TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office at the Bank of England on Friday, the 20th January, 1922, at 1 o'clock, for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914 to 1919, to the amount of £50,000,000.
- 2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any date from Monday, the 23rd January, to Saturday, the 28th January, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.
- 3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.
- 4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for

- the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
- 5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.
- 6. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than two o'clock (Saturday twelve o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills are dated.
- 7. In virtue of the provisions of Section 26 of the Finance Act, 1915, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.
- 8. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

ORDER OF THE BOARD OF TRADE, DATED JANUARY 9TH, 1922, UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5, C. 28), PRESCRIBING THE RATE OF CONTRIBUTION TO THE GAS FUND FOR THE YEAR 1922.

In pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 7 of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, the Board of Trade hereby prescribe that—

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the above Act for the Trade of Hand-Hammered and Dollied or Tommied Chain-making, having given due notice on 13th October, 1921, of Proposal to Vary as therein shown the General Minimum Time-Rates and General Minimum Piece-Rates for Hand-Hammered Chain-making set out in the Notice issued by the Trade Board, dated 1st October, 1920, have given notice that they have varied such General Minimum Time-Rates and General Minimum Piece-Rates, and that they have received notification from the Minister of Labour that he has made an Order, dated 4th January, 1922, under Section 4 (2) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, confirming the Variation made by the Trade Board and specifying 11th January, 1922, as the date from which such variation shall become effective.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS FIXED AND AS VARIED) FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

The Schedule to this Notice sets out all the General Minimum Time-Rates, Guaranteed Time-Rates and Overtime Rates (except the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male Indentured Apprentices), which have been Fixed and Varied by the Trade Board and Confirmed by Orders of the Minister of Labour specifying that the said rates shall become effective as follows:-

The General Minimum Time-Rates marked * and the Overtime Rates based

thereon, as from 12th April, 1920.
The General Minimum Time-Rates and Guaranteed Time-Rates marked † and the Overtime Rates based thereon, as from 15th May, 1920.

The Minimum Time-Rates General marked ‡ and the Overtime Rates based thereon, as from 6th September, 1920.

In all other cases, as from 16th January, 1922.§

§ Note.—Should this date, however, not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 22nd January, 1922.

Workers of 18 years and under 19 years of age, 32s. per week of 48 hours.

Workers of 17 years and under 18 years of age, 27s. per week of 48 hours

Workers of 16 years and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week of 48 hours.

SECTION III.—MALE SURGICAL BOOT-MAKERS as defined in Section II of Part IV of this Schedule, 2s. per hour.

A Foreman or Manager employed on Piece-Work shall be entitled to be paid not less than the Guaranteed Time-Rate notwithstanding that his earnings on Piece-Work are less than such sum.

Section I —In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and all hours worked on Saturdays (subject to the provisions set out below) shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the overtime rates shall apply.

The above-mentioned provision shall not prejudice a worker's claim to a Saturday halfholiday where it is now given.

Section II.—The minimum rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker (other than a worker employed on Piece-Work on work for which General Minimum Piece-Rates have been fixed by the Trade Board) in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

- 1. On any day other than Saturdays, Sundays, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays:—
 - (a) For the first two hours' overtame, one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-OHARTER.
 - (b) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime rates set out in paragraphs 1 (a) and (b) of this Section shall not be payable on any day except Friday, Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays until the number of hours worked exceeds 9½ and 11½ respectively, and shall not be payable on Friday until the number of hours worked exceeds 10 and 12 respectively. In the application of this proviso, one other day in each week, not being Saturday or Sunday, may be by agreement between the employer and the worker, substituted for Friday.

- 2. On Saturday in respect of-
- (a) That class of worker who customarily attends on five days a week:
 - (i) For the first two hours of Overtime (that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday) one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.
 - (ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, s.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.
- (b) That class of worker who customarily attends on six days a week:

For the first two hours' Overtime worked after the first four hours of work on Saturday one-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME AND-A-QUARTER; and for all subsequent Overtime, one-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

Note.—During the first four hours worked on Saturday the minimum rate applicable for this class of worker is the appropriate minimum rate set out in Parts 1 or II of the Schedule to this Notice.

3. On Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, for all time worked, twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE TIME.

Section III.—Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule, in the application of the above Overtme Rates to Workers who customarily attend on six days a week, any other day, not being Sunday, may be by agreement in writing between an employer and a worker substituted in place of Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the provisions of Sections I and II above shall apply in like manner as if in such provisions "Saturday" were substituted for such short day, and such short day were substituted for "Saturday."

Note.—The Overtime Rates set out in Paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of Section II are payable in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

SECTION I.—For the purposes of this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

A Male Learner (not being a Male Indentured Apprentice) is a worker who—

- (a) during the whole or a substantial part of his time is employed in learning various branches of the trade, of which benching and finishing (either in the repairing of boots, shoes, slippers and all kinds of leather footwear or the making of bespoke hand-sewn, riveted or pegged leather footwear) must form a part, by an employer who provides the Learner with adequate facilities for such learning, and
- (b) is registered with or has been granted a certificate by the Trade Board in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board or has made an application for such registration or certificate, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of the Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of Learnership are not complied with:

Provided that an employer may employ a Learner at his first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks; but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at his employment, the probation period shall be included in his period of learnership:

Provided also that-

in cases where the number of Journeymen employed in the workshop in which the Learner is employed throughout the period of 12 months prior to the date of application for registration is:—

> three or less, four to six, seven to nine,

the registration and employment of Male Workers as Learners at the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Part I of this Schedule for Learners, shall be limited to:—

one, two, three,

and thereafter not more than one additional Learner may be employed for every additional three or fewer than three Journeymen.

For the purpose of determining the proportion of Learners to Journeymen in accordance with the foregoing provision, an Apprentice shall count as a "Learner" notwithstanding that such Apprentice does not come within the scope of the Minimum Rates set out in this Notice.

Section II.—A "Surgical Bootmaker" is a worker who is capable of carrying throughout any job in Surgical Bootmaking (that is to say, the making or repairing of a boot or shoe or of a pair of boots or shoes where one is or both are for a foot or feet very malformed or abnormal in shape either from birth or as the result of any subsequent injury or disease) and is wholly or mainly engaged in surgical bootmaking.

A worker who is temporarily engaged in surgical bootmaking, as defined above, but who is not wholly or mainly so engaged shall be deemed to be a surgical bootmaker within the definition during such time as he or she is so temporarily engaged.

SECTION III.—A. "Foreman" shall be deemed to be a Male Person who is employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919; and

- (a) who exercises sole supervising authority over all journeymen, exceeding three in number (exclusive of the Foreman), working in the same shop or department; or
- (b) who continuously exercises supervising authority and is held responsible for the output and the general conduct of the workshop, even although the total number of journeymen employed does not exceed three.

and a "Manager" shall be deemed to be:-

A Male Person who is employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919, and who, whatever the number of persons employed, has financial responsibility for the management of a shop or for dealing with customers.

PART V.

SECTION I.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Shoe Repairing) Order, 1919,

namely: —

"the Boot and Shoe Repairing Trade, that is to say, the repairing wherever carried on of boots, shoes, slippers and all kinds of leather footwear including the making of bespoke handsewn, riveted or pegged leather footwear, but excluding the manufacture of leather footwear on a large scale, the repairing of saddlery and leather goods other than leather footwear and the retailing of leather footwear."

Provided that, notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule shall not apply to Male Indentured Apprentices as specified in Section I of Part I of the Schedule to the Notice D (13) issued by the Trade Board and dated 21st September, 1921.

PART VI.

Section I.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages.
