TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

- 1. The Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the 23rd June, 1922, at 1 o'clock, for
 - (a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the War Loan Acts, 1914-
 - (b) £4 10s. per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1932.
- 2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £55,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £10,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 26th June, 1922, to Saturday, the 1st July, 1922, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

£4 10s. PER CENT. TREASURY BONDS.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000, and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax, and will in all respects rank pari passu with those issued under the Prospectus of the 21st April, 1922. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 26th June, 1922, to Saturday, the 1st July, 1922, inclusive; the first dividend, payable on the 15th October. 1922, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given

for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

Tenders must be made through a London

Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Lioan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

11. Tenders must be made .on: the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

12. The Lords Commissioners Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATION (WALTER THOMAS FUGE).

Whereas Walter Thomas Fuge, of 3, White Hart Street, High Wycombe, being a person who is bonâ fide engaged in practising dentistry, and was so engaged on the 28th July, 1916, but is not registered under the Dentists Act, 1878, has been convicted of an offence against the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920:

Now, therefore, I hereby withdraw from the said Walter Thomas Fuge the authorisation granted in pursuance of the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920, by the authority under my hand dated the 13th August, 1921, to certain persons not registered under the Dentists Act, 1878, to purchase preparations containing not more than 1 per cent. of cocaine for use as local anæesthetics in dentistry.

DANGEROUS DRUGS ACT, 1920.

WITHDRAWAL OF AUTHORISATION (WALTER THOMAS FUGE).

Whereas Walter Thomas Fuge, of 3, White Hart Street, High Wycombe, being a person duly registered under the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, has been convicted of an offence against

the Dangerous Drugs Act, 1920:

And whereas the said Walter Thomas Fuge cannot in my opinion properly be allowed to be in possession of or supply raw opium, nor to carry on the business of manufacturing or selling or distributing any of the drugs to which Part III of the last-named Act applies:

Now, therefore, after consultation with the Council of the Pharmaceutical Society of Great Britain and in pursuance of the powers conferred upon me by No. 6 of the Regulations made under Section 3 and by No. 10 of the Regulations made under Section 7 of the lastnamed Act, I hereby withdraw from the said Thomas Fuge the authorisations granted by the said Regulations to persons who lawfully keep open shop for the retailing of poisons in accordance with the provisions of the Pharmacy Act, 1868, as amended by the Poisons and Pharmacy Act, 1908, to be in possession of and supply raw opium and to carry on the business of manufacturing, selling or distributing the drugs to which Part III of that Act applies.

TRANSFER OF AUXILIARY HOME IN CONNECTION WITH CERTIFIED INDUSTRIAL SCHOOLS FROM 24, Paddington Green, W., to 40, Ports-down Road, London, W. 9.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department hereby gives notice that the Mabys Association for the Care of Young Girls, 66, Denison House, 296, Vauxhall Bridge Road, S.W. 1, have resigned the Certificate granted under the Industrial Schools Act, 1866, in respect of their Auxiliary Home at 24, Paddington Creek W. dington Green, W., and have removed to larger premises at 40, Portsdown Road, W. 9.

The Secretary of State has issued a Certifi-cate under the provisions of the Children Act, 1908, that the latter premises are fitted to be an Auxiliary Home for the reception of girls from Certified Industrial Schools. The Certifi-

cate, which bears date the 14th June, 1922, provides that the number of girls resident in the said Home at any one time, whether sent thereto from Industrial Schools or otherwise, shall not exceed eighteen.

IMPORTATION OF PLUMAGE (No. 2) ORDER, 1922,

(8), dated 7th March, 1922.

The Minister of Labour has given his consent to the issue of this Notice.

(ii) The swine shall be moved by the nearest available route without unnecessary delay, and during the movement shall, so far as is practicable, be kept separate from , all swine not being moved with a licence

under this Order.

- (iii) After completion of the movement the licence shall forthwith be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest policestation in the same district by the person in charge of the swine at the time of completing . such movement.
- 2. Swine may also be removed from the Sale mentioned in the Schedule hereto to premises situate in any Scheduled District for the pur-

poses of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, subject to the provisions of the Order of the Minister declaring such district to be a Scheduled District. 
