

Movement within the Scheduled District.

2.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in the Scheduled District should be permitted to be moved within the Scheduled District as often as occasion may require between different parts of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the Licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the Licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a Licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

Movement into certain Boroughs for Immediate Slaughter.

3. Part II of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920 is hereby applied to the several boroughs and Urban Districts described in the Second Schedule thereto.

Short Title.

4. This Order may be cited as the BIRMINGHAM DISTRICT (FOOT-AND-MOUTH DISEASE) ORDER OF 1922.

ton Bassett, Fazeley, Wigginton, Hopwas Hays, and Tamhorn.

In the administrative county of Worcester—
The borough of Stourbridge,

The petty sessional divisions of Oldbury, Halesowen, Stourbridge, Bromsgrove and Redditch (*except the parish of Inkberrow*); and

The parishes of Wolverley, Chaddesley Corbett, and Rushock, and also comprising

The county boroughs of Birmingham, Smethwick, West Bromwich, Wolverhampton, Walsall and Dudley.

**ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND)
ORDER OF 1922 (No. 6).**

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Modification of Existing Order.

1. The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1922 (hereinafter referred to as "the existing Order") is modified in manner hereinafter appearing.

Withdrawal of Requirement of Isolation during the prescribed period of 28 days detention.

2.—(1) The provisions of the existing Order, which require the detention for a period of 28 days of cattle moved with a licence under that Order to premises other than a slaughterhouse, shall be read and have effect as if the require-
