And whereas by the said Act it is amongst other things provided that where His Majesty is satisfied that reciprocal provisions have been made by the Legislature of any part of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom for the enforcement within that part of His Dominions of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and the High Court in Ireland, His Majesty may by Order in Council, declare that the said part of that Act shall extend to that part of Ĥis Dominions and that on any such Order being made the said part of that Act shall extend accordingly:

And whereas His Majesty is satisfied that the Legislatures of the parts of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereinafter mentioned have made reciprocal provisions for the enforcement within those parts of judgments obtained in the High Court in England, the Court of Session in Scotland, and

the High Court in Ireland:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the above-recited Act in His Majesty vested, is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order. and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

Part II. of the Administration of Justice Act, 1920, shall extend to the parts of His Majesty's Dominions outside the United Kingdom hereunder mentioned:-

British Guiana,

St. Lucia, Seychelles.

The Gold Coast Colony.

And the Right Honourable Winston Spencer Churchill, one of His Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, is to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

HEREAS the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England have, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, duly prepared, and laid before His Majesty in Council, a Scheme, bearing date the 11th day of May, 1922, in the

words and figures following, that is to say:—
"We, the Ecclesiastical Commissioners for England, in pursuance of the Act of the 3rd and 4th years of Her late Majesty Queen Victoria, Chapter 113, of the Act of the 6th and 7th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 37, and of the Act of the 19th and 20th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 104, have prepared and now humbly lay before Your Majesty in Council, the following Scheme for constituting a separate District for spiritual purposes to be taken partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mary Maglalene, Addiscombe, partly out of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Shirley, and partly out of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Luke, Woodside, Croydon, all in the County of Surrey and in the Diocese of Canterbury:

"Whereas we are satisfied that the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, the said New Parish of Shirley, and the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Woodside, Croydon, are Cures wherein or in parts whereof the provision for public worship and for pastoral superintendence is insufficient for the spiritual wants of the inhabitants thereof and it has been made to appear to us that it would promote the interests of religion that the particular portions of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, of the said New Parish of Shirley, and of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Woodside, Croydon, which are hereinafter mentioned and described should be constituted a separate district in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas there is not at present within the limits of the said proposed separate District any consecrated Church or Chapel in use

for the purpose of Divine Worship:

"And whereas we have agreed to make and pay out of the Common Fund created by the firstly herein mentioned Act a grant of £250 per annum to the Minister of the said proposed separate District so soon as a Minister shall have been duly licensed in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein mentioned Act and to his successors:

"And whereas the said grant of the said yearly sum of £250 will, after the publication in the London Gazette of an Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, be made and secured by an Instrument to be executed by us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, under our Common Seal, in accordance with the provisions of the Act of the 29th and 30th years of Her said late Majesty, Chapter 111:

111:

"And whereas a plot of land situate within the said proposed separate District has been conveyed to us, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, as the sites for a permanent Church for such District and for a Parsonage House for the residence of the Minister of the same District, and, in addition to the sum of £1,360 which has been contributed locally towards the cost of the purchase of such sites, there has been contributed and paid to the credit of our account at the Bank of England a sum of £640 towards the cost of erecting such permanent Church:

"And whereas the said sums of £1,360 and £640 have been contributed as aforesaid upon the understanding and condition that (such arrangement appearing to us to be expedient) the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District, and, when such District shall have become a New Parish, then of the said New Parish, and the nomination of the Minister or Incumbent thereof should be assigned in the manner which is hereinafter set forth:

"And whereas the contributors of the said sums of £1,360 and £640 have nominated to us the Archbishop of Canterbury for the time being as the person to whom they desire the whole right of Patronage of the said proposed District or New Parish shall be assigned:

"Now, therefore, with the consent of the Right Honourable and Most Reverend Randall Thomas, now Archbishop of Canterbury (in testimony whereof he has signed and sealed this Scheme), we, the said Ecclesiastical Commissioners, humbly recommend and propose that all those portions of the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, of the said New Parish of Shirley, and of the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Woodside, Croydon, which are more particularly described in the Schedule hereunder written and are delineated and set forth upon the Map or Plan hereunto annexed, shall, upon and from the day of the date of the publication in the Liondon Gazette of any Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying this Scheme, become and purposes and that the same shall be named 'The District of Saint Mildred, Addiscombe.' be constituted a separate District for spiritual

"And we further recommend and propose that the whole right of Patronage of the said District so recommended to be constituted and when such District shall have become a New Parish as aforesaid then of such New Parish and of the nomination of an Incumbent thereto, shall without any assurance in the law other than this Scheme and any duly gazetted

Order of Your Majesty in Council ratifying the same and upon and from the day of the date of the publication of such Order in the London Gazette as aforesaid, be assigned to and be absolutely vested in and shall and may from time to time be exercised by the said Randall Thomas, Archbishop of Canterbury, and his successors, for ever.

"And we further recommend and propose that nothing herein contained shall prevent us from recommending and proposing any other measures relating to the matters aforesaid, or any of them, in accordance with the provisions of the said Acts, or of any of them, or of any other Act of Parliament.

"The Schedule to which the foregoing Scheme has reference.

"The District of Saint Mildred, Addiscombe, comprising: ---

"All those contiguous portions of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, of the New Parish (sometime Chapelry District) of Shirley, and of the New Parish (sometime District Chapelry) or Same County of Surrey
Croydon, all in the County of Surrey
Dincese of Canterbury, Luke, of Saint Woodside, of Surrey which, taken together, are comprised within and are bounded by an imaginary line commencing upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Shirley from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, at the junction of Addiscombe Road with Shirley Road, and extending thence north-westward along the said boundary (thereby following the middle of Shirley Road) for a distance of 45 chains or thereabouts to the junction of Shirley Road with Lower Addiscombe Road and with the footpath leading to Woodside Road and Elmers Road, and extending thence first north-westward and then northward along the middle of the said footpath for a distance of 164 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries such footpath across the Mid Kent Line of the South Eastern and Chatham Railway, and extending thence south-westward along the middle of the said line of railway for a distance of three chains or thereabouts to its junction with the Woodside and South Croydon Line of the London Brighton and South Coast and South Eastern and Chatham Joint Railway, and extending thence first south-westward and then southward along the middle of the last-mentioned line of railway (thereby crossing the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Saint Luke, Woodside, Croydon, from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe) for a distance of 64 chains or thereabouts to the centre of the bridge which carries 'Addiscombe Road across such line of railway said County and Diocese, and the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, the New Parish of Saint Matthew, Croydon, in the said County and Diocese, and the said New Parish of Shirley all meet, and extending thence south-eastward along the boundary which divides the said New Parish Croydon, Saint Matthew, from the said New Parish of Shirley for a distance of 15 chains or thereabouts to the point where it crosses the fence which divides the close numbered 553 upon the Ordnance Map of the Civil Parish of Croydon published in the year 1912 upon the scale of 25 inches to a mile and also upon the map or plan which is annexed to this Scheme from the close numbered 477 upon the said maps, and extending thence first north-eastward and then in various directions along the fences which divide the said close numbered 553 and the closes numbered 547, 546, 541, 483 and 488, upon the said maps from the said close numbered 477 and the closes numbered 479, 480, 481 and 482 upon the same maps for a distance of 1 mile or thereabouts to the point where the fence which divides the said close numbered 488 from the said close numbered 482 meets the southern side of Addiscombe Road, and extending thence first northward to and then eastward along the middle of Addiscombe Road for a distance of 2 chains or thereabouts to its junction with Shirley Road, upon the boundary which divides the said New Parish of Shirley from the said New Parish of Saint Mary Magdalene, Addiscombe, at which point the said imaginary line commenced.'

And whereas drafts of the said Scheme have, in accordance with the provisions of the secondly herein-before mentioned Act, been transmitted to the Patrons and to the Incumbents of the Cures out of which it is intended that the District recommended in such Scheme to be constituted shall be taken, and such Patrons and Incumbents have respectively signified their assent to such Scheme:

And whereas the said Scheme has been ap-

proved by His Majesty in Council:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His said Council, is pleased hereby to ratify the said Scheme, and to order and direct that the same and every part thereof shall be effectual in law immediately from and after the time when this Order shall have been duly published in the London Gazette pursuant to the said Acts.

And His Majesty, by and with the like advice, is pleased hereby to direct that this Order be forthwith registered by the Registrar

of the said Diocese of Canterbury.

# UNIVERSITY OF LONDON ACT, 1898.

Notice is hereby given, in pursuance of the above named Act, that the following new Statutes and amendment of Statute 127 of the University of London have been made by the Senate, and that copies of the said new and amended Statutes can be obtained on application to the Secretary to the Senate, University of London, South Kensington, S.W. 7.

# (a) New Statute 113a.

admit as Internal Students and as candidates for a first degree (except in Medicine and Surgery) without their having previously satisfied the Examiners at an Intermediate Examination Graduates of the University who have taken Degrees as External Students, and also the persons specified in the last preceding Statute if such persons shall have prior to admission pursued an approved course extending over not less than three years.

# (b) New Statute 125a.

125a. Provided that the Senate may admit as Internal Students and as candidates for a first degree in the University after the comple-

tion of an approved course of study comprising all the subjects in which they present themselves and extending over not less than two years the following persons if approved in each case by the Senate:—

(1) Graduates of other Universities;

(2) Persons who have passed the examinations required for a degree in a University;

(3) Persons who have obtained from the University of Cambridge a certificate stating that they have satisfied the examiners in a Tripos Examination qualifying as a Final

Examination for a first degree;

(4) Persons who have passed or obtained Honours at the Second Public Examination of the University of Oxford provided that they have also either passed or obtained Honours at the First Public Examination or have passed such other examination or examinations as under the provisions of the University of Oxford are accepted as statutably equivalent thereto;

provided that persons qualifying under paragraphs (1), (2), (3) and (4) above shall prior to admission as Internal Students have pursued an approved course extending over not less than three years; and

(5) Graduates of the University who have

taken degrees as External Students.

#### (c) Statute 127 as amended.

admitted to a first degree as an Internal Student shall produce to the officer oppointed for the purpose certificates of having pursued his approved course of study extending over the full period prescribed by the foregoing Statutes. Such certificates shall be signed by or on behalf of the Governing Body of the School if and so far as his course of study has been pursued in a School and in every other case by or on behalf of the Teachers under whom it has been pursued. No certificate shall be accepted from any Teacher except in the subject for which he has been appointed or recognised as hereinbefore provided.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to award the Edward Medal to Robert Handford, fireman at the Llanbradach Collieries, Llanbradach, Glamorgan, in the fol-

lowing circumstances:—

On October 25th, 1921, a fall of roof occurred at the Llanbradach Colliery, Glamorgan, and a collier named Carter was partially buried. Some men working near by came to his assistance and began to clear away the rubbish. They had not proceeded far when Handford, the local fireman, arrived, and immediately started to erect wooden sleepers as a protection for Carter's body. A second fall of about 30 tons took place almost immediately, but the few sleepers already erected prevented Carter being crushed. Handford then cleared the rubbish from Carter's head and had succeeded in putting up some more supports when a third fall of about 45 tons took place and the rescue party had to jump Handford persevered with the work of rescue; he gradually made his way over Carter's body, completely protecting it with timber, and succeeded eventually in freeing him from rubbish with the exception of his left leg, which was securely pinned down by a heavy weight of earth. Repeated attempts were made to pull Carter clear, but without success, and it was decided to amputate his leg. Handford, however, made further attempts, at considerable risk of being buried himself, with such success that Carter was eventually extricated without any serious injury to his leg. Handford for four hours was continuously exposed to the danger of being buried; he displayed great promptitude in facing the situation, and his intelligence and bravery undoubtedly saved Carter's life.

# ELECTRICITY COMMISSION.

ELECTRICITY (SUPPLY) ACT, 1919.

South East Lancashire Electricity District.

Whereas in pursuance of the abovementioned Act the Electricity Commissioners, by notice dated the 18th day of June, 1920, provisionally determined that a certain area, comprising parts of the Counties of Lancaster, Chester, Derby and the West Riding of York, should be constituted a separate Electricity District for the purposes of the said Act, and gave to all parties interested an opportunity of submitting schemes for effecting an improvement in the existing organisation for the supply of electricity in the District, including proposals for altering and adjusting the boundaries of the District and the formation of a Joint Electricity Authority:

And whereas a scheme was submitted to the Electricity Commissioners by the South East

Lancashire Electricity Committee:

And whereas the Electricity Commissioners held a Local Inquiry at Manchester on the 17th day of January, 1922, and subsequent days, with reference to the area to be included in the proposed District and to the scheme submitted as aforesaid:

And whereas, in pursuance of such Inquiry and the Scheme submitted and of the provisions of sub-section (4) of Section 5 of the above-mentioned Act, the Electricity Commissioners have duly published, in such manner as they thought best adapted for ensuring publicity, a scheme for effecting an improvement in the existing organisation for the supply of electricity in the District.

Now therefore the Electricity Commissioners hereby give notice that they intend to hold a Local Inquiry at the Town Hall, Manchester, on Tuesday, the 20th June, 1922, at 10.30 a.m., and following days if necessary, with reference to the scheme so published as aforesaid and in order finally to determine the area of the proposed District.

Any body or person interested may attend the Inquiry, either personally or by Counsel,

Solicitor or Agent.

FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE (GREAT BRITAIN) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 33).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:

Contraction of Certain Scheduled Districts.

1. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 22) shall be read and have effect as if the Scheduled Districts described in the Schedule hereto were substituted for the Scheduled Districts described in the First Schedule to that Order.

#### Prohibited Area.

2. Scheduled District No. 1 described in the Schedule hereto shall continue to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order

Licences for Grazing of Animals in Scheduled District No. 2.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, an Inspector of the Local Authority of any district comprised in the Scheduled District No. 2 described in the Schedule hereto may authorise, by licence, the movement of cattle for the purpose of grazing along lanes in the Scheduled District, provided that movement within one mile of any Footand-Mouth Disease Infected Place is not involved, and provided that the cattle are tended by some competent person.

#### Revocation.

4. The Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 32) is hereby revoked.

#### Commencement.

5. This Order shall come into operation on the thirty-first day of May, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

scribed in the First Schedule hereto.

3.—(i) The Area described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby declared to be a Prohibited Area for the purposes of the Footand-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as the principal Order."

(ii) Part III. of the principal Order shall apply to such parts of the Scheduled District as are not within the Prohibited Area

- described in the Second Schedule hereto.

  (iii) The provisions of Article 2 of the Berwickshire and District (Foot-and-Mouth Disease) Order of 1922 shall continue to apply to the Prohibited Area, and the provisions of Article 6 of the "principal Order" shall be read and have effect subject to this modifica-

Authorisation of Show and Sale of Pedigree Pigs at York.

1. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, or in the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 22), a Show and Sale of Berkshire Pigs may be held under the auspices of the Yorkshire and North of England British Berkshire Association, in the cattle market at York, on the first day of June, nineteen hundred and twentytwo, if such Show and Sale is authorised by the Local Authority of the City of York, and subject to the conditions hereinafter specified.

# Movement of Animals to Sale.

2. (1) No animal shall be moved to the Sale authorised under this Order unless it is accom-

- panied (a) by a licence authorising such movement granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the City of York, and (b) by a certificate of a duly qualified veterinary surgeon certifying that he has examined the animals referred to in the licence and all other animals on the premises from which the animals are moved, within twenty-four hours before the movement of the animals, and found them free from any symptom of contagious or infectious disease.
- (2) A licence granted under this Article shall not be available for the movement of the animals referred to therein unless and until it is countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the District from which the animals are to be moved.
- (3) No licence shall be granted or countersigned for movement of pigs to the Sale from any premises situate within a radius of one mile from any place which is for the time being declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease, or from any premises situated in any Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, other than the Scheduled Districts to which the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Great Britain) Order of 1922 (No. 22) for the time being applies.
- (4) An Inspector countersigning a licence under this Order shall specify the route to be taken by the pigs during movement from the premises to the railway station for conveyance to York, and the route to be so specified shall be such that at no point shall the pigs be moved within a radius of one mile of any place which is for the time being declared to be a place infected with Foot-and-Mouth Disease.

If no such route is available, a licence shall not be countersigned.

- (5) In the case of every movement of animals authorised by a licence under this Article the licence and veterinary certificate prescribed therein shall accompany the animals throughout the movement, and shall be produced on demand to an Inspector of the Ministry, or of the Local Authority, or a Police Constable. On arrival at the Market, the licences and veterinary certificates shall be delivered up to an Inspector of the Local Authority.
- (6) Animals moved with a licence under this Article shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by rail and be kept separate from all animals which are not being so moved. When being moved by road the animals shall be moved without unnecessary delay to the place of destination and by the route specified in the licence. In the case of animals moved by rail the animals shall not be untrucked for any purpose until they reach the destination station from which they are to be moved to the premises specified in the licence.

# Veterinary Examination of Animals before Entry to Sale.

3. The Local Authority shall cause a Veterinary Inspector to attend the Sale held under this Order and examine all animals before admittance into such Sale.

# Removal of Animals from Sale.

4.—(1) Animals shall not be removed from the Sale unless they are accompanied by a movement licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district in which the premises to which the animals are intended to be moved are situate, which licence the Local Authority are hereby empowered to grant in respect of movement to any premises in their district, notwithstanding the provisions of the Orders referred to in Article 1, or of any other Order of the Minister applying the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, with or without any modification to any Scheduled District, or of the Swine Fever (Regulation of Movement) Order of 1908.

- (2) Such licence shall not be available until it has been countersigned by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the city of York in the manner prescribed in Article 2 of this Order.
- (3) On arrival at the destination specified in the licence the pigs shall be there detained and kept separate from all other pigs for twenty-eight days unless they are slaughtered on such premises before the expiration of that period.
- (4) The provisions of Article 2 (6) of this Order shall apply to animals moved with a licence from the Sale held under this Order.

#### Disinfection of Rollway Trucks.

- 5.—(1) Every railway truck or other railway vehicle used for the conveyance of any animals moved with a licence under this Order shall, not earlier than twenty-four hours before any such animal is placed in it, be thoroughly sprayed or soused with liquid disinfectant.
- (2) The railway loading banks or loading docks used at York for the unloading or loading of animals moved to or from the Sale held under this Order shall from time to time be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant and shall be kept free from dung, litter and other matter during such times as they are being used for animals moved under this Order.

(3) The liquid disinfectant to be used for the purposes of this Article shall be:—

(a) A one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) a five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid; or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(4) Nothing in this 'Article shall interfere with the operation of the provisions of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912 as to the cleansing and disinfection of railway trucks and other railway vehicles used for the conveyance of animals on a railway.

#### Offences.

6. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal, or, in respect of Article 5, the railway company loading the animals or owning the loading banks in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is done or omitted to be done, shall each, according to and in respect of his or their own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.
