SEEDS ACT, 1920.

General Licence to Sellers of Wheat, Barley, Oats and Rye for Seed in England and Wales.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue of, and in exercise of, the powers vested in him under the Seeds Act, 1920, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby authorises all persons concerned to sell in England and Wales Wheat, Barley, Oats and Rye for seed, on or before the 30th day of April of the year following that in which the seed is harvested, without declaring the particulars required by the Act to the purchaser at or before the time of sale or delivery, provided that such particulars are declared in writing to the purchaser either in an invoice of the seeds, or in some other form, within one calendar month of the sale.

The licence issued by the Minister on the seventh day of September, 1921, with respect to the sale of Wheat, Barley, Oats and Rye for seed is hereby revoked.

IN THE MATTER OF THE FINANCE ACT, 1920, AND THE ROADS ACT, 1920.

Notice is hereby given, under the Rules Publication Act, 1893, that it is proposed by the Minister of Transport after the expiration of at least forty days from this date, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon him by the Finance Act, 1920, and the Roads Act, 1920, and the Motor Car International Circulation (Amendment) Order, 1921, and of every other power enabling him in that behalf, to issue Regulations providing for the total or partial exemption for a limited period from the duty payable under Section 13 of the Finance Act, 1920, of vehicles brought into the United Kingdom by persons making only a temporary stay in the United Kingdom, and for making provision for the registration and identification of such vehicles, and for the issue of licences to drive such vehicles.

And notice is hereby further given, that on account of urgency the Minister of Transport has under Section 2 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, made Regulations, to come into operation forthwith as Provisional Regulations, to continue in force until Regulations have been made in accordance with the provisions of Section 1 of that Act.
