Civil Service Commission,

January 17, 1922.

The Civil Service Commissioners hereby give
notice that the following Regulations are pub-
lished with the consent of the Lords Commis-
sioners of His Majesty's Treasury, viz.:—

**REGULATIONS RESPECTING OPEN COMPETITIVE
EXAMINATIONS FOR THE SITUATION OF ASSISTANT
ENGINEER IN THE ENGINEER-IN-CHIEF'S
DEPARTMENT OF THE GENERAL POST OFFICE.**
N.B.—*These Regulations are liable to altera-
tion from time to time.*

1. *Age.*—The limits of age for this situation
are 20 and 23, with the proviso that in the case
of examinations held within two years of the
date of the first examination under this scheme
the upper limit shall be 25. Candidates must
be of the prescribed age on the 1st March or
the 1st September of the year in which they
are examined, according as the examination is
held in the first or second half of the year.

In reckoning age for this purpose a candi-
date may deduct any time, up to a maximum
of two years, which he has spent since gradua-
tion in an approved engineering works, and
any time, up to a maximum of two years,
which he has spent in His Majesty's Forces
between the 4th August, 1914, and the 31st
December, 1919.

2. *Nationality.*—No person will be eligible
for appointment to the Civil Service who is not
a natural-born British subject, and the child
of a father also a natural-born British subject;
provided that exception may be made in the
case of candidates serving in a civil situation
to which they were admitted with the certifi-
cate of the Civil Service Commissioners, and
provided that exception may be made as
