

be contributed by the College out of its general revenues as may be required to meet the deficiency, but so that the College shall not be bound to contribute more than £1,000 in any year.

Provided that if in any year the monies aforesaid are not sufficient for the payment of pensions in full the Master and Fellows may if they think fit by sale of a competent part of the capital of the Pensions Fund raise the requisite monies and apply the same in payment of pensions, but so that no sale shall be made which would result in the capital of the Pension Fund being reduced to less than £35,000 taken at its then value.

4. Except as herein provided no part of the capital of the Pension Fund shall be applicable for the payment of a pension.

5. Where the monies available under Clause 3 of this Schedule for the payment of the pensions payable in any year are insufficient for the purpose, the pensions for that year shall abate rateably.

6. Monies requiring investment shall be invested in any manner authorised for the investment of cash under the control of the Court and not otherwise.

7. In this Schedule pension includes the balance of any pension payable to a Master under the provisions of Clause 2 (b) hereof.

8. Copies of the Statutes hereafter to be printed shall be printed with the substitutions hereby made incorporated therein.

Whereas by an Act passed in a Session of Parliament holden in the third year of the reign of His late Majesty King Edward the Seventh, intituled "An Act to reorganise the Administration of the Patriotic Fund," the Patriotic Fund Commission constituted by Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, by Warrant under the Royal Sign Manual, dated the seventh day of October, one thousand eight hundred and fifty-four, was dissolved, and the property, rights, duties and liabilities thereof, and all property held in trust therefor, were transferred to and vested in the Royal Patriotic Fund Corporation established in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act:
