MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE HEMP ROLLERS AND HEMP BREAKERS.

EFFECTIVE AS FROM 27TH FEBRUARY, 1922.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 5th March, 1922.

General Minimum Time-Rate.

MALE WORKERS of 21 years of age and over who are employed as HEMP ROLLERS on Non-reciprocating Machines or as HEMP BREAKERS, 54s. per week.

Overtime Rates.

The Rates in full as legally enforceable are set out in detail in the Schedule below.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATE (AS VARIED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE HEMP ROLLERS AND HEMP BREAKERS.

General Minimum Time-Rate.

SECTION I.—For MALE WORKERS of 21 years of age and over who are employed as Hemp Rollers on non-reciprocating machines or as Hemp Breakers, 54s. per week.

SECTION II.—

(a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period, whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 44, "a week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the class in question;

(b) In all other cases "a week" means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION III.—For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment the rates set out in Section I of this Part of this Schedule must be divided:—

(a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section II (a) of this Part by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question;

(b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION IV.—Payment at not less than the hourly rate calculated as described in Section III of this Part must be made for all hours of employment whether in excess of the customary working week or not, except for those hours in respect of which a higher rate is payable under the overtime provisions specified in Part II below.

PART II.

OVERTIME RATES (AS VARIED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE HEMP ROLLERS AND HEMP BREAKERS.

As respects the classes of Male Hemp Rollers and Hemp Breakers specified in Part I of this Schedule, Overtime Rates calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part VII of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (6) dated 21st October, 1921, shall

apply in substitution for the General Minimum Time-Rate set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice F.H. (6) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III. GENERAL.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male workers of the classes specified in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in the specified occupations in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, namely:—

The preparing, spinning and weaving (a) of scutched flax, (b) of hemp, (c) of a mixture of scutched flax and any other fibre, or (d) of a mixture of hemp and any other fibre.

INCLUDING:—

(1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage and

(2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work;

BUT EXCLUDING:—

(1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above-mentioned materials; and

(2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or re-making of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk, worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles when such spinning or preparing is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or re-making; and

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs and mats.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are to be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION III.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of the Minimum Rates.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES (AS VARIED) FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF MALE APPRENTICES AND IM- PROVERS IN TENTING AND DRESS- ING.

Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 5th March, 1922.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR MALE APPRENTICES (AS DEFINED IN PART V OF THIS SCHEDULE) WHO ARE APPRENTICED TO TENT- ING OR DRESSING.

The General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Apprentices as defined in Part V of this Schedule, who are employed under the conditions set out in this Notice in the branches of the Flax and Hemp Trade specified in this Part of this Schedule and included within the scope of the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, shall be as follows:—

Male Apprentices who are Apprenticed to TENTING shall receive:—

During the 1st year of their apprenticeship, 14s. per week.

During the 2nd year of their apprenticeship, 17s. 6d. per week.

During the 3rd year of their apprenticeship, 21s. per week.

During the 4th year of their apprenticeship, 32s. per week.

Male Apprentices who are Apprenticed to DRESSING shall receive:—

During the 1st year of their apprenticeship, 14s. per week.

During the 2nd year of their apprenticeship, 17s. 6d. per week.

During the 3rd year of their apprenticeship, 21s. per week.

PART II.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR MALE IMPROVERS (AS HEREIN DE- FINED) IN TENTING OR DRESSING.

A MALE IMPROVER IN TENTING, that is to say, a male worker who has completed a term of four years' apprenticeship in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule with regard to Male Apprentice Tenters, shall receive during the first year of his employment as a TENTER, subsequent to the completion of his apprenticeship, 40s. per week.

A MALE IMPROVER IN DRESSING, that is to say, a male worker who has completed a term of three years' apprenticeship in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule with regard to Male Apprentice Dressers, shall receive during the first year of his employment

as a DRESSER, subsequent to the completion of his apprenticeship, 32s. *per week*.

PART III.

DEFINITION OF "WEEK."

SECTION I.—

(a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period, whose customary working week consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 44, "a week" means a week of the number of hours customarily worked by the class in question.

(b) In all other cases "a week" means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment the rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule must be divided:—

(a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section I (a) of this Part by the number of hours per week customarily worked by the class in question.

(b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION III.—Payment at not less than the hourly rate calculated as described in Section II of this Part must be made for *all* hours of employment whether in excess of the customary working week or not, except for those hours in respect of which a higher rate is payable under the overtime provisions specified in Part IV below.

PART IV.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE APPRENTICES AND IMPROVERS IN TENTING AND DRESSING.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner set out in the Schedule to the Notice F.H. (6) issued by the Trade Board and dated 21st October, 1921, shall apply in substitution for the rates set out in Parts I and II of this Schedule, in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the Notice F.H. (6) dated 21st October, 1921, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART V.

DEFINITION OF MALE APPRENTICE.

For the purpose of the application of the Minimum Rates set out in Parts I, II and IV of this Schedule, an APPRENTICE is defined as being a male worker of 16 years of age or over who:—

(a) Is employed during the whole of his time in accordance with the provisions of this Schedule under an Indenture (duly stamped) for a period of four years in the case of apprentice tenters or for a period of three years in the case of apprentice dressers, in the form prescribed by the Trade Board as set out in Part VI of this Schedule, and

(b) Has been registered with the Trade Board in accordance with rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such registration which has been duly acknowledged, and is still under consideration.

Provided that:—

(i) The registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of apprenticeship are not complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the minimum rates and under the special conditions for apprentices without registration for a probation period not exceeding twelve weeks; but in the event of such worker being continued thereafter at his employment as an Apprentice, the probation period shall be included in his period of apprenticeship.

PART VI.

FORM OF INDENTURE OF APPRENTICESHIP PRESCRIBED BY THE ABOVE TRADE BOARD.

THIS INDENTURE made the _____ day of _____ between _____, a minor of the age of _____ years (hereinafter called the "Apprentice") of the first part, _____ of _____, the parent or guardian of the Apprentice (hereinafter called the "Guardian") of the second part, and _____ of _____ (hereinafter called the "Employer") of the third part;

WITNESSETH as follows, that is to say:—

1. The Apprentice of his own free will and with the consent of the Guardian hereby binds himself to serve the Employer as his apprentice in his trade of _____ for the term of _____ years from the date of these presents.

2. In consideration of the covenants and agreements entered into by the Guardian and the Apprentice, the Employer hereby covenants with the Guardian and the Apprentice and with each of them severally as follows:—

(a) That he will keep the Apprentice as his Apprentice during the said term and to the best of his power, skill and knowledge instruct the Apprentice or cause him to be instructed in the section of the Flax and Hemp Trade known as _____

(b) That he will keep the Apprentice under his own supervision or place him under a fully qualified Journeyman (or Journeymen).

(c) That he will pay to the Apprentice every week during the said term wages in accordance with the appropriate scale of wages as fixed and as varied from time to time for Male Apprentices by the Trade Board, subject always to the wages being paid pro rata in the event of the employer being unavoidably compelled to work short time for any period, and provided that should the period of short time last for four continuous months the parties may agree to cancel the Indenture.

(d) That in the event of the Apprentice being absent from work through ill health and in receipt of sickness benefit under the National Insurance Act or through unemployment within the meaning of the Unemployment Insurance Act, the Employer shall not be bound to pay wages to the Apprentice in accordance with Clause 2 (c) of this Indenture.

(e) That if the Employer shall die or become permanently incapacitated through illness or injury (to be certified by a fully qualified Medical Practitioner) or cease to carry on the said trade of _____

* Insert "three" in the case of Apprentice Dressers, or "four" in the case of Apprentice Tenters.

before the expiration of the said term of apprenticeship, then and in any such case, the Employer or his Executors or his Administrators, as the case may be, shall, after obtaining the consent and approval of the Guardian and of the said Apprentice, which consent and approval shall not be unreasonably withheld, use all reasonable efforts to find another suitable employer for the Apprentice to take over this Indenture.

(f) That in the event of the death, incapacity or removal of the Guardian from the District in which the Apprentice resides, it shall be open to the Apprentice to propose to the Employer in writing that the Indenture be cancelled, and the Employer shall not unreasonably withhold his consent to the cancellation of the Indenture on these grounds.

(g) That he will not hold the Apprentice liable to make good the value of any work which he may spoil whilst learning his trade, except in the case of wilful or malicious damage.

(h) That he will cause the Apprentice to attend during the terms of this Indenture such approved technical classes as may be agreed by the parties concerned in the Indenture, the Apprentice to suffer no loss of wages by reason of such attendance or by reason of his attendance at school in accordance with the Education Act, 1918, and the time so spent to be reckoned as an equivalent part of the usual working hours and not extra thereto.

(i) That he will supply the Apprentice forthwith, upon its execution, with a true copy of this Indenture.

3. In consideration of the premises, the Guardian and the Apprentice jointly and severally covenant with the Employer as follows:—

(a) That the Apprentice shall truly and faithfully during the said term serve the Employer as his apprentice and his secrets keep and shall diligently attend to the said trade and at all times willingly obey the lawful and reasonable commands of the Employer, and shall not absent himself from the Employer's service without leave.

(b) That the Apprentice shall not do any damage or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the goods, moneys or other property of the Employer.

(c) That the Apprentice shall willingly perform all such shop duties as are usually done by Apprentices.

(d) That the Apprentice shall attend such continuation classes between the hours of 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. as the Employer desires provided that the Apprentice suffer no loss of wages by reason of such attendance.

(e) That in case the Apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to lawful orders or commands of the said Employer, or be slothful or negligent or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself towards the Employer then it shall be lawful to cancel this Indenture and discharge the said Apprentice.

4. Any matter in dispute between the parties arising out of the interpretation or application of the terms of the clauses of this Indenture shall be submitted to the Chairman of the Trade Board for the time being with a view to a settlement.

(3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also

(4) The weaving of carpets, rugs and mats.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are to be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

Signed by order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour confirming the minimum rates as varied by the Trade Board and set out above and specifying the Twenty-seventh day of February, 1922, as the date from which they should become effective.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Acts, 1909 and 1918, for those branches of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Tailoring) Order, 1919, which are covered by the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919, with respect to the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade in Great Britain, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates at present effective for Male and Female Learners and Apprentices respectively set out in the Schedules to the Notices R.B. (15) dated 21st February, 1922, and R.B. (11) dated 8th October, 1921, issued by the Trade Board, and also TO VARY the Form of Indenture prescribed by the Trade Board and set out in Part IV of the Schedule to their said Notice R.B. (11), the proposed variations being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

This Notice is issued with the consent of the Minister of Labour.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF THE FORM OF INDENTURE OF APPRENTICESHIP PRESCRIBED BY THE TRADE BOARD.

The Trade Board propose to vary the Form of Indenture of Apprenticeship set out in Part IV of the Schedule to their Notice R.B. (11) dated 8th October, 1921, by the addition thereto of the following paragraph, which shall be inserted between paragraph 3 and paragraph 4 thereof:

"Notwithstanding any provisions hereinbefore contained the Employers shall not be bound to employ or instruct the Apprentice and the Apprentice on his part shall not be bound to serve the Employers upon such days as the Employers are unable to provide the Apprentice with work owing to causes beyond their control.

Provided that:—

- (a) Upon such days the Apprentice shall be deemed not to be employed under this Indenture or within the meaning of the Trade Boards Acts 1909 and 1918 or any statutory modification or amendment thereof.
- (b) In the event however of the Employers failing to provide the Apprentice with work for a continuous period of six weeks from any cause, whether beyond the control of the Employers or not, the Guardian and the Apprentice shall have the option by seven days' notice in writing to the Employers to determine this Indenture."

PART IV.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE LEARNERS AND APPRENTICES.

Overtime Rates, calculated on the appropriate General Minimum Time Rates proposed in Parts I and II of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part III. of the Schedule to the Notice R.B. (15) issued by the Trade Board, dated 21st February, 1922, shall (subject in the case of apprentices who are indentured in the form prescribed by the Trade Board, to the provisions contained therein with regard to overtime) apply in substitution for such General Minimum Time Rates in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours specified by the Trade Board in their said Notice R.B. (15) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART V.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall apply to the CLASSES OF WORKERS specified in this Notice, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919, and set out in Section II of Part V of the Schedule to the said Notice R.B. (15) issued by the Trade Board, dated 21st February, 1922.

Note.—*The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.*

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The proposed General Minimum Time Rates set out in this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours, and are subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION II.—Subject to the provisions of Section I of Part II of this Schedule, nothing in this Schedule shall apply to Apprentices employed under an Indenture or Contract in writing respectively entered into prior to 10th October, 1921, providing for the effective instruction of the Apprentice in making one or more of the garments specified in Part I of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (11) dated 8th October, 1921.

The Trade Board will consider any **OBJECTIONS** to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 22nd February, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

(11) dated 8th October, 1921, varying and fixing minimum rates of wages for certain male and female Apprentices. The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below are effective as follows:—

1. The General Minimum Time Rates and Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates specified in Sections I and II of Part I of this Schedule and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 22nd February, 1922.*
2. The General Minimum Time-Rates and Piece Work Basis Time Rates specified in Sections I, II and III of Part II of this Schedule, and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 21st November, 1921.
3. The General Minimum Time-Rates in respect of the Male Apprentices referred to in Section IV (A), of Part I of this Schedule as from 7th June, 1920, and the Overtime Rates based thereon as from 19th July, 1920.
4. In all other cases as from 10th October, 1921.

* Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 28th February, 1922.

SECTION VI.—Notwithstanding anything herein contained, the Minimum Rates of Wages for Female Workers set out in the Schedule to this Notice do NOT APPLY to APPRENTICES who have entered the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade under 21 years of age, and who are employed under a contract in writing, entered into prior to the 10th October, 1921, providing for their effective instruction for a period of not less than three years by a fully qualified tailor or tailoress in making a bespoke garment throughout.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HAVE DECLARED the NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE to be as follows:—

Provided that any other day (not being Sunday) may be substituted by an employer for Saturday, as the weekly short day, and in such case the normal number of hours of work on such substituted day shall be five and the normal number of hours on Saturday shall be nine.

Provided also that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a Male or Female Worker, in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade, shall be as follows:—

(A) MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME-WORK.

(1) For the FIRST TWO HOURS of Overtime on any day, except Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(2) For Overtime AFTER THE FIRST TWO HOURS of Overtime on any day except Sundays and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, and for all Overtime on Saturdays (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) For all time worked on SUNDAYS AND CUSTOMARY PUBLIC AND STATUTORY HOLIDAYS the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE-TIME.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum

Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Sub-Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or in the case of Saturday (or the weekly short day substituted therefor), exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that:—

(a) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

(b) Where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on alternate Saturdays, the Overtime Rate shall not be payable in the week on which attendance on Saturday is required until 50 hours have been worked.

(B) MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK.

(a) All Male and Female Workers employed on Piece-work in respect of whom a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed and made effective, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, as set out in this Part of this Schedule, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate or the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double-Time respectively.

(b) All Male and Female Workers (other than Male and Female Indentured Apprentices as defined in Part I of the Schedule to the Notice R.B. (11) issued by the Trade Board dated 8th October, 1921) in respect of whom a Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has not been fixed, employed on Piece-Work, shall receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, as set out in this Part of this Schedule, in addition to payment at Piece-Rates, each of which would yield, in the circumstances

of the case, to an ORDINARY WORKER not less than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable an amount equal to One-Quarter of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, One-Half of the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate or the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Sub-Section (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-work, were Time-and-a-Quarter, Time-and-a-Half or Double-Time respectively.

SECTION III.—Where a worker (*e.g.*, a worker of the Jewish Religion) is customarily employed on Sunday instead of Saturday, the Minimum Rates for Overtime as set out in this Part of this Schedule shall apply to such worker in like manner as if in the provisions of this Schedule as to Overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

PART IV. DEFINITION OF MALE AND FEMALE LEARNERS AND CONDITIONS AFFECTING THEIR EMPLOYMENT.

SECTION I.—For the purpose of this Notice, and subject to the provisions of Section II of this Part of this Schedule, the following definitions shall apply:—

A MALE or FEMALE LEARNER is a worker who, in the case of a MALE LEARNER, has not been employed for more than FIVE YEARS, and in the case of a FEMALE LEARNER, has not been employed for more than FOUR YEARS, in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade; and

(a) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his or her time in learning any branch or process of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade by an employer who provides the Learner with reasonable facilities for such learning, and

(b) Has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided also that an employer may employ a Learner on his or her first employment in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade without a certificate or registration for a probationary period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at his or her employment the probation period shall be included in his or her period of Learnership.

Notwithstanding compliance with the conditions specified in this Part of this Schedule, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if he or she works in a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of his or her parent or guardian.

SECTION II.—In the application of the General Minimum Time-Rates for Male Learners set out in Section III of Part I of this Schedule and for Female Learners set out

in Section IV of Part II of this Schedule the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) In determining the year of Learnership of a Male or Female Learner all employment of the Learner prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded. The General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to a Learner under 14 shall be the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate for the first year of Learnership.

(b) Any Male or Female Learner who has been previously employed in (i) any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, or (ii) any branch of Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring coming within the scope of the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), or (iii) any branch of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade coming within the scope of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board (Great Britain), shall be entitled, subject to the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section, to count the whole period of such previous employment.

(c) In the case of a Male Learner who, prior to being registered as a Learner under the provisions of this Notice, has received continuous instruction in Retail Bespoke Tailoring at any School or Institution where there is a class for Retail Bespoke Tailoring which is approved by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Board (Great Britain), every two School or Institutional years during which the Learner has been so instructed at any such School or Institution shall, for the purposes of this Notice and subject to the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section, be reckoned as one year of Learnership.

(d)—(i) A Female Learner shall cease to be a Learner and shall be entitled to the Minimum Rate applicable to her under the provisions of Part II of this Schedule upon the completion of four years' Learnership.

(ii) A Male Learner shall cease to be a Learner and shall be entitled to the Minimum Rate applicable to him under the provisions of Part I of this Schedule, upon the completion of five years' Learnership. Provided that in determining whether for the purposes of Section I of Part I of this Schedule a Male Worker has completed five years' Learnership, any previous experience in Retail Bespoke Tailoring in any School or Institution specified in paragraph (c) of this Section, shall be reckoned in accordance with the provisions of such paragraph.

PART V. APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice the respective Minimum Rates of Wages specified in this Schedule apply to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain of the CLASSES SPECIFIED IN THIS NOTICE in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919, and set out below.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained the Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall *not apply* to PACKERS, except where they are employed on Packing

operations which are performed in a work-room.

SECTION II.—The “Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade” wherever mentioned in this Notice means the Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations, that is to say:—

Those branches of Men's, Women's, Boys' and Girls' Bespoke Tailoring in which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct, if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor, to whom a Minimum Rate of Wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable, or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop, or in a building of which the shop forms part or to which the shop is attached.

Including—

(1)—(a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of Men's, Women's, Boys' or Girls' Tailored Garments where carried out for the individual wearer by a tailor who employs the worker direct as defined above.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried on in association with, or in conjunction with, the repairing, renovating, or re-making of the garments.

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the making of such garments.

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.

(4) The packing and all other operations incidental to, or appertaining to, any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring.

But excluding—

(1) All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments.

(2) The making of headgear.

Note.—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages shall be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made between Employers and Workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Made-Up Textiles) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers and the General Minimum Piece-Rates for Male Workers employed in Hand Hackling at present effective and set out in the Schedule to their Notice R. (19), dated 10th November, 1921, the variations proposed being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the Notice of Proposal to Vary being given.

SECTION V.

Notwithstanding anything contained in Sections I., II., III. and IV. of this Part of this Schedule a Female Worker entering the Trade for the first time at or over the age of 16 years and a Male Worker entering the Trade for the first time at or over the age of 18 years, may be employed for a period not exceeding six months at a General Minimum Time-Rate which is less by ½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers and less by 1d. per hour in the case of Male Workers than the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable under Sections I., II., III. and IV. of this Part of this Schedule.

SECTION VI.

In cases where a worker is employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker an amount not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable as set out in Sections I., II., III. and IV. of this Part of this Schedule. Provided that in determining as to whether any Piece-Rate satisfies the foregoing condition, regard shall only be had, in the case of female workers, to the earnings of workers of 18 years of age and over, and in the case of male workers, to the earnings of workers of 21 years of age and over, who in both cases have had not less than six months' experience in the Trade.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS. (All ages.)

In lieu of the Overtime Rates at present in operation and set out in the Notice R. (19), issued by the Trade Board and dated 10th November, 1921, the proposed Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers, to apply in substitution for the Minimum Rates which would otherwise be applicable, in respect of all hours worked by a worker in excess of the number declared by the Trade Board to

be the normal number of hours of work in the trade as specified in Sections I. and III. of Part III. of the Notice R. (19), shall be as follows:—

A.—FOR ALL FEMALE WORKERS (OTHER THAN HOMEWORKERS) AND FOR ALL MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON TIME WORK.

(i) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the Proposed General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.* TIME-AND-A-QUARTER.

(ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and for all Overtime on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the proposed General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.* TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(iii) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be twice the proposed General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.* DOUBLE-TIME.

(iv) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the proposed General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.* TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of Section A of this Part.

B.—FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK.

Female and Male Workers (other than Female Homeworkers and other than Male Hand-Hacklers to whom the General Minimum Piece-Rates set out in Part II. of this Schedule are applicable and other than Female and Male Workers employed in Hand Machine Braiding to whom the General Minimum Piece Rates set out in the Trade Boards Notice R (20), are applicable, employed on Piece-Work shall be entitled to receive in respect of each hour of Overtime worked, *in addition to* Piece-Rates, each of which would yield in the circumstances of the case, to AN ORDINARY worker not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time Rate proposed, an amount equal to One Quarter of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time Rate proposed, One Half of the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time Rate proposed, or the appropriate Piece Work Basis Time Rate proposed according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of Section A of this Part if the worker had been employed on Time Work, were TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, TIME-AND-A-HALF or DOUBLE-TIME respectively.

C.—FOR MALE WORKERS EMPLOYED IN HAND-HACKLING ON PIECE-WORK TO WHOM THE GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES SET OUT IN PART II. OF THIS SCHEDULE ARE APPLICABLE.

(i) For the first two hours Overtime on any day except Saturday, Sunday, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed *with the addition of* 3½d. per hour.

(ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday, and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and for all Overtime on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed *with the addition of* 7½d. per hour.

(iii) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed *with the addition of* 1s. 2½d. per hour.

(iv) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed *with the addition of* 3½d. per hour, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of Section C. of this Part.

PART IV.

A Homeworker or Outworker is a worker who works in her own home, or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

PART V.

The above proposed respective Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, as amended by the Trade Boards (Made-up Textiles) Order, 1920, and set out in Section II. of Part V. of the Schedule to the notice R. (19) issued by the Trade Board and dated 10th November, 1921.

NOTE—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any **OBJECTIONS** to the above Proposals which may be lodged with them within two months from the 25th day of February, 1922. Such objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary, The Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

For the purpose of this Notice the following definitions apply:—

- A **HOMEWORKER** is a worker who works in her own home or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.
- SHRINK NETTING** means that the netting is made by shrinking, i.e., the process of putting two meshes into one mesh in order to obtain the required taper or shrink. The net mesh when straight hangs diamond.
- PLAIN NETTING** is ordinary braiding, single selvage. The net mesh when straight hangs diamond.
- A **RAN-SHORT REEL**, a term of measurement representing the amount of twine wound on a reel 69 inches in circumference on the completion of 400 revolutions.
- SQUARE MESH WORK** means that this netting is made by gaining one mesh on the making side and shrinking one mesh on the opposite side. The net-mesh when straight hangs square.

PART III.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply to all Female Home-Workers within the scope of the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, as amended by the Trade Boards (Made-up Textiles) Order, 1920, and set out in Section II of Part V of the Schedule to the Trade Boards' Notice, R (19), dated the 10th November, 1921, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain as Piece-Workers on work to which the proposed General Minimum Piece Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule apply.

The Trade Board will consider any **OBJECTIONS** to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 25th February, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to the Secretary of the Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and so far as possible with reasons, what is objected to.

PROPOSAL TO VARY GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES AND OVERTIME RATES FOR HAND MACHINE BRAIDING.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, as varied by the Trade Boards (Made-up Textiles) Order, 1920, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Piece-Rates and Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed in Hand Machine Braiding at present effective and set out in the Schedule to their Notice R. (20) dated 10th November, 1921, by a reduction of approximately 6½ per cent. in the General Minimum Piece-Rates, and that the proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates and Overtime Rates to apply in lieu of those at present in operation and set out in the Notice R. (20), are as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the Notice of Proposal to Vary being given.

In lieu of the Overtime Rates at present in operation, and set out in the Notice R (20), issued by the Trade Board and dated 10th November, 1921, the proposed Overtime Rates for Male and Female Workers employed in Hand Machine Braiding on piece-work for which General Minimum Piece Rates are proposed in Part I of this Schedule, to apply in substitution for the minimum rates which would otherwise be applicable, in respect of all hours worked by a worker in excess of the number declared by the Trade Board to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade as specified in Sections I and III of Part II of their Notice R (20), shall be as follows:—

- (i) For the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Saturday, Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 3½d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 1½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers.
- (ii) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays and for all Overtime on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 7d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 3½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers.
- (iii) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 1s. 2d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and 7½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers.

- (iv) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be the appropriate General Minimum Piece-Rate proposed with the addition of 3½d. per hour in the case of Male Workers and of 1½d. per hour in the case of Female Workers, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (ii) and (iii) of this Part.

PART III.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts the Proposed Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply to all Male and Female Workers (other than Home-Workers) within the scope of the Trade Boards (Rope, Twine and Net) Order, 1919, as amended by the Trade Board's (Made-up Textiles) Order, 1920, and set out in Section II of Part V of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R (19), dated the 10th November, 1921, in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain as Piece-Workers on work to which the Proposed General Minimum Piece Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule apply.

NOTE.—The employment of Female Workers, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 25th February, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing, and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Rope, Twine and Net Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

SPECIAL REGULATIONS RESPECTING A COMPETITIVE EXAMINATION FOR APPOINTMENT TO THE CLERICAL CLASS (MEN) OF THE CIVIL SERVICE.

1. Candidates must be not less than 18 years of age on the first day of July, 1921. A Candidate born on 1st July, 1903, would be admitted. A candidate who becomes eligible for the offer of an appointment on the result of this examination will be assigned for unpenal service if he has attained the age of 50 at the date of the examination. No offer of appointment will be made to any candidate after he has reached the age of 60.

No exception on any grounds will be made to this rule.

2. In order to be eligible a candidate must have served in His Majesty's Forces or have served at sea and been awarded the British War Medal or the Mercantile Marine War Medal, and must have rendered one full year's approved service before the 1st July, 1921, and at least in part after the 4th August, 1914, in a temporary clerical post in a Government Department or in the War Department, Admiralty, or Air Ministry Establishments, or in such Department or Establishment and His Majesty's Forces combined.
