PRESENT.

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

W HEREAS it is enacted by the County Courts Act, 1888, that it shall be lawful for His Majesty by Order in Council, amongst other things, to alter the number and boundaries of the Districts and the place of holding any Court and to order the division of any District, and to order by what name and in what towns and places the Courts should be held in such District:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. The District of the County Court of Worcestershire held at Droitwich, except the parishes detached therefrom by paragraph 3 hereof, shall be consolidated with the District of the County Court of Worcestershire held at Worcester; and from the 30th day of June, 1922, the holding of the said Court at Droitwich shall be discontinued, and all powers and

jurisdictions theretofore exercisable thereby shall thenceforth be exercised by the said Court held at Worcester and the said Court held at Worcester shall be the Court for the District formed by the said consolidation.

- 2. The County Court of Glamorganshire held at Neath and Aberavon shall be held by the name of the County Court of Glamorganshire held at Neath and Port Talbot.
- 3. The parishes set out in the first column of the schedule to this Order shall, save as to any cases pending upon the 30th day of June, 1922, be detached from, and cease to form part of, the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the second column of the said schedule, and shall be transferred to, and form part of, the Districts set opposite to their names respectively in the third column thereof.
- 4. This Order may be cited as the County Court Districts (Miscellaneous No. 1) Order in Council, 1922, and shall come into operation on the 1st day of July, 1922; and the County Courts (Districts) Order in Council, 1899, (S.R. & O., 1899, No. 178), as amended, shall have effect as further amended by this Order.

THEREAS by treaty, grant, sufferance, and other lawful means His Majesty the King has power and jurisdiction within the limits of the Bechuanaland Protectorate:

And whereas the Rhodesia Railways Limited has applied for a grant of a certain portion of land known as "the Railway Strip" situate in the area known as the Barolong Farms in the Bechuanaland Protectorate

And whereas the Chief of the Barolong has agreed to such grant being made provided that the Rhodesia Railways Limited fence the said Strip:

And whereas it is expedient that the said land should be vested in His Majesty and that His Majesty's High Commissioner for South Africa should be empowered to make a grant thereof to the Rhodesia Railways Limited their successors or assigns:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by virtue and in exercise of the powers by the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, or otherwise in His Majesty vested, is pleased by and with the advice of His Privy Council to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. The portion of land known as the Railway Strip in extent 154 morgen and 69 square roods situate in the area known as the Barolong Farms in the Bechuanaland Protectorate, bounded on the north by Glaisdale, on the south by Ramathlabama's Kuil and on the east and West by the Barolong Farms, as more fully appears from the sub-divisional diagram signed by the Resident Commissioner Bechuanaland Protectorate, and deposited with the Registrar of Deeds of the Protectorate, is hereby declared to be vested in His Majesty.

2. The High Commissioner for South Africa is hereby empowered to grant the said land to the Rhodesia Railways Limited on such terms and conditions, and subject to such provision as to reversion of the said land to the Crown in the event of the railway ceasing to be operated thereon, as he shall think fit, provided that such grant shall not be made until the High Commissioner is satisfied that the Rhodesia Railways Limited has erected a suitable fence on the east and west sides of the said Strip.

3. This Order may be cited as "The Bechuanaland Protectorate (Railway Lands)

Order in Council, 1922."

4. His Majesty may at any time add to, alter or amend this Order.

COMMITTEE UNDER PART II OF THE SAFEGUARD-ING OF INDUSTRIES ACT, 1921.

The Board of Trade give notice, that they have received a complaint by the British Electrical and Allied Manufacturers' Association that Vulcanized Fibre manufactured in the United States of America is being sold or offered for sale in the United Kingdom at prices below the cost of production thereof, as defined by the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, and that by reason thereof employment in the Vulcanized Fibre industry in the United Kingdom is being, or is likely to be, seriously affected. The Board of Trade, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by Part II of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, have referred the matter for inquiry to a Committee constituted for the purposes of that Part of the Act, and consisting of:—

The Committee are directed, after ascertaining the facts, to report to the President of the Board of Trade—

(a) whether the conditions specified in

Section 2, Sub-section (1), of the Safeguarding of Industries Act, 1921, are fulfilled;

- (b) on the effect which the imposition of a duty under Part II of the Act on goods of the class or description covered by the complaint would exert on employment in any other industry being an industry using goods of that class or description as material; and
- (c) whether in the opinion of the Committee production in the industry manufacturing similar goods in the United Kingdom is being carried on with reasonable efficiency and economy.

The Committee propose to hold their first sitting for the taking of evidence at 11 a.m. on Tuesday, the 20th June, 1922, at 5, Old Palace Yard, Westminster, London, S.W. 1.

SECTION III.—DEFINITIONS.—For the purpose of the rates referred to in Section I A of this Part of this iSchedule the following definitions apply:—

DRESSERS.—A Dresser of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on Dressing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Dresser of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Dresser and who turns, screws inside and out, files flat and square at the vice, and finishes his own work throughout.

A Dresser of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II as above defined, is also an expert in all processes or is a Charge Hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

STAMPERS.—A Stamper of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on Stamping and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Stamper of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Stamper and is an expert in all processes, and who undertakes all classes of work of all strengths of metal used.

A Stamper of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II as above defined, is an expert in all classes of Stamping, Pressing and Cutting-out by hand or who is a Charge Hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

POLISHERS.—A Polisher of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on Polishing and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Polisher of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Polisher and is an expert in all processes of any class of common work and can emery-bob and mop best

work.

A Polisher of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II as above defined, is also an expert in all processes of both common and best work or is a Charge Hand responsible for all work and order in the shop.

PLANISHERS OR WHEELERS.—A. Planisher or Wheeler of Grade I is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over employed on Planishing or Wheeling and not fulfilling the conditions of Grade II or Grade III next hereinafter respectively defined.

A Planisher or Wheeler of Grade II is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who has had not less than six years' experience as a Planisher or Wheeler and is an expert in all processes and is able to do good class work.

A Planisher or Wheeler of Grade III is a Male Worker of 21 years of age or over who, in addition to fulfilling the conditions of Grade II as above defined, is employed in making Mitred Breast Plates or Handled Plates of any design.

PART II.

PIECE-WORK BASIS TIME-RATES (AS VARIED).

The Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates for all Male Workers of 21 years of age or over in the Coffin Furniture Section of the Trade are:—

For the Period (as defined in Section I of Part IV) during which the Cost of Living Index Figure (as defined in Section II of Part IV) is:

Note.—In the case of workers of 21 years of age and over employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the appropriate Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate.

In the case of workers under 21 years of age employed on piece-work, each piece-rate paid must be such as would yield, in the circumstances of the case to an ORDINARY worker, not less than the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE WORKERS (ALL AGES).

SECTION I.—In accordance with Section 3 (1) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the

Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week (exclusive of Sunday and any Customary Public or Statutory Holidays) ... 47
On any day other than Saturday 9
On Saturday ... 5

Provided that ALL hours worked on Sundays and on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

SECTION II.—The Overtime Rates for time-workers in respect of hours worked in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade are as follows:—

(a) For all time worked on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, the Overtime Rate shall be one-and-a-half times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF, and

(b) For all time worked on Sundays, the Overtime Rate shall be twice the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable,

i.e., DOUBLE-TIME.

(c) For all other Overtime worked, oneand-a-fifth times the General Minimum Time-Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-FIFTH.

The Overtime Rates shall be payable in respect of all hours worked in excess of 5 on a Saturday and in respect of all hours worked in excess of 9 on any other day (not being a Sunday or Customary Public or Statutory Holiday) notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 47.

Section III.—The Overtime Rates for pieceworkers in respect of hours worked in excess of the declared normal number of hours of work in the trade are as follows:—

- (a) For all time worked on Sundays, piece-rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker at least the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, or where no Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, with the addition of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out above.
- (b) For all time worked on Customary Public and Statutory Holidays, Piece-Rates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker at least the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, or where no Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, with the addition of one-half of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out above.
- (c) For all other Overtime worked, piecerates each of which would yield, in the circumstances of the case, to an ordinary worker at least the Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate applicable, or where no Piece-Work Basis Time-Rate has been fixed the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable, with the addition of one-fifth of the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable as set out above.

N.B.—The hours which young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

"COST OF LIVING" CLAUSES.

SECTION I.—Each "Cost of Living" period referred to in Columns I, II, III and IV of Part I and in Part II of this Schedule, is a period from the twenty-third day of the month of the publication in the "Labour Gazette" of a Cost of Living figure (as defined in Section II below), within the range of percentage specified in the appropriate column, until the twenty-third day of the month of the publication of a figure within the range specified in another column.

Provided that in cases where the twenty-third day of the month does not coincide with the beginning of the weekly pay period, the "Cost of Living" period shall begin or end as the case may be at the beginning of the next following weekly pay period.

SECTION II.—The Cost of Living figure specified in this Schedule is:—the average percentage increase since July, 1914, in retail prices (all items) in the United Kingdom, as published each month by the Ministry of Labour in the "Labour Gazette."

Section III.—The minimum rates set out in this Schedule are operative only during the several periods specified, or until such time as the cancellation or variation thereof may become effective.

SECTION IV.—The rates payable on the date specified by the Minister of Labour are the rates set out in Column III of Part I and Column I of Part II and Overtime Rates as specified in Part III of this Schedule.

PART V.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in Parts I, II and III of this Schedule apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Male Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in the Coffin Furniture Section of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Coffin Furniture and Cerement-Making) Order, 1919, that is to say:—

(a) The manufacture, wherever carried on, of Coffin Furniture from any metal by any process.

(b) The manufacture of Cerements, including shrouds, face curtains, face cloths, sidecloths, winding sheets, pillow covers, coffin pads, sleeves or frilling.

Including—

(c) The operations of folding, packing, warehousing, despatching or other operations incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of any of the above-mentioned articles.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates set out in Parts I, II and III of this Schedule must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section II.—The above General Minimum Time-Rates, Piece-Work Basis Time-Rates and Overtime Rates are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made, between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these Minimum Rates of Wages.

Signed by order of the Trade Board and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as varied by the Trade Board for Male Workers and as set out above, and specifying 6th June, 1922, as the date from which the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male Workers should become effective.

MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR MALE AND FEMALE LEARNERS IN THE RETAIL BESPOKE SECTION OF THE TAILORING TRADE.

Effective as from 29th May, 1922.*

*Should this date not correspond with the beginning of the period for which wages are paid by an employer who pays wages at intervals not exceeding seven days, the rates become effective as from the beginning of the next full pay period, but in any case not later than 4th June, 1922.

The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in the Schedule below take the place of the Minimum Rates of Wages for Male and Female Learners set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (15), dated 21st February, 1922.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE LEARNERS, AS DEFINED IN, AND WHO COMPLY WITH THE CONDITIONS SPECIFIED IN, PART III OF THIS SCHEDULE.

General Minimum Time-Rates.

SECTION I.—MALE LEARNERS.

For the 1st year of Learnership, 9s. perweek of 48 hours.

For the 2nd year of Learnership, 12s. 6dper week of 48 hours.

For the 3rd year of Learnership, 17s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

For the 4th year of Learnership, 24s. per week of 48 hours.

For the 5th year of Learnership, 34s. per week of 48 hours.

SECTION II.—FEMALE LEARNERS.

For the 1st year of Learnership, 6s. 6d. per week of 48 hours.

For the 2nd year of Learnership, 10s. per week of 48 hours.

For the 3rd year of Learnership, 16s. per week of 48 hours.

For the 4th year of Learnership, 24s. per week of 48 hours.

Section III.—The General Minimum Time-Rates for Learners set out in this Part of this Schedule are weekly rates based on a week of 48 hours, and are subject to a proportionate decrease according as the number of hours of employment in any week is less than 48.

SECTION IV.—In the application of the General Minimum Time-Rates for Male and Female Learners set out in Sections I and II of this Part of this Schedule the following provisions apply:—

- (a) In determining the year of Learner-ship of a Male or Female Learner all employment of the Learner prior to the age of 14 shall be disregarded. The General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to a Learner under 14 is the appropriate General Minimum Time-Rate for the first year of Learnership.
- (b) Any Male or Female Learner who has been previously employed in (i) any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, or (ii) any branch of Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring coming within the scope of the Ready-Made and Wholesale Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), or (iii) any branch of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade coming within the scope of the Wholesale Mantle and Costume Trade Board (Great Britain), shall be entitled, subject to the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section, to count the whole period of such previous employment.

(c) In the case of a Male Learner who, prior to being registered as a Learner under the provisions of this Notice, has received continuous instruction in Retail Bespoke Tailoring at any School or Institution where there is a class for Retail Bespoke Tailoring which is approved by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), every two School or Institutional years during which the Learner has been so instructed at any such School or Institution shall, for the purposes of this Notice and subject to the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Section, be reckoned as one year of Learnership.

(d)—(i) A Male Learner shall cease to be a Learner and shall be entitled to the Minimum Rate applicable to him under the provisions of Part I of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (15), dated 21st February, 1922, upon the completion of five years' Learnership.

(ii) A Female Learner shall cease to be a Learner and shall be entitled to the Minimum Rate applicable to her under the provisions of Part II of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (15), dated 21st

February, 1922, upon the completion of four years' Learnership.

PART II.

OVERTIME RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE LEARNERS.

Overtime Rates calculated on the General Minimum Time-Rates specified in Part I of this Schedule in the manner set out in Part III of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (15), dated 21st February, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the Rates set out in Part I of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in Section I of Part III of the Schedule to the said Notice R.B. (15), to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

DEFINITION OF MALE AND FEMALE LEARNERS AND CONDITIONS AFFECTING THEIR EMPLOYMENT.

Section I.—For the purpose of this Notice, and subject to the provisions of Section IV of Part I of this Schedule:—

A MALE or FEMALE LEARNER is a worker who:—

(A)—(i) In the case of a MALE LEARNER, has not been employed for more than FIVE YEARS in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, and has not served as a Trainee under the Ministry of Labour Scheme for the training of disabled ex-service men in Retail Bespoke Tailoring;

(ii) In the case of a FEMALE LEARNER, has not been employed for more than FOUR YEARS in the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade;

AND

(B)—In the case of both a MALE and FEMALE LEARNER:—

(i) Is employed during the whole or a substantial part of his or her time in learning any branch or process of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade by an employer who provides the Learner with reasonable facilities for such learning; and

(ii) Has received a certificate, or has been registered in accordance with Rules from time to time laid down by the Trade Board, or has made an application for such certificate or registration, which has been duly acknowledged and is still under consideration.

Provided that the certification or registration of a Learner may be cancelled if the other conditions of learnership are not complied with.

Provided also that an employer may employ a Learner on his or her first employment in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade without a certificate or registration for a probationary period not exceeding four weeks, but in the event of such Learner being continued thereafter at his or her employment the probation period shall be included in his or her period of Learnership.

SECTION II.—Notwithstanding compliance with the conditions specified in Section I of this Part of this Schedule, a person shall not be deemed to be a Learner if he or she works in

a room used for dwelling purposes, and is not in the employment of his or her parent or guardian.

PART IV.

CALCULATION OF PREVIOUS EXPERI-ENCE IN THE CASE OF CERTAIN CLASSES OF WORKERS.

In determining whether for the purposes of Section I of Part I of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (15), dated 21st February, 1922, a Male Worker has completed five years' employment in accordance with that

(a) Any previous experience in Retail Bespoke Tailoring in any School or Institution specified in paragraph (c) of Section IV of Part I of this Schedule, shall, in the case of a male worker who has been registered as a learner with the Trade Board, be reckoned in accordance with the provisions of such paragraph; and

(b) Any previous experience as a Trainee under the Ministry of Labour Scheme for the training of disabled ex-service men in Retail Bespoke Tailoring shall be reckoned as equivalent to one-and-a-half times the period

served under such Scheme.

PART V.

APPLICABILITY OF MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts and of this Notice the respective Minimum Rates of Wages specified in this Schedule apply to all Male and Female Learners in Great Britain of the CLASSES SPECIFIED IN THIS NOTICE in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade, as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919, and set out below.

Notwithstanding anything herein contained the sunimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule do not apply to PACKERS, except where they are employed on Packing operations which are performed in a workroom.

Section II.—The "Retail Bespoke Section of the Tailoring Trade "wherever mentioned in this NOTICE means the Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the above-mentioned Regulations, that is to say:

Those branches of Men's, Women's, Boys' and Girls' Bespoke Tailoring in which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct, if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor, to whom a Minimum Rate of Wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable, or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop, or in a building of which the shop forms part or to which the shop is attached.

Including-

(1)—(a) The altering, repairing, renovating, or re-making of Men's, Women's, Boys' or Girls' Tailored Garments where carried out for the individual wearer by a tailor who employs the worker direct as defined

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried on in association with, or in conjunction with, the repairing, renovating, or remaking of the garments.

(2) The lining with fur of the above-mentioned garments where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the making

of such garments.

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with, or in conjunction with, the abovementioned branches of tailoring.

(4) The packing and all other operations incidental to, or appertaining to, any of the

above-mentioned branches of tailoring.

But excluding-

(1) All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments.

(2) The making of headgear.

Note.—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART VI.

SECTION I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers earning higher rates of wages, or to agreements made, or that may be made between Employers and Workers for the payment of wages in excess of

these Minimum Rates of Wages.

SIGNED by ORDER of the TRADE BOARD and in pursuance of an Order of the Minister of Labour confirming the Minimum Rates of Wages as Varied by the Trade Board and set out above, and specifying the 29th day of May, 1922, as the date from which they become effective.

 (i) The registration may be cancelled if the other conditions of apprenticeship are not

complied with.

(ii) An employer may employ a worker at the rates and under the conditions specified in this Schedule for apprentices without registration for a probationary period not exceeding three months, but in the event of such worker being continued thereafter at his or her employment as an apprentice, the probationary period shall be included in his or her period of apprenticeship.

Provided also that:--

If a Male Apprentice, prior to being registered as an Apprentice under the provisions of this Schedule, has received continuous No. 32715.

instruction in Retail Bespoke Tailoring at any Institution or School where there is a class for Retail Bespoke Tailoring which is approved by the Retail Bespoke Tailoring Trade Board (Great Britain), the period of apprenticeship applicable as specified in this Part of this Schedule shall, in such a case, be reduced by one year for every two School or Institutional years during which the Apprentice has been so instructed subsequent to his attaining the age of 14 years and that every two School or Institutional years during which the Apprentice has been instructed at any such School or Institution shall be reckoned as one year of apprenticeship for the purpose of ascertaining the General Minimum Time-Rate applicable to him under the provisions of this Notice during the period of his apprenticeship. In determining whether for the purposes of Section I of Part I of the Trade Board's Notice R.B. (15) dated 21st February, 1922, a male apprentice has completed a period of five years' apprenticeship any such previous experience in Retail Bespoke Tailoring in any such School or Institution shall be reckoned in accordance with this proviso.

PART II.

GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR MALE AND FEMALE APPRENTICES.

PART V.

SECTION I.—Subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts the respective Minimum Rates of Wages, set out in this Schedule, apply to all Male and Female Apprentices in Great Britain OF THE CLASSES SPECIFIED in this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of Retail Bespoke Tailoring as defined in the Regulations made by the Minister of Labour and dated 12th December, 1919.

SECTION II.—The Section of the Tailoring Trade specified in the above-mentioned Regu-

lations is as follows:—

Those branches of men's, women's, boys' and girls' bespoke tailoring in which the tailor supplies the garment direct to the individual wearer and employs the worker direct.

A worker shall be deemed to be employed by the tailor direct, if employed by another worker in the employ of the tailor, to whom a minimum rate of wages fixed under the Trade Boards Acts is applicable, or if employed by a sub-contractor engaged in cutting, making or finishing garments exclusively for the tailor in the tailor's shop or in a building of which the shop forms part or to which the shop is attached;

INCLUDING: -

(1) (a) The altering, repairing, renovating or remaking of men's, women's, boys' or girls' tailored garments where carried out for the individual wearer by a tailor who employs the worker direct as defined above.

(b) The cleaning of such garments where carried on in association with or in conjunction with the repairing, renovating or re-

making of the garments;

(2) The lining with fur of the abovementioned garments where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the making of such garments;

(3) All processes of embroidery or decorative needlework where carried out in association with or in conjunction with the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

(4) The packing and all other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned branches of tailoring;

BUT EXCLUDING: -

- (1) All or any of the above-mentioned operations where carried on in a factory where garments are made up for three or more retail establishments;
 - (2) The making of head-gear.

NOTE.—The employment of Women, Young Persons and Children is subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and to the provisions of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART VI.

Section I.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule shall be paid direct to

the Apprentice by the Employers.

SECTION II.—The Minimum Rates of Wages set out in this Schedule must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, or under the Unemployment Insurance Act, 1920, as amended by any subsequent enactments, or deductions authorised by any Act to be made

from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

Section III.—Subject to the provisions of Section II of Part II of this Schedule, nothing in this Schedule shall apply to Apprentices employed under an Indenture or Contract in writing respectively entered into prior to the 10th October, 1921, providing for the effective instruction of the Apprentice in

making one or more of the garments specified in Part I of this Schedule.

(18) dated 7th February, 1922, in their application to Male Tenters of 21 years of age and over with a recognised full charge, the proposed Minimum Rates being as shown in the Schedule set out below

PART II.

PROPOSED OVERTIME RATES FOR A CERTAIN CLASS OF MALE TENTERS.

Overtime Rates calculated on the proposed general minimum time rate set out in Part I. of this Schedule in the manner specified in Part III of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J. (18) dated 7th February, 1922, shall apply in substitution for the proposed general minimum time-rate set out in Part I. of this Schedule in respect of all hours worked in excess of the number of hours declared by the Trade Board in the Schedule to the above-mentioned Notice J. (18) to be the normal number of hours of work in the trade.

PART III.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all male workers of the class specified in Part I. of this Schedule in respect of all time during which they are employed in Great Britain in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, and set out in Part VI. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice J. (18) dated 7th February, 1922.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 3rd day of June, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

THE DESTRUCTIVE INSECTS AND PESTS ORDER OF 1922.

(DATED 31ST MAY, 1922.)

(D.I.P. 532.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, orders as follows:-

Commencement.

1. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Definitions.

2. In this Order:—" The Minister" means the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries; "Inspector" means an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries; and the expression "plant" shall, where the context permits, include tree and shrub and the fruit, seeds, tubers, bulbs, layers, cuttings or other parts of a plant.

Restriction on Importation of Plants.

- 3.—(1) The landing in England and Wales from any country other than Scotland, Ireland and the Channel Islands of any of the plants mentioned in the First Schedule to this Order is prohibited except in accordance with the regulations set out in the Third Schedule
- (2) The importer of any plant the landing of which is regulated by this Article shall comply with the Regulations set out in the Third Schedule hereto.
- (3) This Article shall not apply to any plant the landing of which is authorised by a general licence issued by the Minister or by a special licence issued by an Inspector, or to a consignment of a plant to the Minister for experimental or scientific purposes.

Powers of Entry.

4. An Inspector may, upon production if so required of his appointment or authority, enter any premises and examine any plant on such premises which has been landed in England or Wales from any country except as aforesaid or on which he has reason to believe that an insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order exists or has recently existed.

Precautions to be adopted in case of Disease.

5.—(1) An Inspector may at any time and from time to time by a Notice served on the occupier of premises on which he has reason to believe that there is any plant attacked with any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, require him to adopt such measures for prevention of the spread of the insect or pest as are specified in the Notice.

(2) A Notice under this Article may prescribe the time within which the adoption of any measure thereby prescribed shall be com-

pleted.

Power to deal with living specimens of Insects or Pests.

6. No person shall land, sell, or offer for sale, a living specimen of any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, except with the written permission of the Minister, and an Inspector may, by a Notice served on any person having in his possession or under his charge any such living specimen, require him to adopt such measures for the prevention of the spread of the insect or pest as are specified in the Notice.

Service of Notices, etc.

7. For the purpose of this Order a Notice shall be deemed to be served on any person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there; and a Notice purporting to be signed by an Inspector shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him.

Information to be given as to Diseased Plants or parts thereof.

8. Every person who has or has had in his possession or under his charge any plant which is attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, and every person who as auctioneer, salesman, or otherwise has sold or offered for sale any such plant shall, if so required in writing by the Minister or an Inspector, give to the Minister or Inspector all such information as he possesses as to the persons in whose possession or under whose charge the plant is or has been; provided that any information given under this Article shall not be available as evidence against the person giving the same in any prosecution under this Order, except in respect of an alleged failure, to comply with this Article.

Offences.

- 9.—(1) Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who does any act in contravention of this Order or the Regulations in the Third Schedule to this Order or any Notice served on him under this Order, or fails to do any act which he is required to do by this Order or the said Regulations or any such Notice.
- (2) This Article does not apply to the landing or attempted landing of anything in contravention of this Order the penalty for which is provided by section one of the Destructive Insects Act, 1877 as amended by the Destructive Insects and Pests Act, 1907.

Revocation of Order.

- 10. The Destructive Insects and Pests Order of 1921 is hereby revoked; provided that such revocation shall not:-
 - (i) affect the previous operation of such Order or anything duly done or suffered under such Order; or
 - (ii) affect any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under such Order; or
 - (iii) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any offence committed against such Order;
 - (iv) affect any investigation, legal proceeding or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability or penalty as aforesaid;

and any such investigation, legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed as if this Order had not been made.

One copy of the certificate must be produced to the Customs Officer at the port of entry, and the other copy must be forwarded by the importer to the consignee. In the case of consignments imported through the post, a copy of the prescribed certificate need not be produced to the Customs Officer, but a copy must be affixed to each package.

The original of the certificate must be forwarded by post, before the plants are despatched, by the Exporter to the Horticulture Division of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries, Whitehall Place, London, S.W. 1.

(b) In the case of an importation of plants from a country where no recognised service of plant inspection is maintained, and in the case of a consignment of plants which is not accompanied by copy certificates as above mentioned, or of a package of plants imported through the post to which a copy certificate is not attached, the plants shall be retained by the importer or consignee until they have been examined by an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries at a suitable place designated by the Inspector on by the Ministry and certified in writing to be healthy and free from the insects and pests mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order or until their removal has been authorised in writing by the Ministry or by an Inspector of the Ministry.

(c) Any imported plants which on inspection are found to be unhealthy or attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Second Schedule to this Order, and which, in the judgment of the Inspector, cannot be cleaned by disinfection or other treatment, shall, with the packing and package, either be destroyed or returned to the country of exportation by the importer thereof

country of exportation by the importer thereof.

(e) The Ministry's charge for the services of the Inspector and all charges for storage, cartage and labour incident to inspection and disinfection, shall be paid by the importer.

3. Plants will not be deemed to be healthy which are attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule and the Note to the Sale of Diseased Plants Order of 1922.

THE SALE OF DISEASED PLANTS ORDER OF 1922.

(DATED 31ST MAY 1922.)

(D.I.P. 533.)

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Destructive Insects and Pests Acts, 1877 and 1907, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, orders as follows:—

Definitions.

1. In this Order:—"The Minister" means the Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries; "the Ministry" means the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries; and "Inspector" means an Inspector of the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries.

The expression "Local Authority" means as regards any district the local authority for the district under the Diseases of Animals Acts,

1894 to 1914.

The expression "plant" shall include tree and shrub and the seeds, tubers, bulbs, layers, cuttings or any other parts of a plant.

Prohibition of Sale of Diseased Plants, etc.

2. No person shall sell, offer or expose for sale or cause to be sold, offered or exposed for sale for planting, any plant substantially attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order.

Information to be given as to Diseased. Plants.

3. Every person who has or has had in his possession or under his charge, and every person who as auctioneer, salesman, nurseryman or otherwise has had in his possession for sale or has sold, offered or exposed for sale, any plant substantially attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, shall, if so required in writing by the Minister or by an Inspector, give the Minister or the Inspector, as the case may be, all such information as he possesses as to the person in whose possession or under whose charge such plant is or has been: provided that any information given under this Article shall not be available as evidence against the person giving the same in any prosecution under this Order, except in respect of an alleged failure to comply with this Article.

Powers of Entry.

4. An inspector may, upon production if so required of his appointment or authority, enter any premises on which he has reason to believe that an insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order exists or has recently existed, and examine any plant on such premises.

Action to be taken to prevent sale or movement of Diseased Plants.

5. Any auctioneer, salesman, nurseryman, or other person, on becoming acquainted or being informed by an Inspector, that he has in his possession or under his charge any plant substantially attacked by an insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order shall take steps to prevent the sale or movement of such plant except under the authority of an Inspector.

Power of Inspector to order Destruction or Disinfection.

6.—(1) An Inspector may at any time by notice served on any person who as auctioneer, salesman, nurseryman or otherwise has in his possession for sale or who offers or exposes for sale or causes to be offered or exposed for sale for planting any plant which is substantially attacked by an insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order, require him to adopt such measures as are authorised by this Article and specified in the notice.

(2) A notice under this Article may require the auctioneer, salesman, nurseryman or other person named in the notice to adopt one or more of the following measures, that is to

say:-

(a) to destroy the whole or any part of the plant by fire or such other suitable method as may be specified in the notice;

(b) to disinfect the plant to the satisfac-

tion of the Inspector;

- (c) to take such other steps as the Inspector may consider necessary to prevent the spread of disease.
- (3) Any such notice may appoint the time

within which the adoption of any measure thereby prescribed shall be completed.

Service of Notices, etc.

7. For the purpose of this Order a notice shall be deemed to be served on any person if it is delivered to him personally or left for him at his last known place of abode or business, or sent through the post in a letter addressed to him there; and a notice purporting to be signed by an Inspector shall be prima facie evidence that it was signed by him as an Inspector.

Penalties.

- 8. Every person shall be liable on conviction to a penalty not exceeding ten pounds, who—
 - (1) sells, offers or exposes for sale or causes to be sold, offered or exposed for sale for planting any plant substantially attacked by any insect or pest mentioned in the Schedule to this Order; or
 - (2) fails to take such steps as are required under Articles 5 and 6 of this Order, or fails to give information as required by Article 3; or:
 - (3) wilfully obstructs or impedes any Inspector when acting under this Order.

Notification of Order.

9. This Order shall be published by the Local Authority in accordance with any direction given by the Minister.

Revocation of Order.

- 10. The Sale of Diseased Plants Order of 1921 is hereby revoked: provided that such revocation shall not:—
 - (i) affect the previous operation of such Order or anything duly done or suffered under such Order; or
 - (ii) affect any right, privilege, obligation or liability acquired, accrued, or incurred under such Order; or
 - (iii) affect any penalty incurred in respect of any offence committed against such Order; or
 - (iv) affect any investigation, legal proceeding, or remedy in respect of any such right, privilege, obligation, liability or penalty as aforesaid:

and any such investigation, legal proceeding or remedy may be instituted, continued, or enforced, and any such penalty may be imposed as if this Order had not been made.

Application of the Order.

11. This Order shall apply to England and Wales.

Short Title.

12. This Order may be cited as the Sale of Diseased Plants Order of 1922.

Commencement of Order.

13. This Order shall come into operation on the first day of July, 1922.
