

£4 10s. % TREASURY BONDS, 1932.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporation Profits Tax and will in all respects rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 21st April, 1922. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 3rd July, 1922, to Saturday, the 8th July, 1922, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th October, 1922, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. By an Exchange of Notes of May 13th and 17th, 1922, between His Majesty's Chargé d'Affaires in Mexico and the Mexican Minister for Foreign Affairs, effect has been given to an Agreement between the British and Mexican Governments for the transmission of Diplomatic Bags between the Foreign Office and His Majesty's Legation in Mexico, and between the Mexican Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Mexican Legation in London.

2. The Agreement provides that Diplomatic Bags shall enjoy the privileges and securities granted by the British and Mexican Administrations to Cabinet Mails, and shall be inviolable.

3. The Agreement also provides that the British and Mexican Postal Administrations shall fix, by mutual agreement, the limits of weight and measurement of the Diplomatic Bags, and shall make the arrangements for their transmission.

PRISON ACT, 1898.
