may be employed as Captain's Clerk in the Gunnery School at Chatham or Devonport when no Accountant Officer is borne for the duty.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and by virtue of the authority conferred upon Him by the Copyright Act, 1911, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The Principal Order shall extend to Brazil as if that country were amongst the Foreign Countries of the Copyright Union therein named, subject to the following modifications:—

(a) The provisions of Article 2, proviso (iii) (a) shall apply as if Brazil were included amongst the Foreign Countries named in those provisions.

(b) In the application of the provisions of Article 3 of the Principal Order to works of which the country of origin is Brazil the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act and for the Commencement of the Principal Order.

(c) In the application to such works of Sections 1 (2) (d) and 19 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act in Sections 19 (7) and 19 (8) wherever that expression occurs, and the 9th day of February, 1922, for the passing of the Act.

(d) In the application to such works of the provisions of Section 24 of the Copyright Act, 1911, the date of this Order shall be substituted for the Commencement of the Act wherever that expression occurs in Sub-section (1) (a) and for the 26th July, 1910, in Sub-section (1) (b).

2. This Order may be cited as the Berne Copyright Convention (Principal Order Amendment) (Brazil) Order, 1922.

"And whereas both of the said Benefices of Screveton and Car Colston are now full, the Reverend Thomas Edward Swaine Ferris being the present Incumbent thereof:

"And whereas the said Thomas Edward Swaine Ferris has consented to become the first Incumbent of the United Benefice, if and when the union which is hereinafter recommended and proposed shall take effect:

"Now, therefore, we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, with the consent of the said Edwyn, Bishop of Southwell (in testimony whereof he has hereunto set his hand), do humbly recommend and propose to Your Majesty as follows, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Church and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Saint Mark, Birkenhead, in the County of Chester and in the Diocese of Chester:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Mark, Birkenhead, is vested in the Vicar or Incumbent for the time being of the Vicarage of the New Parish of Saint John, Birkenhead, in the said County of Chester and in the said Diocese of Chester:

"And whereas we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the secondly herein mentioned Act a grant of £250 per annum towards the endowment of the said Benefice of Saint Mark, Birkenhead, upon condition that the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to such Benefice shall be transferred to the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chester:

"And whereas the Reverend Herbert Leigh Leigh-Mallory, Vicar or Incumbent of the said New Parish of Saint John, Birkenhead, is willing that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Mark, Birkenhead, now vested in him as aforesaid as such Vicar or Incumbent, should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop for the time being of the said Diocese of Chester:

"And whereas the Right Reverend Henry Luke, now Bishop of the said Diocese of Chester, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas in the circumstances thus set forth it appears to us that the transfer of the

Patronage of the said Benefice of Saint Mark, Birkenhead, which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the New Parish of Saint Mark, Birkenhead:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Herbert Leigh Leigh-Mallory, Vicar or Incumbent of the said New Parish of Saint John, Birkenhead, acting as such Vicar or Incumbent (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Mark, Birkenhead, now vested in him the said Herbert Leigh Leigh-Mallory, as such Vicar or Incumbent of the said Vicarage of Saint John, Birkenhead, as aforesaid, shall be transferred from him, the said Herbert Leigh Leigh-Mallory and from his successors, Vicars or Incumbents of the said Vicarage of Saint John, Birkenhead, to the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, and his successors in the same Bishopric and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Henry Luke, Bishop of Chester, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Reverend Lord William Gascoyne Cecil, Bishop of Exeter (testified by his having signed and sealed this Representation), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly represent, that it would, in our opinion, be expedient that all that part of the said Parish of Morthoe which is described in the Schedule hereunder written, all which part, together with the boundaries thereof, is delineated and set forth on the map or plan hereunto annexed, should be assigned as a District Chapelry to the said Church of Saint Sabinus, situate at Woolacombe as aforesaid, and that the same should be named 'the District Chapelry of Saint Sabinus, Woolacombe.'

(2) For Overtime after the first two hours of Overtime on any day, except Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-HALF.

(3) For all time worked on Sunday and Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be Twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, DOUBLE-TIME.

(4) For all hours worked in any week in excess of 48 the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Quarter times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, *i.e.*, TIME-AND-A-QUARTER, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of Sub-Section (A) of this Section.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable where on any day (not being a Sunday or a Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) the number of hours worked exceeds nine, or, in the case of Saturday, exceeds five, notwithstanding that the number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 48.

Provided that where it is or may become the established practice of an employer to require attendance only on five days a week, the Overtime Rates shall only be payable on such days after 9½ hours have been worked.

B.—FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON PIECE-WORK:—

(i) All Female Workers employed on Piece-Work shall receive in respect of each hour of overtime worked, IN ADDITION TO PIECE-RATES, each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable:—

(a) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO ONE-QUARTER OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE,

(b) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO ONE-HALF OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE, or

(c) AN AMOUNT EQUAL TO THE FULL AMOUNT OF THE APPROPRIATE PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATE,

according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable under the provisions of

paragraph (A) of this Section, if the worker had been employed on Time-Work, were—

- (a) TIME-AND-A-QUARTER,
- (b) TIME-AND-A-HALF, or
- (c) DOUBLE-TIME, respectively.

NOTE.—The hours which Female Workers, Young Persons and Children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshops Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, the respective Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule apply to all Male and Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Trade specified in the Trade Boards (Sack and Bag) Order, 1920, that is to say:—

The making from woven fabrics of corn sacks, flour sacks, coal sacks, sugar sacks, cement bags, sand bags, nail bags, potato bags, seed bags and similar sacks or bags, or the repairing thereof:

Including—

(A) The following and similar operations (whether performed by hand or machine) known in the trade as:—

- (i) folding (or hooking), cutting, machining, turning;
- (ii) brushing, selecting, mending;
- (iii) branding, tarring, bundling;

(B) The warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to sacks or bags of the kind mentioned above when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the making or repairing thereof;

(C) The warehousing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to any other articles when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in any of the operations mentioned in paragraph (B) above;

But excluding—

(i) any of the operations mentioned above when carried on in association with or in conjunction with the weaving of jute, flax or hemp, or the dyeing, bleaching or finishing of jute, flax or hemp yarn or cloth;

(ii) any of the operations mentioned above when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in a business in which the sacks or bags are used as containers for other articles the production or sale of which forms part of the business;

(iii) the making of rope-bound coal or coke sacks when carried on in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department engaged in the making of made-up textile articles other than sacks or bags whether rope-bound or not, of the kind mentioned;

(iv) any of the operations mentioned in paragraph (B) above when carried on in or in association with or in conjunction with any business, establishment, branch or department mainly engaged in the ware-

housing of, the packing of, and similar operations in regard to made-up textile articles other than sacks or bags, whether rope-bound or not, of the kind mentioned; (v) operations included in the Trade Boards (Waste Materials Reclamation) Order, 1920.

PART V.

The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

The above Rates are MINIMUM Rates and do not prevent the payment of higher rates of wages.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE WORKERS (ALL AGES) OTHER THAN HOME-WORKERS.

Overtime rates calculated on the minimum rates of wages set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part III. of the Schedule to the Board's Notice V. (6) dated 13th October, 1921, shall apply in substitution for the minimum rates set out in Parts I. and II. of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Part III. of the above-mentioned Notice V. (6) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

The Trade Board propose to provide that where it is the established practice of an employer to require attendance on Sunday instead of Saturday the minimum rates for overtime shall apply in like manner as if in the provisions of the Trade Board relating to overtime the word "Saturday" were substituted for "Sunday" and the word "Sunday" for "Saturday."

PART IV.

APPLICABILITY OF RATES.

The above proposed minimum rates shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all workers, except Home-Workers, in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Button Making) Order, 1919, and set out in Part IV. of the Schedule to the Trade Boards Notice V. (6) dated 13th October, 1921.

NOTE.—The minimum rates in Parts I. and II. above indicated thus † are the rates at present in force and are unaffected by this Proposal.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above PROPOSALS TO VARY which may be lodged with them within two months from the 25th April, 1922. ORDER OF THE MINISTER OF AGRICULTURE AND FISHERIES.

(DATED 21ST APRIL 1922.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

1. The restrictions on movement of swine imposed by the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908, and the Swine-Fever (Regulation of Movement) Application Order of 1917 (No. 1), shall not apply to the movement of swine from the sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to any premises in Great Britain not being a Swine-Fever Infected Place, and not being in any Scheduled District
