**PRESENT,**

The KING'S Most Excellent Majesty.

**W**HEREAS by treaty, capitulation, grant, usage, sufferance, or other lawful means, His Majesty the King has jurisdiction in Egypt:

And whereas provision is now made by the Ottoman Order in Council, 1910 (in this Order referred to as "the Principal Order"), and the Egypt Order in Council, 1915 (in this Order referred to as "the Egypt Order"), for the exercise of such jurisdiction, and it is desirable to amend the said Orders:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Egypt (Amendment) Order in Council, 1921," and shall be read as one with the Principal Order and with the Egypt Order.

*Supreme Court.*

2. The Supreme Court for Egypt shall, subject to the provisions of Article 4 of this Order, consist of a Judge to be appointed in accordance with the provisions of Article 8 of the Principal Order.

The Judge shall be at the time of his appointment a member of the Bar of England, Scotland or Ireland, of not less than seven years' standing.

3. During a vacancy in the office of Judge, or in case of the illness or incapacity of the Judge, or of his absence from Egypt, the Secretary of State may appoint a fit person to act as Judge.

An Acting Judge shall, during the continuance of his appointment, have all the power and authority of the Judge.

*Full Court.*

4.—(1.) The Secretary of State shall appoint a person, qualified as provided in Article 2 of this Order, to act as President of the Full Court provided for in Article 8 (3) of the Principal Order and in the Egypt Order, and the President of the Full Court and the Judge of the Supreme Court for Egypt sitting together shall constitute the "Full Court" for the purposes of the said Orders.

(2.) When there is a difference of opinion:

in the Full Court the opinion of the President shall prevail.

(3.) For purposes connected with the work of the Full Court the President shall have all the power and authority in Egypt of a Judge of the Supreme Court.

(4.) The Full Court shall ordinarily sit at Alexandria, but may sit at any place in Egypt.

#### *Registration.*

5. The following provisions are substituted for Articles 151 to 161 inclusive of the Principal Order as applied to Egypt:—

(1.) A register of British subjects shall be kept in the office of every Consulate in Egypt.

(2.) Every British subject resident in Egypt shall, in the month of January of each year, be registered at the Consulate of the Consular District within which he resides, provided that if some other Consulate is more easy of access, he may, with the assent of the Consular Officer, be registered there. A British subject arriving in Egypt must apply for registration within one month after his arrival; provided that a person who fails to apply for or to obtain registration within the time limited by this Article may be registered at any time if he excuses his failure to the satisfaction of the Consular Officer.

(3.) Where a person is in possession of a valid British passport, the Consular Officer shall, on the first registration of any such person, endorse on the passport, without further fee than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder, a certificate of registration in such form as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State. Where any such person applies for the renewal of the registration and produces his passport, the renewal of the registration shall, without further fee than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder, be endorsed thereon.

(4.) Every person who has not previously been registered applying to be registered under this Order shall, unless excused by the Consular Officer, attend personally for that purpose at the Consulate, but any person applying for the renewal of his registration need not attend personally unless directed by the Consular Officer so to do, provided that the registration of the wife or wives of a man who is registered under this Order may, if living with him, be effected without their personal attendance being required, and provided also that the registration of minors, being his relatives in whatever degree, living with the head of a family who is registered under this Order, may be effected without their personal attendance being required.

(5.) A person registered in any register of British subjects established under the provisions of any Order in Council which have ceased to apply in Egypt shall be registered under the provisions of this Order, unless the Consular Officer is satisfied after enquiry that the previous registration was erroneous or that such person is not entitled to registration under the provisions of this Order.

(6.) Every person shall, on every registration of himself, and on every renewal of the registration, pay a fee of 2s. 6d., or such other fee as the Secretary of State from time to time appoints. The amount of the fee may be uniform for all persons, or may vary according to the position and circumstances of different classes, if the Secretary of State from time to

time so directs, but may not in any case exceed 5s.

(7.) Where any person applies to be registered, he shall be entitled, without a fee, to the assistance of the Consular Officer in the preparation of any affidavit that may be required.

(8.) The Consular Officer may require the production of such evidence that an applicant for registration is entitled to the status of a British subject as he may see fit, but subject to such directions as may be issued by the Secretary of State.

(9.) If any British subject neglects to obtain registration under the provisions of this Order, he shall not be entitled to be recognised or protected as a British subject in Egypt, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding £2 for each instance of such failure, but he shall, although not registered, be subject to the jurisdiction of His Majesty's Courts in Egypt.

6. From and after the commencement of this Order, Articles 151 to 161 inclusive of the Principal Order shall cease to apply in Egypt, but this shall not prejudice any rights, obligations or liabilities accrued thereunder.

#### *General.*

7. In Article 103 of the Principal Order the words "except the jurisdiction relative to dissolution or nullity or jactitation of marriage" are hereby repealed so far as concerns Egypt, and, from and after the commencement of this Order, the Supreme Court for Egypt shall, as far as circumstances admit, have for and within Egypt with respect to British subjects all such jurisdiction in matrimonial causes as for the time being belongs to the High Court in England.

8.—(1.) This Order shall take effect as soon as it is first exhibited in the public office of the Supreme Court for Egypt, and that date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of the Order.

(2.) For that purpose the Judge of the Supreme Court shall, on the receipt by him of a certified printed copy of the Order, cause the same to be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in that office. He shall also keep the same so affixed and exhibited during one month from that first exhibition.

(3.) A certified printed copy of this Order shall also be affixed and exhibited in the public offices of the Consular Courts at Cairo and Port Said at the same time as it is first exhibited at Alexandria or as soon thereafter as circumstances admit.

(4.) Proof shall not in any proceeding or matter be required that the provisions of this Article have been complied with, nor shall any act or proceeding be invalidated by any failure to comply with any such provisions.

## GAS.

SPECIAL ORDER MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE UNDER SECTION 2, SUB-SECTION (4), OF THE GAS REGULATION ACT, 1920 (10 & 11 GEO. 5, C. 28), LIMITING THE PROPORTION OF CARBON MONOXIDE WHICH MAY BE SUPPLIED IN GAS USED FOR DOMESTIC PURPOSES.

Whereas in pursuance of the provisions of Section 2, Sub-section (4), of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, the Board of Trade have caused an inquiry to be held into the question whether it is necessary or desirable to prescribe any limitations of the proportion of carbon monoxide which may be supplied in gas used for domestic purposes:

And whereas upon such inquiry it appears desirable that an Order in the following terms should be made:

Now, therefore, the Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 2, Sub-section (4), of the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Gas (Carbon Monoxide) Order, 1922.

2. No gas undertakers as defined by the Gas Regulation Act, 1920, shall supply any gas for domestic purposes containing carbon monoxide unless such gas possesses the distinctive pungent smell of coal gas.

GERMAN REPARATION RECOVERY  
(No. 1) ORDER, 1922.

DATED 16TH FEBRUARY, 1922, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

2. Any Article of the following description shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any Article being a publication in the German Language which is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise to be a periodical publication of a German learned Society, or other Scientific or Philosophical periodical publication.

GERMAN REPARATION (No. 2) ORDER,  
1922.

DATED 16TH FEBRUARY, 1922, MADE BY THE BOARD OF TRADE.

The Board of Trade, in pursuance of the powers conferred upon them by Section 5 of the German Reparation (Recovery) Act, 1921, and of all other powers enabling them in that behalf, upon the recommendation of a Committee constituted under Section 5 of the said Act, hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the German Reparation Recovery (No. 2) Order, 1922.

2. Any article of the following description shall be exempt from the provisions of the said Act, that is to say, any article in respect of which it is proved to the satisfaction of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise—

(a) that such article is imported into the United Kingdom for the purpose of there undergoing any process of manufacture and thereafter being re-exported to Germany;

(b) that such article is consigned from Germany direct to the manufacturer in the United Kingdom by whom the said process is to be carried out;

(c) that such article does not pass into the ownership of any person in the United Kingdom and that no payment in respect of it is made to Germany; and in respect of which security has been given by the manufacturer to the satisfaction of the said Commissioners that such article will be returned to Germany within a period of one month after the date of the completion of the said process.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS as VARIED and made EFFECTIVE from 20th February, 1922\* ; together with Rates which are not affected by the variation and which remain in operation.

The Schedule to this Notice sets out :

The Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by the Trade Board for Male and Female Workers and confirmed by an Order of the Minister of Labour, specifying the 20th day of February, 1922,\* as the date from which they should become effective, AND

The General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for certain classes of Female Learners set out in the Notice H.M. (6) issued by the Trade Board and dated 22nd July, 1921, which remain unaffected by this variation.

All the Minimum Rates set out in this Notice are effective as from 20th February, 1922,\* except the Minimum Rates for Female Learners set out in Section III of Part I of the Schedule in their application to workers in any branch of the trade other than the Wholesale and Retail Cloth Hat and Cap Section, which became effective as from 25th July, 1921, and which remain in operation.

\* Note.—Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates shall become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in no case later than 26th February, 1922.

This Notice takes the place of all Notices previously issued by the Trade Board fixing or varying minimum rates of wages.

Workers commencing employment in the Hat, Cap and Millinery Trade for the first time at or over the age of 19 may serve their first period of six months of employment at 7d. per hour, and their second period of six months at 8d. per hour.

On the expiration of one year's employment in the trade, these workers shall receive the rates to which their age entitles them under the foregoing provisions.

(i) The General Minimum Time-Rate for Learners under 14 years of age shall be 6s. per week of 48 hours or 1½d. per hour, and from the age of 14 years they shall be entitled to the amounts shown in Column I above as if they had commenced at 14.

(ii) The advances to be given to Learners shall become due as from the first Monday in January and July of each year, the Learner being entitled to her first advance from the first Monday in January or July, as the case may be, provided that she has been in the trade at least three months.

(iii) A Learner shall cease to be a Learner and be entitled to the full General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to workers other than learners upon the fulfilment of the conditions appropriate to her as set out below:—

Age of entering upon employment.	Conditions.
Under 15 years of age ... ..	The completion of not less than three years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.
15 and under 16 years of age ... ..	The completion of not less than two years' employment, and the attainment of the age of 18 years.
16 years of age and over ... ..	The completion of two years' employment.

Provided that in determining the age of entry and the length of employment, all service prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded.

(iv) If the conditions set out in Part IV, Section IV of this Schedule, are not complied with, the minimum rate applicable is that for female workers other than Learners set out in Section II above.

## PART II.

## PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES AS VARIED.

## SECTION I.—MALE WORKERS:

(a) Male Workers of the classes specified in paragraphs A and B of Part I, Section I of this Schedule, 1s. 6½d. per hour.

(b) All other Male Workers, 1s. 2½d. per hour.

## SECTION II.—FEMALE WORKERS:

(a) All Female Workers other than Home-workers, 8½d. per hour.

(b) Home-workers (as defined in Part IV, Section II of this Schedule), 8½d. per hour.

SECTION III.—In the case of all Workers employed on Piece-work, each Piece-Rate paid shall be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER of the class in question, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate appropriate to the class.

In determining whether any Piece-Rate satisfies the above-mentioned condition, regard must be had only to the earnings of ordinary workers, *i.e.*, workers of ordinary skill and experience in the class of work in question and not to the earnings of workers of less than ordinary skill and experience, *e.g.*, learners and infirm workers.

## PART III.

## OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED) FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS OF ALL AGES.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK in the Trade to be as follows:—

In any week, 48.

On any day other than Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, 9.

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and hours worked on Saturday (subject to the provisions set out below) shall be regarded as Overtime, to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker of the classes specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

## A.—FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK:

(1) ON ANY DAY other than Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays:—

(a) For the FIRST TWO HOURS OF OVERTIME, One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(b) For OVERTIME, AFTER THE FIRST TWO HOURS OF OVERTIME, One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer only to require attendance on five days a week, the Overtime Rates specified in paragraphs A (1) (a) and A (1) (b) of this Section shall not be payable on any day (other than Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays) until the number of hours worked exceeds 9½ and 11½ respectively

(2) ON SATURDAY in respect of:—

(a) THAT CLASS OF WORKER WHO CUSTOMARILY ATTENDS ON SIX DAYS A WEEK:—

For all Overtime worked after the first five hours One-and-a-Half Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

Note.—During the first five hours worked on Saturday the Minimum Rate applicable for this class of worker is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I of the Schedule to this Notice.

(b) THAT CLASS OF WORKER WHO CUSTOMARILY ATTENDS ON FIVE DAYS A WEEK:—

(i) For the first two hours of Overtime, that is to say, for the first two hours worked on Saturday, One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime, One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) ON SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS:—

For all time worked, Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

Note.—The Overtime Rates set out in Sub-Sections (1) (2) and (3) of this Section are payable as provided above, in respect of all hours of Overtime worked on any day, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(4) Where it is, or may become, the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out in this Section shall apply to workers in like manner as if in the provisions of this Schedule as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

(5) FOR ALL HOURS WORKED IN ANY WEEK IN EXCESS OF 48, One-and-a-Quarter Times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (1) (b), (2) (a), (2) (b) (ii) and (3) of this Section.

Provided that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week in which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

**B.—FOR WORKERS EMPLOYED ON  
PIECE-WORK :**

All Workers employed on Piece-work shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, **IN ADDITION TO PIECE-RATES**, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an Ordinary Worker not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable:—

(a) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO ONE-QUARTER OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE.

(b) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO ONE-HALF OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE, or

(c) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE FULL AMOUNT OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were:—

- (a) TIME-AND-A-QUARTER,
- (b) TIME-AND-A-HALF, or
- (c) DOUBLE-TIME, respectively.

**SECTION III.**—In the application of the above Overtime Rates to Workers who customarily attend on six days a week, any other day, not being Sunday, may be substituted for Saturday as the weekly short day, and in such case the provisions of Sections I. and II. above shall apply in like manner as if in such provisions "Saturday" were substituted for such short day, and such short day were substituted for "Saturday" notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I. and II. of this Part of this Schedule.

*Note.*—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

**PART IV.  
DEFINITIONS.**

For the purpose of the application of the minimum rates set out in this Notice the following definitions shall apply:—

**SECTION I.**

(a) A **CUTTER** is a Male person employed in marking-in and cutting, using electric machine, band knife, shears, or hand knife on any materials other than linings, interlinings, peaks, bazils, or any other trimmings, and who has been so employed for not less than five years after the age of 19.

(b) A **BLOCKER** is a Male person employed in pulling-on and blocking hats and caps by hand iron or steam or by hydraulic machine and in making shapes by the French gas block, and who has been so employed for not less than five years after the age of 19.

**SECTION II.**

(a) A **PRESS-CUTTER** is a Male person employed on any process of Press-Cutting and who has been so employed for not less than three years after the age of 19.

(b) A **LINING-CUTTER** is a Male person employed in cutting linings and inter-linings, or in marking-out, laying-up or hooking-up, and who has been so employed for not less than three years after the age of 19.

**SECTION III.**

A **HOMEWORKER** is a worker who works in her own home or in any place not under the control or management of the employer.

**SECTION IV.**

A **FEMALE LEARNER** is a worker who:—

(a) is employed during the whole or a substantial part of her time in learning any branch or process of the trade specified in Part V. of the Schedule to this Notice by an employer who provides the learner with reasonable facilities for such learning, and

(b) has received a certificate or has been registered in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, and held subject to compliance with conditions specified in this Section, or has made application for such certificate or registration which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration. Provided that the certification or registration of a learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided that an employer may employ a female learner on her first employment without a certificate or registration for a probation period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such learner being continued thereafter at her employment the probation period shall be included in her period of learnership.

**PART V.**

**APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES.**

The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply to all workers in England and Wales in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Hat, Cap and Millinery) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

The making from any material of men's, women's or children's headgear, or the trimming thereof;

*Including:—*

Warehousing, packing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the making or trimming of men's, women's or children's headgear;

*But excluding:—*

(1) The casting and making of solid metal helmets;

(2) The making of rubberised or oilskin headgear where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of other rubberised or oilskin articles;

(3) The making of nurses' or servants' caps, chefs' caps, hospital ward caps, or similar articles;

(4) The making of field bonnets, sun-bonnets, boudoir caps, or infants' millinery where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making of dresses, non-tailored skirts, wraps, blouses, blouse-ropes, jumpers, sports coats, neckwear, tea-gowns, dressing gowns, dressing jackets, pyjamas, underclothing, under-skirts, aprons, overalls, nurses' and servants' caps, juvenile clothing, baby linen or similar articles;

(5) The making of fur hats, where made in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of furs or furriers' skins into garments, rugs, or similar articles;

(6) The making of knitted headgear and the making of headgear from knitted fabrics where carried on in association with or in



conjunction with the manufacture of knitted fabric;

(7) Warehousing and packing of men's, women's, and children's headgear and other similar operations carried on in shops mainly engaged in the retail distribution of articles of any description that are not made or trimmed on the premises.

## PART VI.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages are to be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

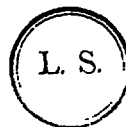

##### THE HAY, STRAW, AND PEAT-MOSS LITTER (IMPORTATION) ORDER, 1922.

Whereas it is deemed advisable to modify the Orders for regulating the importation of hay, straw, and peat-moss litter into this Island.

Now I, the said Lieutenant-Governor, by and with the advice and consent of two members of the Council, and in exercise of all the powers in that behalf given by the Cattle Diseases Prevention Acts, do hereby order as follows:—

1. No hay, straw, or peat-moss litter, or any other substance used in substitution for straw for bedding animals shall be imported into this Island unless accompanied by a Permit issued by the Government Secretary, which Permit may contain such conditions as may at the time of issue be considered desirable.

2. This Order shall not apply to:—

(a) Hay or straw which at the time of importation is being used for packing merchandise; or

(b) Manufactured straw not intended for use as fodder or litter for animals.

3. The Hay and Straw (Landing) Order of 1914, dated the 24th February, 1914, and the Peat-Moss Litter (Landing) Order of 1914, dated 24th February, 1914, are hereby revoked.

4. This Order may be cited as "The Hay, Straw, and Peat-Moss Litter (Importation) Order of 1922."
