The following Statutes made by the Governing Body of Balliol College, Oxford, on the 23rd April, 1920, the 25th May, 1921, and the 21st June, 1921, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877":—

STATUTE to alter and amend the Statutes framed by the Commissioners appointed under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877" (40 and 41 Vict. c. 48), and approved by Her late Majesty in Council on the Third day of May, One thousand eight hundred and eighty-two, in relation to Balliol College in the University of Oxford as amended by a Statute approved by His Majesty in Council on the Tenth day of August, One thousand nine hundred and twenty-one.

In the Matter of a Statute concerning "The Fellows" such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose, held on the twenty-third day of April, One thousand nine hundred and twenty, and passed by the unanimous vote of those present.

1. In Statute III 16 (d) for "provided that . . . within the College walls" substitute "provided that at least four persons engaged in the Educational work of the College exclusive of the Master shall reside within the College walls."

2. In Statute III 16 (e) for "so long as there are four persons during the usual College terms" substitute "so long as there are four persons exclusive of the Master engaged in the Educational work of the College and resident within the College walls during the usual College terms."

After Statute III, Clause 23 (a) ii, the following new Clause shall be added:—

- (1) Any person who in the opinion of the Master and Fellows is likely to do valuable research work in some branch of letters or science and who shall undertake to carry out some definite literary or scientific work in Oxford or (under the direction of the College) elsewhere; which work shall be specified in the resolution by which he is elected. He may also be required to undertake some educational work in this College or in the University.
- (2) In Statute III, 23 (b), for "they may . . . appears to them reasonable" substitute "they may attach to the Fellowship a stipend not exceeding in the first case £50 a year, and in the second and third cases £200 a year, either subject or not to the performance of duties as appears to them reasonable."

- In the Matter of Statutes concerning "The Master," "the Fellows" and the "Disposal of Revenue" and Schedule "C" to the said Statutes such amending Statute being duly made at a General Meeting of the Governing Body of the said College specially summoned for this purpose held on the 21st day of June, 1921, and passed by the unanimous vote of those present.
- 1. After Statute II. 5 (c) insert the following new clause:—(d) If the Master shall have been a Tutorial Fellow or a Fellow and Lecturer of the College for not less than twenty years previous to his election as Master and shall resign the Mastership without having fulfilled the conditions of eligibility to a Pension laid down in the preceding Clause, but having received the consent of the Master and Fellows to his retirement, and also the consent of the Visitor of the College; he shall be entitled to all benefits under Statute III. 18

- as he would have been entitled to if he had not been elected Master but had continued to hold his Tutorial Fellowship or his Fellowship and Lectureship until the date of his retirement; and any Pension payable to him under this Clause shall be charged upon the Pension Fund in the manner provided in Statute III. 18 (g) and not made up in the manner described in Schedule C, Clause 1.
- 2. Re-number Statute II. 5 (d), (e), (f) as II. 5 (e), (f), (g).
- 3. In Statute III. Clause 18 (b) the words and figures "one thirtieth" and "£500" shall stand substituted for the words and figures "one fortieth" and "£400."
- 4. The following sub-clause shall stand substituted for sub-clause (g) of Clause 18 of Statute III.
 - "Pensions shall be payable only out of the monies for the time being applicable therefor under the statutes for the time being in force."
- 5. The following clause shall stand added as Clause 13 of Statute VII.
 - "Where under the provisions of the Statutes a stipend is payable free of income tax, the Master and Fellows may determine what sum is to be allowed in respect of such income tax. Any sum so allowed shall be deemed to be part of the stipend."
- 6. The following Schedule shall stand substituted for Schedule C referred to in Statute III. 19.

SCHEDULE C. PENSION FUND.

- 1. The pension not exceeding £500 granted to a Master retiring under Statute II. 8 shall be made up:—
 - (a) First by an annual deduction of £200 from the emoluments of the Master for the time being but so that such emolument is not in any year reduced below £1,000.

(b) As to the balance out of the revenues of the College.

The pension not exceeding £500 granted to a Master retiring under Statute II. 5 (c) shall be made up:—

- (a) First by such annual deduction as aforesaid.
- (b) As to the balance out of the monies applicable towards the payment of pensions as hereinafter provided.
- 2. There shall be a Pension Fund, the capital whereof shall consist of:—
 - (a) The investments and monies constituting the existing Pension Fund.
 - (b) Such part of the proceeds of sale of any advowson sold by the College as the Master and Fellows may determine.
 - (c) The unapplied income resulting from those investments, monies and proceeds of sale and the accumulations thereof.
- 3. There shall be applicable towards the payment of pensions payable in any year:—
 - (a) The income of the capital of the Pension Fund accruing in that year; and
 - (b) If that income is not sufficient for the payment of the pensions in full such sum to

be contributed by the College out of its general revenues as may be required to meet the deficiency, but so that the College shall not be bound to contribute more than £1,000 in any year.

Provided that if in any year the monies aforesaid are not sufficient for the payment of pensions in full the Master and Fellows may if they think fit by sale of a competent part of the capital of the Pensions Fund raise the requisite monies and apply the same in payment of pensions but so that no sale shall be made which would result in the capital of the Pension Fund being reduced to less than £35,000 taken at its then value.

- 4. Except as herein provided no part of the capital of the Pension Fund shall be applicable for the payment of a pension.
- 5. Where the monies available under Clause 3 of this Schedule for the payment of the pensions payable in any year are insufficient for the purpose, the pensions for that year shall abate rateably.
- 6. Monies requiring investment shall be invested in any manner authorised for the investment of cash under the control of the Court and not otherwise.
- 7. In this Schedule pension includes the balance of any pension payable to a Master under the provisions of Clause 2 (b) hereof.
- 8. Copies of the Statutes hereafter to be printed shall be printed with the substitutions hereby made incorporated therein.

REFERENCES TO THE HIGH COURT OF JUSTICE UNDER SECTION 10 (1).

Pursuant to paragraph 6 of the Unemployment Insurance (Determination of Questions) Regulations, 1920, the Minister of Labour hereby gives notice of his intention to refer to the High Court for decision the following question that has arisen in applications made to him for his decision under Section 10 of the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, namely, whether the employment of a person as a—

Daily maid at a Private Nursing Home, who does general domestic work and cleans patients' bedrooms, but does not herself reside at the said Nursing Home

is or is not employment within the meaning of the Act of 1920.

Under Rules 5 and 18 of the Rules of the Supreme Court for regulating appeals and references to the High Court under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, Section 10, any person who claims to be affected by the decisions to be given in the above-mentioned cases may apply to the Judge for leave to intervene.

Provided that workers who commence employment in the trade at or over the age of 19 shall receive for a period of 12 months a General Minimum Time-Rate of 28s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 7d. per hour. Provided also that this General Minimum Time-Rate shall be increased by 5s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., $1\frac{1}{4}$ d. per hour, in the case of any such worker who is 22 years of age or over. Workers to whom this proviso applies shall, on the expiration of 12 months' employment in the trade, receive such General Minimum Time-Rates as they may be entitled to under the provisions of this Part of this Schedule.

SECTION VII.—The weekly rates, set out in Section VI of this Part of this Schedule are based on a week of 48 hours and are subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

Section VIII. In cases where a worker is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary worker an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies this condition, regard shall not be had to the earnings of workers under 22 years of age.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE WORKERS.

Overtime rates, calculated on the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Part I. of this Schedule, in the manner specified in Part II of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice R.M. (12), dated 26th September, 1921, shall apply, in substitution for the rates set out in Part I. of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Irade Board in Part II of the Schedule to the said Notice R.M. (12), to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

- (a) A MEASURE CUTTER is a person who is employed in any process of Measure Cutting, and is capable of taking a complete set of measures, and of cutting any garment for a Male Person from model patterns, and has sufficient technical knowledge to draft men's trousers and alter the balance and distribution of widths, lengths, etc., for any garment for a Male Person (excluding alterations to stock patterns).
- (b) A CUTTER (other than a Measure Cutter or Knife Cutter or Knifeman) is a person who is employed in:—
 - (i) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings or other materials;
 - (ii) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings or other materials;
 - (iii) Cutting cloth or linings or other materials; and
 - (iv) Dividing; that is, the process ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their assistants of dividing, parting or separating the parts of garments after being cut and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making-up.
- (c) A KNIFE CUTTER or KNIFEMAN is a person who is wholly or mainly employed on Band, Electric or Hand Knife processes.
- (d) A FITTER-UP is a person who is employed in Fitting-up; that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, baisting or machining, which consists of preparing or fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being baisted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing or fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances, sewing, baisting or machining, forming no part or process of fitting-up.
- (e) A TAILOR is a person who is employed in Sewing by hand in the process of making a garment or portion of garment.

- (f) A PRESSER is a person who is employed in Pressing-off by hand or by machine.
- (g) A MACHINIST is a person who is employed in Machining other than as a Plain Machinist as defined in Sub-Section (j) of this Section and is capable of machining any garment throughout.
- (h) A PASSER is a person who is employed in examining Garments, either in the processes of being made-up or upon their completion.
- (i) AN UNDER-PRESSER is a person who is employed in pressing processes other than Pressing-off.
- (j) A PLAIN MACHINIST is a person who is employed in the process of making-up Plain Sleeves, Facings, Linings, Inside Pockets, Quilting and Padding.
- (k) A WAREHOUSEMAN is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., the assembling, keeping, storing and distributing of stock, but EXCLUDING such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Porter.
- (1) A PACKER is a person employed wholly or mainly upon the operation of packing goods and materials but EXCLUDING such operations included in the definitions of a Porter or Warehouseman.
- (m) A Porter is a person employed whelly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., unpacking, moving, loading or unloading of goods or materials, but EXCLUDING such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Warehouseman.

SECTION II.—The expression "London District" means the Metropolitan and City of London Police Districts.

SECTION III.—The expression "Heavy Cotton Clothing" means articles of clothing for Male Persons made wholly or mainly of cords, moles or other fustians, jeans, drills or other similar cotton material, but excluding gabardine raincoats.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts. to all MALE WORKERS in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour dated 15th January, 1920, and set out in Part IV of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.M. (12) dated 26th September, 1921.

NOTE.—The employment of young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any objections to the above proposal to vary which may be lodged with them within two months from

the 5th day of January, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, and the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920, for the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade in Great Britain, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, and dated 20th November, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918 (the Minister of Labour having given his consent to such Notice being given), that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Workers at present fixed and set out in the Schedule to their Notice W.M. Provided that a worker who commences employment in the trade at or over the age of 19 shall receive, until the completion of 12 months' employment, a General Minimum Time-Rate of 28s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 7d. per hour. Provided also that this General Minimum Time-Rate shall be

increased by 5s. per week of 48 hours, i.e., 1½d. per hour, in the case of any such worker who is 22 years of age or over. A worker to whom this proviso applies shall for the purpose of determining whether he has completed twelve months' employment be entitled to include all previous employment in the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke section of the Tailoring Trade coming within the scope of the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain). On the expiration of 12 months' employment he shall receive such General Minimum Time-Rates as he may be entitled to under the provisions of this Part of this Schedule.

SECTION II.—For the purpose of determining whether a worker has completed the required period of employment or experience in the processes or occupations specified in the appropriate sub-section of Section I. above he shall be entitled to include all previous employment or experience in the respective processes or occupations in (a) the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade as defined in Section II. of Part IV. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice W.M. (11), dated 26th September, 1921, and/or (b) the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade coming within the scope of the Ready-made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain).

SECTION III.—In cases where a worker is employed on piece work, each piece-rate raid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker an amount not less than the Piece-work Basis Time-Rate applicable as set out in Section I. above. Provided that in determining as to whether any piece-rate satisfies this condition, regard shall not be had to the earnings of workers under 22 years of ag.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

Overtime Rates calculated on the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Part I of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part II of the Schedule to the above mentioned Notice W.M. (11), dated 26th September, 1921, shall apply in substitution for the rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Part II of the Schedule to the said Notice W.M. (11) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

For the purpose of this Schedule the following definitions shall apply:—

- (a) A Measure Cutter is a person who is capable of taking a complete set of measures and of cutting any garment for a female person from model patterns and sketches.
- (b) A Cutter (other than a Measure Cutter or Knife Cutter or Knifeman) is a person who is employed in—

(i.) Marking-in or marking-up cloth or linings or other materials;

(ii.) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings or other materials;

(iii.) Cutting Cloth or linings or other materials; and

(iv.) Dividing; that is, the process ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their assistants of dividing, parting or separating the parts of garments after being cut and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making-up.

(c) A Knife Cutter or Knifeman is a person who is wholly or mainly employed on Band, Electric or Hand Knife processes.

(d) A Fitter Up is a person who is employed in Fitting-up; that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, baisting or machining, which consists of preparing or fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being baisted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing or fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances, sewing, baisting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.

- (e) A Tailor is a person who is employed in Sewing by hand in the process of making a garment or portion of garment.
- (f) A Presser is a person who is employed in Pressing-off by hand or by machine.
- (g) A Machinist is a person who is employed in Machining other than as a Plain Machinist as defined in Sub-section (j) of this Section and is capable of machining any garment throughout.
- (h) A Passer is a person who is employed in examining Garments, either in the processes of being made-up or upon their completion.
- (i) An Under Presser is a person who is employed in pressing processes other than Pressing-off.
- (j) A Plain Machinist is a person who is employed in the process of making-up Plain Sleeves, Facings, Linings, Inside Pockets, Quilting and Padding.
- (k) A. Warehouseman is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., the assembling, keeping, storing and distributing of stock, but EXCLUDING such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Porter.
- (l) A Packer is a person employed wholly or mainly upon the operation of packing goods and materials, but EXCLUDING such operations included in the definitions of a Porter or Warehouseman.
- (m) A Porter is a person employed wholly or mainly upon one or more of the following operations, viz., unpacking, moving, loading or unloading of goods or materials, but EXCLUDING such operations included in the definitions of a Packer or Warehouseman.

PART IV.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 20th November, 1919, and set out in Part IV of the Schedule to the above mentioned Notice W.M. (11), dated 26th September, 1921.

Note.—The employment of young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJEC-TIONS to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 5th day of January, 1922. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

(b) Laying-up, hooking-up or folding cloth or linings, or other materials.

(c) Cutting cloth or linings, or other materials.

(d) Trimming, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on of cutting and B 2

assembling together the linings and fittings of garments.

(e) Dividing, that is, the process as ordinarily carried on by Cutters or their Assistants, of dividing, parting or separating the parts of garments after being cut, and of assembling them into suitable bundles for making up.

(f) Fitting-up, that is, a process between that of cutting and that of sewing, basting, or machining, which consists of preparing and fitting accurately the various parts of the garment before being basted, sewn or machined, such work of preparing and fitting being always done by shears or knives or other cutting appliances; sewing, basting or machining forming no part or process of fitting-up.

SECTION II.—A FEMALE LEARNER is a worker who:—

- (a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and
- (b) Has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under

consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learner-

ship are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment, in the branch or branches of the trade specified in Part V of the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice W.M. (12), dated 26th September, 1921, without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section a person shall not be deemed to be a learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.
