*Bristol, March 1.* The 27th past arrived in this Port the *Dragon*, Capt. *Freake* Commander, in 7 weeks from *Jamaica*; and this day came in the *John* of this Place, in 17 days from *Cadiz*; she came out with the *Turkey Fleet*, and one Ship from the *East-Indies*, and parted from them near *Scilly*.

*Yarmouth, March 1.* Yesterday came into our Road 6 Dutch Men of War, who are bound to *Hull*, to join two other Men of War that are there.

*Portsmouth, Feb. 28.* Capt. *Jennings*, Commander of His Majesty's Ship the *Plimouth*, cruising with the *Severne* and *Rye* on the French Coast, saw on Thursday last near the Island of *Guernsey*, 12 sail to Leeward; he bore away, and in three hours came up with the Sternmost of them: They proved to be French Ships laden with Wine from *Bourdeaux*; Capt. *Jennings* passed by several of them, leaving them to be taken up by the *Severne* and *Rye*, and kept on his chace after their Convoys, being two Privateers of *Dunkirke*, one of twelve, the other of eight Guns; the latter he came up with and took, with two of the Merchant Men; and the *Severne* and *Rye* took 4 more. Night coming on, and the Weather being very thick and foggy, Capt. *Jennings* lost Company with the *Severne* and *Rye*; but coming in here yesterday found the *Rye* with the Prizes at *Spithead*.

*Deale, March 1.* This day came into the Downs the *Beake-Galley*, *Richard Strutton* Commander; who departed from *Cadiz* on the 12th of *February*, with the *Turkey Convoy*, and other Merchant-Ships that joined them, being in all 72 sail, of which nine English Men of War and one Ostender: Capt. *Strutton* kept them Company till the 23th, when he parted from them about 30 Leagues West-North-West from *Cape Finister*, having a fair Wind and fresh Gale.

*Whitehall, March 3.* His Majesty has been pleased to make *Sir Cloudesly Shovell* Colonel of the Marine Regiment, lately commanded by the Lord *Berkeley*.
