of the one part, and Arthur Maitland Wilson, Francis William George Gore and Thomas Lewis Kekewich Edge of the other part; (e) an Indenture dated the 25th day of August, 1919, and made between the said George Savile Foljambe of the first part, Edmond Walter Savile Foljambe of the second part, Robert Francis Thornhagh Foljambe of the third part and the said Arthur Maitland Wilson, Francis William George Gore and Thomas Lewis Kekewich Edge of the fourth part (all which Indentures are hereinafter referred to as "the Foljambe Family Settlement"); and (f) of the Settled Land Acts, 1882 to 1890, and in consequence of certain events which have happened the Advowsons or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said two Benefices of the Holy Trinity, Dalton, and Tickhill are vested in the said Arthur Maitland Wilson, of Didmarton, in the County of Gloucester, Esquire, Francis William George Gore, of 18, Norfolk Street, Park Lane, in the County of London, Esquire, and Thomas Lewis Kekewich Edge, of Strelley Hall, in the County of Nottingham, Esquire, (hereinafter referred to as "the Trustees") as the Trustees of the Foljambe Family Settlement for the purposes of the Settled Land Acts, 1882 to 1890, upon Trusts under which the said Edmond Walter Savile Foljambe, of Osberton, in the County of Nottingham, Esquire, is tenant for life in possession thereof free from incunibrances with divers remainders over as in the Foljambe Family Settlement are more particularly set out:

"And whereas the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, and the said Edmond Walter Savile Foljambe and the Trustees have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said three Benefices of Wadworth, the Holy Trinity, Dalton, and Tickhill may be re-arranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recom-

mended and proposed:

"And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative values of the said three Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said three Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

" Now, therefore, with the consent of the said

Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, acting as such Bishop and with the consent of the said Edmond Walter Savile Foljambe as such tenant for life as aforesaid and the Trustees (in testimony whereof to this Scheme the said Bishop has affixed his hand and his Episcopal Seal, and the said Edmond Walter Savile Foljambe and the Trustees have hereunto set their respective hands and seals), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Wadworth and the Church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, and from his successors in the same Bishopric and shall be and remain thereby vested in the Trustees upon and subject to the uses following, that is to say, To the use of the said Edmond Walter Savile Foljambe for and during his life and after his decease to the uses limited by and contained in the Foljambe Family Settlement and may from time to time and at all times in perpetuity be exercised by the said Edmond Walter Savile Foljambe and the persons for the time being entitled under the limitations of the Foljambe Family Settlement and their heirs and assigns and that in exchange for the same the whole Advowsons or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said two Benefices of the Holy Trinity, Dalton, and Tickhill and the Churches thereof shall in like manner and upon and from the same date be assigned and transferred from the said Edmond Walter Savile Foljambe and the Trustees and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Leonard Hedley, Bishop of Sheffield, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any

other Act of Parliament.
