FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE: INFECTED PLACE.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

The premises mentioned in the Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 3).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power

enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Movement of Animals out of certain Areas for Immediate Slaughter.

1.—(1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, or in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922, an animal may be moved from premises situate within any area described in the Third Schedule to the last above-mentioned Order to any slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled District (i.e., Scheduled District No. 3 described in the First Schedule to that Order) if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate. Provided that no such licence shall be granted in any case in which the movement would involve movement on any road in a Prohibited Area.

(2) The provisions of the above-mentioned Orders relating to animals moved under those Orders shall apply to any animals moved with a licence under this Order.

Short Title.

2. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 3).

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 4).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Declaration of Further Prohibited Area.

1. The Area described in the Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, and the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 shall be read and have
