WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 7th day of February, 1922, (GH), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 20 of the Grenwich Hospital Act, 1865, it is enacted, inter alia, that the Admiralty shall from time to time continue or appoint such Officers, Clerks, and

Servants for the purposes of the Hospital and Schools as seem fit, and may (subject to the approval of Your Majesty in Council) fix the salaries of such Officers and Clerks:

"And whereas by Section 8 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1872, it is enacted that the provisions of Section 20 of the Greenwich Hospital Act, 1865, so far as the same relate to salaries, shall extend to pensions and pecuniary benefits of any kind:

"And whereas Mr. L. Stacey, Assistant to the Clerk in Charge of the Greenwich Hospital Department of the Admiralty, retired on the 8th January, 1922, from the service of Greenwich Hospital on account of age:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased, by Your Order in Council, to authorize the grant from the funds of Greenwich Hospital to Mr. Stacey of a pension at the rate of Three hundred and sixty-six pounds, four shillings and ten pence (£366 4s. 10d.) a year as from the date of his retirement, and a gratuity of One thousand one hundred and forty-six pounds, four shillings and four pence (£1,146 4s. 4d.):
