WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 4th day of March, 1922 (C.W. 2004/22), in the words following, viz.:—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval

or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Section II of Schedule V of Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to establish, *inter alia*, a scale of Full Pay for Officers of the Engineer Branch of the Royal Navy and to provide that a Lieutenant (E) or Lieutenant Commander (E) who reverts to deck duties is to receive pay on the scale of the Executive Branch while employed solely on such duties:

"And whereas we are of opinion that it is desirable in the interests of Your Majesty's service to give certain Lieutenants (E) a course of Physical Training with a view to appointing such Officers to the Mechanical Training Establishment at Portsmouth for Physical Training duties in lieu of Officers of the Executive Branch:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction, with effect from the 11th day of February, 1922, the issue of Pay at the rates authorized for Officers of the Engineer Branch to Lieutenants (E) whilst undergoing a course of Physical Training and to a Lieutenant (E) or a Lieutenant Commander (E) whilst employed on

Physical Training duties in the Mechanical Training Establishment at Portsmouth provided that they have not reverted permanently to deck duties, and that they shall not be regarded as eligible to receive the Physical Training allowance authorized for Officers who have qualified for such duties by Section VI of Schedule V of Your Majesty's Order in Council of the 22nd day of January, 1920.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 13th day of March, 1922 (C.W. 11916/21), in the words following, viz.—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions, or other allowances in the nature thereof, payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner, and subject to such restrictions, conditions, and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas in the revised scales of retired pay of Officers of Your Majesty's Naval Service which were established by Your Majesty's Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, no provision was made for the rates of retired pay to be granted to Officers of the rank or corresponding rank of Lieutenant-Commander or Lieutenant who are placed on the Retired List on account of non-service at ages of less than 40 years:

"And whereas we consider it desirable in the interests of Your Majesty's Service that such provision should now be made in the cases of the Officers prescribed in the annexed Schedule:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased by Your Order in Council to sanction the Regulations set forth in the said Schedule, with effect from the 1st day of April, 1919.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal.

"SCHEDULE.

"1. The following Regulations to apply to Officers of the rank or corresponding rank of Lieutenant-Commander or Lieutenant in the Executive, Engineer and Accountant Branches of the Royal Navy, other than:—

(a) Officers on the Supplementary List.

(b) Officers promoted from the rank of Mate or Mate (E).

(c) Officers formerly of Warrant rank promoted for long and zealous services.

(d) Officers formerly of Warrant rank promoted for acts of gallantry or daring.

(e) Officers specially promoted to the rank or corresponding rank of Lieutenant during the war from Warrant rank or Commissioned Officer from Warrant rank.

"2. Officers who are placed on the Retired List on account of non-service under the age of 40 years to be granted retired pay at the rate of £75 a year with an addition of £7 10s. a year for each of the first six complete years of service, and an addition of £12 10s. a year for each complete year of service subsequent thereto, in the ranks or corresponding ranks of Lieutenant and Lieutenant-Commander, the time of such Officers while on unemployed pay or half pay to count as one-third of full service for this purpose.

"3. Any such Officer previously retired for non-service under the age of 40 years who served during the recent war in any service capacity and who has not been relegated to the Retired List for misconduct to be eligible to have his retired pay reassessed on the above scale if such reassessment should be to his advantage.

"4. The above rates to be subject to review on or after the 1st July, 1924."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by section sixty-nine of the Government of Ireland Act, 1920 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), His Majesty is empowered by Orders in Council (therein referred to as "Irish Transfer Orders") to make such regulations as seem necessary or proper for setting in motion the Parliaments and Governments of Southern

and Northern Ireland, and also for any other matter for which it seems to His Majesty necessary or proper to make provision for the purpose of bringing the Act into full operation or for giving full effect to any of the provisions of the Act:

And whereas it is provided by subsection (3) of section thirty-two of the Act that it shall be the duty of the Joint Exchequer Board to determine any matter which is to be determined by the Board in pursuance of any Irish Transfer Order made under the Act:

And whereas for the purposes of the financial provisions of the Act the twenty-second day of November, 1921, has been fixed as the appointed day as respects Northern Ireland, and for the purposes of the provisions of the Act relating to the transfer of services the twenty-second day of November, 1921, the first day of December, 1921, the first day of January, 1922, the first day of February, 1922, and the first day of March, 1922, have respectively been fixed by Orders in Council, dated the ninth day of November, 1921, and the twenty-second day of December, 1921, respectively, as the appointed days as respects Northern Ireland in relation to the several Irish services mentioned in the said Orders respectively, but no day has yet been fixed for the purposes aforesaid as respects Southern Ireland:

And whereas the provisions of section 1 of the Rules Publication Act, 1893, have been complied with:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1.—(1) This Order may be cited as the Government of Ireland (Adjustment of Payments) Order, 1922.

(2) The Interpretation Act, 1889, applies for the purposes of the interpretation of this Order in like manner as it applies to the interpretation of an Act of Parliament.

2. The Joint Exchequer Board shall, at the request of the Treasury, determine any question that may arise—

(a) as to the extent to which any charge on the Consolidated Fund of the United Kingdom for Irish services, including any charge for the benefit of the Local Taxation (Ireland) Account, or any grant or contribution out of moneys provided by the Parliament of the United Kingdom, so far as made for those services, ought to abate;

(b) as to the extent to which any payment to be made directly or indirectly out of the Local Taxation (Ireland) Account for Irish services ought to be reduced

by reason of the coming into operation of the financial provisions of the Act as respects Northern Ireland and the transfer of Irish services to the Government of Northern Ireland; and in making such determination the Board shall endeavour to secure that the charge, grant, contribution or payment shall, pending the coming into operation of the financial provisions of the Act as respects Southern Ireland and the transfer of Irish services to the Government of Southern Ireland, continue at a rate or amount sufficient to enable the like payments to be made thereout for purposes in Southern Ireland as would have been made if the Act had not passed.

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order and declare, and be it ordered and declared, as follows:—

In respect of every importation licence granted by the Secretary of State in pursuance of the provisions of Section 40, sub-section (9), of the Explosives Act, 1875, there shall be paid a fee of Two Pounds (£2) for each Two Thousand Pounds or part of Two Thousand Pounds allowed to be imported under the said Licence. Provided that in the case of a consignment of explosive imported for transshipment only and not for distribution in the United Kingdom only one-half of the foregoing fee shall be charged.

The Order in Council of the 9th day of October, 1919, is hereby revoked.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Part II of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the parts of His

Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:—

The Colony of Nigeria.
The Straits Settlements.

And the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislatures of the territories hereinafter mentioned have made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within those territories of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland and the High Court in Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

Part II. of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the territory under His Majesty's protection hereunder mentioned:—

The Protectorate of Nigeria.

And also to the territory in respect of which a mandate is being exercised by His Majesty's Government hereunder mentioned:—

The Tanganyika Territory.

And the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 63, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 2nd day of March, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, and of the Act of the 37th and 38th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 63, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of the Benefice (being a Rectory) of North Cove situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich with part of the neighbouring Benefice (being an United Benefice) of Mutford with Barnby situate in the said County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Norwich and for effecting the union of the residue of the said Benefice of Mutford with Barnby with the contiguous Benefice (being a Rectory) of Rushmere (Saint Michael) situate in the said County of Suffolk and in the said Diocese of Norwich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the Right Reverend Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, (being the Bishop of the Diocese in which that one of the aforesaid Benefices which has the larger population is situate) pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of North Cove with a portion of the said United Benefice of Mutford with Barnby and further to inquire into and report upon the union of the said Benefice of Rushmere (Saint Michael) with the remaining portion of the said United Benefice of Mutford with Barnby duly made their Report to the said Bishop of Norwich, and therein recommended the severance from the said United Benefice of Mutford with Barnby of the Benefice of Mutford and the union of the Benefice of Mutford so severed with the contiguous Benefice of Rushmere (Saint Michael) and therein further recommended the union of the remaining portion of the said United Benefice of Mutford with Barnby with the neighbouring Benefice of North Cove and the terms for effecting the said two unions and the said Bishop of Norwich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for effecting the two unions of Benefices so recommended as aforesaid which Scheme is based upon the terms recommended in the said Report but with the assent of the said Bishop of Norwich and with the assent of the Right Reverend Albert, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, embodies certain modifications thereof:

"And whereas the said Benefices of North Cove and Rushmere (Saint Michael) are now full, the Reverend Horace Harrison Dudgeon being the present Incumbent of North Cove and the Reverend Thomas Heavyside Peat

being the present Incumbent of Rushmere (Saint Michael) and the said Benefice of Mutford with Barnby is at present vacant:

"And whereas the said Horace Harrison Dudgeon has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice of North Cove with Barnby if and when the union recommended and proposed in Part I of this Scheme shall take effect:

"And whereas only one Parsonage House will be left standing or remaining within or belonging to each of the United Benefices when the unions which are hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect, namely the Parsonage Houses at present belonging to the said Benefices of Mutford with Barnby and Rushmere (Saint Michael) and the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Mutford with Barnby will accordingly become the Parsonage House of the United Benefice of North Cove with Barnby and the Parsonage House belonging to the said Benefice of Rushmere (Saint Michael) will accordingly become the Parsonage House of the United Benefice of Mutford with Rushmere:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Bertram, Bishop of Norwich, and with the consent also of the said Albert, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof they have signed this Scheme and sealed the same with their Episcopal Seals), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"PART I.

"As to the union of the said Benefice of North Cove with the said United Benefice of Mutford with Barnby we recommend and propose:—

"1. That the said Benefice of North Cove and the said United Benefice of Mutford with Barnby shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with Cure of Souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of North Cove with Barnby' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich and the Rural Deanery of Beccles, but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette the union shall forthwith take effect, and the said Horace Harrison Dudgeon if he is then Incumbent of the said Benefice of North Cove shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That after the union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation or nomination shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of North Cove and Mutford with Barnby alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Mutford with Barnby having the right upon the first presentation or nomination to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation or nomination and the Patron of the said Benefice of North Cove having the right of presentation or nomination upon the second presentation or nomination to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"PART II.

"As to the severance of a portion of the said United Benefice of Mutford with Barnby and the union of the portion so severed with the said Benefice of Rushmere (Saint Michael) we recommend and propose:—

"1. That a portion of the said United Benefice of North Cove with Barnby (referred to in Part I of this Scheme), that is to say, the Benefice of Mutford shall be severed from the remaining portion of the United Benefice of North Cove with Barnby and that the Benefice of Mutford so severed and the said Benefice of Rushmere (Saint Michael) shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Mutford with Rushmere' and that such United Benefice shall be included in and form part of the said Diocese of Norwich and the Rural Deanery of Lothingland, but the Parishes of the said Benefices of Mutford and Rushmere (Saint Michael) shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That with the consent of the said Horace Harrison Dudgeon testified by his signing this Scheme the union of the said Benefices of Mutford and Rushmere (Saint Michael) shall take effect upon the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, if the said Benefice of Rushmere (Saint Michael) be then vacant, or if the said Benefice of Rushmere (Saint Michael) be not then vacant, then such union shall take effect upon the first vacation of the said Benefice of Rushmere (Saint Michael) after such date of publication.

"3. That after the union of the said Benefices of Mutford and Rushmere (Saint Michael) has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice of Mutford with Rushmere from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices of Mutford with Barnby and Rushmere (Saint Michael) alternately, the Patrons of the said Benefice of Mutford with Barnby having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice of Mutford with Rushmere to be made after the union and every alternate right of presentation, and the Patrons of the said Benefice of Rushmere (Saint Michael) having the right of presentation upon the second presentation to the United Benefice of Mutford with Rushmere to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"4. That upon the union of the said Benefices of Mutford and Rushmere (Saint Michael) taking effect there shall be transferred and annexed to the United Benefice of Mutford with Rushmere all the endowments at present belonging to the said Benefice of Mutford with Barnby except the Tithe Rent Charges arising within the Parish of Barnby and at present payable to the Incumbent of the said Benefice of Mutford with Barnby which Tithe Rent Charges shall continue to belong to the United Benefice of North Cove with Barnby (referred to in Part I of this Scheme).

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accord-

ance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any other Act of Parliament."

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the prescribed time has elapsed and no such objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners:

WHEREAS the Minister of Health, after giving to the Incumbent and the Churchwardens of the Parish of Machynlleth, in the County of Montgomery, 10 days' previous notice of his intention in that behalf, has, under the provisions of the Burial Act, 1853, as amended by subsequent enactments, made a representation to His Majesty in Council that, for the protection of the public health, the opening of any new Burial Ground in the Civil Parish of Machynlleth, in the said County of Montgomery, save with the previous approval of the Minister of Health, should be prohibited, and that Burials should be discontinued therein, as follows, viz.:—

MACHYNLLETH.—Forthwith and entirely in the Parish Church of Machynlleth and in the Churchyard attached thereto.

Provided that—

(a) In any walled grave now existing in the said Churchyard, burial may be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such grave be separately enclosed by stonework or brickwork properly cemented.

(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin, containing the body, shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

Now, therefore, His Majesty in Council is pleased hereby to give Notice of such Representation, and to order that the same be taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council on the 22nd day of April next.

And His Majesty is further pleased to direct that this Order be forthwith published in the London Gazette, and that copies thereof be affixed on the doors of the Churches or Chapels of, or on some conspicuous places within, the Parish affected by such Representation one month before the said 22nd day of April.

4. This Order shall come into operation on the 1st day of April, 1922, and the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, shall have effect as amended by this Order.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime to apply in respect of all hours worked by TIME-WORKERS in excess of the normal number of hours of work in the trade as declared, and set out in Section I of this Part shall be as follows :—

(a) For all hours worked in excess of 5 on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, for the first four hours, and One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF thereafter, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(b) For all time worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE TIME, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

(c) For all hours worked in excess of 48 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be TIME-AND-A-QUARTER for the first six hours and TIME-AND-A-HALF thereafter except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-Sections (a) and (b) of this Section.

(d) The Overtime Rates shall not apply to Piece-Workers.

Provided that, where, in the case of Workers to whom the Shops Act applies, the day which under that Act constitutes the weekly short day (half holiday) is a day other than Saturday, and in the case of other Workers another day is substituted for Saturday, under the provisions of Section 43 of the Factory and Workshop Act, 1901, as respects Female Workers and Young Persons, the above provisions shall apply as though such half holiday or short day were substituted for Saturday and Saturday were substituted for such half holiday or short day.

Provided also that in cases in which another day is substituted for a Statutory Holiday under the provisions of Section 35 of the Factory Act, 1901, the above provisions shall apply as though such other day were the Statutory Holiday and the Statutory Holiday were an ordinary working day.

PART III.

APPLICABILITY OF RATES.

SECTION I.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Notice apply subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Wash-House and General Inside Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919 (that is to say, the laundering of articles of every description and all processes and operations incidental thereto performed by the way of trade or for the purpose of gain), as varied by the Trade Boards (Women's Clothing) Order, 1919, the Trade Boards (Shirt-making) Order, 1920, and the Trade Boards (Linen and Cotton Handkerchief and Household Goods and Linen Piece Goods) Order, 1920, by virtue of which all processes of laundering and other similar operations incidental to or appertaining to the making of the articles specified in the Appendices to the three last-mentioned Orders are excluded from the scope of the Trade Boards (Laundry) Order, 1919.

The Minimum Rates set out in this Notice DO NOT APPLY to Male Workers wholly or mainly employed as Transport Workers, Enginemmen or Stokers.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Notice must be paid clear of all deductions

other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION III.—The Minimum Rates set out in this Notice are without prejudice to Workers earning higher rates of wages.

- A. All Male Workers, 1s. 6½d. per hour.
- B. All Female Workers, 10d. per hour.

OVERTIME RATES.

See Part IV. below.

The Rates in full as legally enforceable are set out in detail in the Schedule below.

PART I.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

SECTION I.—MALE WORKERS:

- Workers of 14 and under 15 years of age, 14s. per week.
- Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 18s. per week.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 28s. per week.

Workers of 18 and under 19 years of age, 34s. per week.

Workers of 19 and under 20 years of age, 40s. per week.

Workers of 20 and under 21 years of age, 47s. per week.

Workers of 21 years of age and over, 60s. per week.

SECTION II.—FEMALE WORKERS:

Workers of 14 and under 15 years of age, 13s. per week.

Workers of 15 and under 16 years of age, 17s. per week.

Workers of 16 and under 17 years of age, 22s. per week.

Workers of 17 and under 18 years of age, 28s. per week.

Workers of 18 years of age and over, 32s. per week.

PART II.

SECTION I.—In the application of the General Minimum Time-Rates set out in Part I of this Notice, the following provisions shall apply:—

(a) In the case of classes of whole-time workers employed by the week or longer period whose usual working week, as agreed between the employer and the workers, consists of a number of hours less than 48 but not less than 44, "a week" means a week of the number of hours usually worked by the class in question as so agreed;

(b) In all other cases, "a week" means a week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—For the purpose of calculating the hourly rate applicable in respect of each hour of employment, the weekly rates set out in Sections I and II of Part I of this Notice must be divided:—

(a) In the case of the workers referred to in Section I (a) above, by the number of hours constituting the usual working week as agreed between the employer and the workers;

(b) In all other cases by 48.

SECTION III.—Payment at not less than the hourly rate calculated as described in Section II must be made for ALL hours of employment (not merely for those constituting "a week," as described in Section I), except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of Part IV of this Schedule.

PART III.

PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

A. MALE WORKERS, 1s. 6½d. per hour.

B. FEMALE WORKERS, 10d. per hour.

In the case of all workers employed on Piece-Work, each Piece-Rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case, not less than the equivalent of the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate to an ORDINARY WORKER, that is, a worker of ordinary skill and experience.

PART IV.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS.

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board HEREBY DECLARE THE NORMAL NUMBER OF HOURS OF WORK IN THE TRADE TO BE as follows:—

IN ANY WEEK	48
ON ANY DAY (other than Saturday)	9	
ON SATURDAY	5

Provided that all hours worked by a worker on Sundays and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as overtime to which the overtime rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates for overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade shall be as follows:—

(a) For the first two hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-quarter times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, **TIME-AND-A-QUARTER**.

(b) For the second two hours' overtime on any day except Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-half times the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, **TIME-AND-A-HALF**.

(c) For all hours in excess of the first four hours of overtime on any day except Sundays and Statutory Holidays and for all hours worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the minimum rate otherwise applicable, that is to say, **DOUBLE TIME**.

(d) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48, the Overtime Rate shall be **TIME-AND-A-QUARTER** for the first two hours, **TIME-AND-A-HALF** for the second two hours, and **DOUBLE TIME** thereafter, except in so far as higher overtime rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds 9 or, in the case of Saturday, 5, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Note.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and also to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART V.

The above minimum rates of wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Boot and Floor Polish) Order, 1920, that is to say:—

(1) the manufacture of boot and shoe polish or cream; blacking; dubbin or floor polish or cream; and

(2) the manufacture of stain for leather or of polish for leather or furniture, when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of any of the articles specified in paragraph (1) above;

including the following or similar operations when incidental to operations included in paragraph (1) or (2) above:—

(i) Checking, testing, grading, weighing, measuring;

(ii) Filling, lidding, boxing, bottling, packeting, labelling

(iii) Packing, unpacking, despatching, warehousing, portering, time-keeping, storing, stock-keeping;

but excluding the manufacture of boxes, canisters, or other containers.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 12).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Modification of Existing Orders.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 9) (hereinafter referred to as "Order 875"), and any Order amending that Order, are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Release of Scheduled District No. 3 (North Wales) and Certain Portions of Scheduled District No. 4 from Restrictions.

2. The Scheduled District No. 3 described in the First Schedule to Order 875, and the counties of Berkshire, Southampton and the Isle of Wight, with all boroughs geographically situate therein, shall cease to form part of any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 (hereinafter referred to as the "Principal Order"), and shall thereupon be included in and form part of the Area No. 2 of the Areas released from restrictions described in the Third Schedule to Order 875.

Release of Certain Areas from Special Restrictions.

3. The Orders referred to in Article 1 shall be read and have effect as if the Areas Nos. 3, 20, 21, 22, 23 and 26 described in the Second Schedule to Order 875 ceased to be subject to the special restrictions applied by Articles 3 and 7 of that Order to Areas so described, provided that such Areas (except Area No. 26) shall continue to form part of the respective Scheduled Districts in which they are situated.

Holding of Farm Sales.

4.—(1) Article 7 of Order 875 is hereby revoked.

(2) No sale of cattle, sheep, goats or swine shall be held on any farm premises in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Principal Order, unless it is authorized by a licence granted by the Local Authority under this Article. Provided that no such sale shall be licensed to be held on any premises situate within a radius of two miles from any place which is, for the time being, declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

(3) No licence shall be granted by an Inspector of a Local Authority for the movement of any animals from any sale held with a licence of the Local Authority granted under this Article to any premises which are situated within a radius of two miles from any place which is, for the time being, declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

(4) The route to be specified by the Inspector granting or countersigning a licence for the movement of an animal from a sale held with a licence of the Local Authority under this Article shall be such that at no point shall the animal be moved otherwise than by railway within a radius of two miles of any place which is, for the time being, declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease. If no such route is practicable, the Inspector shall not grant or countersign a licence.

(5) Notwithstanding anything contained in Article 3 of Order 875, a licence for movement of animals from a sale held with a licence of the Local Authority under this Article may, subject to the foregoing provisions, be granted for the movement of animals out of any Area for the time being included in the Second Schedule to Order 875, provided that the place of destination is in an adjoining Area which is also included in the said Second Schedule and is comprised in the same Scheduled District.

(6) No licence shall be granted under the Principal Order for the movement of animals to any farm premises for the purpose of sale thereon.

Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the seventeenth day of March, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

6. This Order may be cited as the FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 12).
