AMENDMENT OF STATUTE.

At a Meeting of the Principal and Fellows of Brasenose College, held on 22 February, 1922, it was resolved, by a majority consisting of not less than two-thirds of the number of persons present and voting on the question, pursuant to the provisions of the *Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877*, and

Statute XIX of the *College Statutes*, to make the following alterations of Statute, to wit:—

STATUTE VIII.

Clause 8 becomes clause 9.

Insert a new clause 8 as follows:—

"At any Scholarship Examination a Candidate may be admitted who on entering his name shall inform the Principal that he desires the status and privileges of a Scholar without the emoluments; any such Candidate if elected shall enjoy such status and privileges only without emoluments, and shall be regarded as an honorary Scholar: the whole number of vacancies advertised being filled up if suitable Candidates present themselves as if no such honorary Scholar had been elected."

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES FOR FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under that Act and the Trade Boards Provisional Orders Confirmation Act, 1913, for the Hollow-ware Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Board of Trade and dated the 6th July, 1914, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, THAT THEY PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates and Overtime Rates for Female and Male Workers and the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate for Female Workers of 18 years of age or over set out in their

Notice dated 28th September, 1921, and effective under Order of the Minister of Labour dated 21st September, 1921, the proposed variations being as set out in the Schedule below:—

DEFINITION OF LEARNERS :

For the purpose of this Notice :

- (a) A Female Learner is a worker under 18 years of age, or a worker who being of 18 years of age or over has had less than 12 months' experience in the trade, who (in both cases) is engaged in learning under conditions which in the circumstances of the case afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate for Female Workers other than Learners.
- (b) A Male Learner is any male person under 21 years of age who is employed under conditions which, in the circumstances of the case, afford a reasonable prospect of advancement to the General Minimum Time-Rate for Male Workers other than Learners.

PART II.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF THE OVERTIME RATES FOR ALL FEMALE AND MALE WORKERS.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule, in the manner set out in Part III. of the Schedule to the Trade Boards Notice, H. (10), dated 28th September, 1921, shall apply in substitution for the proposed Minimum Rates of Wages specified in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked by a worker, whether employed on time-work or on piece-work, in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice, dated 28th September, 1921, to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

THE ABOVE PROPOSED MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES ARE WITHOUT PREJUDICE TO WORKERS WHO ARE EARNING HIGHER RATES OF WAGES OR TO AGREEMENTS MADE OR THAT MAY BE MADE FOR THE PAYMENT OF WAGES IN EXCESS OF THE MINIMUM RATES.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 21st day of March, 1922.. SECTION I.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male and Female Workers (including Home-Workers) of the classes specified in the Schedule to this Notice in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Brush and Broom Trade as specified in Part VIII of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice M. (30), dated 14th December, 1921.

SECTION II.

The expression "Home-Worker" means a worker who works in his or her own home, or in any other place not under the control or management of the employer.

SECTION III.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION IV.

The above Minimum Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

Signed by Order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour confirming the Minimum Rates as varied by the Trade Board and set out above, and specifying the 20th March, 1922, as the date from which they should become effective.

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Modification of Existing Orders.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 9) (hereinafter referred to as "Order 875"), and any Order amending that Order, are modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Release of Certain Portions of Scheduled District No. 1 from Restrictions.

2. The Scheduled District described in the First Schedule hereto shall be substituted for the Scheduled District No. 1 described in the First Schedule to Order 875, and the area described in the Second Schedule hereto shall thereupon cease to form part of any Scheduled

District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920.

Extension of Article 9 of Order 875.

3. Article 9 of Order 875 shall be read and have effect as if the area described in the Second Schedule hereto were included in the Third Schedule to Order 875 as Number 3 of the areas released from restrictions.

Extension of Certain Existing Areas.

4. Order 875 shall be read and have effect as if the Areas Numbers 1 and 2 described in the Third Schedule hereto were added to and formed part of the Areas Numbers 1 and 2 respectively described in the Second Schedule to that Order.

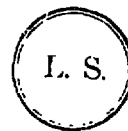

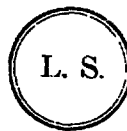
