SCHEDULE.

PART I.

General Minimum Time-Rates.

SECTION I.—(a) Male Workers:—

Workers of 15 years and under 16 years of age, 20s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 years and under 17 years of age, 24s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 years and under 18 years of age, 30s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 18 years and under 19 years of age, 34s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 19 years and under 20 years of age, 40s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 20 years and under 21 years of age, 47s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 58s. per week of 48 hours.

(b) Female Workers:—

Workers of 15 years and under 16 years of age, 17s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 16 years and under 17 years of age, 20s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 years and under 18 years of age, 25s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 31s. per week of 48 hours.

Provided that a Male or Female Worker who enters the trade for the first time under the age of 18 years in the case of a Female Worker and under the age of 21 years in the case of a Male Worker and is employed on Time-Work shall until the expiry of two months' employment in the trade be paid at the rate of not less than three-quarters of the General Minimum Time-Rate which would otherwise be applicable according to his or her age under Sub-Sections (a) and (b) of this Section.

SECTION II.—The above General Minimum Time-Rates are Weekly Rates based on a week of 48 hours and shall be subject to a proportionate deduction according as the number of hours spent by the worker in the factory or workshop under contract of employment in any week is less than 48.

PART II.

PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES.

SECTION I.—ALL MALE WORKERS, 1s. 6½d. per hour.

SECTION II.—ALL FEMALE WORKERS, 10d. per hour.

In the case of all Workers employed on Piece-Work each Piece-Rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate to an Ordinary Worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES—MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS—(all ages).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the TRADE BOARD HEREBY DECLARE THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE TO BE as follows:—

In any week	48
On Saturday	4½

Provided that any other day not being Sunday, may, by agreement in writing between an employer and a worker, be substituted in the place of Saturday, as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours on such substituted day shall be 4½.

Provided also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Statutory Bank

Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime for all Male and Female Workers, whether employed on Time-Work or on Piece-Work in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade declared by the Trade Board in Section I of this Part of this Notice shall be as follows, that is to say:—

(1) For all time worked on Sundays and Statutory Bank Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to DOUBLE-TIME, that is to say, twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable.

(2) For all time worked in excess of 4½ hours on a Saturday (or on the weekly short day substituted therefor under the terms of the first Proviso to Section I of this Part of this Notice) the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to TIME-AND-A-HALF, that is to say, one-and-a-half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week may not exceed 48.

(3) For all time worked in excess of 48 hours in any week the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to TIME-AND-A-QUARTER for the first two hours and TIME-AND-A-HALF thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Section.

PART IV.

Applicability of Rates.

The above minimum rates of wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts; to all workers in England and Wales who are employed during the whole or any part of their time in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Aerated Waters) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The manufacture, wherever carried on, of mineral or aerated waters, non-alcoholic cordials, flavoured syrups, unfermented sweet drinks and other similar beverages, and the manufacture in unlicensed premises of brewed liquors,

Including:

(a) the operations of bottle-washing, bottling and filling and all other operations preparatory to the sale of any of the aforesaid liquors in bottles, jars, syphons, casks or other similar receptacles;

and *Including* also:

(b) the operations of bottle-washing, bottling and filling, and all subsidiary operations preparatory to the sale in bottles, jars or other similar receptacles of cider, ale, stout, porter and other alcoholic beers, where all or any of such last-mentioned operations are, or is, conducted or carried on in association with or in conjunction with all or any of the operations specified under (a) above so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for workers, and whether the two sets of operations or any of them are, or is, carried on simultaneously or not.

NOTE.—The employment of female workers, young persons and children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are to be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

(B.) Female Workers under 15 years of age, 10s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 2½d. per hour.

Female Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 12s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 3d. per hour.

Female Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 16s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 4d. per hour.

Female Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 21s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 5½d. per hour.

Female Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 27s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6¾d. per hour.

Female Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 27s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 6¾d. per hour.

Female Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 28s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 7d. per hour.

Female Workers of 21 years of age and over, 30s. per week of 48 hours, *i.e.*, 7½d. per hour.

Provided that a Male or Female Worker who enters the trade for the first time at the age of 16 years or over, whose employment is not of a casual, seasonal or temporary nature, and who cannot be suitably employed on piecework, shall, until the expiry of two months' employment in the trade, be paid at a rate not less than three-quarters of the General Minimum Time-Rate which would otherwise be applicable under section I (A), or I (B) above, according to his or her age.

SECTION II.—The General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Section I of this part of this Notice for Workers under 21 years of age shall be payable subject to the proviso that such workers are employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, offer a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate of 1s. 2d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and of 7½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers. Otherwise the General Minimum Time-Rate payable to workers under 21 years of age shall be 1s. 2d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 7½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers, irrespective of age.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Section, this provision shall not operate in the case of workers whose employment is of a casual, seasonal or temporary nature.

PART II.

Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers Employed on Time-Work.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the Trade to be as follows:—

On any Day other than Saturday	9
On Saturday	5
Provided that all hours worked on Sundays	

and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker employed on Time-Work in any branch of the Trade specified in Part III of this Schedule in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK:—

(1) For the **FIRST TWO HOURS' OVERTIME** on any day except Saturday, Sunday or Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, **TIME-AND-A-QUARTER**.

(2) For **OVERTIME AFTER THE FIRST TWO HOURS OF OVERTIME** on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for **ALL OVERTIME ON SATURDAY**, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, **TIME-AND-A-HALF**.

(3) For all time worked on **SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS**, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, **DOUBLE TIME**.

(4) For **ALL HOURS WORKED IN ANY WEEK IN EXCESS** of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Section.

Provided that—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an Employer only to require attendance on 5 days a week, the Overtime Rate shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(b) Where a Worker (*e.g.*, a Worker of the Jewish Religion) is customarily employed on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out above shall apply to such Worker in like manner as if in the provisions of this part of this Notice as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART III.

Applicability of Rates.

The above Minimum Rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers (including Homeworkers) in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Toy) Order, 1920; that is to say, the manufacture of articles intended for the amusement of children, including dolls, metal,

wooden or other hard toys, soft toys, books made from textile materials, requisites for table games, bricks, blocks, puzzles, balls, Christmas crackers, Easter eggs, masks or drums.

Including also—

(a) The assembling of parts of any of the above-mentioned articles.

(b) The operations of storing, boxing, packeting, labelling, or despatching, and all other warehousing or packing operations incidental to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles,

But excluding—

(a) The manufacture of toys when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of other articles, so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers.

(b) The manufacture of sports requisites.

(c) The manufacture of toy perambulators, toy wheelbarrows, toy scooters, nursery yachts, toy cycles, toy cars, toy horses, dolls' houses, or other similar toys when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of perambulators, invalid carriages, or folding push cars, so as to form a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers.

(d) The manufacture from ceramic materials of dolls or dolls' parts, dolls' china, marbles or similar articles when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of other pottery.

(e) The making of articles from sugar confectionery.

(f) The making of hollow-ware, including boxes and canisters, from sheet iron, sheet steel or tinplate, or any operations incidental thereto.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be payable clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Health Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.
