"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, acting in pursuance of the Union of Benefices Act, 1919, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting the union of two neighbouring Benefices, that is to say the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Great Saxham and the Benefice (being a Rectory) of Little Saxham, both of which Benefices are situate in the County of Suffolk and in the Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich:

"Whereas Commissioners appointed at our request by the late Right Reverend Henry Bernard, Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, pursuant to the provisions of the said Union of Benefices Act, 1919, to inquire into and report upon the union of the said two Benefices of Great Saxham and Little Saxham, duly made their report to the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich, and therein recommended the union of the said two Benefices and the terms for effecting the union, and the said Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich signified in writing his approval of the said Report:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, have prepared this Scheme for the union of the said two Benefices based upon the terms recommended in the said Report:

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Great Saxham and Little Saxham are now full, the Reverend William Murray (Charles Clarke being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Great Saxham, and the Reverend Charles Wesley Cyprian Floyd being the present Incumbent of the said Benefice of Little Saxham:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the Right Reverend Albert, now Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"1. That the said Benefice of Great Saxham and the said Benefice of Little Saxham shall be permanently united together and form one Benefice with cure of souls under the style of 'The United Benefice of Great and Little Saxham,' but the Parishes of the said Benefices shall continue distinct in all respects.

"2. That if upon the day when any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme shall be published in the London Gazette both of the said two Benefices shall be vacant the union of the same two Benefices shall take effect forthwith; and if the said Benefice of Great Saxham only shall be then vacant the said union shall also take effect forthwith if the Incumbent of the other of the said two Benefices shall consent to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, but if he shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect upon the then next avoidance of the said Benefice of Little Saxham and the then Incumbent of Great Saxham shall be the first Incumbent of the United Benefice; and if the said Benefice of Little Saxham only shall be then vacant the said union shall take effect upon the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Great Saxham, and if neither of the said two Benefices be then vacant, then the said union shall take effect on the next avoidance of the said Benefice of Great Saxham if the Incumbent at that time of the said Benefice of Little Saxham shall have been instituted to Little Saxham, subsequently to the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme or if instituted before that date shall consent to become the Incumbent of the United Benefice; but if he shall have been instituted to Little Saxham before that date and shall not so consent, then the said union shall take effect immediately upon the next vacancy of the Benefice of Little Saxham following such avoidance of the Benefice of Great Saxham and the then Incumbent of Great Saxham shall become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"3. That upon the said union taking effect the Parsonage House at present belonging to the said Benefice of Little Saxham shall become and be the house of residence for the Incumbent of the United Benefice.

"4. That after the said union has taken effect the course and succession in which the respective Patrons shall present or nominate to the United Benefice from time to time as the same shall become vacant shall be as follows, that is to say, the right of presentation shall be exercised by the Patrons of the said two Benefices alternately, the Patron of the said Benefice of Little Saxham having the right upon the first presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate right

of presentation and the Patron of the said Benefice of Great Saxham having the right upon the second presentation to the United Benefice to be made after the union and every alternate turn thereafter.

"Provided always that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, or of any other Act of Parliament.

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have been published locally in the manner prescribed in the Statutory Rules made under the said Act and also transmitted in the manner so prescribed to the Patrons affected together with a Notice in each case requiring any objections to such draft Scheme to be stated or transmitted in writing to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas certain objections have been so stated or transmitted to the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners within the time prescribed in the same Rules:

And whereas the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners after giving full consideration to such objections have deemed right to make no alterations in such draft Scheme:

And whereas public notice of the certification to His Majesty in Council of the said Scheme and the consent thereto in writing of the Bishop of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich has been duly given in the manner and within the time prescribed in the Statutory Rules aforesaid:

And whereas no appeal has been made to His Majesty in Council within the period of one month after the date of the said public notice in accordance with the provisions of the said Act against the said Scheme or any part thereof by any person who has made objection as aforesaid to the said draft Scheme:

And whereas neither of the two Benefices affected by the said Scheme is situate in a City or Municipal Borough:

And whereas the said Scheme has been approved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Saint Edmundsbury and Ipswich.

Burton Fleming with Fordon shall be transferred from the said Rural Deanery of Scarborough to the said Rural Deanery of Bridlington; and each of the Parishes or Cures hereinbefore referred to shall be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of the Rural Dean of the Rural Deanery to which it is hereby transferred, and shall not belong to or be a part of any other Rural Deanery, nor be subject to the jurisdiction and authority of any other Rural Dean.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other matter or thing with respect to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, by virtue of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.
(DATED 4TH APRIL 1922.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Application Order of 1917 (No. 1), shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and not being in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, if the swine are accompanied by a licence in the Form F set forth in the First Schedule to

the said Order of 1908, granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the county of Worcester, and the following conditions, which shall be specified in the licence, are complied with:—

(i) The swine shall be moved to the place of destination specified in the licence and not elsewhere, and shall be there detained and kept separate from all other swine for twenty-eight days, unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period, or are moved under and in accordance with the conditions of a licence in the Form C set forth in the said First Schedule to a bacon factory or slaughterhouse in the same Scheduled Area.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from all swine not being moved with a licence under this Order.

(iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police-station in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing such movement.

2. Swine may also be moved from the Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to premises situate in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, subject to the provisions of the Order of the Minister declaring such district to be a Scheduled District. Swine so moved shall also be subject to the conditions set out in paragraphs (i) (ii) and (iii) of Article 1 of this Order.

3. A copy of a licence issued under Article 1 of this Order shall be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination specified in the licence is situate.

4. A licence under this Order shall for the purposes of the Orders mentioned in Article 1 of this Order be treated as a licence under those Orders.

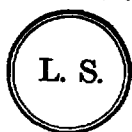

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 19).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries,
by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested
in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts,
1894 to 1914, and of every other power
enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as
follows:—

1. Where by reason of the restrictions on
movement imposed by the Orders made by the
Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries in rela-
tion to Foot-and-Mouth Disease, sheep which
have been moved to wintering quarters in an
Infected Area are not permitted to be moved
out of the Infected Area and by reason of
such restrictions remain upon the wintering
quarters, the occupier of the wintering
quarters—

(a) shall afford the owner of the sheep
and any person authorised by him all such
facilities for feeding, tending or otherwise
using the sheep, or for the sale of the sheep,
as the owner thereof may reasonably re-
quire; or

(b) where the owner of the sheep is unable
or unwilling to avail himself of such facili-
ties, shall take all such steps as are reason-
ably necessary for the proper feeding, tend-
ing or otherwise using the sheep.

2. These provisions shall continue to apply
so long as the said restriction on movement
continues to apply to the sheep, and for seven
days thereafter, and the owner of the sheep
shall be liable to pay to the person who affords
any such facilities or renders any such services
as aforesaid in compliance with this Order,
such sums by way of remuneration or recoup-
ment of expenses as may be just and reason-
able, the amount in default of agreement to
be determined in England and Wales by arbi-
tration under and in accordance with the pro-
visions of the Second Schedule to the Agricul-
tural Holdings Act, 1908, and in Scotland by
arbitration under and in accordance with the
provisions of the Second Schedule to the
Agricultural Holdings (Scotland) Act, 1908.

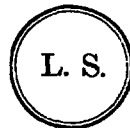
