Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to affirm the said Scheme and to order that the two Benefices therein recommended to be united shall be united to the extent and for the purposes recommended in the said Scheme, and further to order and direct that the said Scheme and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Act.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Norwich.

WHEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 16th day of March, 1922, in the words and figures following, that is to say:—

"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 33rd and 34th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 39, and of the Acts therein mentioned, that is to say, the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 113, the Act of the 4th and 5th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 39, and the Act of the 31st and 32nd years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 114, have prepared, and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for effecting a transfer of the ownership of the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the Churches and Cure (hereinafter called 'the said Benefice') of Ingatestone with Buttsbury, in the County of Essex and in the Diocese of Chelmsford:

"Whereas the Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ingatestone with Buttsbury is vested for an estate in fee simple without incumbrances in Violet Isabel Clement Arnould, of Number 5a, Collingham Place, London, S.W., Spinster, upon trust to convey and assure the same to the Trustee or Trustees of the Will, dated the 31st day of July, 1914, of the late Major-General Robert Charles Boileau Pemberton, upon trust to sell the same in order that the proceeds of such sale may be added to the residuary trust fund contemplated by the same Will:

"And whereas the Reverend Robert Pemberton, of Ingatestone aforesaid, Clerk in Holy Orders, is the present Trustee of the said Will and the persons beneficially interested in the said residuary trust fund are the said Robert Pemberton, Alice Evelyn McLeod Pemberton,

Catherine Pemberton, and Annie Gertrude Pemberton, of No. 78, Cromwell Road, London, S.W., Spinsters:

"And whereas the said Violet Isabel Clement Arnould, Robert Pemberton, Alice Evelyn McLeod Pemberton, Catherine Pemberton, and Annie Gertrude Pemberton, are desirous that the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ingatestone with Buttsbury should be transferred to and be vested in the Bishop of Chelmsford for the time being:

"And whereas the Right Reverend John Edwin, now Bishop of Chelmsford, is willing to accept such transfer, and in token of such his willingness and also in token that the same transfer has that consent of the Bishop of the Diocese which by the Acts in the hereinbefore mentioned Act recited or by some or one of them is made necessary he, the said John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford, has executed this Scheme as hereinafter mentioned:

"And whereas the transfer of the Patronage of the said Benefice of Ingatestone with Buttsbury which is hereinbefore mentioned and hereinafter recommended and proposed will in our opinion tend to make better provision for the cure of souls in the Parish or District in or in respect of which the right of Patronage or Advowson so recommended and proposed to be transferred as aforesaid arises or exists, that is to say, in the Parish of Ingatestone with Buttsbury:

"Now, therefore, with the consents of the said Violet Isabel Clement Arnould, the said Robert Pemberton, the said Alice Evelyn McLeod Pemberton, the said Catherine Pemberton and the said Annie Gertrude Pemberton, (in testimony whereof they have signed and sealed this Scheme), and with the consent of the said John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford, (in testimony whereof he has signed this Scheme and sealed the same with his Episcopal Seal), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order, the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Ingatestone with Buttsbury shall be transferred to the said John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford, and his successors in the same Bishopric, freed from all trusts and uses now affecting the same, and shall thereupon and thenceforth become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said John Edwin, Bishop of Chelmsford, and by his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any further or other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament."
