court being constituted of a Police Magistrate nominated by the Secretary of State, and two Justices of the Peace for the County of London, of whom one shall be a woman, and both of whom shall be chosen from amongst a panel of such Justices nominated for the purpose by the Secretary of State:

His Majesty is pleased, therefore, with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered accordingly, that—

(1) Juvenile Courts for the Metropolitan Police Court District shall be established as in the Schedule to this Order, and shall be

held in the buildings mentioned in the first column of that Schedule: and divisions shall be assigned to them as described in the second column of the said Schedule.

(2) The said Juvenile Courts shall be held on the days and at the hours specified in the third column of the said Schedule or on such other days and at such other hours as may from time to time be approved by a Secretary of State: provided that a Juvenile Court which would in pursuance of the foregoing provision have been held on a day when the Metropolitan Police Courts are closed may be held on the preceding day, or if the preceding day is a Sunday, on the day following.

(3) Each Court shall be constituted of a Police Magistrate nominated by the Secretary of State and two Justices of the Peace for the County of London, of whom one shall be a woman, and both of whom shall be chosen from amongst a panel of such Justices nominated for the purpose by the Secretary of State.

Provided that a Police Magistrate may sit alone in any case where he considers that it would be impracticable for the Court to be constituted in manner aforesaid, or that it would be inexpedient in the interests of justice to adjourn the business of the Court.

(4) The Justices who are to sit at the several sittings of the Courts aforesaid shall be chosen by the panel, or, if necessary, by the Police Magistrate, and in the case of the absence of the Police Magistrate through illness, leave or other cause, his place shall be taken by another Police Magistrate, or by a barrister-at-law in practice for at least seven years appointed, or a Justice of the Peace approved, by the Secretary of State.

(5) The Order in Council made on the 12th day of August, 1913, except so far as it relates to the Greenwich and Woolwich Police Courts, and the Orders in Council made on the 13th day of April, 1918, and the 27th day of May, 1921, are hereby revoked.

This Order shall come into force on the 1st day of February, 1922.

**W**HEREAS by the Mercantile Marine (Uniform) Order, 1918, His Majesty in Council was pleased to prescribe a uniform to be worn by the British Mercantile Marine:

And whereas by the British Mercantile Marine Uniform Act, 1919, provision was made for prohibiting the improper use of the British Mercantile Marine uniform:

And whereas the provisions of the said Act apply to the uniform prescribed by the Mercantile Marine (Uniform) Order, 1918, and any other or further uniform which may be prescribed by Order in Council in connection with the British Mercantile Marine:

And whereas it is expedient that the national standard uniform for the British Mercantile Marine should be such as is hereinafter prescribed:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

(1) The Uniform of the British Mercantile Marine shall be such as is set forth in the Schedule to this Order: Provided that where, on the 4th day of September, 1918, the Masters and Officers of the Ships belonging to any Company or Firm were accustomed to use a cap with a distinctive badge, that badge may, if the Company or Firm so desire, be substituted, in the case of persons whilst serving on board, or employed on the business of, Ships belonging to that Company or Firm, for the cap badge prescribed in the said Schedule.

(2) The persons entitled to wear the Uniform so prescribed shall be Masters and Officers of the Mercantile Marine holding certificates from the Board of Trade, Uncertificated

Junior Officers of the Mercantile Marine qualifying for their first certificate, and Surgeons, Purasers, Wireless Operators, Cadets, and Apprentices of the Mercantile Marine, and Petty Officers and other Ratings of the Mercantile Marine specifically mentioned in the said Schedule, but no other persons whosoever.

(3) The Uniform to be worn by any person whilst employed in any position or rank on board any Ship shall be the Uniform appropriate to that position or rank, without reference to the class of certificate which he may hold.

(4) A member of the Mercantile Marine temporarily unemployed shall be entitled to wear the Uniform appropriate to the highest rank in which he has at any time been previously employed, but any person entitled to wear the Standard Uniform as laid down in Article (2) when employed ashore (other than as a Marine or Engineer Superintendent) is not entitled to wear the Standard Uniform in the course of such employment.

(5) No person entitled to wear the Uniform shall, when on board Ship, in port, or on shore, be dressed partly in Uniform and partly not in Uniform.

(6) This Order shall apply only as respects persons who are or who have been employed on British Ships registered at ports in the British Islands.

(7) The Mercantile Marine Uniform Order, 1918, is hereby revoked; but nothing in this Order shall prevent a person who is entitled to wear a British uniform from wearing a uniform complying with the provisions of the Order hereby revoked of which he was in possession at the date of this Order.

(8) This Order shall come into operation on the day of the promulgation thereof.

(9) This Order may be cited as "The Mercantile Marine (Uniform) Order, 1921."

(3) The space between each row of lace, mohair, or braid, is to be  $\frac{3}{8}$  inch, except when there are 2 rows only, in which case the space between them is to be  $1\frac{1}{8}$  inches. The insertion should be  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch in width on each side of the stripe, and should entirely fill the centre of the diamond, but in the case of chief engineers, the space between the two middle rows is to be entirely filled with purple cloth, the top and bottom rows to be edged with the same,  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch wide.

(4) Masters and Chief Engineers will wear two interlaced chevrons, one pointing upwards and one downwards, and formed by the two inner of the four rows of the distinction lace. Other (deck and engineer) Certificated Officers, together with Surgeons and Assistant Surgeons, Senior Pursers, Pursers, and Assistant Pursers, will wear one diamond of  $\frac{3}{8}$ -inch plain gold lace (or black mohair), and First Wireless Operators one diamond of  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch gold Russia braid (or black braid), with open centre, and an outside measurement (angle to angle) of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches, imposed on the distinction lace. Uncertificated Junior Officers (deck and engineer) will wear a single chevron pointing downwards and formed by the single row of distinction lace.

The foregoing chevrons should have an outside measurement of  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches at the base.

(5) Chief Refrigerating Engineers, holding 1st class certificate, should wear the same uniform as a 2nd Engineer.

Second Refrigerating Engineers, holding 2nd class certificate, should wear the same uniform as a 3rd Engineer.

Uncertificated Refrigerating Engineers, Electricians and Boilermakers qualifying for their first certificate, may wear the Uniform of Uncertificated Junior Engineers.

## 2. GREAT COAT.

For all Officers, Cadets and Apprentices.

Blue cloth. Length to come to 14 inches from the ground. Double breasted. Six buttons on each side to button four buttons, the bottom button not to come below the level of hips. A plait down the back with an opening at the bottom 18 inches long with a fly and three small plain buttons. A cloth strap behind with a button hole at each end, and two corresponding uniform buttons to confine the waist to required size. Stand and fall collar

with hook and eye in collar seam. Edges of coat to be double stitched; the shoulders fitted with straps for rank stripes, when worn.

## 3. FROCK COAT.

For all Officers—but not Cadets or Apprentices.

Blue cloth, double breasted, with padded turn-down collar; cut for six buttons, but to have five buttons on each breast, to button four buttons, the width of lapel to be 3 inches at fourth button, tapering to  $2\frac{1}{4}$  inches at waist seam; two buttons on the hips with side edges in plait of skirt extending half-way down the skirt, with a button at bottom of each side edge; for Officers 5 feet 9 inches in height, length of coat 38 inches, with a proportionate variation for difference in height. The proportionate variation in length of skirt for each inch of difference in height is  $\frac{1}{4}$  of an inch. Lining, black material. Round cuffs, and rank stripes on the sleeves. A black morocco leather belt  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide with gilt buckles of same design as standard cap badge can be worn optionally.

## 4. UNDRESS COAT.

For all Officers, Cadets, and Apprentices.

Blue cloth, with padded turn-down collar; the length to be sufficient to cover the hips; double breasted with five buttons at equal distance on each side, to button four buttons. Pockets without flaps at the sides, in line with the lower button, and one outside left breast pocket. An opening 5 inches long at the bottom of each side seam.

Round cuffs; rank stripes on the sleeves.

## 5. WORKING UNDRESS JACKET.

Blue serge, single breasted, stand collar, with hook and eye at neck, five buttons at the front, and an opening at bottom of each side seam 5 inches long. A patched pocket on each breast without flaps. Shoulder straps for rank stripes in black mohair.

## 6. WHITE UNDRESS COAT.

White drill, single breasted, stand collar, with hook and eye at neck, five buttons at the front, and an opening at bottom of each side seam 5 inches long. A patched pocket on each breast, without flaps. Shoulder straps for rank stripes.

## 7. MESS JACKET.

Blue cloth, double breasted, six buttonholes in each row, four on the turn and two below, padded turn-down collar; slightly roached over the hips with a rounded peak behind; two pockets with welts at the side. Round cuffs with rank stripes.

## 8. WHITE MESS JACKET.

White linen of the same shape as the blue jacket but with a roll collar, two buttons in each row, and two buttonholes on either side to correspond with the buttons, to be worn linked with two No. 2 size buttons connected by a ring. Shoulders fitted with straps for rank stripes.

## 9. SHOULDER STRAPS.

For all Officers—but not Cadets or Apprentices.

Blue cloth with rank stripes,  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch wide, and coloured cloth, according to rank or branch. Straps to be 5 inches long,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide, and to have a No. 3 button on top.

## 10. TROUSERS.

Blue cloth for frock or undress coat. Blue serge for working jacket, and white duck or drill material for white undress coat.

## 11. WAISTCOATS.

Blue cloth, single-breasted, with six buttons.

For wear with blue mess jacket—Blue cloth, single-breasted, cut low, with roll collar and four buttons.

For wear with white jacket—White marcella, the same pattern as the blue waistcoat.

## 12. BUTTONS.

A gilt-raised round button, with a plain rim encircling a rope rim, surrounding an anchor without cable rope through a Naval Crown. (Registered Design No. 604,376.)

(1)  $\frac{8}{10}$  of an inch in diameter (or in button maker's measure 35 lines, relief 7 lines).

(2)  $\frac{15}{20}$  of an inch in diameter (or in button maker's measure 30 lines, relief 6 lines).

(3)  $\frac{13}{20}$  of an inch in diameter (or in button maker's measure 25 lines, relief  $5\frac{1}{2}$  lines).

They are to be worn as follows:—

Size No. 1 on all coats. Size No. 2 on jackets. Size No. 3 on waistcoats and shoulder straps.

## 13. CAP AND COVER.

For all Officers, Cadets, and Apprentices.

Cap:—Blue cloth, with three blue cloth welts,  $3\frac{1}{4}$  inches total depth, diameter across the top  $8\frac{1}{4}$  inches, for a cap fitting  $21\frac{1}{4}$  inches in circumference, the top to be  $\frac{1}{8}$  inch larger or smaller in diameter for every  $\frac{1}{4}$  inch the cap may vary in size of head above or below the before-mentioned standard, e.g., a cap  $22\frac{1}{4}$  inches in circumference, diameter across the top  $8\frac{1}{2}$  inches; cap 21 inches in circumference, diameter  $7\frac{1}{2}$  inches. The sides to be made in four pieces, and to be  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches deep between the welts; a black mohair braid band,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches wide, placed between the two lower welts, the join of the band to be in front so as to be covered by the badge, the upper side of the mohair band to be left unsewn to admit of bottom edge of white cover being slipped under when required.

The cap set up on a band of stiff leather, or other material,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches deep.

The use of steel cap stretchers is prohibited.

Cover:—The cap cover to be of white ribbed marcella.

Peak:—For Masters.—Covered with blue cloth, and bound with patent leather, and embroidered on the front edge with laurel leaves in gold  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch wide.

For all other Officers, Cadets, and Apprentices.—Patent leather without embroidery.

The peak to drop at an angle of 45 degrees, and to be 2 inches deep in the middle when worn with embroidery, and  $1\frac{1}{2}$  inches when plain.

Chin Stay for all Officers, Cadets, and Apprentices:—Black patent leather  $\frac{3}{8}$  inch wide, buttoned on to two black cloth buttons placed immediately behind the corners of the peak.

## 14. CAP BADGE.

Gold Naval Crown over silver anchor (without cable); the anchor on red oval cushion with gold rope rim, surrounded below and at the sides by gold oak-leaves and acorns. The whole on a backing of Navy Blue cloth. (Registered Designs, Nos. 675,203 and 675,204.)

## 15. FOUL WEATHER COAT AND HAT.

A black oilskin and sou-wester of the usual pattern.

## 16. NECKTIES, COMFORTERS, &amp;c.

Neckties:—With frock-coats or undress—a plain black silk or satin tie,  $1\frac{1}{2}$  to 2 inches wide.

With mess undress—a plain black silk or satin tie, 1 inch wide.

Comforter, shirt and collar:—To be white.

## 17. GLOVES.

Plain, brown dogskin, or brown buckskin, with great-coat, undress coat, and working undress jacket.

Plain, white, with frock-coat and mess jacket.

## 18. BOOTS.

Black boots or shoes with all Uniforms other than white undress, with which white shoes may be worn.

## 2. BADGE.

Standard cap badge as for Officers, but without surround of oak-leaves and acorns. Standard cap badge in silver for stewards on cargo vessels.

Blue cloth, double-breasted, with stand and fall collar, four (standard) buttons, and buttonholes to correspond on each side. Three buttons to show, the fourth being under the lapel in which one buttonhole is to be worked, the lowest button to be in line with top of pocket.

A patched pocket, without flap, on each breast.

White drill for wear in hot climates, when Officers wear tunics.

(1) Blue cloth, made with a fly front.

(2) White material, drill or duck.

#### 7. SOCKS.

Blue.

#### 8. NECKTIE.

Black.

#### 9. SHOES.

Black.

#### 10. BUTTONS.

As for Officers, but without the rope rim. Gilt for Boatswains, Carpenters, Quartermasters, and equivalent Petty Officers, horn for Boatswain's Mates and equivalent Ratings.

For overcoats, a button 1½ inches in diameter may be used.

#### 11. OVERCOATS.

Usual Navy pattern, four buttons.

#### 12. DISTINGUISHING ARM BADGES, IN GILT OR RED (ON SERGE) OR BLUE (ON DUCK).

Boatswain—Crossed anchors.

Boatswain's Mate—Single anchor.

Carpenter—Crossed axes.

Carpenter's Mate—Single axe.

Donkeyman or Chief Stoker—Propeller with star above.

Greaser or Leading Stoker—Propeller.

Blacksmith—Crossed hammers.

Plumber—Crossed spanner and tooling iron.

Assistant Blacksmith—Single hammer.

Assistant Plumber—Spanner.

Quartermaster—Wheel.

Assistant Quartermaster—Half-wheel.

Master-at-arms—Crossed keys.

Jointer (on Cable Electrical Engineering Staff)—Crossed jointing iron and tooling iron, with star above.

Jointer's Mate (on Cable Electrical Engineering Staff)—Crossed jointing iron and tooling iron.

NOTE.—Uniform for Quartermaster and Assistant Quartermaster—Serge (or white duck), jumper of usual pattern, with collar of blue jean with a border of two rows of ¼ inch white tape 3/16th inch apart. Black silk neckerchief. White flannel singlet. Serge (or white duck) trousers. M.O.W. cap with ribbon woven with Ship's name.

#### 13. STEWARD'S DEPARTMENT.

Chief Steward on passenger vessels—One ¼ inch gold stripe with three gold stars above, 2 inches apart (centre to centre).

Assistant Chief Steward on passenger vessels—Three gold stars on cuffs (as above).

Steward on passenger vessels—Two gold stars on cuffs, 2½ inches apart (centre to centre).

Assistant Steward on passenger vessels—One gold star on cuffs.

Steward on cargo vessel—One ¼ inch silver stripe and two silver stars, 2½ inches apart (centre to centre), with buttons in silver or white metal.

Cook—Silver star on cuffs.

Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, or in respect of any securities or investments from time to time representing the said sum of £50,000 Local Loans £2 per centum per annum Stock shall cease to be held by us for the benefit of the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stainby with Gunby and shall be held by us for the benefit of our Common Fund to be applied as in the said Acts mentioned: Provided always that such appropriation of the said interest or dividends shall not prejudicially affect the consideration of the amount of any pension to be granted to the said Wilfrid Lionel de Buckenhold Thorold in the event of his vacating the said Benefice by resignation under the provisions of the Incumbents' Resignation Acts, and any pension awarded to him out of the income of the said Benefice in that event shall be paid out of the said interest or dividends so appropriated to our Common Fund in relief of the income remaining to the said Benefice, and Provided further that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said Benefice of Stainby with Gunby shall continue to be payable by the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

#### UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONVOCATION ON  
TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 22, 1921.

Whereas it is expedient (1) to amend Section XII, § 2, of Titulus V of the Statutes of the University of Oxford, so as to extend the consultative and legislative powers of the General Board of the Faculties, and (2) to make certain consequential amendments in Titulus X;

Now the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council as follows:—

1. In Statt. Tit. V. Sect. XII. § 2 (p. 172, ed. 1921), cl. 6 shall be struck out and the following new clauses shall be substituted:—

"6. The General Board shall have power to draft and send to the Hebdomadal Council any proposals on matters connected with the Studies and Examinations of the University which require to be dealt with by Statute; and it shall be the duty of the Hebdomadal Council to submit all such proposals, without alteration, to Congregation. Before sending on any such proposal to Council the General Board shall consult any Board, Delegacy, Committee, or other University Body which in its opinion is specially concerned, and in particular shall consult the Curators of the University Chest if the proposal involves any expenditure which will not be charged on the Faculties Fund under cl. 3 of this subsection; and the General Board shall have power on all occasions to consult and be consulted by such University Bodies as aforesaid on matters connected with Studies and Examinations.

"7. The General Board shall have the same power to move amendments to any Statute which it has promoted, and to which any amendment shall have been adopted, as is possessed by any twelve members of Congregation, provided that, notwithstanding anything in Statt. Tit. X. Sect. III. § 3. cl. 6 contained, any amendments, which the General Board may propose, shall reach the Registrar not later than 9 A.M. on the tenth day after the Congregation at which the previous amendment was adopted. But nothing in this or the preceding clause shall be taken to limit the power of the Hebdomadal Council to propose forms of Statute on any matter, or to move amendments to any Statute of which the



Preamble has been approved by Congregation."

## UNIVERSITY OF OXFORD.

STATUTE APPROVED BY CONVOCAATION ON  
TUESDAY, NOVEMBER 22, 1921.

Whereas it is expedient to make certain changes in Sections I, II, III, V, VI, VIII, XI, XII, of *Titulus V* of the Statutes of the University of Oxford, so as (1) to correct the Schedules of Professors and Readers who are *ex officio* members of Boards of Faculties, (2) to make clear the definition of a "University Lecturer," (3) to specify the minimum attendance to be required of members of the General Board of the Faculties, and (4) to define further the duties of Faculties, Sub-Faculties, and Boards of Faculties, and of the Chairmen of such bodies:

Now the said University, in exercise of the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877, and of all other powers enabling it, enacts subject to the approval of His Majesty in Council as follows:—

1. In *Statt. Tit. V. Sect. I. cl. 1* (p. 155, ed. 1921), the words "deputy, demonstrator, or assistant of a Professor" shall be struck out and the word "Reader" shall be substituted.

2. *Ibid.*, *Sect. II. cl. 6* (p. 157), the words "in French, German, Italian, Spanish, and Scandinavian languages" shall be struck out.

3. *Ibid.*, *Sect. III. cl. 3* (p. 158), shall be struck out and the following new clauses shall be substituted:—

"3. Each Faculty, or, where a Faculty has been divided into sub-Faculties, each sub-Faculty, shall elect a Chairman annually. The Chairman thus elected may, when he judges it expedient, summon meetings of the Faculty or sub-Faculty of which he is Chairman, and he shall do so on the requisition of not less than one-half of the members of the body to be summoned, or, if the number of members of such body shall exceed thirty, on the requisition of not less than fifteen members. Each Faculty or sub-Faculty shall have power to regulate its proceedings by by-laws. The Chairman of the meeting of any Faculty or sub-Faculty shall notify its decisions to the Assistant Registrar, who shall preserve a record thereof.

"4. The Chairman of the Board of any Faculty, which has been divided into sub-Faculties, may, if he judges it expedient, summon a meeting of the Faculty, and he shall do so on the requisition of not less than one-

half of the members of the Faculty, or, if the number of members of the Faculty shall exceed thirty, on the requisition of not less than fifteen members."

4. *Ibid.*, *Sect. v*, in the Schedule of Professors and Readers (p. 159) under the heading "Theology" shall be added "Philosophy of the Christian Religion, Oriel"; under the heading "Law" shall be added "Roman-Dutch Law, Rhodes"; under the heading "Modern History" shall be added "Political Theory and Institutions, Gladstone" and "American History, Harold Vyvyan Harmsworth"; under the heading "Med. and Mod. Lang." shall be added "English Language and Literature, Merton," "French Literature, Marshal Foch," "Italian Studies, Serena," "Byzantine and Modern Greek, Bywater and Sotheby"; and under the heading "Natural Science" shall be added "Biochemistry, Whitley," "Forestry."

5. *Ibid.*, *Sect. VI. § 2. cl. 4* (p. 160), after the words "by the Chairman" the following words shall be inserted:—"of the Faculty, or, if the Faculty has been divided into sub-Faculties, by the Chairman"; and the words "The Chairman of the Board shall" shall be struck out, and the words "The Chairman of the Faculty or the Chairman of the Board shall" shall be substituted for them.

6. *Ibid.*, *Sect. VIII* (p. 163), sub-clause (4) shall be struck out and the following new sub-clauses shall be substituted:—

"(4) To make recommendations to the General Board of the Faculties as to the application of a portion of the Faculties Fund to the purposes set forth in *Sect. XII. § 2. cl. 3* (b) of this Title.

"(5) To elect members of the General Board of the Faculties in accordance with the provisions of *Sect. XII. § 1* of this Title.

"(6) To appoint members of the Boards of Electors to certain Professorships under the provisions of *Statt. Tit. IV*.

"(7) To perform the duties assigned to them under the provisions of *Statt. Tit. VI. Sect. IV*, 'On Degrees in Letters and Science,' and *Sect. v*, 'On the Degree of Doctor of Philosophy.'

"(8) To perform such further duties as are or shall be assigned to them under the provisions of *Statt. Tit. V, VI, and VIII*."

7. *Ibid.*, *Sect. XI. § 3. cl. 2* (p. 166), before the words "Professor of Physiology" shall be inserted the word "Waynflete" and after the words "Professor of Pathology" shall be inserted the words "Whitley Professor of Biochemistry."

"and to make such regulations as it shall deem necessary for carrying out the provisions of this subsection."

Pursuant to paragraph 6 of the Unemployment Insurance (Determination of Questions) Regulations, 1920, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice of his intention to refer to the High Court for decision the following questions that have arisen in applications made to him for his decision under Section 10 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, namely, whether the employment of a person as a—

Cleaner of Solicitor's Office whose duties consist in cleaning and dusting the said offices and in making fires before and after office hours

Housemaid-waitress and housemaid in a seaside Boarding House which, though not closed to visitors at any time of the year, is occupied to its full capacity only at certain holiday seasons

Cleaner of a Public Elementary School (employed by the Local Education Committee of a County Council)

Caretaker employed by a Standing Joint Committee of a County Council to take charge of their Offices  
is or is not employment within the meaning of the Act of 1920.

Under Rules 5 and 18 of the Rules of the Supreme Court for regulating appeals and references to the High Court under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, Section 10,

any person who claims to be affected by the decisions to be given in the above-mentioned cases may apply to the Judge for leave to intervene.

The case has been set down in the High Court, and will probably be heard before the Christmas Vacation or early in January. (2) Varied General Minimum Piece-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female Workers employed on Hand Drawing and for Female Drawing Hands on Machine Work.

(3) Fixed General Minimum Piece-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers employed on Pan Work (Setting only) and for certain classes of Female Pan Hands.

And the Trade Board further give notice that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order dated 8th December, 1921, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Minimum Rates as Varied and Fixed by the Trade Board and specifying 2nd January, 1922, as the date from which such Minimum Rates shall become effective.

##### BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

##### PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st Octo-

ber, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, in Great Britain for the branches of trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, hereby give notice, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice M. (30), dated 14th December, 1921, and effective under Orders of the Minister of Labour, dated 29th December, 1919, and 8th December, 1921, in respect of certain classes of Male Workers, the proposed variation being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

## SCHEDULE.

### PART I.

#### *Proposed Variation of General Minimum Time-rates.*

For all Male Workers other than:—

(i) Male Workers of 21 years of age and over who are employed in one or more of the following operations or branches of work, and who have had not less than three years' experience in one or more of the following operations or branches of work, that is to say:—

“Pan” (Hair and Bass), “Hairs,” “Finishing” (i.e., the work of all wood-workers employed in finishing or part-finishing brushes or brooms by hand or machine), “Boring” (Hand Machine Boring), “Drawing,” “Bone Brush Cutting,” “Bone Brush Fashioning,” “Bone Brush Drilling,” “Bone Brush Profil-

ing,” the manufacture of Artists', Medical, Painting, Whitewash, and Tar Brushes, and Brushes not otherwise specified; and

(a) The drafting, dressing (including cutting), or mixing of animal hair, bass, whisk, or other fibre where the operative performs the aforesaid operations singly or in combination by hand or partly by hand and partly by machine.

(b) The working of ivory or celluloid.

(c) The turning of bone.

Where all or any of the operations specified in (a), (b) or (c) are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of brushes (other than feather brushes) or brooms.

(ii) Male Workers of all ages who have served an apprenticeship of not less than five years in one or more of the operations or branches of work specified in Sub-Section (i) of this Section.

(iii) Male Indentured Apprentices who are employed under indentures in a form prescribed by the Trade Board and are working under conditions laid down by the Trade Board.

(iv) Male Indentured Apprentices or unbound learners employed under an Indenture or written agreement respectively entered into prior to 1st January, 1920, and providing for the proper instruction of the apprentice or learner in one or more of the operations or branches of work specified in sub-section (i) of this Section.

(v) Carmen, Engineers, Power-men, Engine-men and Stokers:—

### PART II.

#### *Proposed Variation of Overtime Rates for Certain Classes of Male Workers.*

As respects the classes of workers for whom variation in the General Minimum Time-Rates is proposed in Part I. of this Schedule, Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed minimum rates in the manner set out in Part VI. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice M. (30), dated 14th December, 1921, shall apply in substitution for the proposed General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I. of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to their Notice M. (30) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

### PART III.

The above proposed minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers of the classes specified in this Schedule in respect of

all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Brush and Broom Trade as specified in Part VIII. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice M. (30) dated 14th December, 1921.

The Trade Board will consider any Objections to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 15th December, 1921. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the persons making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4. It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

## MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

This Notice takes the place of the Notice M. (10) issued by the Trade Board and dated 28th May, 1920, and sets out all the minimum rates of wages which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by Order of the Minister of Labour and are effective under the Trade Boards Acts *except* the minimum rates fixed for certain classes of male indentured apprentices and except the general minimum piece-rates fixed by the Trade Board.

The Minimum Rates set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:—

The Minimum Rates marked \* and Overtime Rates based thereon ... As from 2nd January, 1922.  
The Minimum Rates marked † and Overtime Rates based thereon ... As from 28th May, 1920.  
In all other cases ... As from 1st January, 1920.

§ NOTE.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in no case later than 8th January, 1922.

*Note.*—General Minimum Piece-Rates for Female Pan Hands who are employed on piece-work, on work other than that specified in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule are set out in the Trade Board's Notice M (26) dated 14th December, 1921.

## PART V.

*Definitions.*

For the purpose of this Schedule, the following definitions shall apply:—

(a) A FEMALE PAN HAND is a Female Worker of any age who performs the operation of pan-setting with or without the operations of boring and/or trimming.

(b) A FEMALE PAN - SETTING LEARNER is a Female Worker (of any age) who:—

(i) Is employed during the whole of her time in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule under an Agreement for a period of two years in the form prescribed by the Trade Board as set out in Part VII. of this Schedule. Provided that no

worker shall be permitted to serve more than one period of two years as a pan-setting learner at the minimum rates fixed by the Trade Board and in accordance with the conditions laid down by the Trade Board from time to time.

(ii) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made application for such registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that—

(i) The Registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the special rates and under the special conditions for pan-setting learners without registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks; but in the event of the worker being continued thereafter at her employment as a pan-setting learner the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

(c) A FEMALE "LEARNER" (not being a female pan-setting learner) is a Female Worker of 16 years of age or over who enters the Trade for the first time on or after 1st January, 1920, and—

(1) is employed in learning any one of the following branches of the Trade by an employer who provides the worker with reasonable facilities for such learning:—

- (i) Polishing by Hand,
- (ii) Drawing by Hand,
- (iii) Shaving Brush Making,
- (iv) Enamel Brush Making,
- (v) Bone Brush Making,
- (vi) Machine Filling, and

(2) has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certificate or registration of the learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment, in one of the branches of trade described in paragraph (1) of this Section, without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

(d) A "HOME-WORKER" is a Worker who works in his or her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

## PART VI.

### *Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers.*

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade

Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week 48.

On any day (other than Saturday) 9.

On Saturday 5.

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

### SECTION II.—*Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed on Time-Work.*

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker employed on Time Work (so far as is allowed under the Factory and Workshop Acts and the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920) in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade shall be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours' Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) above.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

Provided also that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays the Overtime Rate specified in paragraph (d) above shall not become payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

### SECTION III.—*Overtime Rates for All Male and Female Workers Employed on Piece-Work:—*

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of all hours worked by all Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-Work (so far as is allowed under the Factory and Workshop Acts and the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920) in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be as follows:—

(i) FOR MALE WORKERS, the General Minimum Piece-Rate applicable as fixed by the Trade Board, or, where no General Minimum Piece-Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece-Rate which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker at least the



same amount of money as the General Minimum Time-Rate, with the addition in both cases of One-Quarter of the General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the General Minimum Time-Rate or the General Minimum Time-Rate which would be applicable to the worker if he were employed on Time-Work according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Section II. of this Part of this Schedule if the worker had been employed on Time-Work were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE TIME respectively.

(ii) FOR FEMALE WORKERS, the General Minimum Piece-Rate applicable as fixed by the Trade Board, or where no General Minimum Piece-Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, a Piece-Rate which would yield, in the circumstances of the case to an ordinary worker not less than the appropriate basis rate fixed by the Trade Board with an addition in both cases of One-Quarter of the appropriate Basis Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Basis Rate, or the appropriate Basis Rate according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Section II. of this Part of this Schedule if the worker had been employed on Time-Work were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF, or DOUBLE TIME respectively.

*Note.*—The expression "Basis Rate" means the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or, in cases where no Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed by the Trade Board, the General Minimum Time-Rate which would be applicable to the worker if she were employed on Time-Work.

#### PART VII.

##### *Form of Agreement Prescribed by the Trade Board for Female Pan-Setting Learners.*

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in Section III. of Part II. of this Schedule a female pan-setting learner shall be employed under an agreement in the following form:—

Memorandum of Agreement made this  
day of                      between  
(hereinafter referred to as "the Employers")  
of the one part and                      (here-  
inafter referred to as "the Learner") of the  
other part.

Whereas the Learner is desirous of being trained in the branch of the Brush and Broom Trade known as the operation of "Pan-Setting" and the employers being engaged in the said trade are willing to give her such training.

Now it is hereby mutually agreed as follows:—

1. The Learner will enter and continue in the service of the Employers and they will receive and retain her in their service as a Learner for the period of two years from the date of this Agreement subject nevertheless to the provisions for earlier determination contained in Clause 5 hereof.

2. During the said term of service the Learner will apply herself diligently to learn the said operation and will faithfully serve the Employers and obey their lawful commands and they on their part will cause her to be well and sufficiently instructed in the said operation.

3. The Employers will pay to the Learner wages in accordance with the current rates of wages applicable to female Pan-Setting Learners as fixed from time to time by the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain) subject however to this proviso that if the Learner shall at any time be absent from her duties (whether by reason of sickness or any other cause whatsoever) without the consent of the Employers the Learner shall not be deemed to be employed for the period of such absence and shall not be entitled to any wages for such period. The wages payable to the Learner under this agreement shall be deemed to accrue from hour to hour.

4. Subject to the Provisions of this Agreement the working hours and conditions of the said service shall be those applying to the women operatives at the factory of the Employers for the time being.

5. If the Learner wilfully disobeys any lawful order of the Employers or otherwise wilfully misconducts herself towards the Employers or those in their employment, it shall be lawful for the Employers to discharge the Learner from their service and absolutely determine this Agreement.

6. If either of the parties hereto desires for any reason to determine this Agreement before the expiration of the said period of two years or in the event of any dispute arising involving allegations of unsuitability or of failure to apply herself diligently to learn the said operation on the part of the Learner or of failure on the part of the Employers to cause her to be well and sufficiently instructed in the said operation or of wrongful exercise by the Employers of their power to dismiss the Learner under Clause 5 hereof which cannot be settled between the parties hereto the Employers and the Learner hereby mutually agree that the matters in dispute shall stand referred in the first instance to the Brush and Broom Trade Board (Great Britain) with a view to effecting a settlement thereof.

#### PART VIII.

##### SECTION I.

The respective Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers (including Home-workers) in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, that is to say, the manufacture of brushes (other than feather brushes) or brooms;

INCLUDING the following operations, where all or any of them are carried on in asso-

ciation with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such brushes or brooms:—

(a) The drafting, dressing or mixing of bass, whisk, or similar fibres, or animal bristles or hair, and the working of wood, bone, ivory, or celluloid;

(b) All finishing, warehousing, packing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such brushes or brooms;

But EXCLUDING the following operations:—

The sawing and turning of wood as a preliminary operation to the manufacture of such brushes or brooms, the making of metal parts, and the mounting of brushes with metal or tortoiseshell backs.

Provided that the rates shall not apply to workers employed as Carmen, Engineers, Powermen, Enginemen or Stokers.

Provided also that nothing in this Schedule shall apply to female apprentices or female learners employed under an Indenture or Written Agreement respectively entered into prior to 31st January, 1921, and providing for

the proper instruction of the apprentice or learner in the operation or branch of work known as pan-setting.

## SECTION II.

The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

## SECTION III.

The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

### BRUSH AND BROOM TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

#### GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES, GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES, GUARANTEED TIME-RATES PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE APPRENTICES.

This Notice takes the place of the Notices M. (16) and M. (22) and Part V of the Schedule to the Notice M. (20) issued by the Trade Board and dated 18th October, 1920, 20th June, 1921, and 26th April, 1921, respectively, and sets out all the Minimum Rates of Wages which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by Order of the Minister of Labour for certain classes of Male Indentured Apprentices (as defined in Part III of the Schedule set out below).

The Minimum Rates set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:—

The Minimum Rates marked † and the Overtime	} As from 18th October, 1920.

In all other cases ... ..	As from 2nd January, 1922.*

\* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full-pay period, but in no case later than 8th January, 1922.

## PART I.

### *Minimum Rates for Male Apprentices.*

(As defined in Part III of this Schedule.)

The General Minimum Time Rates, General Minimum Piece-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates, and Piece-work Basis Time-Rates for Male Apprentices as defined in Part III of this Schedule who are employed in the branches of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Brush and Broom) Order, 1919, under the respective conditions set out in this Notice shall be as follows:—

#### SECTION I.—Male Apprentices who are apprenticed to:—

- (a) Any two or more of the following branches of the Trade: (i) Pan work (hair and bass); (ii) Hairs; (iii) Drawing; (iv) Wood Spindling; (v) Sand Papering by Machine; (vi) the Manufacture of Whitewash Brushes; (vii) the Manufacture of Tar Brushes and "Sundries"; (viii) Boring; or
- (b) The Cutting, Sorting and Dressing of Bass by hand when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the Manufacture of Brushes (other than feather brushes) or Brooms; shall receive:—

During the 1st year of their apprenticeship, one-half  
During the 2nd year of their apprenticeship, one half  
During the 3rd year of their apprenticeship, seven-twelfths  
During the 4th year of their apprenticeship, two-thirds  
During the 5th year of their apprenticeship, three-quarters

- (a) The appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in the Trade Board's Notices dated 14th December, 1921; or where no such General Minimum Piece-Rates are applicable to the work on which the Apprentice is engaged; or
- (b) Piece Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than 1s. 4½d. an hour.

Provided that during the first twelve months of apprenticeship the Apprentice shall receive a Guaranteed Time-Rate of not less than 12s.† per week of 48 hours, and during the first six months of employment in a section of the Trade other than that in which the Apprentice commences his apprenticeship, a Guaranteed Time-Rate equal to the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to a worker of his age other than an apprentice, notwithstanding that his earnings on Piece-work are less than such rate.

Provided also that the Minimum Rates set out in this Section shall only apply in cases where a Journeyman Instructor has responsibility for the work of the Apprentice during the first 12 months and supervision of the Apprentice during the remainder of the apprenticeship in the Journeyman's own section of the trade, and where during the first nine months of the Apprentice's employment in any branch of the trade a Journeyman is paid by the employer in respect of the instruction of and responsibility for the Apprentice, a sum each week equivalent to the difference between the earnings of the Apprentice on the above Minimum Piece-Rates and the sum which the Apprentice would have earned if he had been employed at the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in the Trade Board's Notices dated 14th December, 1921, or where no such General Minimum Piece-Rates are applicable at Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than 1s. 4½d. an hour to an Ordinary worker.

(i) Hand Finishing (Common and Toilet), or

**SECTION III.—Male Apprentices who are apprenticed to :—**

Painting, Brush-making and Finishing (to include (a) Sash Tools and (b) other painting brushes) shall receive :—

During the 1st year of their apprenticeship, one-half	of (a) The appropriate General Minimum Piece Rates set out in the Trade Board's Notices dated 14th December, 1921 ; or Where no such General Minimum Piece-Rates are applicable to the work on which the Apprentice is engaged ; of (b) Piece Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than 1s. 4½d. an hour.
During the 2nd year of their apprenticeship, one-half

- (b) During the remainder of the apprenticeship the Apprentice is taught the manufacture of other painting brushes and during ten months (in the aggregate) of this period, the Journeyman is paid by the employer in respect of the instruction and supervision of the Apprentice a sum equivalent to the difference between the piece-work earnings of the Apprentice and the sum which the Apprentice would have earned if he had been employed at the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in the Trade Board's Notices dated 14th December, 1921, or, where no such General Minimum Piece-Rate is applicable, at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than 1s. 4½d. an hour:

(i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by an Apprentice employed on Time-work (so far as is allowed under the Factory and Workshop Acts) in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(c) For all time worked on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE-TIME.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be Time-and-a-Quarter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) above.

Provided that, where it is or may become the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable where on any day the number of hours worked exceeds 9½.

Provided also that, where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate specified in paragraph (d) above shall not become payable in the week in which attendance on Saturdays is required until 50 hours have been worked.

SECTION III.—*Overtime Rates for Male**Apprentices employed on Piece-work :*

The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of each hour worked by a Male Apprentice employed on Piece-work (so far as is allowed under the Factory and Workshop Acts) in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be the piece-rates applicable under Part I of this Schedule (*i.e.*, either the appropriate proportion of the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in the Trade Board's Notices dated 14th December, 1921, or where no such general minimum piece-rates are applicable to the work in question, the appropriate proportion of piece-rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER not less than 1s. 4½d. per hour), with the addition of one-quarter or one-half or the whole of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to a worker other than an Apprentice of the same age, as set out in the Trade Board's Notice M. (30), dated 14th December, 1921, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Section II of this Part, if the worker had been employed on time-work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double Time respectively.

## PART III.

*Definition of Male Apprentice.*

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule, a Male Apprentice is defined as being a Male Worker who:—

(a) Is employed during the whole of his time in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule under an indenture (duly stamped) for a period of five years (except in the case of Apprentices to the branches of bone brush-making specified in Section IV of Part I of this Schedule, in which case the period shall be four years), in the form prescribed by the Trade Board as set out in Part IV of this Schedule.

(b) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that:—

(i) The Registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of apprenticeship are not complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the special rates and under the special conditions for Apprentices without registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks; but in the event of such worker being continued thereafter at his employment as an Apprentice the probation period shall be included in his period of apprenticeship.

(iii) In cases where the number of Journeymen who have been in the service of the employer in the branch or branches of trade to which the Apprentice is bound, throughout the period of 12

months prior to the date of application for Registration has been:—

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule an Apprentice shall be employed under an Indenture of Apprenticeship in the following form:—

2. In consideration of the covenants and agreements entered into by the Guardian and the Apprentice, the Employer hereby covenants with the Guardian and the Apprentice and with each of them severally as follows:—

(a) That he will keep the Apprentice as his Apprentice during the said term and to the best of his power, skill and knowledge instruct the Apprentice or cause him to be instructed in the section or sections of the Brush and Broom Trade known as \_\_\_\_\_

(b) That he will keep the Apprentice under his own supervision or place him under a fully qualified Journeyman (or Journeymen).

(c) That he will pay to the Apprentice every week during the said term wages in accordance with the appropriate scale of wages as fixed and as varied from time to time for Male Apprentices by the Trade Board.

(d) That if the employer shall die or become permanently incapacitated through illness or injury (to be certified by a fully qualified Medical Practitioner) or cease to carry on the said trade of \_\_\_\_\_ before the expiration of the said term of apprenticeship, then, and

in any such case, the Employer or his Executors or his Administrators, as the case may be, shall, subject to the consent and approval of the Guardian and of the said Apprentice being first obtained, find another suitable Employer for the Apprentice to take over this Indenture.

(e) That he will not hold the Apprentice liable to make good the value of any work which he may spoil whilst learning his trade, except in the case of wilful or malicious damage.

(f) That he will cause the Apprentice to attend during the term of this Indenture such approved technical classes as may be agreed by the parties concerned in the Indenture, the Apprentice to suffer no loss of wages by reason of such attendance, or by reason of his attendance at school in accordance with the Education Act, 1918, and the time so spent to be reckoned as an equivalent part of the usual working hours and not extra thereto.

(g) That he will supply the Apprentice forthwith, upon its execution, with a true copy of this Indenture.

3. In consideration of the premises, the Guardian and the Apprentice respectively severally covenant with the Employer as follows:—

(a) That the Apprentice shall truly and faithfully during the said term serve the Employer as his Apprentice and his secrets keep and shall diligently attend to the said trade and at all times willingly obey the lawful and reasonable commands of the Employer, and shall not absent himself from the Employer's service without leave.

(b) That the Apprentice shall not do any damage or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the goods, moneys or other property of the Employer.

(c) That the Apprentice shall willingly perform all such shop duties as are usually done by Apprentices.

(d) That the Apprentice shall attend such continuation classes between the hours of 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. as the Employer desires provided that the Apprentice suffer no loss of wages by reason of such attendance.

(e) That in case the Apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to lawful orders or commands of the said Employer, or be slothful or negligent or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself towards the Employer, then it shall be lawful to discharge the said Apprentice.

#### PART V.

##### General.

SECTION I.—The General Minimum Time-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates set out in this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours and shall be subject to a propor-

tionate adjustment according as the number of hours worked is less than 48.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall be paid direct to the Apprentice by the Employer and not by the Journeyman.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION IV.—Nothing in this Schedule shall apply to Indentured Apprentices or Unbound Learners employed under an indenture or written agreement respectively entered into prior to 1st January, 1920, and providing for the proper instruction of the apprentice or learner in one or more of the following operations or branches of work, that is to say:—

“Pan” (Hair and Bass), “Hairs,” “Finishing” (i.e., the work of all woodworkers employed in finishing or part-finishing brushes or brooms by hand or machine), “Boring” (Hand and Machine Boring), “Drawing,” “Bone Brush Cutting,” “Bone Brush Fashioning,” “Bone Brush Drilling,” “Bone Brush Profiling,” the manufacture of Artists’ Medical, Painting, Whitewash and Tar Brushes, and Brushes not otherwise specified; and

(a) The Drafting, Dressing (including Cutting), or mixing of Animal Hair, Bass, Whisk or other Fibre where the Operative performs the aforesaid operations singly or in combination by hand or partly by hand and partly by machine.

(b) The Working of Ivory or Celluloid.

(c) The Turning of Bone.

Where all or any of the operations specified in (a), (b) or (c) are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of brushes (other than feather brushes) or brooms;

and the Provisions of this Schedule shall not prevent such Apprentices and Unbound Learners receiving their due proportions under their contracts of the Piece-Rates arranged from time to time.

## THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

### COUNTY OF WORCESTER.

(ii) Holt Fleet Bridge over the River Severn, on the Droitwich-Ombersley-Holt-Witley main road, from the Lodge Gates 300 yards south-west of the bridge to its junction with the district road leading to Uphampton 800 yards north-east of the bridge; and

(iii) New Mill Bridge over the River Teme near Shelsley Beauchamp, on the district road to Shelsley Beauchamp, from its junction with the Stanford-Ham Bridge main road to a point on the north-east side of the bridge 200 yards south-

west of Church House Farm, Shelsley Beauchamp.

## ROAD VEHICLES.

THE ROAD VEHICLES (PART YEAR LICENSING) ORDER, 1921, DATED DECEMBER 5, 1921, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF TRANSPORT.

To the County Councils of the several Administrative Counties in Great Britain and in Southern Ireland;

To the Councils of the several County Boroughs in England and Wales and in Southern Ireland and of the Royal Parliamentary and Police Burghs concerned in Scotland;

And to all others whom it may concern.

The Minister of Transport, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by Section 22 of the Finance Act, 1921 (11 & 12 Geo. 5, c. 32), and without prejudice to the further exercise of those powers, hereby orders as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Road Vehicles (Part Year Licensing) Order, 1921.

2. In this Order:

The expression "quarterly period" means any of the periods from the first day of January to the twenty-fourth day of March, from the twenty-fifth day of March to the thirtieth day of June, from the first day of July to the thirtieth day of September, or from the first day of October to the thirty-first day of December in any year.

The expression "cycles" means the vehicles chargeable with duty under paragraph 1 of the Second Schedule to the Finance Act, 1920 (a).

The expression "licences" does not include general licences for manufacturers of or dealers in mechanically-propelled vehicles.

3. The mechanically-propelled vehicles to which this Order applies are mechanically-propelled vehicles chargeable with duty under the Finance Act, 1920, other than trams and vehicles on which a duty of five shillings is chargeable under that Act.

4. The periods of the year for which licences under the Finance Act, 1920, in respect of mechanically-propelled vehicles to which this Order applies may be taken out shall be either the period of one calendar year, or any of such periods less than a year as are hereinafter specified, and the duties payable in respect of licences for periods less than a year shall be at the rates hereinafter specified; that is to say:—

(a) 10-1 G. 5 c. 18.

(a) In the case of such mechanically-propelled vehicles other than cycles—

(i) A licence may be taken out for any period less than a year expiring on the thirty-first day of December in any year, and if the same is taken out on or after any of the dates mentioned in the first column of the First Schedule hereto the duty payable on such licence shall be the proportion of the full annual rate of duty specified in relation to each of such dates respectively in the second column of the said Schedule;

(ii) A licence may be taken out for any quarterly period on payment of three-tenths of the full annual duty; and

(iii) A licence may be taken out for any period less than a quarterly period expiring on the last day of any quarterly period, and the duty payable on such licence shall if the licence is taken out on or after the first day of the second month of the quarterly period be two-thirds of the full quarterly rate of duty or shall if the licence is taken out on or after the first day of the third month of the quarterly period be one-third of the full quarterly rate of duty: provided that for the purposes of the foregoing provision in respect of any quarterly period ending on the thirtieth day of June, the first day of the second month shall be deemed to be the first day of May, and the first day of the third month shall be deemed to be the first day of June;

(b) In the case of cycles a licence may be taken out for any quarterly period on payment of duty of the amounts specified in the second column of the Second Schedule hereto in relation to the cycles described in the first column of the said Schedule respectively.

5.—(1) For the purposes of Section 6 of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920 (b) this Order shall as regards Southern Ireland be deemed to have been made prior to the appointed day.

(2) This Order does not extend to Northern Ireland.

6. This Order shall remain in force until rescinded or modified by the Minister of Transport.
