At the Court at *Buckingham Palace*, the 20th day of *June*, 1922.

PRESENT,

The KING's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS there was this day read at the Board a Memorial from the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty, dated the 8th day of June, 1922 (C.W. 6035/22), in the words following, viz. :—

"Whereas by Section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act, 1865, it is enacted, *inter alia*, that all pay, pensions or other allowances in the nature thereof payable in respect of services in Your Majesty's Naval or Marine Force to a person being or having been an Officer, Seaman, or Marine therein, shall be paid in such manner and subject to such restrictions, conditions and provisions as are from time to time directed by Order in Council:

"And whereas Your Majesty was graciously pleased by Schedule V., Section VI. of Your Order in Council bearing date the 22nd day of January, 1920, to sanction, *inter alia*, payment of an allowance of 5s. a day to a Paymaster Commander or Paymaster Captain in charge of the accounts of a Division at the Royal Naval Barracks at Portsmouth, Devonport or Chatham:

"And whereas we are of opinion that the Accountant Officer (who will normally be of the

rank of Paymaster Captain) in charge of the accounts at the Royal Naval Base, Port Edgar, should under existing circumstances be granted a similar allowance:

"We beg leave humbly to recommend that Your Majesty may be graciously pleased to authorize payment of an allowance of 5s. a day to the Accountant Officer, Royal Naval Base, Port Edgar, for so long as the number of accounts for which he is responsible does not fall below 4,000, and with effect as from the 1st January, 1922.

"The Lords Commissioners of Your Majesty's Treasury have signified their concurrence in this proposal."

His Majesty, having taken the said Memorial into consideration, was pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to approve of what is therein proposed.

And the Right Honourable the Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty are to give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
