

firmation, under the above-mentioned Acts, an Order made by them authorising the incorporation of the Welsh Highland Railway (Light Railway) Company, and the transfer to that Company of the undertakings of the North Wales Narrow Gauge Railways Company, and of the Portmadoc Beddgelert and South Snowdon Railway Company respectively, and reviving the powers granted by various Orders to the Portmadoc, Beddgelert and South Snowdon Railway Company for the compulsory purchase of lands and extending the periods limited by those Orders for the same, and for the completion of the Light Railways and Works thereby authorised and for other purposes.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES:

(DATED 14TH FEBRUARY 1922.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 5).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Substitution of Areas.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922, and the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 3), shall be read and have effect as if the area described in the Schedule hereto were substituted for the two areas Nos. 2 and 4

described in the Third Schedule to the first-mentioned Order.

Movement through Areas by Railway.

2. The prohibition contained in Article 5 of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 of the movement of animals out of any area described in the Third Schedule to that Order shall not apply to the movement of animals out of any such area where they are moved through any such area by railway from a place outside that area to another place outside that area, without unnecessary delay and without the animals being untrucked within that area except for the purposes of feeding or watering the animals within the railway station premises where such untrucking takes place.

Short Title.

3. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 5).
