FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 20).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power

enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Contraction of Scheduled District and Infected Area.

(1) The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 15) and any Order amending that Order, shall be read and have effect as if the parishes of Cambusnethan, East Kilbride, Glassford, New Monkland, Shotts, Stonehouse and Dalsersf, in the county of Lanark, were excluded from and ceased to form part of any Scheduled District or Infected Area to which that Order for the time
