The following Statutes made by the University of Cambridge, on the 30th day of June, 1922, have been submitted for the approval of His Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of "The Uni-

versities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877."

STATUTES to alter and amend the Statutes in relation to the University of Cambridge made under "The Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act, 1877" (40 and 41 Victoria, Chapter 48), which amending Statutes are now submitted for the approval of His Majesty the King in Council.

We, the Chancellor, Masters and Scholars of the University of Cambridge, in pursuance of the power given to us by the 53rd Section of the said Act, do hereby alter and amend the Statutes made under the said Act in relation to our said University in manner following, that is to say:—

By substituting in Statute A, Chapter II, Section 12, intituled "Students in Science," the words "Music, Philosophy, Letters or Science" for the words "or Music."

By substituting in Statute A, Chapter II, Section 13, intituled "Students in Letters," the words "Music, Philosophy, Letters or Science" for the words "or Music."

(b) £4 10s. per cent. Treasury Bonds, repayable at par on the 15th April, 1932.

2. The maximum amount of Treasury Bills and Treasury Bonds to be issued will be £45,000,000. The amount of Treasury Bonds issued will not exceed £5,000,000, but subject to that limit the total amount issued will be divided between Bills and Bonds in such proportions as Their Lordships may determine.

TREASURY BILLS.

3. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000 or £10,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 17th July, 1922, to Saturday, the 22nd July, 1922, inclusive, and will be payable at three months after date.

4. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

5. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000, and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

£4 10s. % TREASURY BONDS, 1932.

6. The Bonds will be in denominations of £50, £100, £200, £500, £1,000 and £5,000. They will be exempt from Corporations Profits Tax and will in all respects rank *pari passu* with those issued under the Prospectus of the 21st April, 1922. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, the 17th July, 1922, to Saturday, the 22nd July, 1922, inclusive; the first dividend payable on the 15th October, 1922, will represent in the case of each Bond interest to that date from the date of the Bond.

7. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bonds required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one shilling) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bonds of different dates.

8. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

9. The persons whose Tenders are accepted will be informed of the same not later than

the following day, and payment in full of the amounts of the accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of Cash or a Banker's Draft on the Bank of England not later than 2 o'clock (Saturday 12 o'clock) on the day on which the relative Bills or Bonds are to be dated.

10. In virtue of the provisions of Section 1 (4) of the War Loan Act, 1919, Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills and Bonds.

His Majesty The KING has been graciously pleased to confer the Decoration of the Albert Medal upon Jack Chalmers, of Sydney, New South Wales.

The following is an account of the services in respect of which the Decoration has been conferred:—

On the 4th February, 1922, Milton Coughlan was swimming just outside the breakers at Coogee Beach, Sydney, N.S. Wales, when he was attacked by a shark, which bit deeply into his left forearm. Freeing himself, he fought and drove away the shark, which, however, returned and succeeded in establishing a hold on his right arm, but the grip was again broken.

Observing what had happened, Jack Chalmers had a line tied round his waist, and immediately dashed across the rocks to the rescue, and although he slipped and fell, and was momentarily stunned through his head coming into contact with a rock, he quickly recovered, plunged into the water and swam out to Coughlan, who was floating helplessly in the water; Chalmers caught hold of him round the body, and held him until they were both hauled in to the rocks.

The injured bather's arms were practically bitten through and the flesh torn from them, and the unfortunate man succumbed to his injuries shortly after reaching hospital.

Jack Chalmers undoubtedly fully realised the risk he was incurring, and showed extraordinary gallantry in going to Coughlan's rescue in the circumstances. That the danger was considerable is clear from the fact that a number of sharks were seen swimming around the spot where the rescue occurred immediately after the bather was lifted ashore.

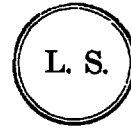

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals, Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Application of Restrictions to Scheduled Districts.

1. Parts I., III. and IV. of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order," are hereby applied without modification, save as hereinafter provided, to the several districts described in the First Schedule hereto, each of which shall be a Scheduled District for the purposes of that Order.

Declaration of Prohibited Areas.

2. The areas described in the Second Schedule hereto are hereby declared to be Prohibited Areas for the purposes of the Principal Order.

Movement within the Prohibited Areas.

3.—(1) Where an Inspector of the Ministry considers it necessary or expedient, after inquiry, that an animal in either of the Prohibited Areas should be permitted to be moved within the same Prohibited Area as often as occasion may require between different parts

of the same farm, he may, notwithstanding any prohibition of movement contained in the principal Order, authorise such movement by an Occupation Licence, and the Inspector may insert in the Licence such conditions as he may consider necessary or desirable for the purpose of preventing the animals referred to in the Licence from coming into contact with any other animals.

(2) If in respect of any animal the conditions of a Licence granted under this Article are not complied with, the owner of the animal and the person for the time being in charge thereof shall each, according to and in respect of his own acts and defaults, be guilty of an offence against the Act of 1894.

ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 7).

The Minister of Agriculture and Fisheries, by virtue and in exercise of the powers vested in him under the Diseases of Animals Acts, 1894 to 1914, and of every other power enabling him in this behalf, hereby orders as follows:—

Control of Movement of Animals from Irish Animals Landing Places.

1. Cattle, sheep, goats or swine landed at any Irish Animals Landing Place in Great Britain shall not be moved therefrom except in accordance with the following provisions of this Order.

Movement of Cattle, Sheep, Goats or Swine for Immediate Slaughter.

2 Cattle, sheep, goats or swine may be

moved from the Landing Place direct to a slaughterhouse if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.

Animals for Slaughter to be Slaughtered within 96 hours of Arrival at Slaughterhouse.

3. Where animals are moved with a licence under this Order direct to a slaughterhouse, the animals on arrival at the slaughterhouse shall be detained therein until slaughtered, and shall be slaughtered within 96 hours of their arrival at the slaughterhouse.

Movement of Cattle not Intended for Immediate Slaughter to be subject to 14 days' detention.

4. Cattle may also be moved from the Landing Place direct to any premises other than a market, fairground, saleyard, lair or place of exhibition if accompanied by a licence granted by an Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place, subject as hereinafter provided:—

(a) Cattle moved with a licence under this Article shall not, except as provided in paragraph (b) of this Article, be moved from the place of destination specified in the licence until the expiration of a period of 14 days from the date of their arrival thereat. During the said period of detention the cattle shall be under the supervision of an Inspector of the Local Authority.

(b) During the prescribed period of 14 days' detention the animals may, if accompanied by a further licence granted by an Inspector of the Local Authority of the district, be moved to other premises not being a market, fairground, saleyard, lair or place of exhibition, in which case the provisions of paragraph (a) of this Article shall apply to the animals so moved as if such premises were the original place of destination, but not so as to extend the prescribed period of detention. Such further licence shall specify the date of expiration of the prescribed period of 14 days' detention. If the place of destination to be specified in such further licence is situate in the District of another Local Authority the licence shall not be granted unless the consent of that Local Authority to the movement of the animals into their District has been previously obtained.

Provisions as to Licences and Movement.

5. A movement licence granted under this Order shall be available for four days, inclusive of the date thereof, and no longer.

6. A copy of every licence granted under this Order shall forthwith be sent by the Inspector granting the same to the Local Authority of the District in which the place of destination is situate, and also to the occupier of the place of destination.

7. In the case of every movement of animals authorised by a licence under this Order the licence shall accompany the animals throughout the movement, and shall be produced on demand to an Inspector of the Ministry or of the Local Authority, or a Police Constable.

8. The licence shall forthwith, after completion of the movement, be delivered up at, or sent by post to, the nearest police station in the same District by the person in charge of the animals at the time of completing the movement.

9. Animals while being moved with a licence under this Order shall, so far as is practicable, be moved by rail and be kept separate

from all animals which are not being so moved. When being moved by road the animals shall be moved without unnecessary delay to the place of destination specified in the licence.

In the case of animals moved by rail the animals shall not be untrucked for any purpose until they reach the destination station from which they are to be moved to the premises specified in the licence, except that animals may be untrucked for the purpose of feeding or watering within the railway station premises only, at any station not situated within a district which is for the time being a Scheduled District for the purposes of the Foot-and-Mouth Disease (Control of Movement) Order of 1920, and provided that any dock, pen or other part of the railway premises used for this purpose is disinfected in the manner prescribed in Article 12 of this Order both immediately before and after each occasion of such use.

Provision as to Marking.

10. An animal shall not be moved from the Landing Place with a licence under this Order unless before the movement is commenced it is marked by and at the expense of the owner or his agent in manner following:—

Cattle.—By the clipping of a broad arrow, ↑ about six inches long, on the left hind-quarter of each of the cattle if the cattle are to be moved to premises other than a slaughterhouse, and on the right hind-quarter of each of the cattle if they are to be moved to a slaughterhouse.

Sheep.—By the clipping of a broad arrow ↑ on the forehead of each of the sheep; and also by the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the sheep with the following composition, namely: Rosin, five parts; oil of turpentine, two parts; and blue or red ochre, one part; melted and used warm; or with some other adhesive composition of a blue or red colour.

Swine.—By the painting or stamping of the letter M, about six inches long, on both sides of each of the swine with the composition above mentioned.

Movement of Animals subject to other Orders or Regulations.

11. Nothing in this Order shall be deemed to authorise the movement of an animal in contravention of any other Order of the Minister or any Regulation of a Local Authority prohibiting or regulating the movement of animals into their District.

Disinfection of Railway Trucks and Railway Loading Banks.

12.—(1) A railway truck or other railway vehicle used for the conveyance of any animals from an Irish Animals Landing Place shall, immediately before any such animal is placed in it, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant, under the supervision and to the satisfaction of the Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place.

(2) A railway loading bank or loading dock used for the loading of Irish animals at an Irish Animals Landing Place for conveyance therefrom shall, when required by an Inspector of the Ministry at the Landing Place, be thoroughly sprayed with liquid disinfectant.

(3) The liquid disinfectant to be used for the purposes of this Article shall be—

(a) A one per cent. (minimum) solution of chloride of lime containing not less than thirty per cent. of available chlorine; or

(b) a five per cent. (minimum) solution of carbolic acid (containing not less than ninety-five per cent. of actual carbolic acid); or

(c) a disinfectant equal in disinfective efficiency to the above-mentioned solution of carbolic acid.

(4) Nothing in this Article shall interfere with the operation of the provisions of the Animals (Transit and General) Order of 1912 as to the cleansing and disinfection of railway trucks and other railway vehicles used for the conveyance of animals on a railway.

Offences.

13. If anything is done or omitted to be done in contravention of this Order, the owner and the person for the time being in charge of the animal, or, in respect of Article 11, the railway company loading the animals or owning the loading banks in respect of which, as the case may be, the same is done or omitted to be done, shall, each according to and in respect of his or their own acts or omissions, be deemed guilty of an offence against the Diseases of Animals Act, 1894.

Revocation.

14.—(1) The Animals (Landing from Ireland) Order of 1922 and the Animals (Landing from Ireland) Orders of 1922 (Nos. 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6) are hereby revoked.

(2) Cattle moved from a Landing Place before the date of commencement of this Order with a licence under the Orders hereby revoked shall not be required (notwithstanding any provision in the revoked Orders) to be detained at the place of destination specified in such licence for a longer period than 14 days after the date of the commencement of this Order.

Commencement.

15. This Order shall come into operation on the tenth day of July, nineteen hundred and twenty-two.

Short Title.

16. This Order may be cited as the ANIMALS (LANDING FROM IRELAND) ORDER OF 1922 (No. 7).
