FAVERSHAM WATER COMPANY.

WATER UNDERTAKINGS (MODIFICATION OF CHARGES) ACT, 1921.

Rateable value of £20 but not exceeding £40, 10 per cent. per annum.

Rateable value of £40 but not exceeding £60, 8 $\frac{3}{4}$ per cent. per annum.

Rateable value exceeding £60, 8 per cent. per annum.

Minimum charge in any one year, 11s. 8d. per annum.

Each water-closet beyond the first, 6s. 8d. per annum.

Each bath, capacity not exceeding 50 gallons, 13s. 4d. per annum.

Each bath, capacity exceeding 50 gallons, at discretion.

Water by measure, 2s. per 1,000 gallons.

ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACTS, 1882 TO 1919.

HAYWARDS HEATH ELECTRICITY SPECIAL ORDER, 1921.
