*Navy.*—Officers, R.N., R.N.R. and R.N.V.R., in possession of Full Dress Uniform—No. 1 Dress (Full Dress).

Officers, R.N., R.N.R. and R.N.V.R., not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—No. 3 Dress (Frock Coat with Epaulettes).

*Army.*—Officers in possession of Full Dress Uniform of their rank—Levée Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform of their rank—Service Dress.

*Air Force.*—Officers in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Full Dress.

Officers not in possession of Full Dress Uniform—Service Dress.

The following are the Regulations to be observed:—

1. Gentlemen who have been presented and who wish to attend a Levée should make a written application, as detailed below.

2. No applications can be received from gentlemen wishing to be presented. Their names must be forwarded by the gentleman making the presentation.

3. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Royal Navy and the Royal Marines, of whatever rank, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the First Lord of the Admiralty. All Civil Officers of the Admiralty will follow the same rule.

4. All Officers, whether on the active or retired lists of the Army, except those on the Indian and Colonial Establishments, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Secretary, War Office; but Officers of the Household Cavalry or the Brigade of Guards should communicate with the Comptroller, Ceremonial Department, St. James's Palace.

5. All Officers of the Royal Air Force, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards through the usual channels.

6. All Officers of the Indian Civil Service and of the Indian Army, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State, at the India Office, Whitehall.

7. All Officers of the Colonial Service and Colonial Forces, of whatever rank, whether on the active or retired lists, will communicate with and obtain their cards from the Colonial Office, Whitehall, with the exception of Officers of the local Forces of the self-governing Dominions, who will apply to the Secretary, War Office, for their cards for attendance or for presentation, supporting their applications in all cases by a credential from the Governor-General, Governor, Officer commanding the local Forces, or the representative in London of the Dominion concerned.

8. Lords Mayor and Mayors, High Sheriffs, Sheriffs, Recorders, Chairmen of Quarter Sessions, Metropolitan Police Magistrates and other Stipendiary Magistrates, and all gentlemen connected with the Home Office, will make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Secretary of State for the Home Department.

9. Chairmen of County Councils, and all gentlemen connected with the Ministry of Health, will make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Minister of Health.

10. Judges, Law Officers, King's Counsel, and all Legal Officials holding appointments under the Crown, other than those mentioned, will make their applications through the Private Secretary to the Lord Chancellor.

11. Similarly, all gentlemen connected with the Foreign Office or any other Government Department will communicate with and obtain their cards for attendance or presentation from the Department under which they serve.

12. Peers, Bishops, His Majesty's Lieutenants for Counties, Deputy Lieutenants for Counties, Members of Parliament, Officials connected with the Houses of Parliament, Clergy of all Denominations, and all gentlemen other than the above mentioned, should communicate with the Comptroller, Ceremonial Department, St. James's Palace.

13. The names both for attendance and presentation must be received at the various offices above indicated not later than ten days prior to the date of each Levée.

## TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

STAMPED OR PRESSED METAL WARES  
TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR  
MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

This Notice sets out all the Minimum Rates of Wages which have been fixed or varied by the Trade Board and confirmed by orders of the Minister of Labour and which are at present effective under the Trade Boards Acts, and takes the place of all Notices fixing and varying minimum rates of wages previously issued by the Trade Board.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:—

1. The General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for the classes of female workers specified in Sections I and II of Part I-B and in Section I of Part II-B respectively of this Schedule, and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 14th January, 1922.†

2. In all other cases as from 14th October, 1921.

† Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 20th January, 1922.

*General Minimum Time-Rates.*

Special Classes of Skilled Male Workers of 21 years of age and over: 1s. 6d., 1s. 8d., 1s. 8½d., 1s. 9½d., or 1s. 10d. per hour, according to occupation and length of experience.

Male Workers of 21 years of age and over other than these special classes: 1s. 2½d. per hour.

Male Workers under 21 years of age: According to age and occupation. (See Sections II and III of Part I A of the Schedule below.)

Female Workers of 18 years of age and over employed as Polishers or as Drop Stampers: 9d., 10d., or 11d. per hour, according to length of experience.

Female Workers of 18 years of age and over employed as Hand-Brush-Japanners who are capable of finishing all classes of work, Hand-Brush-Lacquers who are capable of finishing all classes of work, Blow-Pipe-Braziers, or Solderers using ordinary Hand-Iron or Blow-Pipe with bar solder: 8d., 9d., or 10d. per hour, according to length of experience.

All other Female Workers of 18 years and over: 8d. per hour.

All other Female Workers under 18 years of age: According to age and occupation. (See Part I B of the Schedule below.)

*Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates.*

Male Workers (all classes): 10 per cent. above the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rates.

All Female Workers employed as Polishers or as Drop Stampers: 1s. per hour.

All Female Workers employed as Hand-Brush-Japanners who are capable of finishing

all classes of work, Hand-Brush-Lacquerers who are capable of finishing all classes of work, Blow-Pipe-Braziers, or Solderers using ordinary Hand-Iron or Blow-Pipe with bar solder: 11d. per hour.

All other Female Workers of 18 years of age or over: 9d. per hour.

All other Female Workers under 18 years of age: According to age. (See Section II of Part II of the Schedule below.)

### SCHEDULE.

#### PART I.

##### GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES.

A.—General Minimum Time-Rates (as varied) for MALE WORKERS.

SECTION I.—MALE WORKERS of 21 years of age and upwards who are employed as BRAZIERERS, BURNISHERS, DROP-STAMPERS, DIPPERS, DIPPERS who are also BRONZERS, ANNEALERS or BRASS POLISHERS:—

(a) *Braziers, Burnishers or Drop-Stampers*—

Workers of Grade I, as defined in Section IV of this Part of this Schedule, 1s. 6d. per hour.

Workers of Grade II, as defined in Section IV of this Part of this Schedule, 1s. 8d. per hour.

Workers of Grade III, as defined in Section IV of this Part of this Schedule, 1s. 9½d. per hour.

(b) *Dippers*, 1s. 6d. per hour.

(c) *Dippers who are also Bronzers*—

Workers of Grade I, as defined in Section IV of this Part of this Schedule, 1s. 6d. per hour.

Workers of Grade II, as defined in Section IV of this Part of this Schedule, 1s. 8d. per hour.

Workers of Grade III, as defined in Section IV of this Part of this Schedule, 1s. 9½d. per hour.

(d) *Annealers*, 1s. 6d. per hour.

(e) *Brass Polishers*—

Workers of Grade I, as defined in Section IV of this Part of this Schedule, 1s. 6d. per hour.

Workers of Grade II, as defined in Section IV of this Part of this Schedule, 1s. 8½d. per hour.

Workers of Grade III, as defined in Section IV of this Part of this Schedule, 1s. 10d. per hour.

SECTION II.—MALE WORKERS under 21 years of age who are employed as BRAZIERERS, BURNISHERS, DROP-STAMPERS, DIPPERS, DIPPERS who are also BRONZERS, or as ANNEALERS:—

Workers under 15 years of age, 4½d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 6d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 9½d. per hour.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 10d. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 11½d. per hour.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 1s. 0½d. per hour.

SECTION III.—All other MALE WORKERS not included in Sections I and II above:—

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 1s. 2½d. per hour.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 1s. per hour.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 10d. per hour.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 8½d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 6d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 4¾d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 3½d. per hour.

SECTION IV.—For the purpose of the above Rates the following definitions shall apply:—

#### BRAZIERERS:

A Brazier of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on brazing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Brazier of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Brazier and who is an expert in brazing in all classes of metal except aluminium.

A Brazier of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is also an expert in brazing aluminium OR is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

#### BURNISHERS:

A Burnisher of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on burnishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Burnisher of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Burnisher and who is an expert hook and straight Burnisher at the vice and satisfactorily burnishes deep thin shell work at the lathe.

A Burnisher of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is an expert in speed and quality in all classes of work OR is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

#### DROP-STAMPERS:

A Drop-Stamper of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on drop-stamping and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Drop-Stamper of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Drop-Stamper and who undertakes all classes of deep or shallow work in all strengths of the metal used.

A Drop-Stamp of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is an expert in all classes of work OR is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

DIPPERS who are also BRONZERS:

A Worker of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on dipping and bronzing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Worker of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Dipper and Bronzer and who is an all-round Dipper and Bronzer and also does art bronzing and colouring, or electro-plating or has a knowledge of electro-plating.

A Worker of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, also has an expert knowledge of art bronzing or metal colouring or electro depositing and solutions OR is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

BRASS POLISHERS:

A Polisher of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on polishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III as hereinafter defined.

A Polisher of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Polisher and is an expert in all processes of any class of common work and can emery-bob and mop best work.

A Polisher of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II, as above defined, is also an expert in all processes of both common and best work OR is a charge hand with the duty of being responsible for all work and order in the shop.

B.—General Minimum Time-Rates (as fixed and as varied) for Female Workers.

\* SECTION I.—For FEMALE WORKERS who are employed as POLISHERS or as DROP-STAMPERS:—

(a) Workers of 18 years of age and over:—

During first 12 months of employment after the age of 18, 10d. per hour.

After completion of 12 months of employment after the age of 18, 11d. per hour.

Provided that, in the case of Female Workers entering the branches of the trade specified in this Section for the first time at or over the age of 18 years, the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable during the first two months of employment shall be 9d. per hour.

(b) Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 9d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 7½d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 6½d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 5d. per hour.

\* SECTION II.—For FEMALE WORKERS who are employed as HAND-BRUSH-JAPANNERS who are capable of finishing all classes of work, HAND-BRUSH-LAC-QUERERS who are capable of finishing all classes of work, BLOW-PIPE-BRAZERS or SOLDIERS using ordinary Hand-Iron or Blow-Pipe with Bar Solder:—

(a) Workers of 18 years of age and over:—

During first 12 months of employment after the age of 18, 9d. per hour.

After completion of 12 months of employment after the age of 18, 10d. per hour.

Provided that, in the case of Female Workers entering the branches of the trade specified in this Section for the first time at or over the age of 18 years, the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable during the first two months of employment shall be 8d. per hour.

(b) Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 8d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 6½d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 5½d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 4½d. per hour.

SECTION III.—For all FEMALE WORKERS not included in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule:—

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 8d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 7d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 5½d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 4½d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 3½d. per hour.

## PART II.

### PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES.

A.—Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates (as varied) for all Male Workers (All Ages).

The Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for any class of Male Workers shall be 10 per cent. above the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate for such class, as set out in Part I A. of this Schedule.

B.—Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates (as fixed and as varied) for Female Workers.

\* SECTION I.—

(a) For all FEMALE WORKERS who are employed as POLISHERS or as DROP-STAMPERS, 1s. per hour.

(b) For all FEMALE WORKERS who are employed as HAND-BRUSH-JAPANNERS who are capable of finishing all classes of work, HAND-BRUSH-LAC-QUERERS who are capable of finishing all classes of work, BLOW-PIPE-BRAZERS or SOLDIERS using ordinary Hand-Iron or Blow-Pipe with Bar Solder, 11d. per hour.

SECTION II.—For all FEMALE WORKERS not included in Section I of this Part of this Schedule:—

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 9d. per hour.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 8d. per hour.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 6½d. per hour.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 5½d. per hour.

Workers under 15 years of age, 4½d. per hour.

NOTE.—In the case of all Workers employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the equivalent of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate to an ORDINARY worker, *i.e.*, a worker of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question.

### PART III.

#### OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week	...	...	...	47
On Saturday	...	...	...	4½

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker, whether employed on time-work or on piece-work, in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

(a) For all hours worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

(b) For all hours worked in excess of four-and-a-half on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 47.

(c) For all hours worked in excess of 47 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to TIME-AND-A-QUARTER for the first two hours and TIME-AND-A-HALF thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-Sections (a) and (b) of this Section.

NOTE.—(1) The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

(2) The Minimum Rates for Overtime set forth in Section II of this Part of this Schedule are effective, as respects workers to whom the General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates marked \* apply, as from 14th January, 1922.

### PART IV.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919.

SECTION II.—The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:—

The manufacture from metals (other than precious metals) by the processes of cold stamping or cold pressing (including cutting or piercing) of cabinet fittings, window fittings, curtain accessories, stationers' sundries, drapers' sundries, fittings for gas or electric light, fittings for suit-cases or hand-bags or purses, buckles, eyelets, ferrules, labels, collar studs, tie-clips, thimbles, photograph frames, stamped chains, bells, fancy nails (excluding the shanks), parts of safety razors (excluding the blades), parts of braces or suspenders, corset steels or busks, whistles, tin-openers, medals or any similar articles or metal parts of such articles;

Including:—

(a) The operations of annealing, hardening, barrelling, polishing, bronzing, nickelling, lacquering, japanning, non-vitreous enamelling, tinning or assembling, where these operations are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

(b) The operations of carding, boxing, packeting, labelling, weighing, packing, warehousing or despatching, where these operations are incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

But excluding:—

(a) The operations specified in the Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) Order, 1913;

(b) The making of buttons or any operations incidental thereto;

(c) The making of coffin furniture or any operations incidental thereto;

(d) The making of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, hair-curlers, snap fasteners or safety pins or any operations incidental thereto;

(e) The making of steel pens and the making of stationers' metal sundries or other similar metal articles when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;

(f) The minting of coinage of the realm;

(g) The process of hand-embossing.

### PART V.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

- (b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership:

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

SECTION III.—The expression "HOMEWORKER" means a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

SECTION IV.—The RETAIL BRANCH of the Trade is that branch of the Trade specified in Part VII. of the Schedule to the Notice W.D.S. (6) issued by the Trade Board and dated 28th September, 1921, in which it is the usual practice for the employer to supply the garment direct to the wearer.

## PART VI.

## APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts the proposed respective minimum rates set out in this Schedule shall apply to all Female Workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade as specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 29th March, 1920 (as varied by the Trade Boards (Shirtmaking) Order, 1920), and as set out in Part VII. of the Notice W.D.S. (6) issued by the Trade Board and dated 28th September, 1921.

The Trade Board further give Notice that the Notice of Proposal to Vary Minimum Rates of Wages for certain classes of Female Workers in the Retail Branch of the Trade in certain areas W.D.S. (7) issued by the Trade Board and dated 28th October, 1921, is hereby WITHDRAWN.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from 18th January, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Dressmaking and Women's Light Clothing Trade Board (Scotland), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

- (a) Is employed by an Employer who provides such Learner with reasonable facilities for practically and efficiently learning the branch of the Trade as carried on by him and the various processes involved in the making of any of the articles specified in the definition of the trade referred to in Part VI of this Schedule; and
- (b) Has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a Female Learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at her employment, the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

Provided that, notwithstanding compliance with the conditions contained in this Section, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of her parent or guardian.

#### SECTION III.

The expression "HOMEWORKER" means a worker who works in her own home or any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

#### PART VI.

##### APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts the proposed respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall apply to all Female workers in Scotland in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade as specified in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour, dated 31st March, 1920, and set out in Part VII of the Notice H.M.S. (6) issued by the Trade Board and dated 28th October, 1921.

The Trade Board further give Notice that the Notice of Proposal to Vary Minimum Rates of Wages for Certain Classes of Female Workers in all branches of the trade except the Wholesale Cloth Hat and Capmaking Branch in certain areas H.M.S. (7), dated 28th October, 1921, is hereby WITHDRAWN.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 18th January, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade Board (Scotland), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES.

Overtime Rates calculated on the Minimum Rates proposed above in the manner set out in the Schedule to the Notice issued by the Trade Board and dated 10th September, 1921, shall apply in substitution for the above-mentioned proposed Minimum Rates for Male Workers in the Coffin Furniture Section of the Trade in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours therein declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the Trade.

## GENERAL.

SECTION I.—The average percentage increase in the Cost of Living Figure mentioned in this Notice refers to the Average Percentage Increases since July, 1914, in Retail Prices in the United Kingdom (all items) as published each month by the Ministry of Labour in the "Labour Gazette."

UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE.

COURTS OF REFEREES AMENDING NO. 2  
REGULATIONS, 1921.

THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE (COURTS OF REFEREES) (AMENDING) (NO. 2) REGULATIONS, 1921, DATED NOVEMBER 14, 1921, MADE BY THE MINISTER OF LABOUR UNDER THE UNEMPLOYMENT INSURANCE ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5, c. 30) (A).

Whereas the Minister of Labour, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, has made the Unemployment Insurance (Courts of Referees) Regulations, 1920 (b) (hereinafter referred to as the Principal Regulations), for regulating certain matters with reference to the constitution and procedure of Courts of Referees:

And whereas the said Principal Regulations have been amended by the Unemployment Insurance (Courts of Referees) (Amending) Regulations, 1921 (c):

And whereas it is expedient further to amend the said Principal Regulations:

Now, therefore, the Minister of Labour, by virtue of the powers conferred on him by the said Act and of all other powers enabling him in that behalf, hereby makes the following Regulations for amending the said Principal Regulations:—

1. At the end of paragraph (4) of Regulation 2 of the Principal Regulations as amended by the said Unemployment Insurance (Courts of Referees) (Amending) Regulations, 1921, there shall be inserted the words:—

"or whilst he is himself claiming unemployment benefit or is claiming payment out of public funds under any scheme for making payments to discharged seamen, marines, soldiers, or airmen in respect of unemployment."

(a) These Regulations, although statutory, are provisional only. Permanent Regulations will be made later.

2. Where by these Regulations any Regulations or words are directed to be added to or omitted from the Principal Regulations or to be substituted for any other Regulations or words in the Principal Regulations, copies of the Principal Regulations, printed under the authority of His Majesty's Stationery Office after these Regulations come into force, may be printed with the Regulations or words added, omitted, or substituted as these Regulations require, and with the Regulations and paragraphs thereafter numbered in accordance with such direction; and the Principal Regulations shall be construed as if they had, at the time at which these Regulations come into force, been made with such additions or omissions.

3. These Regulations may be cited as the Unemployment Insurance (Courts of Referees) (Amending) (No. 2) Regulations, 1921, and shall come into force on the date hereof.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give

sioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

**REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE  
EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF ASSISTANT  
ENGINEER IN THE ENGINEER-IN-CHIEF'S  
DEPARTMENT OF THE GENERAL POST OFFICE.**  
N.B.—*These Regulations are liable to altera-  
tion from time to time.*

1. *Age.*—The limits of age for this situation  
are 20 and 23, with the proviso that in the case  
of examinations held within two years of the  
date of the first examination under this scheme  
the upper limit shall be 25. Candidates must  
be of the prescribed age on the 1st March or  
the 1st September of the year in which they  
are examined, according as the examination is  
held in the first or second half of the year.

In reckoning age for this purpose a candi-  
date may deduct any time, up to a maximum  
of two years, which he has spent since gradua-  
tion in an approved engineering works, and  
any time, up to a maximum of two years,  
which he has spent in His Majesty's Forces  
between the 4th August, 1914, and the 31st  
December, 1919.

2. *Nationality.*—No person will be eligible  
for appointment to the Civil Service who is not  
a natural-born British subject, and the child  
of a father also a natural-born British subject;  
provided that exception may be made in the  
case of candidates serving in a civil situation  
to which they were admitted with the certifi-  
cate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and  
provided that exception may be made as

regards the father in the case of candidates who served in His Majesty's Armed Forces during the Great War.

3. *Education*.—Candidates must have taken a complete engineering course and a degree following thereon at an institution of university rank, allowance being made for war and post-war conditions so far as recognised by the university regulations, provided that this requirement may be waived in the case of a man who is serving in the Post Office and is nominated by the Postmaster-General. Whitworth scholars, and students of the Imperial College of Science and Technology who have gained the Diploma of Membership of the Imperial College in physics or engineering, or who hold the Diploma of Associateship of the City and Guilds Institute, will be regarded as eligible.

4. *Health and Character*.—Candidates must satisfy the Civil Service Commissioners as to their health and character.

5. Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of less than five years' service are ineligible.

The following classes of persons are eligible under certain conditions only, that is to say:—

(a) Persons actually serving in the Army or the Air Force.

(b) Persons actually serving in the Navy.

(c) Persons holding situations in the Civil Service.

(d) Members of the Royal Irish Constabulary of more than five years' service.

(e) Apprentices in His Majesty's Dockyards.

(f) Persons who have entered upon or completed a course of education or training for the occupation of teacher, on account of which grants are payable from the Exchequer.

No person actually serving in the Army or in the Air Force will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Army Council or the Air Council, as the case may be.

No person actually serving in the Navy will be eligible unless he produces to the Civil Service Commissioners, when called upon to do so, the permission of his Commanding Officer to attend the examination, dated before the commencement of the competition and given in accordance with such orders as may from time to time be issued by or under the authority of the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty.

Persons comprised in the classes (c), (d), (e) must obtain the permission of the authorities of their Department to attend the examination before the commencement of the competition.

Persons comprised in class (f) will not be qualified to receive appointments until the consent of the Board of Education in England, the Committee of Council on Education for Scotland, or the Commissioners of National Education, Ireland, as the case may be, given in conformity with rules sanctioned by the Lords of the Treasury, has been notified to the Civil Service Commissioners.

1. Mathematics.
2. Electro-Technology.
3. Materials.
4. Theory of Machines.

capital; to charge all moneys so borrowed on the District Fund and the General District Rate and the gas undertaking or other undertakings, assets, rates, revenues, rents and other property of the Council or any of such securities, and to empower the Council to execute, grant and issue mortgages and other securities; to authorize the Council to apply any of their funds or other moneys authorized to be raised to any of the purposes of the Order, and to provide that moneys borrowed under the powers of the Order shall not be deemed within the limit of borrowing under the Public Health Act, 1875.

10. 12. To authorize the Council to pay superannuation allowances and pensions to their officers and servants, and to make payments for those and other similar purposes out of revenue.

13. To make further provision with regard to the recovery by the Council of rates, rents and charges for the supply of gas and residual products, and for the supply, hire or use of meters, stoves, ranges, engines, pipes and other fittings and apparatus supplied, and for work done by the Council, the authentication and service of notices, the recovery of penalties, the recovery of demands, the inclusion of several sums in one and the same summons; and generally to confer all such further and other powers as may be deemed necessary or expedient for effecting the purposes aforesaid or any of them.
