"And whereas the said Benefice of Stanhope is now vacant:

"And whereas an annual payment of £800 is made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Stanhope as part of the income of such Benefice:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said William Robert Wellesley, Viscount Peel, acting on behalf of Your Majesty as such Chancellor of Your Duchy of Lancaster as aforesaid (in testimony of which consent he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the Bishops of the said several Dioceses within which the said Benefice of Stanhope and the said other eight Benefices are respectively situate as aforesaid, that is to say, with the consent of the Right Reverend Herbert Hensley, Bishop of Durham, the Right Reverend John Augustine, Bishop of Lichfield, the Right Reverend Albert Augustus, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, the Right Reverend Frank Theodore, Bishop of Peterborough, the Right Reverend John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford, the Right Reverend George, Bishop of Bristol, the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, (in testimony whereof the said Bishops have respectively signed this Scheme and sealed the same with their Episcopal Seals), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that as from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same, the said annual payment of £800 made by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, to the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice of Stanhope shall cease to be payable and in lieu thereof there shall be paid by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, an annual sum of £300 to the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Stanhope, an annual sum of £100 to the Incumbent for the time being of the said Benefice of Tutbury, an annual sum of £75 to the Incumbent for the time being of each of the said Benefices of Clare and Saint Andrew, Whitwick, and an annual sum of £50 to the Incumbent for the time being of each of the said Benefices of Ashen, Mundon, Ashley, Edingthorpe, and Long Bennington, such annual sums to be as from the day aforesaid due and payable to the Incumbents of the said Benefices of Stanhope; Tutbury; Clare; Saint Andrew, Whitwick; Ashen; Mundon; Ashley; Edingthorpe; and Long Bennington respectively and to be apportionable between any outgoing Incumbent of any of the said Benefices or his representatives on the one hand and his successors in the same Incumbency on the other hand; and to be receivable by the Incumbents in whose favour the same are payable as aforesaid by equal quarterly payments on the first day of February, the first day of May, the first day of August and the first day of November in every year.

"And provided always that the whole of the First Fruits and Tenths now payable to the Governors of Queen Anne's Bounty in respect of the said Benefice of Stanhope shall continue to be payable by the Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the respective Registrars of the said Dioceses of Durham, Lichfield, St. Edmundsbury and Ipswich, Peterborough, Chelmsford, Bristol, Norwich and Lincoln.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as "The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts," duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 17th day of November, 1921, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 5th and 6th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 108, and of the Act of the 21st and 22nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 57, which Acts are known as 'The Ecclesiastical Leasing Acts,' have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme relating to the Benefice of Stainby with Gunby, in the County of Lincoln, and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas the annual value of the said Benefice of Stainby with Gunby has been improved by means of a sale of glebe lands belonging to the said Benefice, which sale was effected by a Deed of Conveyance, dated the 31st December, 1920, under the authority of the said Acts, by the Reverend Wilfrid Lionel de Buckenhuld Thorold, Rector or Incumbent of the said Benefice, with the concurrence of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

"And whereas the proceeds of the said sale have been paid to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and have been invested in accordance with the provisions in that behalf contained in the said Acts and in respect of such investments there is standing in the name of us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, a sum of £70,623 0s. 10d. Local Loans £3 per centum per annum Stock, which said sum of Stock is now held by us in trust to pay the Rector or Incumbent for the time being of the
