TENDERS FOR LOANS ON TREASURY BILLS.

1. DURHAM AND NORTHUMBERLAND (FOOT - AND - MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as

1. Parts I and IV of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," are hereby applied to the District described in the First Schedule hereto, which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Movement within the Scheduled District.

(1) Where an inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in the Scheduled Dis-

trict should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibi-tion of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the inspector may insert in the Licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the Licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a Licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Movement into certain Boroughs for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Part II of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the several boroughs described in the Second Schedule hereto.
