During operations at Jandola, on 29th June, 1921, his company commander was killed, whereon he took charge of the company, and handled it with great skill and coolness. At the time he took over command the company was just starting to cross the Sagar Algard, being on the extreme right of the battalion. The enemy had held up this advance at this point by heavy fire and by carrying out an outflanking movement in force. The situation at this time was critical; if this company had not defeated the enemy flanking movement the remainder of the regiment would have been taken in rear. Although short of ammunition he defeated the flanking movement, after which, still under heavy fire, he got in all the wounded, rifles and equipment. When the retirement was started the enemy charged; in face of this he completely broke the enemy's rush and carried out a most skilful retirement. His company did not lose a

single rifle or piece of equipment, and brought in the equipment of a Lewis gun number who had been killed.

It was mainly due to the courage, skill and coolness of this Indian officer that the regiment was able to effect a successful retirement without the heavy loss in men and rifles which at one time seemed inevitable.

He himself displayed great personal bravery and set an excellent example to his men.

For bravery and ability during the attack on Khaniqin Road Station on 16th August, 1920. The insurgents set fire to a small

sleeper bridge on the railway about a mile from the station. This N.C.O., in command of fifteen men, made very gallant attempts to extinguish the fire under heavy enemy sniping from a hill commanding the bridge. He showed marked ability in commanding his men in subsequent operations (Iraq).

MACHINE GUN CORPS.

7817467 Pte. (A./Cpl.) Hobday, F. E., No. 7 Armd. Mot. By. (East Ham).

For gallant conduct and devotion to duty on 21st April, 1921, at Hinis Tangi whilst in command of an armoured car. The car was attacked by a party of about 50 Mahsuds. Cpl. Hobday jumped into the turret and, although wounded in five places, worked the gun with considerable effect, eventually dispersing the enemy with many casualties. He continued to work the gun until he fainted from loss of blood. As the car was not in good running order, Cpl. Hobday's action prevented the enemy from overwhelming his party (Waziristan).
