TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice, that Tenders will

be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 16th June, 1922, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914-1919; and

(b) £4 10s. per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1932.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £50,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £5,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided beween Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer, on any business day from Monday, the 19th June, 1922, to Saturday, the 24th June, 1922, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date

- 6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will in all respects rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 21st April, 1922. They will be dated, at the option of the Tenderer, on any business day from Monday, the 19th June, 1922, to Saturday, the 24th June 1922, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October 1922, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

TRADE BOARDS ACTS, 1909 AND 1918.

JUTE TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO FIX GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES AND TO VARY OVERTIME RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE WEAVERS IN THE AREAS OF DUNDEE, CARNOUSTIE AND TAYPORT (AS DEFINED IN PART IV. OF THE SCHEDULE TO THIS NOTICE).

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established in Great Britain under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the Jute Trade, as specified in the Trade Boards (Jute)

Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, as required by Section 3 (5) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, that THEY PROPOSE TO FIX General Minimum Piece-Rates for Female Workers employed on Hessian Weaving as defined in Section II. of Part I. of the Schedule set out below, AND TO VARY the Overtime Rates at present fixed and set out in the Trade Board's Notice J (19) dated 8th March, 1922, in their application to such workers, the proposed Minimum Rates being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES FOR FEMALE WORKERS EMPLOYED ON HESSIAN WEAVING (AS HEREINAFTER DEFINED) IN THE AREAS OF DUNDEE, CARNOUSTIE AND TAYPORT (AS DEFINED IN PART IV. OF THIS SCHEDULE).

SECTION I.

ţ

The proposed General Minimum Piece-Rates to apply to Female Workers employed on Hessian Weaving as specified in Section II. of this Part of this Schedule shall be as follows:—

- (a) THE STANDARD GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATE SHALL BE A SINGLE LOOM RATE FOR WEAVING THE STANDARD LENGTH OF THE STANDARD FABRIC OF THE STANDARD WIDTH AND SHALL BE 40 gd.
- (b) THE DOUBLE LOOM RATE SHALL BE TWENTY PER CENT. (20 PER CENT.) LESS THAN THE SINGLE LOOM RATE.

Provided that a worker shall not be required to work a single loom at the double loom rate for a continuous period of more than $8\frac{3}{4}$ hours, or for a total of more than $8\frac{3}{4}$ hours in any one week.

- 2. FOR THE PURPOSE OF THE PROPOSED GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES SET OUT IN THIS NOTICE:—
 - (a) The STANDARD Fabric shall be a 10½ oz. 40 in. 11 porter 13 shots per inch when chested finished: Dundee Hessian.
 - (b) The STANDARD Length shall be 100 yards (36 inch measure) of yarn laid.
 - (c) The STANDARD Width shall be 40 inch of finished cloth.
- 3. THE STANDARD GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES SET OUT IN PARAGRAPH 1 OF THIS SECTION SHALL BE INCREASED OR DIMINISHED:—
 - (a) For variation of build in accordance with the percentages given on Table A in Part II of this Schedule.

Provided that in cases where variation on the Standard Rate has to be made in respect of both Porter and Shots, the variations for Porter and Shots shall not be made separately but as follows, that is to say, the sum or difference, as the ease may be, of the appropriate percentage figures set out in the Table for Porter and Shots respectively shall first be calculated, and the Standard Rate shall then be varied by the application thereto of the percentage figure so arrived at.

- (b) For variation of width in accordance with the percentages given on Table B in Part II of this Schedule.
- 4. There shall be no difference for quality.
- 5. In all calculations in this scheme the SHOTS are counted BY THE INCH.
- 6. Fractions shall be dealt with as follows:-

Fractions of One Shot-

Fractions of One Inch-

Under $\frac{1}{4}$ shall NOT count. $\frac{1}{4}$ and under $\frac{3}{4}$ shall count as a $\frac{1}{2}$. $\frac{3}{4}$ and over shall count as 1.

Under a ½ inch shall NOT count.
½ inch and over shall count as 1 inch.

- 7. THE ABOVE GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATES SHALL BE SUBJECT 1TO PAYMENT OF THE FOLLOWING EXTRAS:—
 - (a) Narrow Cloth in Wide Looms.

No allowance shall be made for cloth the yarn width of which (including selvages) in the reed is within 10 inches or 10 per cent. of the reed space, whichever is the greater. If the yarn as measured within the reed (including selvages) is narrower than this, one-sixth of the total difference in inches shall be added to the cloth width.

PART I .- Continued.

- (b) Where the weaver strips the cloth off the cloth pin, two per cent. (2 per cent.).
- (c) Where the weaver ties on, Twopence (2d.) per 100 threads.
- (d) Where the weaver does any fileying an extra shall be paid to be mutually arranged between master and worker, provided that such extra shall be at not less than the appropriate minimum rate fixed by the Trade Board.
- (e) For Centre Selvages :--

If unsplit in the loom-

5 per cent. for the first centre selvage; and

3 per cent. for each centre selvage thereafter.

If split in the loom by the weaver-

A further 2 per cent. for each centre selvage so split.

(f) For Coloured Stripes in the Warp :-

Up to 10 per cent. of coloured single jute threads, no extra.

For each additional 2 per cent. of coloured single jute threads or part thereof, 1 per cent. extra.

(g) For Heavy Wefts, to be paid under the following scale on the calculated weight of weft to give the required weight of cloth:—

(h) Where cloth is woven one thread in a split :-

8 porter in 16 reed, $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. extra; and thereafter for every $\frac{1}{2}$ porter in excess of 8 porter, an additional $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent.

- 8., Long Lengths.—In linoleum goods no extra will be paid for these.
- 9. Where the number of threads in the warp is increased above the normal build for which payment is made, the width of cloth to be paid for shall be that which the threads would give if not crowded.

SECTION II.

The above proposed General Minimum Piece Rates shall apply to the weaving of all Hessian, floor-cloth and linoleum goods.

The General Minimum Piece-Rates proposed in this Notice are on the basis that the cloth produced is to be free from all weaving faults, which shall be made good by the weaver in accordance with the hitherto accepted practice of the trade, and that the weaver is to perform her other usual duties such as keeping the loom clean and removing the waste from it.

The General Minimum Piece-Rates shall not apply to cloth woven in looms the reed space of which is 32 inches or narrower.

Note.—IN THE CASE OF FABRICS TO WHICH THE GENERAL MINIMUM PIECE-RATE? ARE NOT APPLICABLE, IT IS REQUIRED BY THE TRADE BOARDS ACTS THAT EACH PIECE-RATE PAID SHALL BE SUFFICIENT TO YIELD, IN THE CIRCUMSTANCES OF THE CASE, TO AN ORDINARY WORKER, NOT LESS THAN THE APPROPRIATE GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATE FIXED BY THE TRADE BOARD.

PART III.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF OVERTIME RATES FOR THE CLASSES OF FEMALE WEAVERS SPECIFIED IN PART IV. OF THIS SCHEDULE.

The Trade Board propose to vary the Overtime Rates for female workers employed on piece-work at present fixed and set out in the Trade Board's Notice J (19) dated 8th March, 1922, in their application to female workers employed on work to which the general minimum piece-rates specified in this Schedule are applicable so that such workers shall receive in respect of each hour of overtime worked, in addition to the appropriate general minimum piece-rates, an amount equal to one-half of or the full amount of the general minimum time-rate which would have been applicable to the worker if she had been employed on time work, according as the Overtime Rate which would have been payable if the worker had been employed on time work were time-and-a-half or double time.

PART IV.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to the classes of Female Workers specified in this Schedule, in respect of all time during which they are employed in the Municipal Burgh of Dundee and the Parish of Liff and Benvie, the Parish of Mains and Strathmartine, the Parish of Dundee and that part of the Parish of Monifieth which lies south and west of Dighty Water; the Burgh of Carnoustie and the Parish of Barry, and the Parish of Panbride; and the Burgh of Tayport, and the Parish of Ferry-Port-on-Craig in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Jute) Order, 1919, that is to say:

The preparing, spinning or weaving (a) of jute or (b) of jute and any other fibre, except flax or hemp,

Including (1) The preparing and spinning of waste reclaimed at any stage, and (2) All packing, despatching, warehousing, storing, or other operations incidental to or appertaining to any of the above-mentioned work; but

Excluding (1) The calendering, bleaching, dyeing or finishing of any of the above mentioned materials, and

- (2) The preparing or spinning of materials required for the making or remaking of (a) rope (including driving rope and banding), (b) cord (including blind and window cord, but excluding silk worsted and other fancy cords), (c) core for wire ropes, (d) lines, (e) twine (including binder and trawl twine), (f) lanyards, (g) net and similar articles, when such preparing or spinning is carried on in the same factory or workshop as the said making or remaking; and
- (3) The making or repair of sacks or bags; and also
- (4) The weaving of carpets, rugs or mats.

PART V.

SECTION I.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any superannuation or other provident fund.

SECTION II.

The above proposed Minimum Rates of Wages shall be without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages.

PART VI.

The Trade Board further give notice that the proposals contained in this Schedule are in substitution for the proposals contained in the Notice J (12) issued by the Trade Board and dated 13th May, 1921, which is hereby withdrawn.

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposals to Fix and Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 10th June, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address) and should be sent to the Secretary of the Jute Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely and, so far as possible, with reasons, what is objected to.

FLAX AND HEMP TRADE BOARD (GREAT BRITAIN).

PROPOSAL TO VARY MINIMUM RATES OF WAGES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE LEARNERS EMPLOYED IN WEAVING BY ATTACHING A CONDITION TO THEIR EMPLOYMENT.

In accordance with Regulations made under Section 18 of the Trade Boards Act, 1909, by the Minister of Labour, and dated 31st October, 1918, the Trade Board established under the Trade Boards Act, 1918, for the flax and Hemp Trade in Great Britain as specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, HEREBY GIVE NOTICE, that they PROPOSE TO VARY the General Minimum Time-Rates for certain classes of female learners at present effective and set out in the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (13) dated 8th June, 1922, by attaching a condition for securing their effective instruction in the trade, the proposed variation being as shown in the Schedule set out below.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

SCHEDULE. PART I.

PROPOSED VARIATION OF GENERAL MINIMUM TIME-RATES FOR CERTAIN CLASSES OF FEMALE LEARNERS EMPLOYED IN WEAVING BY ATTACHING A CONDITION FOR SECURING THEIR EFFECTIVE INSTRUCTION IN THE TRADE.

SECTION I.

The Trade Board propose to vary the general minimum time-rates for female learners employed in weaving at present effective and set out in Section IV. (i) of Part I. of their Notice F.H. (13), dated 8th June, 1922, so that they shall apply only to female learners who in addition to being employed under the conditions specified in Section IV. of Part I. of the Schedule to the said Notice F.H. (13) are employed in learning weaving in accordance with the following condition which the Trade Board propose to attach to the said minimum rates of wages:—

"A learner employed in weaving shall be placed under a competent worker to be taught, and the teacher, during the period of teaching, shall be paid at the rate of not less than her average earnings for the previous eight full working weeks, with the addition of 3s. 6d. per week."

SECTION II.

If the condition proposed in Section I. of this Part is not complied with, the learner shall be paid at not less than the appropriate minimum rate applicable to workers other than learners as set out in Section II. or III. of Part I. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (13) date. 8th June, 1922.

PART II.

The above proposed variation shall apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Board's Acts, to all female learners (as defined in Section IV. (iv.) of Part I. of the Schedule to the Trade Board's Notice F.H. (13), dated 8th June, 1922) who are employed in weaving in respect of all time during

which they are employed in Great Britain as weaving learners in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Flax and Hemp) Order, 1919, and set out in Part VII. of the Schedule to the said Notice F.H. (13).

The Trade Board will consider any OBJECTIONS to the above Proposal to Vary which may be lodged with them within two months from the 10th day of June, 1922. Such Objections should be in writing and signed by the person making the same (adding his or her full name and address), and should be sent to The Secretary of the Flax and Hemp Trade Board (Great Britain), 7-11, Old Bailey, London, E.C. 4.

It is desirable that the Objections should state precisely, and, so far as possible, with reasons

what is objected to.

PART III.

OVERTIME RATES (as varied).

Section I.—In accordance with Section 3 (i) (c) of the Trade Boards Act, 1918, the Trade Board have declared the normal number of hours of work in the trade to be as follows:—

In any week 47 On Saturday 42

Provided that all hours worked on Sundays and on Statutory Holidays shall be regarded as Overtime to which the Overtime Rates shall apply.

Section 11.—The Minimum Rates for Overtime in respect of hours worked by a worker, whether employed on time-work or on piecework, in excess of the declared normal number of hours shall be as follows:—

- (a) For all hours worked on Sundays and Statutory Holidays the Overtime Rate shall be twice the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., DOUBLE-TIME.
- (b) For all hours worked in excess of fourand-a-half on Saturday, the Overtime Rate shall be One-and-a-Half times the Minimum Rate otherwise applicable, i.e., TIME-AND-A-HALF, notwithstanding that the total number of hours worked in the week does not exceed 47.
- (c) For all hours worked in excess of 47 in any week, the Overtime Rate shall be equivalent to TIME-AND-A-QUARTER for the first two hours and TIME-AND-A-HALF thereafter, except in so far as higher Overtime Rates are payable under the provisions of Sub-Sections (a) and (b) of this Section.

Note.—The hours which female workers, young persons and children are allowed to work are subject to the provisions of the Factory and Workshop Acts, and of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920.

PART IV.

Section I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages apply, subject to the provisions of the Trade Boards Acts, to all Female Workers in Great Britain in respect of all time during which they are employed in any branch of the trade specified in the Trade Boards (Stamped or Pressed Metal Wares) Order, 1919.

SECTION II.—The Trade as specified in the above-mentioned Order is as follows:—

The manufacture from metals (other than precious metals) by the processes of cold stamping or cold pressing (including cutting or piercing) of cabinet fittings, window fittings, curtain accessories, stationers' sundries, drapers' sundries, fittings for gas or electric light, fittings for suit-cases or handbags or purses, buckles, eyelets, ferrules, labels, collar studs, tie-clips, thimbles, photograph frames, stamped chains, bells, fancy nails (excluding the shanks), parts of safety razors (excluding the blades), parts of braces or suspenders, corset steels or busks, whistles, tin-openers, medals or any similar articles or metal parts of such articles;

INCLUDING:-

- (a) The operations of annealing, hardening, barrelling, polishing, bronzing, nickelling, lacquering, japanning, non-vitreous enamelling, tinning or assembling, where these operations are carried on in association with or in conjunction with the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;
- (b) The operations of carding, boxing, packeting, labelling, weighing, packing, warehousing or despatching, where these operations are incidental to or appertaining to the manufacture of such stamped or pressed metal articles;

BUT EXCLUDING:-

- (a) The operations specified in the Trade Boards (Hollow-ware) Order, 1913;
- (b) The making of buttons or any operations incidental thereto;
- (c) The making of coffin furniture or any operations incidental thereto;
- (d) The making of pins, hairpins, hooks and eyes, hair-curlers, enap fasteners or safety pins or any operations incidental thereto;
- (e) The making of steel pens and the making of stationers' metal sundries or other similar metal articles when carried on as a subsidiary branch of work in association with or in conjunction with the making of steel pens, so as to provide a common or interchangeable form of employment for the workers;
 - (f) The minting of coinage of the realm;(g) The process of hand-embossing.

PART V.

Section I.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages must be paid clear of all deductions other

than deductions under the National Insurance Act, 1911, as amended by any subsequent enactments or deductions authorised by any Act to be made from wages in respect of contributions to any Superannuation or other Provident Fund.

SECTION II.—The above Minimum Rates of Wages are without prejudice to workers who are earning higher rates of wages or to agreements made or that may be made between employers and workers for the payment of wages in excess of these minimum rates of wages.
