BOROUGH OF BEVERLEY.

WATER UNDERTAKINGS (MODIFICATION OF CHARGES) ACT, 1921.

NOTICE is hereby given, that the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough of Beverley (hereinafter called "the Corporation") have made application to the Minister of Health under the above Act for an Order modifying Sections 42, 43 and 48 of the Beverley Waterworks Act, 1881, and the provisions of the Agreement dated the 25th day of May, 1881, made between the Justices of the Peace for the East Riding of the County of York of the one part and James Robinson Pease and Henry Edward Silvester of the other part, confirmed by Section 15 of the above-mentioned Act of 1881, so as to enable them to levy maximum rates and charges for water supply for domestic purposes, for water-closets beyond the first, for baths and for water supplied by measure in the water limits within which they are empowered to supply water, and to increase the rates and sums for water supply to the East Riding Mental Hospital at Beverley, in accordance with the following scale, namely:—

1. For Domestic Purposes.

If the rack rent or (if not let at a rack rent) the annual value of the dwelling-house or of part of a dwelling-house does not amount to seven pounds per annum, the rate of thirteen shillings per annum upon such rack rent or annual value, as the case may be.

If such rack rent or annual value amounts to seven but does not amount to thirty pounds per annum, the rate of ten pounds and ten shillings per centum per annum upon such rack rent or annual value.

If such rack rent or annual value exceeds thirty pounds the rate of nine pounds per centum per annum upon such rack rent or annual value.

The Corporation shall not be compelled to afford a supply of water for domestic purposes to any such owner or occupier for any less sum than twelve shillings in any one year.

2. Water-closets beyond the First and Baths.

For a second water-closet and for any private bath, the following rates:—

When the rack rent, or if not let at a rack rent, the annual rent shall not exceed ten pounds the sum of seven shillings and six pence per annum.

When such rent shall exceed ten pounds, but shall not exceed twenty pounds, the sum of nine shillings per annum.

When such rent shall exceed twenty pounds, but shall not exceed forty pounds, the sum of twelve shillings per annum.

When such rent shall exceed forty pounds, but shall not exceed eighty pounds, the sum of fifteen shillings per annum.

When such rent shall exceed eighty pounds the sum of eighteen shillings per annum.

And for every additional water-closet beyond the second, and for every additional bath beyond the first, the sum of seven shillings and six pence per annum respectively.

3. For Water Supplied by Measure.

If the consumption of water shall not exceed an average for the quarter of four thousand gallons per day one shilling and three pence per one thousand gallons, but not less than seven shillings and six pence per quarter.

If the consumption shall exceed an average for the quarter of four thousand gallons, and not exceed ten thousand gallons per day, one shilling and three-half pence per one thousand gallons, but not less than nineteen pounds and ten shillings per quarter.

If the consumption shall exceed an average for the quarter of ten thousand gallons, and not exceed thirty thousand gallons per day, one shilling per one thousand gallons, but not less than forty-three pounds and ten shillings per quarter.

If the consumption shall exceed an average for the quarter of thirty thousand gallons per day nine pence per one thousand gallons, but not less than one hundred pounds and ten shillings per quarter.

The above scale represents a 50 per cent. increase of the present statutory maximum rates and charges and minimum sums.

4. Water Supply to East Riding Mental Hospital.

An increase of the sum of one hundred pounds per annum payable under Clause 3 of the said Agreement to one hundred and fifty pounds per annum, and an increase in the rate of six pence per one thousand gallons mentioned in Clause 4 of the said Agreement to nine pence per one thousand gallons.

A copy of the application, and of all documents submitted to the Minister in connection therewith, may be inspected, and extracts thereof made, free of charge, at the Town Clerk's Office, 31, Lairgate, Beverley, between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m. Copies of the documents may be purchased from the under-mentioned, at the usual charges made for copying.
