#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS AND TREASURY BONDS.

1. The Lords Commissioners of His  
Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that  
Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's  
Office, at the Bank of England, on Friday, the  
30th June, 1922, at 1 o'clock, for

(a) Treasury Bills to be issued under the  
Treasury Bills Act, 1877; the National Debt  
Act, 1889; and the War Loan Acts, 1914-  
1919; and

(b) £4 10s. per cent. Treasury Bonds, re-  
payable at par on the 15th April, 1932.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills  
and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be  
£50,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds  
issued will not exceed £5,000,000, but subject  
to that limit the total amount issued will be  
divided between Bills and Bonds in such pro-  
portions as their Lordships may determine.

#### TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or  
£10,000. They will be dated at the option of  
the Tenderer on any business day from Mon-  
day, the 3rd July, 1922, to Saturday, the 8th  
July, 1922, inclusive, and will be payable at  
three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the  
Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not  
less than £50,000, and must specify the date on  
which the Bills required are to be dated, and  
the net amount per cent. (being an even  
multiple of one penny) which will be given for  
the amount applied for. Separate Tenders  
must be lodged for Bills of different dates.
