

Charles Kemble, William Long, and Charles James Bevan, of the eighth part, which Indenture was enrolled in the High Court of Chancery on the 6th day of January, 1872:

“ And whereas the said Edward Stuart, now Bishop of Winchester, and the said Church Patronage Trustees have respectively signified to us their desire that the Patronage of the said two Benefices of Saint Matthew, Southampton, and the Holy Trinity, Ventnor, may be rearranged by way of exchange in the manner which is hereinafter recommended and proposed:

“ And whereas we have made due inquiry and calculation as to the circumstances and relative value of the said two Benefices and of the Patronage thereof respectively and we do hereby certify to Your Majesty in Council that the circumstances and present values of the said two Benefices are as set forth in the Schedule hereunto annexed:

“ Now, therefore, with the consent of the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, acting as such Bishop (in testimony whereof to this Scheme he has set his hand and affixed his Episcopal Seal) and with the consent of the said Church Patronage Trustees, that is to say, the said John Francis William Deacon, Ernest Newton Sharpe, Henry Lawe Corry Vully de Candole, Edward Grose Hodge, and Edward Ranulph Kenyon (in testimony whereof to this Scheme they have respectively set their hands and seals) we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, humbly recommend and propose that upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the London Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme and without any conveyance or assurance in the law other than such duly gazetted Order the

whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of Saint Matthew, Southampton, and the Church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, and from his successors in the same Bishopric and shall become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Church Patronage Trustees, their heirs and assigns, upon the same trusts and subject to the same powers, provisos and declarations as are comprised in and form the 9th Schedule of the said Indenture dated the 21st day of December, 1871, and as by the operation of the said Indenture affect and relate to the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Ventnor, and that in exchange for the same the whole Advowson or perpetual right of Patronage of and presentation to the said Benefice of the Holy Trinity, Ventnor, and the Church thereof shall be assigned and transferred from the said Church Patronage Trustees, their heirs and assigns, freed and discharged from all and every the trusts powers provisos and declarations comprised in and forming the said 9th Schedule of the said Indenture of the 21st day of December, 1871, and shall so freed and discharged become and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time and at all times be exercised by the said Edward Stuart, Bishop of Winchester, and his successors in the same Bishopric for ever.

“ And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of either of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar of the said Diocese of Winchester.
