EXPLOSIVE SUBSTANCE.

The Secretary of State for the Home Department gives notice that, in pursuance of the powers conferred on him by Sections 37 and 39 of the Explosives Act, 1875, he made an Order entitled "Order of the Secretary of State, No. 4 (C), dated June 21, 1922, relating to the Conveyance of Explosive by Road," to the effect that the Byelaws made under the said provisions and gazetted on the 30th November, 1875, and known as Order of the Secretary of State No. 4, shall be amended and shall take effect as if in No. 3, paragraph (p), of the said Byelaws there were inserted a provision to the effect that where the explosive consists of articles incapable of communicating explosion from one to the other, such as fuses for shell, tubes, primers and Q.F. ammunition up to 3-inch calibre, the quantity of explosive that may be conveyed in any one carriage may exceed 2,000 lbs., but shall not exceed 10,000 lbs.

WORKMEN'S COMPENSATION ACT, 1906.

The Home Secretary gives notice, that in pursuance of Section 2 (1) of the Employment of Women, Young Persons and Children Act, 1920, he has made an Order authorising the

employment on two day-shifts of women over 18 and male young persons of 16 years of age and over in the Slag Department at the works of The Clay Cross Co., Ltd., Clay Cross, near Chesterfield, subject to the conditions that no worker shall be employed in the afternoon shift in consecutive weeks; that suitable protective clothing, cloakroom and messroom accommodation, washing facilities and efficient lighting shall be provided; that a woman or young person shall not be allowed to lift, carry or move anything so heavy as to be likely to cause injury to the woman or young person; and that certain safety precautions shall be observed.
