The following Address of the Ministers, Elders and Office-Bearers of the Church of Scotland, convened in General Assembly, having been transmitted by His Grace the Lord High Commissioner to the Right Honourable Robert Munro, His Majesty's Secretary for Scotland, has been by him laid before the King, who was pleased to receive the same very graciously:-

TO THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY.

MAY IT PLEASE YOUR MAJESTY,

We, the Ministers and Elders of the Church of Scotland, gathered together in the Annual General Assembly of our Church, desire most respectfully to acknowledge the gracious letter with which Your Majesty has been pleased to honour us, and to assure Your Majesty of our deep gratitude for your continued interest in our welfare and for the confidence Your Majesty is pleased to express in our efforts to promote the advancement of our country by the spread of the spirit of unity and goodwill among all classes of the people. We beg to assure Your Majesty that it will always be our earnest endeavour to show ourselves worthy of Your Majesty's approval by the diligent use of all suitable means to further the moral and spiritual well-being of the nation.

We receive with sincere gratitude the renewal of the Royal Grant of £2,000, which we will seek to use in such a manner as to diffuse the knowledge of Christian truth and the influence of the Christian religion throughout the Highlands and Islands of Scotland.

The intimation that Your Majesty has again appointed His Grace the Duke of Sutherland as Your Majesty's Representative in the General Assembly has afforded us the utmost satisfaction, knowing, as we do, his warm attachment to the Church of his fathers and the kindly interest which he and the Duchess of Sutherland take in all that relates to the welfare of the community.

Will Your Majesty permit us to express the deep and affectionate interest which has been
