And whereas British Guiana is one of His Majesty's possessions:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Finance Act, 1917, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered and declared, that under the law in force in the Colony of British Guiana excess profits duty was chargeable for any accounting period which ended within the years 1917, 1918, 1919 and 1920 or which ended on the 31st day of December, 1917, 1918, 1919 and 1920, in respect of profits in respect of which excess profits duty was also payable in the United Kingdom, and that arrangements have been made with the Government of British Guiana whereby in respect of any such profits only the duty which is higher in amount is to be payable and that the amount of such duty is to be apportioned between the respective Exchequers in proportion to the amount of duty which would otherwise have been payable in the United Kingdom and in the Colony of British Guiana respectively.

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say, the Benefice (being a Vicarage) of Great Carlton and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Little Carlton, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Lincoln and in the Diocese of Lincoln:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Great Carlton and Little Carlton, duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Lincoln and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Lincoln signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas the said Benefice of Great Carlton is now full, the Reverend Edmund William Boswell Loft being the present Incumbent thereof, and the said Benefice of Little Carlton is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Edmund William Boswell Loft has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"And whereas the advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to each of the said Benefices of Great Carlton and Little Carlton now belongs to one and the same Patron or Patrons:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said William Shuckburgh, Bishop of Lincoln (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Great Carlton and the said Benefice of Little Carlton shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Great Carlton with Little Carlton' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Edmund William Boswell Loft if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Carlton shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

WHEREAS by treaty, grant, usage, sufferance or other lawful means, His Majesty The King has jurisdiction in Abyssinia:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in this behalf by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. This Order may be cited as "The Abyssinia (Amendment) Order in Council, 1921," and shall be read as one with the Abyssinia Order in Council, 1913, hereinafter called "the Principal Order."

2. The following provisions are substituted for articles 131 to 142 inclusive of the Principal Order:—

(1) A register of British subjects shall be kept in the office of every Consulate in Abyssinia.

(2) Every British subject resident in Abyssinia shall, in the month of January of each year, be registered at the Consulate of the Consular District within which he resides, provided that if some other Consulate is more easy of access, he may, with the assent of the Consular Officer, be registered there. A British subject arriving in Abyssinia must apply for registration within one month after his arrival; provided that a person who fails to apply for or to obtain registration within the time limited by this article may be registered at any time if he excuses his failure to the satisfaction of the Consular Officer.

(3) Where a person is in possession of a valid British passport, the Consular Officer shall, on the first registration of any such person, endorse on the passport without further fee

than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder a certificate of registration in such form as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State. Where any such person applies for the renewal of the registration and produces his passport, the renewal of the registration shall without further fee than that provided for in sub-article (6) hereunder be endorsed thereon.

(4) Every person who has not previously been registered applying to be registered under this Order shall, unless excused by the Consular Officer, attend personally for that purpose at the Consulate, but any person applying for the renewal of his registration need not attend personally unless directed by the Consular Officer so to do, provided that the registration of the wife or wives of a man who is registered under this Order may, if living with him, be effected without their personal attendance being required, and provided also that the registration of minors being his relatives in whatever degree, living with the head of a family who is registered under this Order, may be effected without their personal attendance being required.

(5) A person registered in any register of British subjects established in Abyssinia previously to the making of this Order shall be registered under the provisions of this Order, unless the Consular Officer is satisfied after enquiry that the previous registration was erroneous or that such person is not entitled to registration under the provisions of this Order.

(6) Every person shall, on every registration of himself, and on every renewal of the registration, pay a fee of two shillings and sixpence, or such other fee as the Secretary of State from time to time appoints. The amount of the fee may be uniform for all persons, or may vary according to the position and circumstances of different classes, if the Secretary of State from time to time so directs, but may not in any case exceed five shillings.

(7) Where any person applies to be registered, he shall be entitled, without a fee, to the assistance of the Consular Officer in the preparation of any affidavit that may be required.

(8) The Consular Officer may require the production of such evidence that an applicant for registration is entitled to the status of a British subject as he may see fit, but subject to such directions as may be issued by the Secretary of State.

(9) If any British subject neglects to obtain registration under the provisions of this Order, he shall not be entitled to be recognised or protected as a British subject in Abyssinia, and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding two pounds for each instance of such failure, but he shall, although not registered, be subject to the jurisdiction of His Majesty's Courts in Abyssinia.

3. From and after the commencement of this Order, articles 131 to 142 inclusive of the Principal Order are hereby repealed, but such repeal shall not prejudice any rights, obligations or liabilities accrued thereunder.

4.—(1) This Order shall take effect as soon as it is first exhibited in the public office of the Court of the Consul General, and that date is in this Order referred to as the commencement of the Order.

(2) For that purpose the Consul General shall, on the receipt by him of a certified printed copy of the Order, cause the same to be affixed and exhibited conspicuously in that office. He shall also keep the same so affixed and exhibited during one month from that first exhibition.

(3) Proof shall not in any proceeding or matter be required that the provisions of this article have been complied with, nor shall any act or proceeding be invalidated by any failure to comply with any such provisions.

INDENTURE OF APPRENTICESHIP prescribed by the above Trade Board.

THIS INDENTURE made the day of between a minor of the age of years (hereinafter called the "Apprentice") of the first part, of the Parent or Guardian of the Apprentice (hereinafter called the "Guardian") of the second part and of (hereinafter called the "Employer") of the third part:

WITNESSETH as follows, that is to say:

1. The Apprentice of his own free will and with the consent of the Guardian hereby binds himself or herself to serve the Employer as his Apprentice in his trade of for the term of * years from the date of these presents.
2. In consideration of the covenants and agreements entered into by the Guardian and the Apprentice, the Employer hereby covenants with the Guardian and the Apprentice and with each of them severally, as follows:—
 - (a) That he will keep the Apprentice as his Apprentice during the said term and to the best of his power, skill and knowledge instruct the Apprentice or cause him to be instructed in the section or sections of the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade known as
 - (b) That he will keep the Apprentice under his own supervision or place him or her under a fully qualified Journeyman (or Journeymen).
 - (c) That he will pay to the Apprentice every week during the said term wages in accordance with the appropriate scale of wages as fixed and as varied from time to time for Male or Female Apprentices by the Trade Board.

- (d) That if the Employer shall die or become permanently incapacitated through illness or injury (to be certified by a duly qualified Medical Practitioner) or cease to carry on the said trade of before the expiration of the said term of apprenticeship, then, and in any such case, the Employer or his Executors or his Administrators as the case may be, shall, subject to the consent and approval of the Guardian and of the said Apprentice being obtained, find another suitable Employer for the Apprentice to take over this Indenture.
- (e) That he will not hold the Apprentice liable to make good the value of any work which he or she may spoil whilst learning his or her trade, except in the case of wilful or malicious damage.
- (f) That he will cause the Apprentice to attend during the term of this Indenture such approved technical classes as may be agreed upon by the parties concerned in the Indenture, the Apprentice to suffer no loss of wages by reason of attendance at any Technical Classes either as aforesaid or under the provisions of the Education Act, 1918, and the time so spent to be reckoned as an equivalent part of the usual working hours and not extra thereto.
- (g) That he will supply the Apprentice forthwith, upon its execution, with a true copy of this Indenture.

(c) Sewing Machinists.

Insert "four" in all other cases.

3. In consideration of the premises, the Guardian and the Apprentice respectively severally covenant with the Employer as follows:—

- (a) That the Apprentice shall truly and faithfully during the said term serve the Employer as his Apprentice and his secrets keep and shall diligently attend to the said trade and at all times willingly obey the lawful and reasonable commands of the Employer, and shall not absent himself or herself from the Employer's service without leave.
- (b) That the Apprentice shall not do any damage or knowingly suffer any damage to be done to the goods, moneys or other property of the Employer.
- (c) That the Apprentice shall willingly perform all such shop duties as are usually done by Apprentices.
- (d) That the Apprentice shall attend such continuation classes between the hours of 9 a.m. and 7 p.m. as the Employer desires provided that the Apprentice suffer no loss of wages by reason of such attendance.
- (e) That in case the Apprentice shall at any time during the said term be wilfully disobedient to lawful orders or commands of such Employer, or be slothful or negligent; or shall otherwise grossly misbehave himself or herself towards the Employer, it shall be lawful to discharge the said Apprentice, who shall be entitled to the right of appeal to the Trade Board.

4. In consideration of the Covenants and Agreements entered into by the Guardian and the Apprentice with the Employer, it shall be mutually agreed that:

If either of the parties hereto desires for any reason to determine this Agreement before the expiration of the said period of two or four years or in the event of any dispute arising involving allegations of unsuitability or of failure to apply himself or herself diligently to learn the said operation on the part of the Apprentice or of failure on the part of the Employer to cause him or her to be well and sufficiently instructed in the said operation or of wrongful exercise by the Employer of his power to dismiss the Apprentice under Clause 3 e hereof which cannot be settled between the parties hereto the Employer and the Apprentice hereby mutually agree that the matters in dispute shall stand referred in the first instance to the Perambulator and Invalid Carriage Trade Board (Great Britain) with a view to effecting a settlement thereof.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Authorisation of Show and Sale at Yeovil.

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, or in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922, the holding of a Show and Sale by Messrs. W. Palmer and Company, at the Repository in the borough of Yeovil, on the third day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, is hereby authorised, subject to the conditions herein-after specified.

Movement of Animals to Show and Sale.

2.—(1) No animal shall be moved to the Show and Sale except from premises situated within the counties (including any boroughs geographically situated therein) of Dorset, Somerset and Wiltshire.

(2) No animal shall be moved to the Show and Sale unless it is accompanied by a licence authorising such movement granted by the Local Authority of the administrative county of Somerset or by some person authorised by that Local Authority to issue such licences.

Removal of Animals from Show and Sale.

3. Animals shall not be removed from the Show and Sale unless they are accompanied by a movement licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the premises to which the animals are intended to be moved are situate, which licence the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant in respect of movement to any premises in their district, notwithstanding the provisions of the Orders referred to in Article 1. No such licence shall be granted for the movement of an animal to any premises situated in the area described in the Second Schedule to the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922, No. 8, or in any area which is for the time being a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920.

Conditions of Movements.

4. Except as provided in this Order the provisions of the Orders referred to in Article 1, relating to animals moved with a licence under

those Orders, shall apply to animals moved with a licence under this Order.

Cattle, sheep, goats or swine shipped from Ireland shall not, unless and until it is otherwise ordered by the Minister, be landed after noon on the third day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-two, at the landing place defined by Order of the Minister as a landing place for Irish animals at Manchester.

Local Authority to Enforce Order.

2. The provisions of this Order shall be executed and enforced by the Local Authority.

Offences.

3. If any animal shall be landed in contravention of this Order, the owner thereof and the owner and the lessee and the occupier of the place of landing, and the person causing, directing or permitting the landing, and the owner and the charterer, and the master of the vessel from which the same is landed, as the case may be, shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or defaults, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 1ST MARCH 1922.)

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 9).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Application of Order to Scheduled Districts.

1. Parts I, III and IV of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," are hereby applied, subject to the modifications hereinafter appearing, to the several districts described in the First Schedule hereto, each of which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Movement into Scheduled Districts.

2. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Principal Order, animals may be moved by road or rail into any Scheduled District described in the First Schedule hereto from premises in either of the areas described in the Third Schedule hereto for any purpose, if accompanied throughout the movement by a licence granted under this Order.

Prohibition of Movement out of certain Areas Specified in Second Schedule.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Principal Order, or this Order, no cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved out of any of the areas described in the Second Schedule hereto, except direct to a slaughterhouse situated within any Scheduled District described in the First Schedule hereto, and then only if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted under this Order.

Movement from one Scheduled District to another for Immediate Slaughter.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal Order, an animal may be moved from any premises situate within any Scheduled District described in the First Schedule hereto, to any slaughterhouse in another such Scheduled District, if accompanied by a Movement Licence granted under this Order.

Slaughter within 48 hours of Animals moved with a Licence to a Slaughterhouse.

5. Where animals are moved with a licence under the Principal Order or this Order authorising their movement to a slaughterhouse, the animals on arrival at the slaughterhouse shall be detained therein until slaughtered, and shall be slaughtered therein within forty-eight hours of their arrival thereat.

Modification of Principal Order as regards Granting of Movement Licences.

6.—(1) A Movement Licence granted under the Principal Order or this Order shall be granted only by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the premises to which the animals are to be moved

are situate. Except as provided in Article 8 of this Order a licence so granted shall not be available unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the animals are to be moved, who shall in every case endorse upon the licence the route by which the animals are to be moved and the date and time of the countersignature. No licence shall be granted or countersigned by an Inspector of any Local Authority if in his opinion it is undesirable to grant or countersign it.

(2) A movement licence granted under this Order shall be available for three days from the time it is countersigned, and no longer.

(3) In the case of every movement of animals authorised by a licence under this Order, the licence shall accompany the animals throughout the movement.

Holding of Farm Sales.

7. Notwithstanding anything contained in the principal Order, no sale of cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be held on any farm premises in any Scheduled District described in the First Schedule hereto unless it is authorised by the Local Authority under this Article, which authority the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant: Provided that no such sale shall be authorised to be held on any premises situated within any area described in the Second Schedule hereto.

Movement direct to a Slaughterhouse of Animals landed from Ireland.

8. Animals landed at an Irish Animals Landing Place shall not be moved therefrom except direct to a slaughterhouse, and then only if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District in which the slaughterhouse is situate. The licence shall in such cases be countersigned by an Inspector of the Ministry before the animals leave the landing place.

Movement of Animals into any part of Great Britain not within any Scheduled District.

9. No cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be moved by rail or otherwise into either of the areas described in the Third Schedule hereto from any Scheduled District described in the First Schedule or from the other area described in the Third Schedule hereto.

Offences.

10. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is done or omitted to be done, and the occupier of the premises concerned shall, each according to and in respect of his own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Revocation.

11. The Orders described in the Fourth Schedule hereto are hereby revoked.

Commencement.

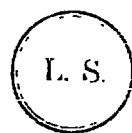
