

(Watford Urban Extension) Confirmation Order, 1909, and by the Watford Urban District Extension Order, 1920, confirmed by the County of Hertford (Watford Urban District) Confirmation Order, 1921:

And whereas under and by virtue of the Local Government Act, 1894, the Local Board became the Urban District Council for the Urban District of Watford, hereinafter called "the District Council":

And whereas by the Watford (Urban) Additional Councillors Election Order, 1895, made by the County Council of the Administrative County of Hertford the number of Urban District Councillors for the District was altered from 12 to 18:

And whereas by the Watford Order, 1898, made by the aforesaid County Council the District was in and by such Order divided into four Wards represented by eighteen elected members in all:

And whereas by the Watford Wards and Councillors Order, 1904, made by the aforesaid County Council, the number of Wards of the District was altered to five and the number of elected members was increased to twenty-one:

And whereas the Local Government Board did on the 15th day of March, 1895, under Section 33 of the Local Government Act, 1894, issue an Order by which the District Council were vested with the power to appoint Overseers of the Poor for the Parishes of Watford Urban and Oxhey, and they did on the 12th day of November, 1895, issue a further Order under the same Section by which the District Council were vested with the power to appoint and revoke the appointment of Assistant Overseers for such Parishes:

And whereas by an Award dated the 14th day of August, 1871, the terms and conditions upon which the London Orphan Asylum (now known as the London Orphan School) might cause a sewer or drain of and from their premises to communicate with the sewer of the Watford Local Board of Health were settled:

And whereas the County Council of the Administrative County of Hertford by the Hertfordshire Polling Districts Order, 1920 (which as regards the District has since been altered by the Watford Urban District Extension Order, 1920), made in pursuance of the Local Government Act, 1888, divided the County of Hertford into Polling Districts and appointed Polling Places:

And whereas by Commissioners' Awards dated the 18th day of January, 1855, and the 15th day of April, 1869, and made pursuant to the Acts for the Inclosure Exchange and Improvement of Land divers commons and waste lands within the District were set out allotted and divided:

And whereas by an Order of the Board of Charity Commissioners for England and Wales dated the 21st day of October, 1898, In the Matter of the Charity called or known as The British School with the Charities of Stewart Marjoribanks and Arthur Ashfield the District Council appoint one representative Trustee of the said Charities consolidated by the said Order:

And whereas by an Order of the Board of Education dated the 14th day of August, 1906, In the Matter of the Foundation of Francis Combe the District Council appoint one representative Trustee of the said Foundation:

And whereas by an Order of the Board of

Charity Commissioners for England and Wales dated the 24th day of August, 1909, In the Matter of the Charity of Dorothy Lady Morison with the subsidiary Charities of Ann Phip and Hannah Pocock the District Council appoint three representative Trustees of the said Charities consolidated by the said Order:

And whereas by a Scheme made by the Board of Education on the 22nd day of December, 1909, under the Charitable Trusts Acts, 1853 to 1894, for the alteration of the Scheme regulating the Watford Endowed Schools the District Council appoint eight Representative Governors of the Foundation known as The Watford Grammar Schools and the said Scheme as altered by subsequent Schemes of the Board of Education dated the 17th day of June, 1919, and the 31st day of January, 1922, affects the District:

And whereas by a Scheme made by the Charity Commissioners and dated the 17th day of December, 1912 (and varying a Scheme of the High Court of Justice (Chancery Division) of the 4th day of July, 1881), In the Matter of the Charity of George Johnson Reveley the District Council appoint two Representative Trustees of the said Charity:

And whereas the District Council appoint a Local Committee for the District under the Naval and Military War Pensions, etc., Act, 1915, by virtue of a Scheme made by the District Council on the 19th day of September, 1916, and approved by the War Pensions, etc., Statutory Committee on the 5th day of October, 1916, which Scheme was revised by a Supplemental Scheme (since revoked) made on the 1st day of March, 1918, and approved by the Minister of Pensions on the 7th day of March, 1918, and by a second Supplemental Scheme made on the 9th day of September, 1919, and approved on the 18th day of September, 1919:

And whereas the District Council (with the Watford Rural District Council) appoint two members of the Provincial Council for the County of Hertford under the National Joint Industrial Council for Local Authorities non-trading services (Manual Workers) under a Scheme which was approved on the 27th day of June, 1921:

And whereas by the Watford Joint Hospital Order, 1902, confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 8) Act, 1902, which Order has since been amended by the Watford Joint Hospital Orders of 1906 and 1913, the Watford Joint Hospital District was formed which affects the District and the District Council and the Chairman or Vice-Chairman of the Urban District Council is an ex-officio member of the Governing Body to which Body the District Council also elect six elective members:

And whereas a Joint Committee has been appointed under Section 53 of the Local Government Act, 1894, for the purposes of the Burial Acts by the District Council and the Watford Rural Parish Council and tables of fees, payments, and sums settled in accordance with the provisions of the Burial Act, 1852, have been made and so far as necessary were approved by the Minister of Health on the 28th day of April, 1922:

And whereas by the Watford Order, 1913, confirmed by the Local Government Board's Provisional Orders Confirmation (No. 1) Act, 1913, and by the Watford Order, 1917, confirmed by the Local Government Board's Pro-
